ORDER NO. 1.

1- The undersigned hereby assumes the responsibility of Commanding Officer of all the U.S. Guerrilla forces in the island of Luzon and that of personal representatives of General Douglas McArthur, for the conduct of guerilla operations and incident affairs. This is in accordance with verbal instructions from Gen. McArthur on January 20, 1942.

2- All guerilla leaders on the island will derive their authority to operate from this headquarters and shall be duly appointed by the undersigned or his representatives having such authority in writing from this headquarters.

3- Any persons or person operating as guerilla in the name of the U.S.A. without the required authority in Par.2 upon, will be considered an enemy of the U.S. Government.

4- Any person belonging to the armed forces of the U.S. Government entering into such unlawful operations still punishable as provided for under the articles of WAR of the U.S.A.

5- All persons guilty of looting private property, confiscating supplies or otherwise disturbing the peace of civilians unlawfully by misrepresentation of themselves as a part of the guerilla force of the U.S.A., will be treated as enemies of the U.S.

6- All guerilla units bearing proper authority to operate as such are authorized to collect arms and equipments belonging to the U.S. Government from all persons unlawfully possessing such arms and equipments.

7- All guerilla units authorized to operate will be directly responsible thru the district and are under the command of this Headquarters.

8- Each area and District Commander receiving this order will be responsible that true copies of this order shall be distributed to all leaders.

1. Herewith there is presented the private secretary of late Lt. Col. J. A. Terry and one of the members of the Staff certify the following:

That I contacted with the U. S. Forces in Japan in the year 1941.

That on January 20, 1942, late Lt. Col. J. A. Terry received instructions from the 10th Amphibious Marine to organize and operate MARTHUS COMPANIES in Japan.

That late Lt. Col. J. A. Terry with some American Officers, enlisted men, etc. and some Filipinos, came to Manila, Puerto, P. I. as per General Headquarters to organize specific activities.

That Major Francisco Marco D. of the 10th Amphibious Marine was instructed by late Lt. Col. J. A. Terry in the said General Headquarters in the presence of the following persons: William B. Bradley, Colonel; Major Gen. Earl Harris; Major Gen. Earl L. Clegg; and Major Gen. B. A. Canine.

That the following MARTHUS COMPANIES listed below had been already organized and operating before we transferred to the Japanese Imperial Forces.

That the Northwest Philippine Military District consisted of all the companies mentioned above listed to the General Headquarters and reported to Lt. Col. William B. Bradley commanded by Col. Earl Harris.

That from the year 1940 to its later part of 1944, Major Francisco Marco D. was the Chief of Staff of the District until he reported to the Northwest Philippine Military District because Col. Earl Harris was in the construction camp at Manila, Philippines.

That the members of the Northwest Philippine Military District under the command of Major Francisco Marco D. were composed of American officers and enlisted men as follows: Major Francisco Marco D., District Chief; Major Gen. Earl Harris, District Chief; Major Gen. Earl L. Clegg, District Chief; Major Gen. B. A. Canine, District Chief; Major Gen. Earl L. Clegg, District Chief; Major Gen. B. A. Canine, District Chief.

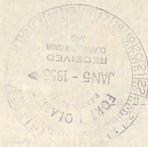

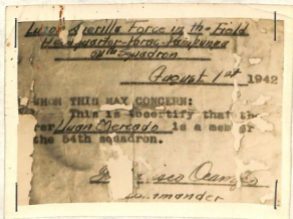

Many important matters were being taken in these conferences regarding the activities of the underground movement against the enemy that brought to success.

The answer is to prepare for action to deliver the most effective blow as we respond to General MacArthur's message to our people from Leyte: "As our line of operation rolls into your sector a rise and strike." What does this mean? This means the following:

- a. The American people have faith in the loyalty of the Filipinos.
- b. Forget personalities NOW and FOLLOW your leaders.
- c. Leave nothing to chance but develop SECRETLY your fighting value by application and hard work.
- d. You are enjoined to start a whispering campaign against the enemy.
- e. Be informed of the disposition of the enemy troops and activities in your field of action and pass on the information to proper authority.
- f. Be informed off the friendly troops in your locality.

 7. You are therefore instructed to transmit these reports to the records of your unit and the division in your sector.

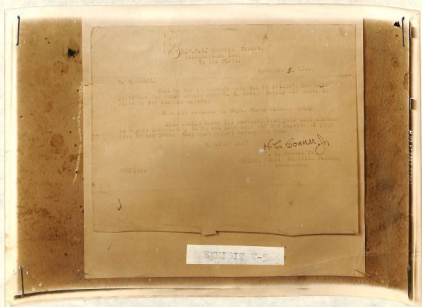
