

"Boundaries between companies: Between Companies B and A - A.Sneed (house) (346.8-732.5) - crossroads 421-A - end of fence at (343.7-733.5) (all to Company B); between Companies A and C: L.Fish - point of woods at (345.95-732.40) - point of woods at (346.0-732.8) - road bend at (344.4-733.4) (all to Company A).

"Company B, with one platoon of Company D attached, will capture hill 466-b and assist Company A in the capture of the high ground to the south thereof.

"Company A, making its main effort on its left, will assist the advance of Company C by capturing the hill 600 yards south of hill 466-b.

"Company C, assisted by Company A on its right, will capture the high ground in the vicinity of J.Haight and envelop the hostile right.

"Company D (less one platoon) from positions in the northern edge of woods 600 yards east of J.Haight, will support the advance of Companies A and C.

"1st Platoon, Howitzer Company, 1st Infantry, from initial positions about 700 yards southwest of road junction 434-A, will support the attack.

"1st Battalion, 1st Field Artillery, from positions in the valley of Cattail Br 500 yards southeast of road junction 416 (347-733) will support the attack, paying particular attention to the advance of Company C.

"Battalion Am DP: Road Junction 438-B.

"Command Post: 1st Battalion, 1st Infantry - road junction 459-B."

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Enemy shell fire falling near road junction 438-B has killed one man of Company B and wounded four (one severely). These wounded men, along with one walking wounded of Company A, have been sent to the house nearest road junction 432-B.

The Blue advance guard artillery has opened fire from position 600 yards north of road junction 423-A.

REQUIREMENT: The medical estimate of the situation of the Surgeon, Advance Guard (Surgeon, 1st Battalion, 1st Infantry) as of 8:20 AM.

c. At 7:10 PM units of the 1st Medical Regiment are located as follows:

1st Collecting Company is establishing station in the vicinity of the stream crossing 200 yards south of RJ 829-A (375-739) for the 1st Brigade. It has been in operation all morning and supplies are badly depleted.

2nd Collecting Company is in reserve at Cherry Grove School (371-733). It will leave at 9:40 PM to move to a site in the vicinity of the stream crossing at 374.7-741.4 and will arrive at that point at 10:10 PM and establish station for the 2nd Brigade.

3rd Collecting Company is in the vicinity of KINNEY (373-740) and is clearing the field east of that site. It is estimated that the field will be cleared by 9:00 PM. The Company is under orders to close station at that time and move to the vicinity of CR 721-F (371-739) in regimental reserve.

1st Ambulance Company (less 1 platoon which is assisting the 3rd Collecting Company) is at Cherry Grove School. It will leave at 9:00 PM for a position along the stream 500 yards south of CR 721-F in regimental reserve. It will arrive at that site at 10:00 PM. The platoon with the 3rd Collecting Company is under orders to transport the foot elements of that company to the vicinity of CR 721-F after the collecting station has been cleared. It will arrive at CR 721-F at 10:50 PM.

2nd Ambulance Company is to establish a shuttle to the collecting station of the 1st Brigade and is now assembling at RJ 764-D (371-736). It will leave for WILLIS (372-736) at 9:10 PM.

3rd Ambulance Company is at station at RJ 710-F (369-738) and is evacuating the 3rd Collecting Company at KINNEY. It is under orders, when this station is evacuated, to move to the vicinity of RJ 754-B (371-739), establish station and be prepared to evacuate the Collecting Station for the 2nd Brigade by 10:30 PM.

The Hospital Battalion is operating a station with two companies at MARKERS MILL (361-730); 300 patients are in the station. Army will complete evacuation of this station by Midnight. The 1st Hospital Company is enroute to the vicinity of RJ 615-A (365-736) and will have established station by 10:00 PM. Evacuation to this station to begin at this hour. The remainder of the battalion to proceed to the vicinity of RJ 615-A when evacuated and go into reserve. It is estimated that the remainder of the battalion will arrive at RJ 615-A at 1:30 AM.

1st Veterinary Company has established station for the defense in the vicinity of the stream crossing 100 yards west of RJ 740-P (371-737).

