Brief History of the Bulacan Military Area

FROM: 1st Lt. J. H. Manzano TO: Chief, Claims Service Div. 9 Sept 48

The following is an extract of the factual history of the BMA on file at the G-3 Records Section. Additional information has been furnished by id. Soi. Bernard L. Anderson and the undersigned.

Generilias in the prevince of Balacan were originally organised by Gent. Joseph R. Barkar, Gey. USA upon his arrival in north-eastern Balacan on 1 July 1942 in the company of ht. Colonel Bernard L. Anderson. On 4 July 1942, Captain Joseph R. Barkar left for the Zmbales are and left Col Anderson in command of Balacan with instruction to containe organizing generaliza in the area and to control same.

Activities and Strength of Unit

Setueen July 1942 and March 1945, inclusive, activities of guarrillas in the Automa Military Area were practically mil with the exception of security treeps and supply units for Anderson's handquarters.

Activities were limited to organizing, periodic training and procurement of supplies for Lt Col Amberson's headquarters. Majority of members remained in their own homes subject to call.

The only combat unit active in the area at the time was the 23th Quarrilla Squadron of which approximately nimety per cent of its members have been recognized with the Anderson's Command and the balance with the MAA.

Ta March 1945, it Gol Anderson issued the "Lay low" orders to all his units with strict orders to avoid armed clashes with the enemy. Activities sere liabled to erganizing and intelligence.

However, armed troops were maintained in the field for security purposes. Speradic claims with the enemy were reported. These occurred only when guerrilla units were attacked.

In the latter part of March 1945, Lt Col Anderson left
Bulscan for Tayabas to initiate contact with GRO, SVPA. Activities

headquarters. Hence, when contact was lost, activities ceased.

The activities of the Balacan Hilitary Area from September 1945 to the middle of 1946 were at a minimum. In September 1944, with the arrival of submarines at 561 Ambreonies inedequatives in fayyabs, activities of the MMS gradually increased. Though sent sent overland from Ambreon to Snyabas to procure area and other equipment landed by submarine. Intolliquate activities were intensified. Training of troops wan initiated.

Arms in pessection of the unit prior to the arrival of submarines in September 1944 were promused from civilians in the immediate vicinity and by sending appointion to Bestann. Arms promused from Reteam were small in number due to attacks of these expeditions by contingents of the Enthalahap organization. It is doubtful whether a total of 400 wagons were produced there.

Approximately 85 tens of supplies vers allocated to the BMA. These included arms, assumition, descritton and signal equipment, food, medical supplies, clothing and money.

In October 1944, a SMA rester was submitted to GMR, SWA in the strength of 15,000 members and in December 1944, in strength of 16,000. In October 1944, Le Andrew F. Hubry, Alls, arrived in Delector from Engales and trained demolition teams. In November 1944, Gaptain Bartolose Gabunghang arrived an SMA SE and set up transmonivers at SMA headquarters in addition to those Sentes had set up in September 1944. During the liberation operations in 1945, the BMA engaged notively in support of Sixth Army combat operations.

The above are the recognized figures approved by PHILOM to a built strength of 25,000 claimed by Captein Alejo S. Santos as of 1945 in his representations made to this headquarters.

Investigation of the Bulacan Military Area was conducted by Captain Robert & Northon and the undersigned between 1 June and 20 August 1947, inclusive.

SUPPLY PROCEDURE

From the time of inception of guerrillas in Bulacan to December 1945, there was no system of issuing receipts devised to be issued to individuals domating supplies or a system wherein only authorized personnel were to sign these receipts.

Upon appointment of an individual as a commander, he was automatically authorised to procure supplies and issue receipts for same. These commanders, in turn, delegated their authority to subcritiantes.

In late 1965, 16 Gol Anderson devised two forms of receipts to be utilised for such cases. One use a MORIFF TON COMMENT, and another, a RECEIFF TON SUPPLIES. These forms were, in nost cases, disregarded by the RMA. This may have been due to the extraordinary conditions existent at the time.

marrilla funds, in most cases, were used for the purchase of food and medical supplies. Mayever, it was always preferable to requisition the supplies directly rather than solicity funds and them purchase supplies. This was especially true in Bulsean where food was abundant.

Incidentally, in the latter part of 1945, Col Anderson and the undersigned were placed on EUT with G-2, Executive Group, Mg JFFAC to account for every deliar and peec issued by GHG SUFA during the period of enemy occupation.

The only unit that gave Anderson difficulty in this accounting was the MAA. Approximately F20,000 in Philippine Tietery Notes were mover accounted for by Captain Santes. AFFAC records will bear this out.

PERSONAL HISTORY OF BUA C.O.

The following information on ALBYO 5. SARTOS was obtained through personal contact with him during and after the period of enemy occupation.
