STATEMENT of Lt. Col. William C. Chenoweth, taken in Casualty Branch, 30 November 1944:

- 9.3. When the war broke, the USAFE Engineer, Colonel Casey (now Major Generia Casey) employed all the mining engineers of the Philippines who would volunteer their cervices to the Engineering Department. Many of those minors assisted in the desolition work on Lucu and the other tailands. On Lucon most of them were taken to Betaan, assigned either to the First Corps, the Second Corps, or the Department Engineer, and served as civiliane until early February. Between the outbreak of the wapsid the middle of February almost all of them were given countsisions as officers in the Army. Those who had had previous military experience were usually commissioned as First Lieutenants, although men who had a particularly outstending reputation in the Islands, and who were crawing civilian salaries of from eight to sixteen hundred pesse a month, received commissions as in high as Major.
- *2. As Engineer for the Second Corps, I had between forty and fifty of these mining engineers assigned to see. Their services were invaluable because of their knowledge of rough and practical engineering and their experience in handling Filipinos. The following are sen whose names I recell;

"h. 2 Valentine, a Russian. He was hired as a civilian to serve with the Engineers in the Second Corps, but was never commissioned.

3. The procedure of hiring and commissioning civilians, as I have outlined above as followed by Gen. Seasy on wunon, as followed to a considerable extent on all the Melands of the Philippines. Any civilian in the Philippines who converted the services was gladly accepted by the Amyr and, in anot cases, insued a commission, usually as a first or Second Meutemant. This was done because of the neute shorthage of white officers.

- 1. Biclosed is a message concerning appointment ande by me. This one of many similar messages received and likely to be received for some time to come. To answer each letter in detail requires a great deal of paper movic on up part, since I wat the ter replies await. At this time I am receiving daily medical treatment and supposedly resting and recuperating. I request therefore that the following concess, requiring of as the basis for action of his many parties of the confirmation and pertinent data peculiar to each case,
- Circumstances surrounding appointments and promotions.
 Dec 8, 1941 Mar. 4, 1942, I commanded the 6let Division P. A. and the island of Panay. Mar. 4, 1942 May 17, 1942 I commanded the entire Visayan Force.
- b. Luxon, being primary theator, received the bulk of the trained troops and magner equipment variable.  inversacies, brigods, bloods (AL), matches, flash light batteries, bolos, spears,

We shipped a large consignment of intrenching tools to Batsan on the Legaspi (captured and sunk). This service made demands on us for responsible personnel.

The above general statement covers the cases that I believe will arrive. It appears that somebody is reluctant to give credit for the service performed by some of these people. I have heard that some cases have been turned down. It is true that the appointments were not handled in routine fashion as per peacetime requirements. I suggest however, that the regulations and rules were not written with any such situation in mind. Our isolation was stultifying. No superior ever visited my areas after the war began. Mail service broke down. Radio was crowded. I had a letter about March 1942 from (them) Brig. General Sutherland, C. of S. USAFFE, stating that he didn't approve of my promotions, and stating that the solution was simple-all I need do was to send my lists in and they would be approved. The facts are that I sent in three lists at least, and never got a single reaction to any of them. Hever a single promotion or appointment, to my nemory. I have been told that promotions were deadly slow even on Luson. In my area they were non-existent. The war went right on. Our tasks multiplied and got more hope-less every month. I did what I thought General MacArthur would want me to do and in good faith took these people on for service, and they served in good faith and in my opinion justice demands that their service be recognised. 3. Specific case of Colonel Albert F. Christie, Infantry. General MacArthur had directed me to be very careful not to demote or depost Filipino officers, and to be careful not to belittle their rank, for obvious political reasons. In the 61st Division I had as C. of S. a former Filipino Constabulary officer, Colonel Quimbo. I soon found him totally inadequate for C. of S. He was given a command and proved totally inadequate for it. I am told by people who knew him in staff school that his inadequacy was obvious before he came to me. I am also informed that when the Japs invaded Panay, he disappeared, and that his subsequent conduct was under question. But he was a likeable old fellow, and I didn't want to hurt him nor to violate Gen. Magarthur's tirective. Tet he was my second in command. I hated to think of what would happen if I were a casualty and he took over command. Next in rank was Colonel Christie. I then thought that I had authority to make acting promotions. I therefore appointed Col. Quimbo brigadier general and made him lisison officer with the civil government, a task for which he was well suited by nature and experience. This made him so happy that he didn't



mind the reversal of rank; and it left Christic as second in command. Brig. General (then) Sutherland told ne later that he disapproved of my appointment of Christie. I had no word about it from General MacArthur however. I went in March to Cebu as C. G. V. V. This left Christic with not only Quimbo but also Col. Garcia who had been unloaded from Luzon and who, Sutherland himself wrote ne, was not suited for command. Christie them inherited command of the 61st Division and of Panay, a command which he performed in a very able manner. Since he was designated as acting brigadier general, the Filipino colonels were perfectly willing to serve under him. He continued in this status until surrender in May, 1942. Since he was appointed in good faith, and acted in good faith and later commanded a division, I believe that he should receive credit for holding the rank. The procedure was irregular, but the situation in the Visayans, isolated as they were, was also irregular.

4. I lost all records, but submit from memory the following list of promotions and appointments made by me. This does not preclude other cases, which I would remember if brought to my attention, but which I do not remember off-hand.

Panay Thomas N. Powell, Sr. (Civilian, lawyer-died or Killed as FOW on Crukm Maru Hell-ship) had been a reserve officer formerly-appointed by me Lieut.