Army Medical Supply Depot is at GETTYSBURG - 10 miles northwest of LITTLESTOWN where the 1st Division has a credit established.

The Service Company is operating a station at MARKERS MILL. It has been ordered to move to the vicinity of C. LESTER (365-736) and open at 9:30 PM.

d. At 7:10 PM Captain "Service Company" is at the command post 1st Medical Regiment at GR 721-F having just returned from a G-1 - G-4 conference at the forward echelon of Division Headquarters at PINE GROVE SCHOOL (370-738) which he attended with the regimental commander. At this conference he obtained the information given above. He has the following additional information concerning the supply situation:

Vehicles (except individual ammunition vehicles and ambulances) will not operate during hours of daylight east of LONG ARM CREEK.

CLASS I SUPPLIES

Ration cycle begins with supper.

Each individual has one reserve ration in his pack.

Each Company of the Medical Regiment has one "A" ration for men, and animal-drawn companies have one forage ration, in company transportation which was delivered by trucks of Service Company last night.

There is one "B" ration for the regiment on the trucks of Service Company.

There is one "B" ration for all elements of the division in the Quartermaster Regiment transportation.

The Quartermaster Regiment will issue an "A" ration, with forage ration, and fuel for one day, by unit distribution, trucks of the Quartermaster Regiment arriving at the Service Station at C. LESTER with these supplies at 9:30 PM.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ALL SECTIONS OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT (FORMS 86a, 86b, 86c, ETC.)

(a) **PLAN AND PURPOSE OF THE REPORT.**—The Statistical Report comprises several sections in each of which is incorporated specific information required by the various divisions of The Surgeon General's Office and the office of the Chief Surgeon in a theater of operations. The sections are designed to furnish the following information: First section (Form 86a), data concerning sick, injured, and battle casualties, hospitalization, and other statistical data; second section (Form 86b), movement of communicable diseases; and third section (Form 86c), status of Medical Department personnel, other personnel attached to the Medical Department for duty, and transportation and material available for utilization by the Medical Department. The third section relates solely to Medical Department personnel, or personnel attached thereto; while the other sections (first and second sections) include statistical data covering the entire command of which the Medical Department unit forms an integral part. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their particular areas. (Para. 2a and 2b, AR 40-1066.)

(b) **BY WHOM RENDERED.**—All Medical Department units will render this report. In time of peace separate reports will be rendered for each character of training unit. (Par. 2c, AR 40-1066.)

(c) **TIME INTERVAL FOR RENDERING.**—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the morning report for Saturday, and the third section as of the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Par. 2d, AR 40-1066.)

(d) **CHANGES THROUGH WHICH RENDERED.**—In time of peace, and in the Zone of the Interior in time of war, the statistical report will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to The Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the corps area or department surgeon; and the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Par. 2e (1), AR 40-1066.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the forces, the original through medical channels to such intermediate administrative office as may exist, and the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Par. 2e (2), AR 40-1066.)

(e) **EXPLANATION OF SPECIAL SYMBOLS.**—The purpose of the capitals in parentheses (A), (B), etc., and of the asterisks (*) is explained in paragraph (f). The Arabic numerals in parentheses (1), (2), etc., refer to the paragraphs in special instructions for the preparation of the section of the report (Form 86a, 86b, or 86c) in which the details of the preparation are covered.

(f) **TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS.**—Telegraphic reports will be rendered only when specifically required or in emergency. Such reports will be forwarded in code and will comprise the data on all items on the report marked with an asterisk. Capitals (A), (B), etc. (immediately preceding or following the headings), will be used as code letters to designate the headings. In addition to the telegram, all sections of the completed report (86a, 86b, or 86c, etc.) will be forwarded by mail as provided for in paragraph (d). (Par. 2f, AR 40-1066.)

II

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THIRD SECTION, STATISTICAL REPORT (FORM 86c)

The numbers preceding the following paragraphs correspond with and relate to the numbers appearing on the face of this form.

(1) In a theater of operations the numerical designation of the unit only will be given. In the Zone of the Interior complete identification of unit by name and place will be made.

