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

1. Reference your communication to me of 25 February 1947 regarding claims of more than a half million pesos by residents of Davao City for motor vehicles allegedly requisitioned between December 10 and 20, 1941, by USAFFE under my command, I certify that the following statements are true to the best of my knowledge and belief:

a. I assumed command of the Davao Sector on or about 10 December 1941. At that time my command had approximately 15 vehicles which were partly Army and partly civilian, same having been brought with my command from Malaybalay. Shortly after my assuming command of this Sector, I placed in concentration camps some 10,000 or more Japanese nationals - men, women and children. In order to properly feed this large concentration camp it was necessary for me to requisition vehicles from local inhabitants of the City of Davao as there were no motor pools of Government vehicles on the Island of Mindanao. In addition to the supply of food to interned Japanese nationals, my command began the construction of some 5 kilometers of defense works along the beaches of the Gulf of Davao. This construction work also required a number of vehicles for transporting workers and material.

b. I had only one Staff officer available to me, namely an adjutant. This fact compelled me to make use of civilian committees formed of local American businessmen and Allies. To the best of my recollection, a Mr. D. M. Burchfield was placed in charge of all my motor transportation. All of this transportation, although administered by a civilian, was directly under Army control and utilized by Army orders. I have no recollection of the authorizing of the use of the name "Civilian Emergency Transportation". Notwithstanding that fact,

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this transportation was under Army control. In order to augment the small supply of motor vehicles that I brought with me, certain civilian-owned transportation was requisitioned. The majority of this transportation was alien-owned (Japanese), being taken from local Japanese residents and mostly from the Japanese plantations in the vicinity of Davao of which there was a large number.

e. Only a very limited number of trucks or motor cars were requisitioned from local Filipino citizens. In all cases, with exception of Japanese requisitioned vehicles, proper receipts were given and proper estimates of value at the time the vehicles were requisitioned were made. In all cases where proper requisitions were made the owners of vehicles were informed that they would be given reasonable rental and same returned to them in first-class condition, otherwise the United States Government would make proper payment for vehicles lost or destroyed. It was not contemplated that these vehicles would be used for Red Cross, fuel control, civilian emergency activities, or other enterprises not connected with the Army. These vehicles were used by the Army on any type of work that was considered necessary for the defense of the City of Davao.

d. It is my understanding that these records, together with other records, were lost or destroyed during the defense of Davao, or in subsequent operations or surrender of the Philippine Islands. It is believed that Mr. Burchfield should be in a position to give additional vital testimony regarding this situation.

e. Approximately 8 vehicles (mostly Japanese-owned) were moved from Davao to Malaybalay to fill a requisition of the Commanding General at Malaybalay.

f. I am positive that any claim for 290 vehicles is false. And it is my opinion that less than 50 vehicles were in use by my headquarters, the majority of same were secured from the Japanese residents.

g. It is recommended that no claims be approved by your headquarters regarding payment for any vehicles unless claims are properly supported by a valid receipt or requisition signed by Mr. Burchfield, and in all cases these receipt should be verified by Mr. Burchfield. The

Dear Sir:

During the past twenty months various representatives of this Office have requested your comment on the requisitioning of certain vehicles by the Davao USAFFE Motor Pool. Your responses have proven of high value. The number of claims filed by residents of Davao grew so out of proportion to the number of vehicles operated by the Pool that it became necessary to withhold action until the diverse statements of Mr. Ildefonso Joven and other "suspect" witnesses could be fully compiled and probed.

A composite list of claims now reveals that demands have been filed for more than three times the number of vehicles you recall requisitioning. For the purpose of doing justice to the owners of vehicles properly requisitioned for use of USAFFE, and to protect the U.S. Treasury from false claims, your evidence is urgently needed in the form of specific comment as to each claim. We are inclosing a copy of the consolidated list showing:

- a. Name of the claimant.
- b. Description of the vehicle allegedly requisitioned.
- c. Date of alleged requisitioning.
- d. Claimant's assertion as to whether or not receipts were furnished.
- e. Gist of Mr. Ildefonso Joven's statement.
- f. Gist of statements of other alleged witnesses.

With the above information to refresh your recollection, we request that you prepare an affidavit setting forth in detail, item by item your specific recollection as to each claimant, stating (1) if you remember the owner of the vehicle, and (2) stating if you remember having requisitioned the vehicle or if you remember specifically that you did not requisitioned the vehicle claimed. It is requested that you make a specific comment, in terms that you remember or that you do not remember. To aid identification we inclose a copy of each of the ten receipts submitted by the eighty eight claimants. Any information formal or informal in nature indicating the points on which your specific recollection rests is also desirable.

