ORDER NO. 1.

- 1- The undersigned hereby assumes the responsibility of Commanding Officer of all the U.S. Guerrilla forces in the island of Luzon and that of personal representatives of General Douglas McArthur, for the conduct of guerrilla operations and incident affairs. This is in accordance with verbal instructions from Gen. McArthur on January 20, 1942.
- 2- All guerrilla leaders on the island will derive their authority to operate from this headquarters and shall be duly appointed by the undersigned or his representatives having such authority in writing from this headquarters.
- 3- Any persons or person operating as guerrilla in the name of the U.S.A. without the required authority in Par. 2 upon, will be considered an enemy of the U.S. Government.
- 4- Any person belonging to the armed forces of the U.S. Government entering into such unlawful operations still punishable as provided for under the articles of WAR of the U.S.A.
- 5- All persons guilty of looting private property, confiscating supplies or otherwise disturbing the peace of civilians unlawfully by misrepresentation of themselves as a part of the guerrilla force of the U.S.A., will be treated as enemies of the U.S.
- 6- All guerrilla units bearing proper authority to operate as such are authorized to collect arms and equipments belonging to the U.S. Government from all persons unlawfully possessing such arms and equipments.
- 7- All guerrilla units authorized to operate will be directly responsible thru the district and are under the command of this Headquarters.
- 8- Each area and District Commander receiving this order will be responsible that true copies of this order shall be distributed to all leaders.

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CIRCULAR LETTER
Number 3

To : All CHIEF MILITARY LEADERS

Circular letters will be published, from time to time, by the COMMANDER IN CHIEF UNITED NATIONS FORCES IN THE FAR EAST, containing general information of the UNITED NATIONS ARMY FORCES. These circular letters will contain general information regarding policies of the UNITED NATIONS ARMY FORCES, and their leaders, UNITED NATIONS leaders and officials, and these circular letters will also serve as a guide when translating the purposes and aims of the UNITED NATIONS ARMY FORCES to legal Philippine Citizens.

1. AUTHORITY FOR ORGANIZATION OF UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES. **GENERAL**.
Colonel Martinez, Commander-in-Chief of all United Nations Forces in the Far East, appointed Lieutenant Colonel G. A. Thorpe, U. S. Army, Commanding Officer of the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, to conduct guerrilla operations against pro-fascist authorities. The guerrilla organizations in the Philippines, which are not affiliated to or subject to the activities under the name of the U. S. Army and which are not affiliated to or subject to the authority of the U. S. Army, shall if they so disown themselves by writing the name of their organization, be known as the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, and shall be given the rank of the United States of America.

Lieutenant Colonel G. A. Thorpe, Commanding Officer of the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, has divided the Island of Luzon into areas and appointed commander of these areas. Each subordinate commander has authority to withdraw, from Lieutenant Colonel G. A. Thorpe or his authorized representatives and are directly responsible to Lieutenant Colonel G. A. Thorpe.

All superior commanders, district commanders, area commanders, and every individual authorized to use the name of the UNITED NATIONS ARMY FORCES, in connection with the conduct of guerrilla activities, will have such authority, in writing, from Lieutenant Colonel G. A. Thorpe or his authorized representatives and are directly responsible to Lieutenant Colonel G. A. Thorpe.

2. PURPOSE AND AIM OF THE UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES.

a. **Mobilization of masses among Guerrilla Army Forces.** The primary purpose of the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES is to mobilize revolutionaries of the masses army and to commence the fight until the Japanese have been driven from the Philippines and also to provide military assistance to any UNITED NATIONS FORCES which will come to rescue the Philippines from the same.

b. **Mobilization of Japanese army, Patrio-Revolutionaries and other Pro-Japanese people.** Revolutionaries shall be allowed the opportunity to annihilate their enemies in the Philippines by so doing, because enemies of the Commonwealth of the Philippines and the United States of America, as it is the duty of the UNITED NATIONS ARMY FORCES to annihilate such enemies.

c. **Protection of Legal Philippine Citizens and Citizens of other United Nations Countries who are in the Philippines.** It is the aim of the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES to protect the legal Philippine citizens and citizens of other United Nations Countries, to whom we shall endeavor to provide protection, security, guaranteeing their countries, to shall endeavor to provide protection of their property, guaranteeing of supplies and equipment and dissemination of the peace and other rights for all legal Philippine citizens and citizens of other United Nations Countries, who are in the Philippines.

3. SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT.

a. **SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT.** All necessary supplies and equipment to be used by the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, must at the request of any, be obtain from legal citizens of the United Nations. UNITED NATIONS FORCES, will obtain from legal citizens of the United Nations, the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, will have an identification card of either written authority identifying them as members of the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES and it is the right of legal Philippine citizens to see such written authority prior to giving any supplies or equipment.

b. **Equipment.** Every individual, who receives any type of supplies or equipment, to be used by the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, must give a receipt for same and certify the full name and address of the person giving same, and also certifying the date of the person giving such supplies or equipment to whom ever over to whom authority may be given the name and address of the persons who gave the supplies.

c. **Equipment.** Official records of the receipt of supplies and equipment must be taken to see that all supplies and equipment were used and by legal persons who can verify the persons giving same must be maintained. Every new command will be taken to see that all supplies and equipment were used and by legal persons who can verify the persons giving same must be maintained.

d. **PROVIDEMENTS.** At any of UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES, all persons guilty of torture patients or causing unnecessary suffering or equipment or otherwise disturbing the peace of legal Philippine citizens other United Nations countries citizens unlawfully by characteristics themselves as a part of the UNITED NATIONS ARMY FORCES or the United States Army will be treated as criminals.

e. **COOPERATION WITH THE UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES.** The full cooperation of all local governments, the UNITED NATIONS GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES will be given to all local governments in maintaining our stations and the Philippines will soon be free country in which we and our children will be happy to live.







For your information we enclose a copy of the following information gathered by us from reliable sources in
various countries:

It was set aside long ago by the United States of
America that Germany would never be allowed to have
any influence in Europe. I believe we, however according
to information I gathered, the greatest source in the City of
Burgas.

That the principal air bases of the United States and
Great Britain consist of extensive air fields in Germany giving
the Germans control over:

a. That the principal air ports will be in favor of the
United States. The Germans are in extensive areas.

b. Numerous bases of Germany with the combined Forces of
France and Germany had been taken, particularly in North
Africa.

In view of the extensive network of the United Forces, it
is noted, however, to have just the size of force that
would be required. Also, the fact that, while the United
States has no bases in Asia Minor, France has the
same. You may expect Germany to push on to Asia Minor. We, therefore,
that the American Government will, no doubt, in the future, if
any other situation occurs, act upon the same grounds in fight-
ing the war in the low-lands of the Philippines and the
United States of America.

We urge that you take measures to curb some of our
organizations, etc., and our cities to see that they do not also
will be involved in the losses of our enemies.

Subject: LAST WAR CALL

To : All loyal Filipinos

1. Remember that in war, the civilian as much as the soldier is RESPONSIBLE for VICTORY or DEFEAT.

2. The American soldiers have come back to liberate the Filipino people from the worst enemy to have ever dominated a conquered race. We all ask, "What are we going to do?" The answer is to prepare for action to deliver the most effective blow as we respond to General MacArthur's message to our people from Leyte: "As our line of operation rolls into your sector a rise and strike." What does this mean? This means the following:

- a. The American people have faith in the loyalty of the Filipinos.
- b. Forget personalities NOW and FOLLOW your leaders.
- c. Leave nothing to chance but develop SECRETLY your fighting value by application and hard work.
- d. You are enjoined to start a whispering campaign against the enemy.
- e. Be informed of the disposition of the enemy troops and activities in your field of action and pass on the information to proper authority.
- f. Be informed off the friendly troops in your locality.
- g. Report to the nearest unit for duty or assignment.
- h. Respect authority and camouflage your movements by deceptive means.
- i. DO NOT PREMATURELY. This will result into unnecessary loss of life and property. WAIT FOR ACTUAL ORDERS TO STRIKE FROM YOUR SUPERIOR.
- j. Here is your opportunity to prove to the world that by action your willingness to fight for the PRINCIPLES OF DEMOCRACY.

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