(2) Indicate specifically month, day, and year. Do not use figures to indicate month. In telegraphic reports omit the year.

(3) Mean strength is obtained by adding daily strength of command (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) for each day for the period, plus number of patients in hospital (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) not otherwise included in strength of command, each day for the period and dividing the sum by the number of days in the period.

(NOTE.—Discharged soldiers or other civilians will not be included in this strength.)

(4) State number of civilians employed and paid out of Medical Department funds (ambulance, reconstruction aide, etc.).

(3) Personnel, other than Medical Department, attached to the Medical Department for duty.

(4) Report other statistical data pertaining to personnel and transportation as called for by higher authority and other forms or notes bearing on subjects which in the opinion of the each reporting should be communicated to such authority.

(7) In all orders insert both the number being used by or under the direct control of the Medical Department and immediately thereafter, in parentheses, any additional number of the station, including those stored as a War Reserve. Zeros will be used in the appropriate column or columns marked (7) to show that an entry has not been entered.

INSTRUCTIONS

I

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ALL SECTIONS OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT (FORMS 86a, 86b, 86c, ETC.)

(a) PLAN AND PURPOSE OF THE REPORT.—The Statistical Report comprises several sections in each of which is incorporated specific information required by the various divisions of The Surgeon General's Office and the office of the Chief Surgeon in a theater of operations. The sections are designed to furnish the following information: First section (Form 86a), data concerning sick, injured, and battle casualties, hospitalization, and other statistical data; second section (Form 86b), movement of commandable disease; and third section (Form 86c), status of Medical Department personnel, other personnel attached to the Medical Department for duty, and transportation and material available for utilization by the Medical Department. The third section relates solely to Medical Department personnel, or personnel attached thereto; while the other sections (first and second sections) include statistical data covering the entire command of which the Medical Department unit forms an integral part. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their rendition arises. (Par. 2a and 2b, AR 40-1080.)

(b) BY WHOM RENDERED.—All Medical Department units will render this report. In time of peace separate reports will be rendered for each character of training unit. (Par. 2c, AR 40-1080.)

(c) TIME INTERVAL FOR RENDERING.—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the morning report for Saturday, and the third section as of the first day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Par. 2d, AR 40-1080.)

(d) CHANNELS THROUGH WHICH RENDERED.—In time of peace, and in the Zone of the Interior in time of war, the statistical report will be made in triplicate; one carbon copy forwarded direct to The Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the corps area or department surgeon; and the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Par. 2e (1), AR 40-1080.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the force, the original through medical channels to each intermediate administrative office as may exist, and the second carbon copy retained; except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Par. 2e (2), AR 40-1080.)

(e) EXPLANATION OF SPECIAL SYMBOLS.—The purpose of the capitals in parentheses (A), (B), etc., and of the asterisks (*) is explained in paragraph (f). The Arabic numerals in parentheses (1), (2), etc., refer to the paragraphs in special instructions for the preparation of the section of the report (Form 86a, 86b, or 86c) in which the details of the preparation are covered.

(f) TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS.—Telegraphic reports will be rendered only when specifically required or in emergency. Such reports will be forwarded in code and will comprise the data on all items on the report marked with an asterisk. Capitals (A), (B), etc., (immediately preceding or following the headings), will be used as code letters to designate the headings. In addition to the telegram, all sections of the consolidated report (86a, 86b, 86c, etc.) will be forwarded by mail as provided for in paragraph (d). (Par. 2f, AR 40-1080.)

II

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THIRD SECTION, STATISTICAL REPORT (FORM 86c)

The numbers preceding the following paragraphs correspond with and relate to the numbers appearing on the face of this form.

(1) In a theater of operations the numerical designation of the unit only will be given. In the Zone of the Interior complete identification of unit by name and place will be made.

(2) Indicate specifically month, day, and year. Do not use figures to indicate month. In telegraphic reports omit the year.

(3) Mean strength is obtained by adding daily strength of command (officers, sergeants, and enlisted men) for each day for the period, and dividing the total by the number of days in the period.

(NOTE—Discharged soldiers or other civilians will not be included in this strength.)

