CONTRACT FOR THE CHARTER
of the
M/V "KANLAON II"

This CHARTER PARTY entered into this minth day of March, 1942, at the City of Iloilo, Philippines, by and between -

THE HOLLO SHIPPING COMPANY, INC., a corponation duly organized and existing under nation that the state of the Philippines with principal office at the City of Hollo, as owner of the Motor vessel of "KANLA-ON"II", to be hereinafter designated as the OWNERS,

#### and

#### WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the terms, conditions and stipulations herein stated, THE OWNER and THE CHARTERER do hereby mutually agree with each other as follows:

1. That THE OWNER dows hereby grant and let, and THE CHARTERER DOES MERREBY TAKE THE MOTOR VESSEL, subject-matter of this contract, more particularly described as follows:

2. That THE OWNER hereby guarantees that hhe motor ressel above described is in first-class condition, and the Government of the United States has satisfied itself that its interests are fully protected; That a survey of the hull and other equipments required under Paragraph 8, 48 30-313 has been waived, and THE OWNER consents to accept the vessel when it is returned at the conclusion of this Charter Party without any further examination of hull or machinery, and that the said motor vessel will be accepted as is, fair wear and tear only excepted;

3. That the motor wessel hired under the terms of this contract will be used at such time as she may be required in the military service of the United States for the duration of the war:

4. That the motor vessel now is, and while in the service of the United States shall be, kept and maintained tight, staunch, strong, victualed, tackled, appareled and ballasted;

5. That an inventory shall be taken of the accessories and personal effects on said vessel, which inventory is here-by incorporated by reference and made an integral part of this Charter Party. All supplies on board shall go with the motor vessel;

6. That THE CHARTERER shall, upon termination of the period for which the said motor vessel was hired, return to THE CWINER at Iloilo City, or to its representative, mid vessel in the same order as when received, ordinary wear and tear, damage by the elements, collision at sea and in port, groundings, fires, bursting of boilers, and breakage of machinery excepted;

7. That THE CHARTERER shall be free to use and employ any officer, engineer or member of the crew and shall likeany dilicer, engineer or member or the cree and shall like-wise have the power to dismiss or make chinges in the app-cintments for the good of the service; and that THE CHRITTERS, at its election, may engage the present complement of said motor vessel and compensation paid to said complement as per pay schedule of the ANNI TRANSPORT CENTURE for this class of vessel;

 That every member of the crew shall be a citizen of the Philippines or of the United States, native-born, or completely naturalized;

 That the war risks shall be borne by THE CHARTERER or the Government of the United States; the marine risks by THE OWNER:

10. That the master of the vessel shall obey all orders or instructions which he may receive from the Army Officer in charge of the operations;

11. That for and in consideration of the faithful per-11. That payment shall be made at the end of the war by the Finance Officer at Sebu City, Philippines out of funds furnished for the purpose by the Government of the United States, upon presenting bills to be certified by the Quartermaster that the said vessel has faithfully performed its part of this contract;

13. I, Benjamin Mallerca, 30 years of age, and redident 6f Oten Jelle, after having been swern to according to law, de hereby depose and say:

That I was an Oiler on L/V Camla-em with 1500 herse power plying daily between Ileile City and Pulupandam:

That after the war broke out on December 8, 1941 M/V Canla-en was used to transport seldiers, feed supplies and munitiens from Heile City, Cobu to Kindames:

That in January, 1942 all of us, crews of M/V Canla-on were inducted into the USAFFE:

That semetime on or about March 12, 1942 our bout was shelled by a Japanese Cruiser at Lile-an, Cobu;

That our beat was damaged but not sunk after receiving 12 hits:

That it was brought to Open, Cobu where it was repaired;

That when the beat was about to leave the dry dock to resume a service on April 10, 1942, the Japanese forces landed at Cobu;

That the M/V Canla-on together with around six other interialand beats then anchered at Cebu Pert was scuttled by the crews

That we, the crew, were told to disperse:

That I went heme to Oten, Ileile, after five days travel;

That since and during the Japanese secupation of Panay, I have #6 not cooperated with them; And

That I have supported the guerilla Army and the Civil Government under Governor Temas Confesor throughout the period of resistence.

THAS: I. Pedro Sevilleno, 36 yrs. of age, single and residing at San Joaquin, Iloilo, P.I. was a Sailor aboard the "KANLA-ON II"

attached to the Army Transport Service, in Cebu City. My monthly salary was SIXTY PESOS (P60.-) a month plus

food and allowance. We were inducted an Jan. 7, 1942

Before the invasion of Cebu by the Japanese forces, the "KANLA-ON" II" was engaged in transporting soldiers from one place

"AAULA-UN" 11 was empowed in temporal sounders from one place to another and bringing supplies to ordered places. On APIL 7, 1942 he "KANLA-UN II" together with the Transport ships the "Princess"; the "You, Tark", "Dunaguete", "the "Raulino" and the "Frincessof Cabu" were loaded with supplies as foodstuffs, gasoline, cigaretes etc. supposed to be for Coregidor, to aid the American and Filpino Forces who were starving fighting side by side against the Jamese. These ships were loaded day and night until noon of April 9 1942. The fall of Esta-an stopped our

sailing until the landing o the Japanese forces or the morning of April 10, 1942. all the ships full loaded with supplies were souttled by

the army to prevent its use y the enemy. Officers and crew of the "KANLA-ON II" proceeded to Iloilo with the exception of to Chief Officer, who is a native of Cabu.

Arriving at Iloil on the night of April 14, 1942 we took a rest and decided to repar to the Iloilo Quartermester Depot the next day, but we were not de to locate the said office, untilthe landing of the Japanese fors at Iloilo on the 16th. We evecuated to a Josquin and returned to the City only
