SUBJECT: Result of Mission in Eastern Mountain Province (Bokod area)
TO : G-2, 32nd Div. (thru CIG Det.)

1. Corporal, Antonio Martin and Pvt. Domingo Lopez of 168th Squadron Intelligence Section sent to Ambuclao, and Bokod areas on July 25, 1946 arrived August 3, 1946, under instruction of that Headquarters.

2. They had successfully accomplished their mission; contacted civilians in Ambuclao, Bokod areas and vicinities, also liberating forces in that sectors.

3. Most of the 6,700 populations of Bokod Municipality and Kabayan with a population of 6,450 evacuated to Baguio while others civilians who are sick of Malaria, Dysentery, and Influenza, due lack of medicine and food supplies, and many are dying.

4. At present all sick civilians are concentrated in Bokod Central, and Ambuclao, while civilians in Kabayan who were un-able to evacuate in Baguio are behind the enemies. However they were informed to evacuate to Baguio, if they have possible way to get out from the foes.

TO : G-2, 32nd Div. (thru CIC Det.)

1. Cpl. Martin and Lupez EM of this Unit sent to Kayapa Proper for the purpose of gathering ground information arrived and had reported only (20) Japs in civilian houses in two groups at (68.7-71.1) and (68.7-71.1). living on camotes, and most of the enemies in this sector were killed by civilians in small groups. while hundreds of enemy retreated to North after their defeat in Villa Berdi Trail.

2. ^{1,500 Natives} Civilians around this place residing in Kayapa Proper is hereby requesting a squad patrol to clean the sector, so people can start raising their crops and building their homes.

2. (7) enemy armed with rifles fled around Kayapa area. Natives are still hunting remaining enemy, and request to use arms which they captured from the enemy (3) light machine guns and rifles, for the main time until the area is fully liberated.

3. (22) enemy killed by Civilians around the sector of Binalian led by the following persons, Gayat Goyang, Carlos Sabino and Alinio Ngala-on the 1st Week of August '45.

SUBJECT: Enemy positions in Kayapa, Pampang, N.M.

TO : C-2, 32nd Division
(Thru CG, GIC Det. 32nd Div.)

1. (68.3-79.6) 22 May 1945- 5 Tunnels being used by the enemy as ammunition and supply dumps. 200 enemy around guarding the entrance to these tunnels. Arms unknown except rifles.
2. (70.3-79.0) 22 May 1945- 1500 enemy quartered in civilian houses and scattered along the creeks in fox-holes. Arms consist of 75 mm. guns, trench mortars and unknown number of rifles.
3. (70.3-79.3) 22 May 1945- 400 enemy in fox holes along the creeks. Arms unknown except rifles.
4. (70.1-79.7) 21 May 1945- 800 enemy quartered in civilian houses and along the creeks. The houses in this area are being used as their Mess Halls. Supplies are stored in tunnels.
5. (71.3-79.3) 21 May 1945- 6 Tunnels being used by the enemy as ammunition and supply dumps. 1000 enemy scattered along the creeks east and west of this point. Arms consist of light machine guns, trench mortars and unknown number of rifles.
6. (70.3-77.9) 21 May 1945- 150 enemy in civilian houses. Supplies being transported from this point to Kayapa Proper.
7. (69.6-78.0) 21 May 1945- 130 enemy with Radio Station in this point.
8. (69.6-78.8) 21 May 1945- 250 enemy occupying civilian houses.
9. (69.4-78.7) 21 May 1945- 150 enemy occupying civilian houses where supplies are stored.
10. (68.3-78.5) 21 May 1945- 500 enemy with tunnels and foxholes at the junction of the creek camouflaged, arms unknown.
11. (68.5-77.6) (2) deep tunnels/ammunition and supply dumps 130 enemy occupied civilian houses.
12. (69.3-79.1) 21 May 1945- 200 enemy quartered in civilian houses up north. Supplies and ammunition stored below the church in dug tunnels.
13. (68.9-79.9) 21 May 1945- 200 enemy in 2 tunnels and occupying civilian houses at night time.
14. (69.3-80.1) 21 May 1945- 300 enemy, 2 Tunnels constructed and serves as supply and ammunition dumps. Big engine in this tunnel. Houses in both sides of the road occupied by the enemy.

15. (67.4- 81.7) 21 May 1945- 500 enemy troops with 50 Filipino U.N.(YOIN), quartered in civilian houses with defenses consisting of fox-holes, earth embankments. YOIN Troops are armed with American rifles.

