1. The attached documents are accepted as proof of death of the following officers:

Capt. Leo Boelens AC O-426888
2nd Lt. Roy Welbon sig C.

2. Major R. E. Steele AIF, reports that Lt. Welbon, after being shot thru the hip in an ambush, was taken to Baroy. When the Japanese were driven out of Baroy, a grave marked with Lt. Welbon's name was found in the plaza. The grave was opened and the body therein was identified as that of an American and the clothing was the same as that worn by Lt. Welbon at the time of ambush. Due to the advanced state of decomposition, facial identification was impossible, but both Lt-Col. Bowler and Major Steele, who attended the autopsy willingly certified to the best of their knowledge that the body was that of Lt. Roy Welbon and that he was killed in line of duty.

3. Capt. Leo Boelens, returning to his station inspite of the fact that the enemy were known to be in the area, was shot and killed by a Japanese sniper. His death was in line of duty.

My name is WENCESLAO DEL MUNDO (Sgt., USFIP).

I have been on duty with Capt. Boelens since we came over from the 110th Div., and I have been with him since then. I have with me two soldiers, Pvt. Benigno de la Cruz and Pvt. Victoriano Jumarang. These two soldiers were also with us since Capt. Boelens arrived from the other side.

On Saturday, 22 Jan 44, at about 7:15 AM, we heard firing from the direction of Maranding. Capt. Boelens told me to prepare because we were going down to investigate the firing. But he changed his mind and told me instead to go to "C" Co to secure information from them. The CO told me of the intercepted message about the firing at Lama-Lama and Duramawang. This I told to the Captain. As the Captain had much work to do on the project tools and equipment, we ourselves packed the things ready for evacuation. After packing he told me to proceed to the "C" Co area. Lt. Fardilla advised me to go straight to the evacuation place and put the things there. I was there that afternoon and so was Victoriano Jumarang when Capt. Boelens and Benigno de la Cruz followed up. He (Capt. Boelens) examined the place and he told me that he had a notion to go down and sleep at our quarters near the landing field to look over the situation. I invited the Captain to sleep with me at the camp, but he insisted on going down. He brought with him his beddings and his Carbine with 5 magazines, and Benigno de la Cruz brought with him a Springfield rifle with ammunition. Before moving out he gave me his last word that if anything was lost among his things he would find my dead body right beside them. Then he departed. It was already 6:00 PM and I did not hear anymore news until I heard firing at around 7:00 PM. The HQ, "C" Co was evidently attacked by the Japanese and I stood by our things to keep them from being lost. That next morning I met Lt. Fardilla and he informed me that he heard two shots fired at the end of the landing field prior to the firing at the HQ, "C" Co, and he told me to look for Capt. Boelens if the Japs would depart. The Japs departed that morning after taking their breakfast at around 8:00 AM towards Salong, and I followed up at once looking for Capt. Boelens and Benigno de la Cruz. I followed up the trail which I thought they passed, but I reached our quarters at the landing field without any trace of them. I spent that night at the quarters and woke up the next morning to find out that the Japs had come back and were in the vicinity of the field. Without hesitation I ran and observed them from a safe distance. I saw them come up Capt. Boelens' quarters and heard some knocks which I found later that they destroyed our safe. They also excavated and destroyed the drums of crude oil and coconut oil and poured them into the ground. After making all this destruction, they departed towards Pansilan. I went out of my hiding place and examined the things they destroyed. After this, I went back to our evacuation camp. I met Eraso, a civilian who was captured by the Japs and later released, who told me that the body of Capt. Boelens was right at the end of the field. I asked him why he knew this and he said that together with the Japs they passed by the dead body. I followed up at once, telling him to lead the way to the body, and I saw Capt. Boelens

déad with two wounds at the back, a bayonet thrust behind the left ear and several knife wounds at the back of the head. This was on Monday, 24 Jan. I went back at once and decided to bury the body that very next morning. On 25 Jan, morning, I arranged with Lt Fardilla and Lt Fernan the burial of Capt Boelens with the help of some volunteer guards. This I did by burning the body because of its odor and burying the remains into a 4-foot deep grave. I finished the burial at 12:00 PM, and I went back to our camp to rest.

Regarding the project records and money, I have them in my possession, and I know too that some of the records and project equipment are in the hands of some trusted civilians. His personal belongings are still intact in my hands and have not been touched.

As the only witness to the ~~W~~ilbon accident I am hereby submitting my report.

Lt Roy E. Wilbon, 1st Lieut., USFIP, was wounded and captured by the Japanese Jan 24, 1944, during a Japanese raid on Saroy and the vicinity.

Lieut. Wilbon and myself were both assigned to the Force Radio Station, which at the time was situated in Kanuigan, a barrio 15 kms. from the coast.

Jan 23 we heard heavy firing from three different directions but did not receive any definite report on the whereabouts of the Japanese.

Jan 24 we heard no firing and decided to go to CPG, 3 kms. away, for information.

All the same day, we were about to cross a clearing, with a few seemingly deserted houses.

As we, after careful observation, had not seen anything suspicious, we went ahead. Just as we were passing between two nipa huts, automatic gunfire was opened up on us from one of the shacks. Lieut. Wilbon, walking about 5 feet ahead of me fell instantly to the ground, face down. I stepped behind the other hut and ran across an open field. Miraculously, in spite of heavy firing from automatic rifles and mortar, I got away without being hurt, except for a bullet burn on my right hand thumb.
