PATRIOTS OF THE PHILIPPINES:

Solion has a military commander ponetrated energy occupied shores with a greater potential of interior support than that which I today rely upon from the people of the Fhilippines.

It is a support whose strength is measured largely in value of the strict - an unconquarable spirit which displie the ordered of mer still remains unbroken and definat. Such a spirit, born of a desire and nurtured upon a determination to be free, inevitably everyhelms material force how-over rathlessly applied maintenes to its heights when the hour for liberation strikes. That how has struck!

It but remains to guide this great interior force to maximum utilization without exposing the people to undue and needless sacrifice.

I shall from time to time prosulgate ejecific instructions to guide your effort relying fully, however, upon your instate common sonse to gauge the limitation of your local action. Your general course of conduct should conform as far as practicable with the following concepts:

- Secure your families with such food as is available to you, as rapidly as possible at points away from wital enemy installations which our military forces shall consclosely attack with increasing wickness until destroys:
- Support the local commander whom I appoint over the area in which you reside or, if none is so appointed, the local leader of the resistance movement.
- 3. Avoid any sesistance to the energy, but to the contrary, her asses his increasantly, taking full enrange of every feworable opportunity to do so; harms his by disructing his measured communication and his essential linus; harms him by destroying his manitions, food, fuel, transport and other vital supplies; and harms him by outting does or subdaing him at every turn, to the out that he may know no rost or relaxation within your domunity that he energy soldier may escape the fate which incorrebly confronts all death or surrector.
- 4. To the people in areas for reserved from the zens of active operation, I comment a period of electness and preparation a period in which full advantage must be taken of foverable opportunities to strike decisive blows, but in which promisure or ill-considered action, if it be at the expense of needless less of life, is to be avoided.
- b. Above all, I call for unity among the people that unity as essential to the development of nations strongth at this critical time. Let the depth of your patrioties and your love of freedom rise above all differences, fractional quarrole, disputes and petty jealousies, that all patriots unflinchingly march shoulder towards a common disting.

The duration of the compeign and the human suffering which inevitably follows in the wake of war will be determined, in large measure, by the extent of your support. May God strongthen you to meet this test.

Mr. BELL. Mr. Speaker, pursuant to

the unanimous consent of the House granted today, I wish to insert herewith certain pronouncements and proclamations issued by Gen. Douglas MacArthur, commander in chief of the American Porces of Liberation in the Polilipoines, since he landed on the Island of Leyte on October 20, 1944.

Because of the importance of these statements as historical state papers, and because they reaffirm the policy of illuralism followed by the Congress in dealing with the Philippines, I feel they should be preserved as part of the permanent Rucous of the Congress.

Immediately upon landing, General MacArthur directed the following proclamation to the people of the Philippines:

MHERRAS, military necessity requires that such persons be removed from any opportunity to the atom the occurity of our military forces or the success of our military operations.

NOW THEREFORE, I, howehas the mittur, General of the Army, United States Army, as Generaler in the fourtheast Prefrie Area, hereby do publish and doctor in the being purpose to remove such persons, when opposited a, from any resistion of political and economic influence in the inilipines and to hold them in restraint for the duration of the war; whereafter I shall release then to the Publication Covernment for its judgment upon their respective eness.

WERRAS, it is opportial that the financial and monetary expecture of the Commonwealth of the Philippines be meintained on a sound basis.

NOW, HIGHERORS, I SERGIO OVERLE, Precident of the Delitypines, by wirther of the owner world in an by the Constitution and the Leave of the Communical th of the Poilinghes, so hereby promises the following rules and regulations concerning unrount, books and accounts and dobt moretaring for all erose free free seemy companion and country that throughout the Philimeter.

I. CURRENCY

- 1. The new Victory Series of Philippine Treasury Certificates (Victory Power) and the Philippine coins identical to pre-war iccues now in circulation will be legal tendor.
- 2. All pre-ter Philippine Treasury Certificate, and coins will continue to be logal tender and may be exchanged at par for the Victory Poses if so desired by the holders.
- 3. The rate of exchange will be two Victory Pesos for one United States dollar. Transactions at any other rate are prohibited.
- 4. For each province liberated from the energy, an heavy-one corresponding out to appoint by the United States Army and the Commonwealth Government to during, invaring to an report the bone-fide energeony currentees issued by full authorized current boards. The Committee will securate in the extent of the authorize given to such boards, the account of energeony currency actually printed and issued, and will recommend as seen as possible the redemption of the currentees round to be girlly issued. 6. Japanese currency, Philippine National Bank Notes (except duty authorized emergency issues), Notes or the Bank of the Philippine Islands, New Central Bank Notes and unauthorized emergency currencies are not legal tender. Transactions in these currencies are prohibited.

11. RANKS TREASURIES AND OTHER ACCOUNTABLE OFFICERS

- 1. The books of banks, their branches and agencies in the provisions, provisions, ofty and municipal treasuries and other soverment accountable officers will be sacled forthwith and exist age excent frozen, so of the date the province, sity, or number half y is liberated from enemy occupation and control, pending further action by the Government. All books, accounts and previous records as closed shall become insetting filed and preserved for reference and other surposes see may be required.
- 2. Provincial and municipal treasurers and other accountable offices are duly reconstituted, observing strictly the existing accounting laws, rules and regulations pertaining to eccounte and accounting system of the Commonwealth of the Philiptimes.
- 3. Provincial tresumers will ecopt for andekeeping rew savings deposite in pre-mar Philippine Treasury Certificates and Victory Pesos. Withdrawnle in each only of not less than one peep may be made from each carlings account upon pre-catation of the deposit book. No instructor will accrue on succe deposit. In nadition to opening new savings accounts, provincial treasuries will provide incilities for exchanging United States deliar for Victory Pesos.

III. DEBT MORATORIUM

Payment of all date and other monotary obligations controcted after Docember 33, 1941, oxeopt dates and other monetary obligations entered into in any erea after designation by Executive Order that such area has been freed from enemy occupation and control, to temporarily suspended pending action by the Commenceth the Government.