16. (67.5- 82.1) 21 May 1945- Bedoga for unloading of supplies coming from Nueva Vizcaya and truck stations of trucks retreating from the Baguio area, and also Radio station located at this point. Several tunnels constructed at the both sides of the ridge, used as ammunition and supply dumps. 1,500 enemy quartered under trees in this area.

17. (67.5- 83.3) 21 May 1945- 1,500 enemy. Tunnels constructed and used as ammunition and supply dumps. Arms unknown except rifles.

Note: The enemy strength in the above mentioned places are being increased daily due to the number of enemy forces retreating from the Baguio area.

SUBJECT: Civilian Evacuees from N. Visaya

TO : Lieut. C.A. WEEKS
CO, CIC Det. 32nd Div.

1. About 500 civilian evacuees from Aritao and Bone, Nueva Visaya were escorted by 24 soldiers of the 14th Infantry, USAFIP, NORTH LUZON under Sgts. Naster Bengabong, and Johnny Mabunga, 12 of them only having arms and the rest were without arms.
2. On 21 May 1945, Sgt. Naster Bengabong went ahead with the families of said soldiers leaving behind them, some civilians who were unprotected from the enemy.
3. In Iapa, northeast of the junction of the Minlawit and Kayapa river, these civilians were found by 4 Japanese soldiers on the 21st of May.
4. The Japs upon seeing the civilians, rounded up the group and tied all the men then threw 2 hand grenades at them and one Japanese with a bolo started killing the women and children.
5. Some civilians (6 of them) were able to escape from the enemy and these civilians were met by Agents Johnny Willie and Avelino Luto, both under this command, at the junction of the Kayapa and Mil-lawit Rivers on 23 May 1945, and have guided these civilians to the American area.
6. According to these rescued civilians, there were still some wounded civilians who were left behind.

1. (04.3- 01.0) 21 May 1945- 800 enemy armed with two (2) 105 mm. guns. Ammunitions and supplies deposited under trees, carefully camouflaged. This point is their Observation Post.

2. (07.0- 70.4) 21 May 1945- 1,600 enemy in tents and occupying civilian houses with their constructed defenses consisting of fox-holes, earth embankments and trenches. Enemy hospital and Radio Station at this point located among the bamboo grooves and trees.

3. (02.3- 04.9) 700 enemy quartered in huts under trees, armed with 75 mm. guns, mortars, light machine guns and unknown number of rifles. (21 May 1945)

4. (KONGKONG) 21 May 1945- 1,200 armed with 75 mm. guns, trench mortars, machine guns of unknown number, quartered in civilian houses; supply trucks are found scattered among the trees in this area.

5. Kamata- 21 May 1945- 1500 enemy quartered in civilian houses with their constructed defenses consisting of fox-holes, earth embankments and trenches.

6. (06.4- 71.2) 21 May 1945- 15 medium sized tanks parked under trees and bamboo grooves. At day time, they hide and at night, they go to Santa Fe to fight.

7. (03.1- 02.4) 21 May 1945- Civilian Concentration is located on the top of a hill in barrio Anduburban.

(Thru CG, CIG DNT, 2nd Div.)

1. Agents LISIAYO HUGHAY and 6 civilian guides were sent for reconnaissance mission to Kayapa Proper, Kayapa (Pampang), Sobok area and Pangasinan.

2. On May 6, 1945, Agent Bagnay arrived with his companions after fighting their way through enemy infested areas and have taken the following trophies from the enemy:

- a. 2 U.S. Rifles, Model 1917
- b. 1 binocular
- c. 1 Japanese flag

3. Agent Bagnay with his companions encountered an enemy patrol around Kayapa area and in the fight that followed, they have killed 4 Japanese without losing any man.

4. They were also successful in bringing down about 500 civilians from Kayapa Proper and Kayapa (Pampang), Nueva Vizcaya to Pangasinan.

3. 600 Japs along Ba-an creeks armed (5) 105, 7 75 mm and light machine gun., trucks transporting supplies being stationed there.
4. 300 Japs stationed in Mayabaco, Bow-wit under trees in foxholes.
5. Pingkian to Pampang road (3,000) japs scattered along the road specially in curves, Adun creek, in tunnels, armed (8) 105, (6) 75mm and light machine gun.

Willie is now a Mayor of this Municipality.

4. I'm sending of the natives to Lebano re "B" and Balolong could help Lebano as he has no more work to do.

5. Cpl. Martin and Pvt. Lopez had captured (1) alive Japs on August 3, 1945 and had turn the Japs to Capt. Villante of the Squadron 1st regt LGAF with a American Captain.