(4) State number of civilians employed and paid out of Medical Department funds (sanitary, reconstruction aid, etc.).

(5) Personnel, other than Medical Department, attached to the Medical Department for duty.

(6) Report other statistical data pertaining to personnel and transportation as called for by higher authority and other items or notes bearing on subjects which in the opinion of the officer reporting should be communicated to such authority.

(7) In each column insert both the number *hundred* in parentheses, and the *correct* control of the *actual* column or columns marked (7) to show that an entry has not been overlooked.

Example: Ambulances, motor 3 (8) 1 (8) 4 (8)

This means that there are 12 ambulances at the station, only 4 of which are being used by the Medical Department.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ALL SECTIONS OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT (FORMS 85a, 85b, 85c, ETC.)

(a) **PLAN AND PURPOSE OF THE REPORT.**—The Statistical Report comprises several sections in each of which is incorporated specific information required by the various divisions of The Surgeon General's Office and the office of the Chief Surgeon in a theater of operations. The sections are designed to furnish the following information: First and other statistical data, including sick, injured, and battle casualties, hospitalization, and other statistical data; second section (Form 85b), movement of communicable diseases; and third section (Form 85a), status of Medical Department personnel, other personnel attached to the Medical Department for duty, and transportation and material available for utilization by the Medical Department. The third section relates solely to Medical Department personnel, or personnel attached thereto; while the other sections (first and second sections) include statistical data covering the entire command of which the Medical Department unit forms an integral part. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their rendition arises. (Para. 2a and 2b, AR 40-1080.)

(b) **BY WHOM RENDERED.**—All Medical Department units will render this report. In time of peace separate reports will be rendered for each character of training unit. (Par. 2c, AR 40-1080.)

(c) **TIME INTERVAL FOR RENDERING.**—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the morning report for Saturday, and the third section as of the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Par. 2d, AR 40-1080.)

(d) **CHANNELS THROUGH WHICH RENDERED.**—In time of peace, and in the Zone of the Interior in time of war, the statistical report will be made in triplicate: one carbon copy forwarded direct to The Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the corps area or department surgeon; and the second carbon copy retained; except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Par. 2e (1), AR 40-1080.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the forces, the original through medical channels to such intermediate administrative office as may exist, and the second carbon copy retained; except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Par. 2e (2), AR 40-1080.)

(e) **EXPLANATION OF SPECIAL SYMBOLS.**—The purpose of the capitals in parentheses (A), (B), etc., and of the asterisks (*) is explained in paragraph (f). The Arabic numerals in parentheses (1), (2), etc., refer to the paragraphs in special instructions for the preparation of the section of the report (Form 85a, 85b, or 85c) in which the details of the preparation are covered.

(f) **TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS.**—Telegraphic reports will be rendered only when specifically required or in emergency. Such reports will be forwarded in code and will comprise the data on all items on the report marked with an asterisk. Capitals (A), (B), etc. (immediately preceding or following the heading), will be used as code letters to designate the headings. In addition to the telegram, all sections of the completed report (85a, 85b, 85c, etc.) will be forwarded by mail as provided for in paragraph (d). (Par. 2f, AR 40-1080.)

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THIRD SECTION, STATISTICAL REPORT (FORM 85c)

The numbers preceding the following paragraphs correspond with and relate to the numbers appearing on the face of this form.

(1) In a theater of operations the numerical designation of the unit only will be given. In the Zone of the Interior complete identification of unit by name and place will be made.

(2) Indicate specifically month, day, and year. Do not use figures to indicate month. Telegraphic reports omit the year.

(3) Mean strength is obtained by adding daily strength of command (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) for each day for the period, plus number of patients in hospital (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) not otherwise included in strength of command, each day for the period and dividing the sum by the number of days in the period.

(NOTE.—Discharged soldiers or other civilians will not be included in this strength.)

(4) State number of civilians employed and paid out of Medical Department funds (medical reconstruction aids, etc.).

(5) Personnel, other than Medical Department, attached to the Medical Department for duty.

(6) Report other statistical data pertaining to personnel and transportation as called for by higher authority and other items or notes bearing on subjects which in the opinion of the officer reporting should be communicated to such authority.

