AFFIDAVIT

THAT, I, LORETO DELGADO, of legal age, married, filipino and a resident of the Municipality of San Jose, Province of Antique, Philippines, do hereby certify that the following statement are true and correct:

That, I am duly and legally appointed Assistant Civil Engineer of the Province of Antique, Commonwealth of the Philippines and have been Assistant Civil Engineer of said Province since August 16, 1941;

That, this office with Mr. Rodolfo Maslog as the District Engineer, thru the Bureau of Public Works, Manila with Mr. Vicente Fragante as the director, was directed by the USAFFE to undertake the following projects:

1. Construction and reinforcement of all bridges along the Antique-Capiz and Antique-Iloilo Interprovincial Road; along San Jose-Sibalom-San Remegio Road and Ilaures-Valderama Road, making these sections passable at all times and meeting all USAFFE requirements;

2. Constrection and extension of the San Jose Landing Field including all installations as required by the USAFFE such as the construction of aerplane pens, aeroplane hideouts fuel and ammunition dumps, air raid shelter, dug wells, quarter and shop for American officers and crews, and fox holes for the protection of laborers and personnel in case of an enemy straffing.

That, the construction of the above named projects was cons-truected mainly for the use of the USAFFE;

That, all the laborers except the skilled and the semi-skilled were rotated every 15 days;

That, the following were employed under my control:

That, the construction and reinforcements of bridges were completed before the Japanese landed in Panay on April 16, 1942;

That, the construction of the extension of the San Jose Landing Field including all installations required by the USAFFE were almost complete when the Japanese landed in the province on April 17, 1942. Only the remaining installation that was in full swing from April 1st to 15, 1942 was the construction of Air raid shelter and quarters for Americans, which were almost complete when the enemy landed in the province. The construction of the runway, aeroplane pens, aeroplane hideouts, fuel and ammunition dumps, dug wells, and other minor installation were completed before March 31, 1942. The enemy landing in the province on April 17, 1942 caused the ceasing of all work;

That, the installation was bombed on April 16, 1942 at about 9:00 A. M. by the two Japanese planes, but no casualty, because

most of the laborers went home and to evacuate in the mountains when they learned of the Japanese landing in Oton, Iloilo, on April 16, 1942;

That, the installation was strafed on or about the 2nd week of April 1942 by the two Japanese planes, but no casualty because enough fox holes for workers were provided for in case of enemy strafing;

That, no action was taken to protect the workers because when the enemy landed in the province on April 17, 1942, the workers were already in their evacuation places;

That, the common laborers were rotated every 15 days while the skilled and semi-skilled laborers were employed almost continuously. All the workers stopped working when they learned of the enemy landing in Oton, Iloilo on April 16, 1942, and they evacuated to their respective evacuation places;

That, the workers except a few of them were paid up to and including March 31, 1942 by the USAFFE;

That, after the end of every quincena vouchers and payrolls covering payment of salaries and wages of all persons working in these projects were being prepared in the office of the District Engineer as agreed upon by the USAFFE and this office, preaudited and sent to the USAFFE office in Iloilo for final approval. Once approved a paymaster from the office of the Provincial Treasurer of Antique gets the money value of the approved payroll and vouchers from the USAFFE office in Iloilo, and paymaster pays the laborers usually at the site of work;

That, the paymaster so employed was Mr. Eduardo Panaguiton, now deceased;

That, the paymaster was the employee of the Provincial Treasurer of Antique, intrusted to pay our Public Works laborers and also designated to pay our workers in various projects requested by the USAFFE and undertaken by this office, and was assisted by our Chief Clerk, Mr. Pedro A. Jareta;

That, the salaries of the paymaster and his helper was charged against the USAFFE. That to the best of my knowledge said paymaster Mr. Eduardo Panaguiton's account was not fully liquidated due to the landing of the enemy in Panay and to his untimely death;

That, most of our workers, except a few of them have been paid

their salaries up to and including March 31, 1942;

That, as Assistant Civil Engineer, I received instructions from my immediate superior, Mr. Rodolfo Maslog and Mr. Ladislao J. Tokentino, Civil Engineer and I am the one incharge of directing and supervising the whole construction of the San Jose Landing Field, repair, construction, and reinforcement of bridges in our highway as required by the USAFFE and directed by my chief;

That, in the absence of my immediate superiors named above, I was incharged of rotating and employing laborers and carpenters in the different projects required by the USAFFE;

That, I am the one incharge of assigning to the different capatazes their respective project to work on.

