WARNING MEMORANDUM:

To: All Officers and Men.

This headquarters has been officially notified by the Cebu Surgeon that there is a total lack of antirabies serum in Cebu, and that there is no source of supply whatsoever available. Furthermore it would take five months to manufacture this serum even if the necessary ingredients were available.

In view of the above adverse condition any person bitten by a dog infected with rabies would in all probability die.

Therefore it is a military necessity that every member of this command should protect himself as far as possible from being bitten by any dog.

- B. Specialist ratings, flying pay, or air mechanic rating can not be allotted.
- C. Officers may allot base pay, longevity pay, and subsistence allowance; (flying pay and quarters allowance cannot be allotted.)

4. All authorizations for allotment of pay must be forwarded to this Headquarters indicating on form that proper entries have been made on either the service record and/or transcript of pay account.

5. All allotments and deductions except Government insurance must be renewed prior to expiration date.

6. Many Philippine Army Officers are reporting the fact that they made application for National Service Life Insurance during the Month of December 1941, and inclosing money order or personal check for first premium with application to Veteran's Administration, Manila. It is quite probable that these applications were not delivered due to interruption of the mail service. In order to protect beneficiaries concerned, such cases have been forwarded by radio to the Commanding General, USAFFE with the request that if no record of insurance application is found, to use our radio as application for the insurance. Any such cases not already reported should make out new application for insurance and authorization for deduction of pay, and forward them to this Headquarters together with report on original application. Necessary information to put policy into effect will then be forwarded by radio. Should original application and remittance reach it's destination, adjustment will be made at a later date.

7. It is directed that Sector Commanders take immediate steps to insure compliance with above.

8. In stating rank "brevet" rank will not be indicated. The rank under which pay is being drawn only will be shown.



Subject: WIA entry on Medical Records. January 16, 1942

To: The Commanding Officer all Medical Units, Installation
and all Medical Department Officers.

The following instructions pertaining to the entry of wounded in action on Medical Records, approved by Headquarters USAFFE, January 16, 1942, is published for your information and guidance:

1. Since medical statistics, award of compensation and decorations are dependent upon wounds received in action and in order that such records may be accomplished with uniformity, the following will be used to determine the appropriate entry in connection with battle casualties:
 - a. To be WIA the recipient must be injured directly by an enemy weapon or missile or indirectly, as by rock, gravel or other flying debris which has been set in motion by the action of a bomb, shell or other missile.
 - b. An injury received as a result of action of an individual to avoid contact, directly or indirectly, with an enemy missile will be considered an injury and not a wound received in action.

1. The following G-2 Circular, Hq. USAFFE, Manila, P. I. is quoted for the information of and strict compliance by all personnel of the Visayan-Mindanao Force:

G-2 Circular No. 1

1. There is positive evidence of careless and widespread discussion of military matters amongst military personnel, and in the hearing of outsiders. This tendency was obvious even before the outbreak of hostilities. Talkativeness, an indiscretion in time of peace, becomes a direct menace in time of war. It is apparent that specifically technical matters are being discussed, viz., location of ground units, headquarters, aviation equipment, performances and types and numbers of troops.

2. It is urged upon all military personnel to exercise the greatest caution in this respect. It is prohibited to mention:

- a. Types, performance and numbers of aircraft.
- b. Troop locations and numerical designations.
- c. Details of operations and troop movements.
- d. Location of Command Posts.

2. All organization and separate unit commanders will immediately take necessary action to insure compliance with FM 30-25, Sec. II. Impress upon all personnel under your command that the man who discusses or even

mentions military matters within the hearing of civilians is not only a menace to our military effort, but he is endangering his life and the lives of his comrades. Such carelessness must cease. Discussion of military matters among military personnel should be confined to only that which is necessary for efficient operation of our military effort.


