

- A. The following history of the Hqs Det, Dept of Northern Luson PC has been deduced from a special study conducted on twelve Hqs Det, Dept of NL cases:
 - At the outbreak of the war, the Hqs Det, Dept of NL PC was stationed at San Fernando, La Union. CO of the unit was Dept Inspector of NL PC, Col James A. Green with Cart. Romulo Hanriquez as Ex-Off.
 - It is alleged by all except Col Green and one Epifanio C. Fedua, that they were automatically inducted together with the entire FC on 17 Dec (1 by wirtue of Office Hemorradium 4233 (copy attached) did 6 Oct 45. This emercandum invokes for its authority, (1), per 6, par 14 Micte on the Philippina Anway, 1941 1942, prepared by the Philippina Research and Information Section, Advance Schelon, USAITE, APP 501, dtd 25 Jan 45, and (2), par 1, Letter He, USAITE, dtd 12 Dec 44, File AG 322 dtd 12 Dec 1944, FEFA, Subj: "Status of Philippina Constabulary."
 - ULAFFE on the status of the FC has been erroseously construed as applying to FHE-WALE Constabulary, whereas in fact th applied only to liberation period constabulary units which had been or were being reactivated. This letter cannot in any sense be applied to <u>Prewar</u> Constabulary units.
 - It has been determined by this Headquarters that the above meanrandum does not constitute valid proof of an automatic induction of the PG on 17 Dec 41. The following prove that there was no automatic induction of the Dept of NL PG nor of the whole PG on 17 Dec 41:
 - (1) Affidavit of Col Green dtd 18 Sep 45 (copy attached) indicates that on 2T Feb 42 he received radio instructions from Gen Francisco "thru Col Warner, to have all of the Constabulary in the Dept Morthern Lagon inducted into the USATFS." No such instructions would have been released on that date if a prior induction of the entire PC had already been made.
 - (2) Gol Green in an affidavit dtd 3 Jan 46 (copy attached) alleges induction on 10 Mar 42 by Gol Warner. This allegation is substantiated by a statement of Col. Everett Lauman Warner

in his Certified Report, 14th Inf PA (See Historical Data of the 14th Inf, AUS). It would be illogical then for men under his (Green's) command to be inducted shead of him.

(3) Recent studies on three FC units in Negros island and one unit in Apayao revealed that FC units determined to have bonefide USAFFE status were not inducted on one particular date.

It is a common allogation of these cases that the Detachment failed to reach Bataan due to instructions from higher headquarters to stay in their posts and maintain peace and order and that in case of invasion smooths take to the hills.

Due to enemy activity after the initial enemy landings in Northern Luson, the Detachment was kept constantly moving from one place to another. Members of the Det alleged to have moved from San Fernando, La Union to Trinidad, Benguet, to Bontoe, to Banaue and to Kiangan.

During Mar 42, Gols Horan and Green issued instructions that "sall parsonnel of the Fhilippine Constabulary has been ordered to the service of the USATES" and that "the primary function of the FO will continue to be the preservation of law and order" (See attached photostate comy of these instructions).

Note: Although this communication is undated, it has been determined that it was issued sometime in Mar 42 based on affidavit of Euseblo Vivar, JO, lat Abra GD FG, dtd 24 Dec 45. Gee history of 1st Abra GO FG).

Most of the members allege to have been separated from the main group on different dates during the period Feb 42 to 5 June 42, date (latter) when CO Col James A. Green surrendered on orders from Gen. Wainwright.

Two members of the Det, Padua, Epifanio C. and Lubrin, Jose A., allege to have joined the 14th and 121st Inf Regts, respectively, before the official termination of the beleaguered period for USAFFE.