Further evidence is needed to establish the nature and scope of the commitments made on behalf of USAFFE at Davao. We request there-

claim of local residents of Davao for as high a number as 290 vehicles is ridiculous and in line with other claims which have been referred to the undersigned for verification. It is a clear case of local individuals attempting to secure payment from the United States Government for personal property taken by the Japanese.

Any further information I can give regarding these unjust claims will be gladly furnished.

fore that you start your affidavit by setting out the whole picture with respect to the following:

- a. Exactly what was Civilian Emergency Transportation in Davao?
- b. How was it related to army activities?
- c. Who authorized its establishment?
- d. What were the specific terms of the authority granted as to mission and function?
- e. What were the implications of registration at the motor pool?
- f. What promises were made to owners of vehicles with respect to payment for the vehicles?
- g. Was it contemplated that vehicles for Red Cross activities, fuel control, CEA activities and other enterprises not of a military nature should be supplied with vehicles requisitioned by the army? Did the aforementioned organization requisition vehicles on their own?
- h. Was any record retained of (1) registration of vehicles at the motor pool? (2) requisition of vehicles? If so who may now be in possessin of such a record? To enable us to provide consistent evidence we are inclosing a copy of all letters which prior to this time you have sent to us on this matter.

Your affidavit will be of the greatest value in enabling this office to present what appears to be a broadside attack on the United States taxpayers and to do justice to the individuals who have a proper claim.

STATEMENTS OF D. M. BURGHFIELD.

The 8th of December, 1941, Col. Roger A. Hillsman arrived in Davao, Mindanao, to organize what little there were of Filipino trainees, for the defense of Davao. The Philippine Army had absolutely no equipment.

At a meeting with the Americans of Davao held by Col. Hillsman, certain Americans were appointed to positions, to help in the organization. At that meeting I was appointed as head of transportation, in charge of issuing passes, and the registering of all cars and trucks which were allowed to operate. I also had the requisitioning of all trucks, cars and supplies. I was given an appointment in writing to this position by Col. Hillsman which unfortunately the Japanese took.

When I started to work on the 12th I did not have a single truck, driver or mechanic. I immediately requisitioned 9 of my trucks and moved my shop and all of my men and clerks to the motor pool. With this as a start I had within one week 85 trucks and cars and about 100 drivers and mechanics. I was moving supplies and troops as far as Cotabato.

The value of the nine trucks which I turned over to the Army were as follows:

In as much as these trucks were turned over to the Army and were used by the Army, I request that I be reimbursed for them. The value placed on these trucks is my book value and not replacement value. I have made no claims for the salaries of myself or my men, or for the shop equipment.

It is my desire to leave for the United States as soon as possible, but believing that this can not be handled from there I am staying over to file it here.

I attach hereto a certificate dated August 8, 1942 signed by four prominent Americans of Davao. I am unable to get their signature again, as Mr. H. K. Umpstad is dead, Mr. Stumbo and Mr. Christensen were in Los Banos and I do not know where they are at present.

The signatures appearing below were in Dgao during the period referred to and know of my work.

Dear Sir:

I have yours of the 9th inst. regarding claims and requesting information as to the set up in Davao up to the time of the Japanese invasion.

When Colonel Reger A. Hillman came to Davao, if I remember rightly, December 10th, 1941, the armed forces had no transportation. He formed several civilian teams and I was appointed by him as head of transportation. It was my work to get a transportation organization to functioning as soon as possible. I had absolutely nothing to start with. I brought, 9 of my own trucks to the park and started gathering in all Japanese equipment. To the best of my memory with only two exceptions, Pedro Lat and my own 9 trucks, no trucks were turned in without being given a receipt. If I am not mistaken I had about 50 good trucks. These were 9 of my own, 10 I think it was from Pedro Lat, from Furukawa Plantation Co. about 10, from various other Japanese outfits 6 trucks. The balance were trucks belonging to Davao firms. To the best of my knowledge there never was a truck or car turned in for which a receipt was not issued. The receipts I issued stated the make, type, year, if possible motor number, condition of tires and car. No price was put on the receipt.