That, on or about December 15, 1941, I was assigned by the District Engineer, Mr. Rodolfo Maslog, to work with the San Jose Landing Field as Capataz and paid at a daily wage of P4.00;

That, the names appearing below were some of the employees from the District Engineer's Office assigned in the San Jose Landing Field with their respective duty and salary as:

That, our salaries and wages were paid by the USAFFE thru the Provincial Treasurer of Antique, Mr. Jose A. Quimpo;

That, I worked continuously with the San Jose Landing Field since on or about December 15, 1941 to February 24, 1942, inclusive, and was paid in full of my wages;

That, from February 25th to April 15, 1942, inclusive, I was transferred and worked continuously in Topographic Survey of Mt. Baloy, Valderrama, Antique as Surveyman and was paid at daily wage of P4.30 and was entitled to a travel pay or per diem of at P1.50 per day;

That, I was paid in full of my wages and travel pay up to March 31, 1942 by Lt. Escarilla, Engineering Corps, 61st Division, USAFFE;

USAFFE

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That, I was not paid of my wages from 1st to 15 April 1942, inclusive, and travel pay from 1st to 5 April 1942, inclusive;

That, up to 15 April 1942, the Topographic Survey of Mt. Baloy and its surroundings were not finished as on April 5, 1942, we were called down to San Jose, Antique by Lt. Escarilla to prepare and make the maps out of the notes we have taken from the field;

That, the names appearing below were the laborers working continuously since February 25th to April 5, 1942, inclusive, except Ramon de Ocampo who worked up to the 15th, with the survey with their respective duty, wage and inclusive dates of employment as:

That, as Capataz, there were several laborers under my supervision and we have been paid in full of our wages up to March 31, 1942 by Mr. Eduardo Panaguiton, Paymaster of the Office of the Provincial Treasurer of Antique;

That, since 1st April 1942, I was released of my work as Capataz and assigned as Special Police of the same San Jose Landing Field by the District Engineer, Mr. Rodolfo Maslog and to receive the ~~same~~ rate of P1.00 per day;

That, I worked continuously from January 1st to April 14, 1942 and ceased working on the 14th April on account of the invasion by the enemy of Antique;

That, I have not been paid of my wages from April 1st to 14, 1942, inclusive;

That, as Capataz I was under the supervision of Civil Engineer, Mr. Ladislao J. Tolentino of District Engineer's Office and as Special Police my supervisor was Mr. Martin Adricola.

That, the extension of the telephone service include all the municipalities of Antique, only in the Municipal Building, in the residences of provincial officials and some important barrios and such service was exclusively official;

That, when the USAFFE took over the telephone service, some of the extensions to the barrios were transferred to the outpost of the USAFFE;

That, we were paid of our salaries by the Provincial Treasurer of Antique, Mr. Jose J. Quimpo, and have been paid


of our salaries up to April 15, 1942, and also an advance of equivalent to three months salary;

That, the telephone was used in transmitting messages or telegraph messages from San Jose and Iloilo to the different outpost of the USAFFE concerned and to get messages from outpost that to be sent by telegraph to Iloilo or to other USAFFE destination;

That, the central of the telephone service was burn by the USAFFE when the enemy landed in Iloilo on April 16, 1942.

That, I, RODOLFO MASLOG, of legal age, married, filipino and a resident of the Municipality of San Jose, Province of Antique, Philippines, do hereby certify that the following statements are true and correct:

That, I am the duly and legally appointed District Engineer of the Province of Antique, Commonwealth of the Philippines and have been District Engineer of said Province since September 1940;

That, my office, thru the Bureau of Public Works, Manila, with Mr. Vicente Fragante then as director, was directed in the latter part of 1941 and early part of 1942 by the USAFFE to undertake the following projects:

1. Construction or reinforcement of all bridges to accommodate USAFFE requirements along the Antique-Capiz and Antique-Iloilo Inter-provincial Roads, along the Laures-Valderrama road and along the San Jose-San Remengio road and to keep these roads and bridges available and passable at all times.
2. Construction or enlargement of the Air Landing Field at San Fernando, San Jose, Antique consisting of the enlargement of the then existing air strip, surfacing of the runways with broken stones, sodding the whole airstrip with grass, construction of airplane pens and shelter, to be matted with woven bamboo wawali, fuel and ammunition dumps or bodegas both surface and underground, digging of wells where mechanized pumps have been installed, and construction of quarters, offices and shops.
3. Construction of fox holes fitted with woven bamboo baskets due to sandy soil, around the vicinity of the landing field and in and around the poblacion of the town of San Jose for protection of laborers and civilians from enemy air raids;
4. Topographic Survey of the sector surrounding Mt. Baloy.

