SUBJECT: Native And Alien Pay Schedules For Such Employees Coming Under The Provisions Of Public Law 490

1. Reference is made to message U24490 your command relative to the base pay schedules effective in the Philippine Islands for native and alien Federal employees during the period of absence of such employees under the provisions of Public Law 490. No complete pay schedules are available here.
2. Attached for your information are copies of schedules in effect for native and alien employees working in the Quartermaster and Ordnance Offices in the Philippine Islands in 1940 and 1941.
3. In accordance with delegated authority, it is suggested that pay schedules for such employees be established locally by your command.
4. With respect to the regulations effecting annual and sick leave and overtime payments for native and alien employees, attention is invited to paragraphs 7b(2) and 8a of attached memorandum dated 5 February 1945, subject: Policy To Govern Preparation Of Accounts Of Missing Persons.
5. A representative of the Civilian Personnel Division, Office of the Secretary of War, is enroute and will upon arrival in your command lend assistance in connection with settlement of accounts of War Department employees coming under the provisions of Public Law 490.