6. Adan (73.9-74.8 Pingkian) 250 Jap foot troopers are in small huts under trees along creek. (May 7, 45 B-2)
7. Cabanglasan (74.6-77.4 Kayapa) 90 Jap foot troopers armed with rifles and trench mortars are under trees along a dry creek. (May 7, 45 B-2)
8. Santa Rosa (79.5-76.2 Pingkian) 200 Jap foot troopers armed with rifles, trench mortars and 5 machine guns are in small huts under trees along a creek. (May 7, 45 B-2)
9. Road curve (74.3-76.9 Kayapa) 300 Jap foot troopers armed with rifles, trench mortars and 10 machine guns are in houses and tents along the creek. Ammunition and supplies are kept in four tunnels on the road side. (May 7, 45 B-2)
10. Langka (76.1-75.9 Pingkian) 110 Jap foot troopers were camped under trees along two small creeks. (May 7, 45 B-2)

SANTA FE, NUEVA VIZAYA

1. Bulate Pass - 19 heavy guns of various caliber are mounted between three hills approximately 120 meters east of Bulate Hotel, which is already bombed. (May 11, 45 B-2)
2. Mungati - 160 Jap foot troopers with one - 105 gun mounted in a creek approximately 2 km. northeast of Santa Fe. The Japs have also rifles and machine guns. (May 11, 45 B-2)
3. Barakak - 200 Jap troopers camped along the creek. They have rifles, machine guns and 7 trucks. (May 7, 45 B-2)
4. Imungan Proper - 329 Japs Infantrymen armed with light guns are in foxholes on both sides of the Provincial Road, approximately one km. southeast of Imungan School Building. (May 7, 45 B-2)
5. Gadagad (77.1-60.1) Two (2) 75 mm and three (3) 105 mm guns are mounted along Gadagad creek, approximately one km. west of Highway No. 5. 300 enemy troops are in here. (May 7, B-2)
6. Cusaran - 80 Jap foot troopers armed with 2 machine guns and rifles are detailed to transport food supplies from Cusaran to Mt. Aebay using three horses. (May 7, B-2)
7. Manged (68.8-59.6) 250 Jap foot troopers armed with machine guns, trench mortars and rifles are in civilian houses. (May 8, B-2)
8. Laglag - 450 Jap troopers armed with machine guns and rifles are advancing to Mt. Aebay. (May 8, B-2)

1. 71.6-01.6 (2 August '45) 700 enemy armed with machine guns, trench mortars, and rifles unknown number, quartered in civilian houses, and built their camps along the creek under trees, in tunnels and foxholes. This point is suspected hid-out of General YAMA SHITA, with some Filipinos.
2. 72.1-00.6 (2 Aug. '45) 450 enemy armed with light machine guns and rifles unknown number camping along the creek under trees with foxholes and tunnels.
3. 74 .7-92.6 (2 Aug. '45) 200 enemy light machine guns trench mortars, with rifles unknown number, quartered along the creek among the trees, and near camote garden.
4. 72.3-00.6 (2 Aug. '45) 300 enemy armed with (2) automatics and rifles unknown number, quartered at the junction of the creek.
5. 71.J-90.9 (2 Aug. '45) 800 armed with light machine guns, trench mortars with rifles unknown number stationed along the creek, near camote, garden among the trees.
6. 72.3-00.6 (2 Aug. '45) 800 armed with light machine guns trench mortars, with rifles unknown number built their camps under trees along the creeks and camote garden, edge.

1. 80.3-63.2 (18 May 45) 6 med. size stationed at day time fighting at Santa Fe area at night time, with 800 enemy armed with 75 mm, light machine guns, trench mortars unknown number, along the creeks in foxholes.
2. 79.0-63.5 (18 May 45) 500 enemy scattered along the creek in foxholes unknown arms.
3. 81.3-63.3 (18 May 45) 50 Officers quartered in culvert under national road and along the creeks and dumps munitions deposit.
4. 81.1-64.1 (18 May 1945) 200 enemy along the creeks under trees, in foxholes.
5. 82.1- 64.4 (200) enemy quartered in road culverts, and 1000 enemy scattered along the road among trees and creeks from Calititan to Bona.
6. 86.3-69.9 (1800) enemy quartered among the mango trees and creeks in tunnels unknown arms.
7. 66.7-70.3 (18 May 45) 12 med. size tanks with cannons, trucks etc, ammunition dumps in tunnels, foxholes mango trees and bomb groves
8. 67.4-70.7, 800 enemy in foxholes tents and houses among the bomb groves arms unknown.