A number of Filipinos had taken Japanese cars and trucks, when the Japs were interned. These were hidden out, and I had neither the men nor the time to locate them. Many cars and trucks were caught over on the Cotabato boundary.

There were many cars being used by such organizations as hospitals, Red Cross and several Constabulary Officers. Where these cars came from I had no information and as far as I was concerned they were not turned into the government.

Regarding the following claims:

Mr. Cecilio de los Reyes, 6 Chevrolet trucks
Mr. Julian de los Reyes, 1 Oldsmobile Sedan

I am sure that had my organization taken the above, receipts would have been issued. I cannot remember any person turning in any such number of trucks.

Mrs. Felicidad Ramos, 8 automobiles

I had no public utility work under my organization. I cannot remember any such number of cars ever being turned in by any one person.

Nicolas Gotera, 12 cars

No such number was ever turned in. I do not remember ever having seen Gotera during December. As stated receipts would have been issued had they been taken.

Joven should have told you that I had a clerk who had charge of inspecting cars and trucks and issuing receipts for those I took. I forget the man's name but I believe he worked for Standard Oil. It might help your investigations if ownership of claims were definitely proved.

There was no particular effort made by the Filipinos of Davao to help in the work we were doing. In many cases deliberate attempts were made to get Japanese cars or trucks and keep them.

I hope this will help in your work and I regret that I cannot give you more information.

Dear Sir:

I have your letters regarding the cars of Delfin Hofilena and Sergio Jalpia.

Delfin Hofilena: I have no memory of ever having taken his car. I was badly over worked and under staffed, but to the best of my knowledge a receipt was issued for every car I commandeered for Filipinos. There certainly was no chaos.

Sergio Jalpia: This woman, if she is the same woman, came to me at my office in the motor pool and complained that she could not get meat in as she had no transportation. I had a small Ford truck put in order and turned over to her together with a permit to purchase gasoline. That was the last time I ever saw Sergio. The statement that I told her that she would receive a receipt in five days for her car is not true. I had a clerk who issued receipts for all cars turned in. The receipt stated make of car, type, model, motor number, and year. It did not state any price. I cannot remember of any offer of equipment from any Filipino, except one Pedro Lot. So far as I know they did their cars and trucks.

You asked what I did with the car. When the Japs took Davao I left everything including all records in my office and surrendered at the Davao Club.

I am sorry I cannot be of more help in the matter.

Dear Sir:

In answer to yours of the 4th. re the claim of Mr. Labao.

I can not remember receiving any cars from Mr. Labao. To the best of my knowledge no one ever turned in any large number of cars. If receipts were issued I always put down the owners name and not the driver's. But if the drivers name was put on the receipt, as claimed by Mr. Labao, the claim can still be proven as each receipt has the motor number, and license number of the car for I very much doubt Mr. Labao's claim.

There were several, so called, P. U. Operators in Davao, who owned the P.U. Permit but not the car. The car was registered in the operators name, but was operated by the actual owner. The owner of the car paid the permit owner twenty five pesos per month for the permit.

Regarding the service station. To the best of my knowledge all stocks and the service station, belong to the oil company. Stocks with the exception of spare parts etc. are on consignment. My office issued gas and oil purchase permits, and kept stock on hand records, but the actual control was in hands of Mr. Cleyton Jones, and Mr. Parks. These two men are in Davao now.

EXTRACT OF AFFIDAVIT OF ILDEFONSO JOVEN DATED 2 SEPTEMBER 1945

That upon the outbreak of the war Mr. Burchfield was assigned by Col. Hilsman to be Chief of Transportation and I was selected as his assistant.

That it is my duty to make assignment of vehicles after they have been requisitioned.

That it was a policy of the office to issue a receipt to the owners of each vehicle immediately after it is requisitioned or commandeered.

That to the best of my recollection I recall the following vehicles belonging to the following persons were taken:

Gregorio Garcia	- 2 cars
Santa Marina	- 1 car
Ventosa	- 1 car
Dr. Ebro	- 1 car (Chevrolet Sedan 1939)
Emelio Ferenil	- 1 car
Ramos	- 1 car
Candido Abrina	- several cars
Lebron	- several P.U. cars
Davao Amatchua	- all vehicles.

That many other vehicles were taken besides those mentioned. As a matter of fact practically all of the automobiles and trucks in Davao were commandeered by USAFFE.

Dear Sir:

In answer to yours of May 7th regarding the claim of Gloria J. de Sta Marina.

