GENERAL ORDER
NO.1

1. Effective April 28, 1942, the American Group, War Prisoners, Camp O'Donnell, will be reorganized as follows:

a. The American side of the camp is designated "The Whole American Group". Major General Edward J. King, Jr., has been designated as the Chief of the Whole American Group with the staff personally authorized. Brigadier General A. J. Funk is designated as Assistant Chief of the Whole American Group.

b. The American side is divided into two groups, designated as Group No. 1 (East side) and Group No. 2 (West Side.)

c. Major General George M. Parker is designated as the Chief of Group No. 1, with such assistants as have been previously authorized.

(1) Group No. 1 consists of four sub-groups with Chiefs as indicated:

Sub-Group #1. Brigadier General A. C. Wopride, Chief

Sub-Group #2. Brigadier General W. T. Brougner, Chief

Sub-Group #3. Brigadier General James R. Weaver, Chief

Sub-Group #4. Colonel Charles R. Gage, Chief

Each Sub-Group Chief is authorized two (2) assistants.

d. Major General Albert W. Jones is designated as the Chief of Group No. 2 with such assistants as have been previously authorized.

(1) Group No. 2 consists of three (3) sub-groups with Chief as indicated.

Sub-Group #1. Brigadier General Mason Lough, Chief

Sub-Group #2. Brigadier General Clifford Blumel

Sub-Group #3. Brigadier General Clinton A. Pierce

Each Sub-Group Chief is authorized two (2) assistants.

2. Each sub-group will be organized into occupational groups as required by the implementation of this Headquarters Order, dated April 28, 1942.

3. Each occupational group, so far as practicable, will consist of units of 100 men of each of the occupations listed from

"A" to "D". For example, the 1st engineering construction
all W.O.C.'s and privateers. This organization will be quartered
in units of 100 men each. As appropriate to the greatest extent
possible in housing for the, the officers of the group will be quar-
tered with in their group, or in some cases, possibly several occupa-
tions and professions may be quartered in the building.

4. One-half of 100 men will be in civilian clothes and quartered
to the present camp.

5. Three line officers, one W.O. group, one technical or pro-
fessional will be assigned to each unit for administration and dis-
cipipline purposes. One line officer will be assigned to super-
vise each four units.

6. Classification K will consist of all men not physically
qualified to perform the actual functions of their calling or pro-
fession or perform manual work.

7. Officers will be assigned according to their professions
and callings but will, at present, be quartered in separate build-
ings.

8. The reorganization will be completed and quarter assign-
ments made at the earliest possible moment and a report made to
the headquarters upon completion.

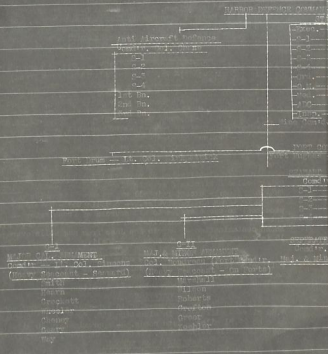

The following orders of the Commander of this concentration camp will be read and displayed to all American Prisoners of War: -

1. Each Building will be divided into approximately 10 men groups, with a leader for each.

In the event of any one escaping from the group, the group leader and remainder of the group will be shot to death. At the same time, the Platoon Commander and Assistant Platoon Commander will be severely punished.

If the missing man is a mental defective man, he only will be punished.

2. Each Group Headquarters will furnish this Headquarters a list of each group, its leader, not later than the evening roll call report of July 11, 1942.

The regulation mentioned above is not applicable to the hospital at the present time owing to difficult circumstances therein. Each group commander and Hospital officials will discuss among themselves the best system applicable to the hospital and present these ideas to the undersigned.

In view of these orders, it is sincerely desired by the Commander that all Prisoners of War cooperate, thereby protecting all from unfairness and trouble.

1. All prisoners of war, both Filipinos and Americans, must contribute, in any way, to the reconstruction of the New Philippines.

3. Under separate cover is a systematic plan of organization adopted by the Imperial Japanese Army which will serve as your model in creating your central system. The plan is advised to make the best idea possible which will be submitted tomorrow at 1:00 P.M.

4. Tomorrow at 1:00 o'clock we shall decide the organization of 2 in the Filipino and American prisoners.
