The Commanding Officer all Medical Units, Installation and all Medical Department Officers.

The following instructions pertaining to the entry of wounded in action on Medical Records, approved by Headquarters USAFFE, January 16, 1942, is published for your information and guidances

Since medical statistics, award of compensation and decorations
are dependent upon wounds received in action and in order that such records may be accomplished with uniformity, the following will be used to
determine the appropriate entry in connection with battle casualties;

a. To be WIA the resupient must be injured directly by an enemy weapon or missile or indirectly, as by rock, gravel or other flying debris which has been set in motion by the action of a bomb, shell or other missile.

b. An injury received as a result of action of an individual to avoid contact, directly or indirectly, with an enemy missile will be considered an injury and not a wound received in action.

Subject: Camouflage Disciplino.

: All unit Commanders;

All Services.

1. Lives are being needlessly lost and valueble supplies and stocks destroyed because of poor camouflage. The importance of proper concealment and canouflace discipline cannot be overemphasized.

2. Troops in bivouse or shelter must be conceeled under cover. Meedless or thoughtless slashing of vegetation, trees, etc. for greater convenience and comfort at the sacrifice of concealment must be stored. Grouping of transportation around occupied areas must be avoided. Mass display of white towels, laundry, etc. disclosing a position should be avoided.

Transportation and supply routes to positions should be kept concealed under natural cover. Such routes when built should be carried beyond the position served in order not to disclose a position located at a dead-and of a road.

4. Supplies must be 'ept in dispersed and concealed locations and similar precautions exercised with respect to maintaining all possible natural cover.

5. Agressive as well as defensive canouflage measures should also be taken. Such measures should include the location of durmy anti-sircraft guns, a dursy machine guns, dursy headquarters and supply installations in areas not utilized for actual operations installations in order to diversify the number of targets to be covered by the enony with resultant decrease in concentration on active installations. Durmy planes may be located on inactive durmy fields. Disabled cars should be located around felse headquarters or sup ly installations to give a false impression of activity. Such durny installations should be partially canouflaged to be difective.

6. The active and continued vigilance of all contenders must be exercised in insuring compliance with this directive.