B. A thorough search of all available archives for the Hqs Det, Dept of NL PC made at Archives Sec, Records Branch and at Project "J" revealed:

- That there are no records for this unit at Archives Sec;
- (2) That the following record appears in Project "J" for Lt Col. Warner, alleged inducting officer of Col Green:
 - a. Everett L. Warner Capt 0125572 Hgs Etry, 2d Bn, 88th FA. KIA 15 Dec AL.
- (3) That the following information pertaining to Lt Col Everett L. Warner appears in his certified report on the Lith Inf, incorporated in the Historical Data Lith Inf, AUS, at Records Branch:
 - a. 11. Nov 41 Reported for daty to 60 Col John Horen, 43d 10f (E3) at Camp John Hay. Designated Intelligence Officer, Provost Marchall, Investigating Officer, Summary Court, Surveyying Officer, Post Library, Enterinment and Recreation and Officer In Charge, Salisted Mon'es Doratbry,
 - b. 11 Dec 41 Promoted Major, FA; accepted Dec 17.
 - c. 26 Dec 41 Instructed by Horan to "preceed me (Horan) over the trails to the east and let me know if National Road #5 is free of Jap troops and clear to the south ..."
 - d. In compliance with Gol Horants orders, proceeded south to Nueva Viscaya. At Artico, Nueva Viscaya found remanate of PA units unable to join their main lines to Batsan. Used this personnel to form the nucleus of the lat Provisional Guarrilla Regisent, Inter designated the LACh in Regt, which he, together with LACh in Regt, shich he, together with Hinton (AUS) and capt Guillermo Batar (PA), organized.
 - e. 13 Feb 42 Accepted promotion to Lt. Col, PA.
 - 19 Jun 42 Surrendered on orders of Gen. Wainwright thru Lt Col Kalakuka,



to Col Yoshisawa, GO, 142d Inf at Echague, Isabela.

- G. From the above facts and findings the following conclusions have been drawn:
 - The Hqs Det, Dept of Northern Luzon PC was stationed at San Fernando, La Union at the outbreak of the war.
 - The Detachment was under Col. James A. Green, Dept of NL Inspector, as CO and Capt. Romulo Manriquez as Ex O.
 - Due to enemy activity after the initial landings, the Detachment constantly moved from one place to another.
 - 4. Two members joined the 14th and 121st Inf Regts before 6 May 42.
 - The rest of the members were separated from the main group on different dates during the period Feb 42 to 5 Jun 42.
 - The Detachment was not inducted into the USAFFE on 17 Dec 41 nor was it ever inducted on a subsequent date.
 - 7. Members of the Det who joined the 14th and 121st 1nf Regts or any other USAFFS unt the store of May 42 must, in order to be accorded postdive USAFFS status, meet the requirements set forth in Sec III, Vets Branch Adjudication Policy, as changed by Sec I, Branch Memorandum No. 3 tdd 3 Peb 1

That at the outbreak of the war with Japan, I was Frowthodial Inspector of the Constabilary with station at Dumagnets, Negros Ordental On or about because 4, 1924, in addition to my other duties, I was assigned as Executive Officer of Negros Sector, URAFFE, with station at is Carlots, Negros Occidental.

- TO : Commanding General, Sixth Army.

 Services of Supply.
- 1. The Fhilippine Constabulary is a military force, a component of the Fhilippine Army, charged primarily with the enforcement of the laws of the Fhilippine Commonwealth and with the maintenance of order. Its units and personnel are in the service of the United States Army Forces in the Far East.
- Units of the Fhilippine Constabulary are being reactivated by orders issued by Headquarters Philippine Army after approval by this headquarters.
- Members of the Philippine Constabulary will wear the United States Army uniform with a red-bordered khaki shoulder patch with "Constabulary" in red letters.
- h. These new "hilippine Constabulary units must not be confused with so-called "Fhilippine Constabulary" or "Bureau of Constabulary" units or, anised by the Japanese or by puppet governmental agencies under Japanese confusol. Such units have no official status. Individuals who were members of such units will not be included in Philippine Constabulary units.
- 5. In operational areas, Bhilippine Constabilary units will be assigned by this headquarters to the operational control of United States Army commands. It is desired that they be employed primarily in civil law enforcesont, cooperating with civil powemmental authorities. They may be assigned such other military police duties as may be practicable, this will be supplied and provided secical service by the command haying operational control. Personnel administration will be through Philippine Army charmels.
- 6. Units initially organized will be companies of a strength of 5 officers and 112 enlisted men. Two companies, one at Tacloban and one at Dulag have been organized and are being brought to authorized strength as personnel and equipment become available.