I am well acquainted with Mrs. Sta Marina, but I cannot remember her turning her car. I am not all sure that she did not turn in her car.

With reference to the list contained in Mr. Joven's affidavit I doubt that those cars were turned in, and as for the Davao Amotohua, I never heard of that outfit before.

As explained in my letter of April 25th to Maj. Oberreich cars which were operating for so called defense organizations were registered and allowed to run. That registration in no way took possession of the car for the army, nor did it promise any payment later.

Mr. Joven's statement (1st paragraph) "as a matter of fact practically all cars and trucks in Davao were commandeered by the USAFFE" is not true. After five years it is of course impossible to remember every detail, but I feel sure that I did not have more than fifty cars, and they were mostly old PU cars. I remember I had trouble in furnishing the army good cars. I think I had about fifty trucks.

To get a check on the number of cars and trucks I had, I would suggest that you have some old resident American contact Rustacio Cabitingan, and ask him, without letting him know why the information is wanted, about how many cars and trucks I had in the pool. Cabatingan was my No. 1 mechanic. Another man who might remember is L. Caspe. He was my No. 1 driver and was on one of my trucks at the pool. Caspe is now working for Hanson Orth Stevenson, in Davao.

It might be a good idea to ask any one making a claim, what organization used his car. If he says "Red Cross" "Para Shooters" then be sure that the car was not turned into the pool. Knowing the Filipino as I do it is hard for me to believe that the receipts for their car was lost.

I suggest that you have Mr. H. W. Fahl, now in Davao make some inquiries, on the quiet, for you.

I trust this will be of help.

Dear Sir:

In answer to yours of May 17th. regarding the affidavit of Joven's in the claim of Alfonso Ang Liongto.

Food was a very servious problem, and every effort was made to get food into the ware houses in Davao.

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I remember sending a Iuson Stevedoring lighter to Digos for corn, and issuing two or three permits for Chinese trucks to haul in corn. At that time three Chinese trucks were turned in by Chinese, but if I remember correctly Ang Liongto was not one of them. To the best of my memory I never received either a car or truck from him.

I do remember that both Ang Liongto and his brother is law David worked with the Japs. Ang Liongto was allowed to keep his launch, and was buying produce for the Japs. David was if I remember City Treasurer, and was very proud of his position.

AFFIDAVIT OF D. M. BURCHFIELD DATED 10 OCTOBER 1946

The following date and circumstances concerning my claim against the U. S. Government for nine civilian vehicles, owned by me, are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief:

Prior to the Japanese invasion, I was operating a freight transportation service in the city of Davao, Philippine Island. On or about December 10, 1941 Col. Roger A. Hillsman, USA; and staff of eight arrived in Davao to organize its defenses. There was absolutely no transportation equipment in Davao.

On December 12, Col. Hillsman appointed me as head of transportation, giving me full authority to commandeer all vehicles for military purposes. The work we did was gathering Japanese prisoners, assembling all available food supplies, moving labor for digging trenches, and moving troops.

When I was appointed there were no Army vehicles of any kind, so I had to commandeer civilian equipment. The first units I brought up were nine of my own trucks, which consisted of:

2 International Stake Body trucks, 4 ton
4 International Stake Body trucks, 3 ton
1 Ford Stake Body truck, 4 ton
2 Ford Stake Body trucks 3 ton

Most of these trucks had recently been overhauled; the two four ton International trucks were new and all had new tires. With this as a starting unit, I was within a week able to build up a pool of, if I remember correctly, 85 trucks. And at the time of the invasion of the Japanese, I was hauling rice from Cotabato and I moved a battalion of troops from Malaybalay to Davao. Col. Hillsman is I understand in the United States and could verify these statements. When the Japanese landed in Davao, which was to the best of my knowledge daylight, December 20, 1941, I stayed at the motor pool and had chauffeurs on each truck waiting for any orders which might come from Army headquarters. We stayed there until the Japanese were about two miles from the motor pool. When I was sure that our forces had withdrawn, I had each chauffeur to destroy as much as possible of the motor of his truck. To the best of my knowledge (I was held a prisoner in Davao for two years) not one of these trucks was ever repaired and used by the Japs.

When I was released from Santo Tomas, I stayed there roughly two months helping the Army administer to the needs of the released prisoners. During that time I filed this claim, together with substantiating statements, with the Army in Manila. The Army Claim




