SUBJECT: BC and PUPPET OFFICIALS ACTIVITIES REPORT -

TO : CO, 118th Infantry Regiment (Thru CO, 2nd Bn., 118th Inf.)

1. The following activities of the members of the EC-Force and the activities of the officials of the Philippine Republic from March 1 to 15 inclusive, are hereby summarized for the information and guidance of that office:

(a) MARCH 4, 1944: General Paulino Santos, Lt. Jesus M. Larrebaster, Lt. Col. Munag and Mad. Betungmalake arrived at Tacurong with plenty of EC soldiers from Davao as their escort. Immediately upon their arrival, conference was called. All prominent men of Tacurong and some Datus around attended the conference. In the conference, the following speakers were:

l. General Paulino Santos - Gen Santos emphasized to the civilians the aims of the Philippine Republic, the reconstruction works, loyalty to said Government keep and defend her, food campaign and maintenance of peace and order.

2. Lt. Col. Vicente Nunsg - Col. Nunsg explained to the public, the stationing of the BC-Force at Taurrong. He said that the purpose of the BC Force of Taurrong are purposely to maintain peace and order in all places they could reach such as Buluan District, Lasangen, Liguasan, and the whole District of Maganoy and Dagums. The BC Force will run after all batus that could not control their followers in their respective places, in which case, they had already begun the campaign like in the places of Maganoy District. They succeeded in climinating capturing and driving all More residents already in Maganoy District. He claimed that Maganoy is already cleared up and the next place he will lead his campaign, will be Buluan District. In proof, he assembled already all his forces and stationed them

to Tacurong.

3. Maj. Estungmalake - Maj. Estungmalake declared that the Army now existing at Euluan is not genuine as it compose mostly of Moros. In this connection, the DE Force was tationed at Tacurong for the purpose of chasing this Army so as to clear entirely that district against these the Deltan DE Compose of th

(b) MARCH 29, 1944:
Capt. Sebastian Javelosa with over 48 EC with
him succeeded in clearing Magancy from Moros. He assembled
all Christians thereat and place them in Camps (Cotas). He
advised the Christians that biggest trouble that they had
never expected to come is now right by their nose. So they
were all ordered to build camps for their safety and ready
to meet any trouble.

Reliable informations were received thru our runners to the effect that Capt. Saveloss and Capt. Gumbay Piang of the 119th Regt., has some mutual understanding regarding the campaign of Capt. Javelosa against the Moros. Capt. Gumbay Piang is the men power and meterial of Javelosa's campaign. He will be given nen with arms and ammunitions just for the purpose of chasing Luminos's District. In proof hereof, most of Capt. Javelosa's men are now with Capt. Gumbay Piang's command and Capt. Fiang's men are now with Capt. Javelosa's Echemovi, Agulerre; hereade and many others with enlisted men fully armed. These officers and enlisted men are all from the 119th Regt., under Caut. Pians's command.

capt. Javelosa with these officers with him, are now preparing an attack to the places of Ruluan District, in as much as Magancy has been already eleared up. Buluan will be done just as what had been done to Magancy.

cround the Christians cas to separate absolutely the Mcors and Christians so as to separate absolutely the Mcors and Christians apart. The only place now where Mcors exist is Buluan Dist, and it is the main determination of Javelosa accompanied by Lt. Samaon Afdal and the above-mentioned officers and EM, to chase Lt. Luminog until the last:

Capt. Javelosa posted some of his soldiers at Tacurong, Lambayong, Tinoniquis, Karandangan, Tantangan and other strategical places. He has with him over 60 EW with the officers and EW under Lt. Afdal as roving patrol always.

- Buluan Unit request that he be authorized to lead a Combat Patrol against Javeloss for the good of the Civilian populace and the organization as a whole. How is the time to meet Javeloss by force before it is too late. Buluan might be a scene or horror and bloodshed and the best remedy for it is to a stack Javelosa anywhere he is in order to stop his atrocious feat. Possible trouble might arise at any time and the undersigned deems it wise to have the fight outside the community of Buluan for the protection of Buluan proper.
- 3. Request further than reinforcement be sent here, Just to be ready in case of emergency as probable trouble is expected within a few days.

SUBJECT: Malicious Relationship Between Capt.
Javelosa and the 119th Inf. Regiment

TO : The CO. 106th Division

1. Hereto attached is a report of the CO, 2nd Bm, dated 29 March 1944 and two reports of the CO, Combat Company, Hq Bm dated 2 March 1944 and 15 March 1944, for the apprisal of the CO, 106th Division regarding the atrocities committed in this vicinity of the area occupied by the 2nd En., by the Japanese and the BCs under Capt. Javelosa.

2. Particular attention is invited to sub-paragraph B and D of the report of the CO, 2nd Bn. and par. 2 of the report dated 2 March 1944 and sub-paragraph D, par 3, dated March 15, 1944 of the CO, Combat Company, Hg En. re common understanding between the EC under Capt. Javelosa and the soldiers of the 119th Inf. Regiment. According to reports received by this Headquarters re activities of Capt. Javelose. it was stated that he was tried by the Japanese Forces because of murdering innocent Moro civilians in the Municipal District of Maganoy for which he was found guilty and sentenced to death, but because he promised to wipe out the guerrillas and to capture Capt, Udtug Matalam dead or alive, the sentence to death made against Capt. Javelose was deferred rending upon his successes in wiping out the guerrillas and canturing Capt. Udtug Matalam dead or alive. It was further reported that Lt. Samaon Afdal, Executive Officer of the 119th Infantry used to boast that his soldiers are dancing together with the BCs under Capt. Javelosa and that he allowed his men to exchange the new.30 caliber ammunitions 2 for 1 from the BC soldiers as a sort of propaganda, i.e., for 1 new ammunition the BC soldiers give 2 old ones.
