1. Attached find the file of ANGLES, ALFONSO S., List #27 and 280 file on Food Procurement, QM, Paton. On the basis of all available evidence the case of ALFONSO S. ANGLES was given a positive determination under the Missing Persons Act; and he was held to full as a War Department employee.

2. It is desirable to establish the legal liability of the Food Procurement Agency on the basis of some approved case. As a result, we have a list of approximately 64 not identified by Mr. ANGLES as being laborers under his control, claiming benefits under the Missing Persons Act.

3. Inasmuch as the legal Section has set a precedent in the payment of the ANGLES case, it is felt that payment of all cases appearing on his list should be authorized.

2. It is reasonable to assume that Col Gaines, the legal officer, reviewed all available evidence and on basis of same approved Mr. ANGELES' case. As a result, we have a list of approximately 64 men identified by Mr. ANGELES as being laborers under his control, claiming benefits under the Missing Persons Act.

1. The original affidavit of Alfonso S. Angeles shows that he was:

a. 1st employed as a capataz on Orion Airfield.

b. Was a middle man procuring food for army at time of surrender on Bataan.

2. The list of employees at Orion shows that Angeles was a capataz with 31 men.

3. Major Ernesto Rufino states he employed Angeles to procure food stuffs for the 41st Division (PA) for period 3 Jan 1942 to 16 Jan 1942. Captain Sadang states he employed Mr. Angeles to procure food for 11th Inf (PA) with a salary of ₱2.50 per day, and his men at the rate of ₱1.50 per day, and that Angeles and his men rendered valuable services from 17 Jan 42 to 25 Jan 42.

4. Santos Salvador states that Angeles and his men were employed by GHQ OMC to procure food supplies for armed forces and were to be paid at the rate of \$1.25 per foreman and 0.75 per laborer, and that Angeles rendered valuable service until the fall of Bataan.

5. In affidavit dated 4 October 1945 Angeles states he was employed as foreman by USED from 18 Dec 41 to 2 Jan 1942. On 3 Jan 42 he was employed as foreman to obtain food supplies by Major Rufino Executive Officer Division (PA), and that on 17 Jan 1942 he was hired in the same capacity up to 25 January 1942, and that he was employed by Col Brezina on 26 January in the same capacity and as intelligence operative and continued to serve in that capacity until the fall of Bataan. Angeles then states: "below are the list of names of my men who were under my direct supervision and was with me during these activities and also their rate of pay."

6. The employment on the Orion Airfield is obviously outside of the act since it was for less than 30 days in duration. The employment by the Philippine Army is not sufficient to make the men employees of the War Department. The question then arises as to whether the men referred to are War Department Employees by reason of their alleged employment between 26 January and 9 April. At the outset it should be noted that in his original affidavit

Angeles states that he was middleman engaged in procuring food. These individuals were recruited locally and they were paid on a daily basis on the Orion Airfield for the days they worked. It may be assumed the same was true after they started work gathering food. The evidence does not establish whether the men were hired by Angeles or by the government. The capataz system of employment may or may not establish the relation of Employer Employee-- depending upon the contract. If the capataz recruits the men under a contract to be paid for so many men the laborers are employees of the Capataz. If the capataz is merely a foreman then the laborers are employees of the principal employer (in this case the War Department). There is a note in the file which states that only 30 of the 65 or 70 workers who were employed to gather food worked until the fall of Bataan. The gathering or procuring of food was certainly a temporary expedient and the individuals were recruited locally. There is no reason to expect that these individuals were expected to become a permanent part of the Civilian Complement of the Armed Forces for the duration of the war. They were to be paid on a daily basis.

It is my opinion that the evidence is insufficient to establish that the named individuals were employees of the War Department and not the employees of Mr. Angeles. It is my further opinion that the evidence is insufficient to establish that the individuals were anything other than local labor casually hired, if it be conceded that the men were hired by the CM, and not by Mr. Angeles.

Orion Airfield - Food Procurers

Around 18 Dec 41 approximately 750 laborers, both men and women, were employed on the Orion Landing Field in Bataan during the Japanese advance. These people were recruited from the barrios in that locality. The airfield was not completed and due to the retreat of the American forces the project was abandoned on or about 2 Jan 42.

The airfield workers, as such, do not come under the MPA as they worked less than thirty days/ however, a group of about 65 or 70 of these workers under the supervision of Alfonso Angeles, who has been identified as a foreman on the landing field construction, were employed in procuring food stuffs for the troops until the fall of Bataan.

The workers at the airfield were never paid, nor were those who continued to work as food gatherers. We have one official voucher on the landing field workers which is only partially complete, and does not show any person being paid/ nevertheless, it does establish these laborers as having worked.

We have affidavits from the officers who were responsible for the recruitment of the food procurers, but said affidavits mention only Mr. Angeles, the man in charge, by name.

Mr. Angeles has been interviewed by Lt Renneisen and also by Capt Couplin, and he has sworn an affidavit listing his workers and also stating that ~~only~~ about thirty of them worked ~~xxxx~~ until the fall of Bataan, 9 Apr 42. The remainder of his men about thirty-five in number, were caught behind the battle lines about 28 Feb 42 when Pilar Bataan fell to the Japs and the men were unable to rejoin their companions. Mr. Angeles' assistant, Mr. Jose Herrera, officially identified as a foreman at the Orion Landing Field project, substantiates Mr. Angeles' statement.

4. That the contract of employment of the said Mr. Alfonso Angeles was on the P2.50 a day basis, in his capacity as Capataz, while that of his laborers at P1.50 a day basis, and double these amounts in case of overtime work which happened to be done almost every night; and

5. That we know these facts above-cited by virtue of our employment in the said Orion Airfield.


