

MEMO To: The CG Harbor Defenses, Manila & Subic Bays.

- Request authority to install two army ranges in the small tunnel, just west of the/heaptal entrance to Malinta Tunnel, now being used to house an auxiliary motor and generator.
- There is sufficient room to install these ranges near the entrance of this small tunnel and there would be no necessity of removing any of the equipment now installed there.
- 3. It is imperative that additional space for cooking facilities be acquired at once. No more electrical stoves can be installed within the hospital tunnel as the generators now in use here do not produce sufficient current for the efficient operation of such equipment as is now installed.
- 4. There are over 850 being fed in the hospital mess, many of whom are on special dists. Cooking outside the tunnel is uncertain and cannot be accomplished with any degree of efficiency.

"The fighting morale of United States troops still offoring resistance on the Philippines received a severe blow by General MacArthur's flight to Australia, the newspaper "Asahi" wrote Sunday. It declared that MacArthur's flight most probably hastened the end of enemy resistance in the Philippines. The fact that the enemy was able to resist the Japanese in the Philippines so long, is attributed by "Asahi" to the following reasons:

(1) The United States has still at their disposal the fortress of Corregidor, which during the past forty years have been developed into a strong, first-class military base.

(2) The Bataan peninsula, close to Corregidor, is mountainous, offering many difficulties to the attackers.

(3) Advence from Eanila on Rataan peningula is made difficult because the inclined road leading from leania clong Hanila Bay is extremely merrow and under observation and sums from Corregidor, Too, the Americans laid wast minoftelds which make attack on Corregidor from the see side difficult. Neverthless, "Asahi" concludes that the enemy position is hopeless, since

enemy positions are becoming ever tighter and the enemy has no possibility of relieving his position by an offensive."

#### SUBJECT: Medical Records.

TO: The Surgeon of each Force or Unit; The Commanding Officer of each General Hospital and each Medical Officer, Philippine Islands.

- The following is a list of the more common errors noted on Emergency Medical Tags submitted to this office:
  - Name of patient illegible. It is desired that the name be printed.
  - b. Organization and station where tagged, and date often omitted. The "Station" entry should be such as to identify organization preparing same. Example: "Clearing Co llth Med En."
  - c. In some cases the treatment given is not shown.
  - d. Form 105, Medical Service, Philippine Army, should show the disposition of patient on the reverse side of the duplicate, the disposition being shown on the original under "Supplemental Record."
  - e. In many cases the Supplemental Record of original EMT is not being utilized or accomplished where indicated.
  - f. Tags should be made out with pencil. Under no circumstances should indelible pencil or ink be used.
  - g. All tags should accompany a Report Sheet, Form 51 MD and not be sent in separately.
  - h. Signature often illegible. The name should be printed if signature cannot be read.
- Medical records on hand upon receipt of this communication will be checked to insure conformity with above instructions.
- 3. Under "Remarks" on Yorn 51 MD should be entered the dates of participation in combat.
