- 1. Officially all units of the USAFFE were placed on an automatic daily field ration as of December 1, 1941, as covered in Administrative Order No. 1 to Field Order No. 1, Headquarters, USAFFE, same date.
- 2. Prior to December 1, 1941, instructions were issued to the Philippine Army units, then being mobilized by Headquarters, USAFFE that all troops of the Philippine Army would be placed on a field ration December 1, 1941, in accordance with instructions issued to the effect that upon that date the United States Army would take over the supply of the Philippine Army through prescribed channels, that is, field depots. However, due to the orders issued for the field on December 1, 1941, by Headquarters, USAFFE, that all troops would move to their predetermined positions and readiness, this order could not be carried out and railheads for their supply had to be established. Railheads did not get into automatic distribution until the 8th of December. Some organizations of the Philippine Army did not draw rations immediately from railheads but continued to purchase their own supplies in the field as they had done prior to December 1st. Due to this, it is my understanding that the Finance Officer paid on these vouchers until divisions could be supplied through railheads. It is my belief that when the depots opened for automatic supply on or about December 15, 1941, all units of the Philippine Army were on an automatic basis drawing their supplies from these depots.
- 3. The Regular United States Army and the Philippine Scouts remained at home stations until on or about December 15, 1941 and lived off their remaining garrison rations instead of taking field rations. On or about December 15th, these troops were in the field and drawing field rations on an automatic basis through the field depots.
- 4. However, the official order, as I stated above placed all troops of the USAFFE on an automatic daily basis for field rations beginning December 1, 1941.
