
TOTAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPE

18 September 1944

Subject: AMERICAN CASUALITIES IN COTABATO RAID

To: Commanding Officer 106th Division, USPIF

- The two American casualties during the Allied raid on Gotabato on Sunday morning, 10 September 1944, were Lt. Odia Mokee Davidson (300-93-73 USN), Filot, and Lt. James Everett (32095 USN).
- 2. Their plane, No. 1806, probably an "avenue", leading four others, dived after a Augenese air-themsport (MOFST) which tried to take off the airfield and literally "fed the enemy with beads and bullets" at any-length to use the More description of their bravery. The plane evashed to the ground and burnt from a very low attitude. Everett plunged head first to the ground, while Davidson, pillet remained in the plane. There is a belief, nowway, that Davidson tried to go out of the plane too, judging from the flat that the legs were out.
- 3. A0 Sama Ahad of our "0" company, as well as others, arrived at the aome of the disasters at shoot five o'clock in the afternoon on the day of the reid. He and his companions found the wreak still burning and machine gum entradies expleding, and managed to get the identifications of the two dead officers despite the damper. A0 Sama had also removed the despite of Le. Byerrett from the pursuing rice meaters away and buried it. The remains of LE braidion could not be recoved from the burning plane, but whatever in lett could be retrigued.
- 4. Below is a sketch showing the locations of the remains of Lieutenants Everett and Davidson:



5. Japanese officers and Dawa Sinsuat were shead of our men. I hear that several items, such as a scaline gun, a watch, a militery notolock, parachute, otc., were taken by Duma Sinsurt. Duma has also the pistol, a 38-callber Saith and Wesson, of Lieutenant Everett.

6. At Sema Ibad has been assigned by me to take charge of the graves of the two dead officers