All the above projects have to be done rush.

That, there were employed in the above projects one Civil Engineer, three Assistant Engineers, four Graduate Engineers, one Surveyman, one Foreman as:

in addition to two road roller operators, four tenders, nine drivers, about 30 capatazes and cabos, tool keepers, timekeepers, scrapmen, plowmen, carpenters and all kinds of laborers totaling at one time over a thousand.

That persons assigned in the maintenance of roads and bridges were permanent and so were the men assigned in the construction of the landing field except laborers who were on the rotation system of one quencena a turn;

That, all technical, skilled and semi skilled personnel were employed from the commencement of the projects to the landing of the enemy in Panay;;

That, overtime work were frequently resorted when found necessary;

That, the reinforcement and repair of all bridges were completed but that maintenance of roads and bridges was a continuous project and work thereon was stopped only when the enemy landed in Panay on April 16, 1942, when all wooden structures were burn or otherwise destroyed by the USAFFE;

That, all works in the Air Landing Field was mostly completed except maintenance work and construction of quarters, offices and shops which were full underway. That on or about April 14, 1942, I received a radiogram from the USAFFE office in Iloilo incharge of the construction of the Air Landing Field to turn over the said field to a certain officer on April 16, 1942. That on the morning of said date, April 16, 1942, two enemy planes strafed and bombed the landing field. After the bombing I proceeded to the landing field to determine damage to personnel and property and to turn over the installation as directed. That I found no casualty to personnel and no damage to property and that upon inquiry I was informed that the USAFFE officer who was to take over the landing

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

field had left the place to evacuate to the interior of the province. That due to the landing of the enemy in Panay work in the said landing field was abandoned as all persons had to scurry to their respective evacuation places in the mountains;


That, after the end of every quencena vouchers and payrolls covering payment of salaries and wages of all persons engaged in the aforementioned projects were being prepared in this office and in conformity with arrangement had between this office and the USAFFE office in Iloilo said vouchers and payrolls were pre audited, after which the same were taken to USAFFE Iloilo office for final approval and once approved a paymaster from the office of the Provincial Treasurer of Antique took delivery of the money value of said vouchers and payrolls from said USAFFE Iloilo Office. That, the paymaster made direct payments assisted by clerks of this office to the different persons concerned. Usually these payments were made at the sight of work;

That, the paymaster so employed was Mr. Eduardo Panaguiton, now deceased and that he was assisted by Mr. Pedro Jareta, Chief Clerk of this office and by the different engineers and capatazes. That said Mr. Panaguiton and Mr. Pedro Jareta were paid their respective salaries by the USAFFE in the same manner as the persons employed in the aforementioned projects, and as elsewhere described. That to the best of my knowledge said Mr. Eduardo Panaguiton's account was not fully liquidated due to the landing of the enemy in Panay;

That, persons employed in the aforementioned projects most of them were fully paid their salaries and wages up to and including March 15, 1942, that some were fully paid up to March 31, 1942, and that none was paid for the quencena April 1 to April 16, 1942.

I, FELIPE Z. VELASCO, of legal age, married, filipino and a resident of the Municipality of Pandan, Province of Antique, Philippines, do hereby certify that the following statements are true and correct:

That, I was the Maintenance Foreman of the District Engineer's Office, Bureau of Public Works for the Province of Antique long before the outbreak of the recent war;

That, I was paid at daily basis of P2.90 and entitled to a per diem or travel pay at P1.50 per day when traveling for inspection and supervision;

That, on or about January 1, 1942, I was ordered and instructed by the District Engineer, Mr. Rodolfo Maslog that beginning that day I, the Capatazes and Camineros under my supervision will work for maintaining the roads and reinforce the bridges from San Jose to Valderrama and up to the boundary of Antique and Capiz and that all expenses including our wages incurred will be charged to the USAFFE;

That, on these works there were seven Capatazes and each Capataz had a number of Camineros as follows with their respective amount of daily wage and assignment:

That, the Capatazes and Camineros above-mentioned were paid in daily basis and have been paid of their wages up to March 31, 1942, inclusive;

That, at the time of the invasion by the enemy of Antique on April 17, 1942, all roads were maintained and the reinforcing of the bridges were finished;