(7) In each column invert both the number being used by or under the direct control of the Medical Department and immediately thereafter, in parentheses, any additional number at the station, including those stored as a War Reserve. Zero will be used in the appropriate column or columns marked (7) to show that an entry has not been overlooked.

INSTRUCTIONS

I

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ALL SECTIONS OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT (FORMS 85a, 85b, 85c, ETC.) (9)

(6) **PLAN AND PURPOSE OF REPORT.**—The Statistical Report comprises several sections in each of which is incorporated specific information required by the various divisions of The Surgeon General's Office and the office of the Chief Surgeon in a theater of operations. The sections are designed to furnish the following information: First section (Form 85a), data concerning sick, injured, and battle casualties, hospitalization, and other statistical data; second section (Form 85b), movement of communicable diseases, and third section (Form 85c), status of Medical Department personnel, other personnel attached to the Medical Department for duty, and transportation and material sources available for utilization by the Medical Department. The third section relates solely to Medical Department personnel, or personnel attached thereto; while the other sections of the Medical Department used form an integral part. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their rendition arises. (Par. 2a and 2b, AR 40-1080.)

(7) **BY WHOM RENDERED.**—All Medical Department units will render this report. In time of peace separate reports will be rendered for each character of training unit. (Par. 2c, AR 40-1080.)

(8) **TIME INTERVAL FOR RENDERING.**—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the preceding report for Saturday, and the third section as of the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Par. 3d, AR 40-1080.)

(9) **CHANNELS THROUGH WHICH RENDERED.**—In time of peace, and in the Zone of the Interior in time of war, the statistical report will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to The Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the corps area or department surgeon; and the second carbon copy retained; except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Par. 2a (3), AR 40-1080.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the forces, the original through medical channels to such intermediate administrative offices as may exist, and the second carbon copy retained; except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Par. 2a (2), AR 40-1080.)

(10) **EXPLANATION OF SPECIAL SYMBOLS.**—The purpose of the capitals in parentheses (A), (B), etc., and of the asterisks (*) is explained in paragraph (7). The Arabic numerals in parentheses (1), (2), etc., refer to the paragraphs in special instructions for the preparation of the section of the report (Form 85a, 85b, or 85c) in which the details of the preparation are covered.

(11) **TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS.**—Telegraphic reports will be rendered only when specifically required or in emergency. Such reports will be forwarded in code and will comprise the data on all items on the report marked with an asterisk. Capitals (A), (B), etc. (immediately preceding or following the headings), will be used as code letters to designate the heading. In addition to the telegram, all sections of the completed report (85a, 85b, 85c, etc.) will be forwarded by mail as provided for in paragraph (4). (Par. 2b, AR 40-1080.)

II

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THIRD SECTION, STATISTICAL REPORT (FORM 85c)

The numbers preceding the following paragraphs correspond with and relate to the numbers appearing on the face of this form.

(1) In a theater of operations the numerical designation of the unit only will be given. In the Zone of the Interior complete identification of unit by name and place will be made.

(2) Indicate specifically month, day, and year. Do not use figures to indicate month. In telegraphic reports omit the year.

(3) Mean strength is obtained by adding daily strength of command officers, nurses, and enlisted men for each day for the period, plus number of patients in hospital (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) not otherwise included in strength of command, each day for the period and dividing the sum by the number of days in the period.

(NOTE.—Discharged soldiers or other civilians will not be included in this strength.)

(4) State number of civilians employed and paid out of Medical Department funds (Quartermaster, reconstruction site, etc.).

(5) Personnel, other than Medical Department, attached to the Medical Department for duty.

(6) Report other statistical data pertaining to personnel and transportation so called for by higher authority and other items or notes bearing on subjects which in the opinion of the officer reporting should be communicated to such authority.

(7) In each column insert both the number being used by or under the direct control of the Medical Department and immediately thereafter, in parentheses, any additional number at the station, including those stored at a War Reserve. Zeros will be used in the appropriate column or columns marked (7) to show that an entry has not been overlooked.
