Government and working in the Civilian Evacuation Camp called Cabcabin, I know of no civilians who worked under Capt. Archer as Food Distributors, although it is quite possible that some of them volunteered their services and probably assisted in the maintenance of the Camp.

It is my belief that any civilians working in any of these refugee camps either donated their services or were employed by the Philippine Government.

The men from the camps who worked outside of the camps, on roads etc. were paid by the services who employed them.
