20th Dec - This time I gained 2 kilos, I now weigh 71.5 kilos. Not so Bad. Air Reids continue, we are being raided to or three times a day. Most of the raids are now at night, his area is now being left slone. Why? Here's hoping it stays that way. Wallie Hewston and are "Bunking up" During the cold weather, the weather is now darn cold, ice every morning, not so good. Food remains about the same, we now get rice 3 times a day. How much longer that will last is a problem. No news, everything seems to be about the same. 23rd Dec. - Two more days to Christmas, somehow or other I expect this to be our best X'mas, for one thing we have 714 Red Cross packages in camp. Enough for 3 to one man, our camp has 238 men in it at present. I man is in the hospitel in Tokyo. A Dutchman. A far cry from the conditions which existed two years ago, this winter we won't have any fires in the berracks, just the same as last year, so what we don't have we won't miss.

On Dec. 21st - The Japanese Civilians in camp pulled a surprise "snakedown" However they only found "Contraband" in the possession of the Dutchman, nothing on us "Yanks". And did they find plenty. "Fish on, Coconut oil; Alcoho, Potatoes, onions, leather, stones, magazines, and all sorts of things, the "strafing", was severe a few of the Dutchman had faces like numpking, WE "Americans" were lucky, but this morning one lad went down to the "Bennoo" before roll call was caught, and was "strafed" by one of the "Japs" with a G.T. belt. Dann rought, too yesterday 35 bags of sweet potatoes came in, so maybe we go back on potatoes for breakfast. They're darm g.od, but insufficient for a meal.

Last wight some more mail came in, again I was left out. I have t heard from home since Feb. 11th, I wonder if everyone is OK. Gosh, I hope nothing

has happened to anyone.

On Christmas Day we are going to have shother Gale occasion, dancing, skits, stories, etc. I'm to conduct a church service again. Dec. 26th. Meme's Birthday, here's hoping flow that I'm back home for your mext birthday. And I will be, make no bones about that. Yesterday was Christmas, and I do believe that it was the bast Christmes we've had in Japan, each man received a "Red Cross" Food Package, which was mighty fine. And from the Janamase 16 oranges, siso a good real from the hitches, Vesterday we had a small loaf of bread issued, the first for almost a year, it went very well with a can of meat.

our K'mas show as a big success, My act was given the prize, (2 dozen oranges, 4 pks. cigarettes) anyway we got the biggest laughs, I barrowed a cape and made a tall hat for my part, and "Krita" really looked like a bum. Not a bad performance, even if I do say it. I can't figure out why I haven't been receiving any mail. Of course I'm not the only one, but really I'm puzzled. On Christmas Eve the boys came over again, and did they drop a load. However, they took a day off yesterday and so to-day I expect an alert. Today I'm resting in our "Yesume" shack, I don't feel too good, I have a had cold and it has scatled in my stormachw which makes me feel poorly. Well, Mema, next year mill find us all back together again, so you and Dad have got to keep yourselves well. Buddy is OK, of that I'm sure, and I know that he too is looking for this darn wer to end. Doneld will soon have snother bir

day, he must now be a big boy, Wait until I got back, will we have fun. I forgot to mention it, but our barracks were decorated for Christmas tree, and all sorts of drawing etc. adorned the walls, streamers made from paper were strong from the ceiling, all in all the place looks very, very, nice, And now, we are sweating out New Years Day. Perhaps another Box, too, Jan. 6.1h - I havn't written in this book for quite sometime, things have been mighty quite, that is in so fer as the war is concerned. No news of any sort. Air Raids conimus, we are alerted a couple of times a day. Last night the "Anti-Air-Craft" shouted loud and often, one raid at 9:0'clock, another one at 7:00 O'clock this morning. I hope that we continue to be lucky and nothing is dropped on us.

We received a nother "Red Cross" food package on New Years Day, mine is all come, except for some soup andgum. We wrote another card home, I hope my people are getting some mail from me, I havn't been receiving any mail. Such luck. Ffood is about the seme, not any more than usual. Last night each man

was issued another blanket, we certainly needed one too.

Yesterday a traveling "troupe" of Japanese actors players at Shows Denko", not bed ather. We had a very easy worked. I've had trouble with my

left ear, very, very, painful.

Jan 11th - Today I've been in bed all day, another day off, This pleases me very much, lest night we were weighed again, this time I gained, due perhaps to the "Red Cross" Box, more & more, bigger boxes I my.

Our boys are in my better shape now, that at any time, since we're been here, the Dutch, however are not doing so good, many are sick, and a lot of them are slive with "Cooties," So many in fact that they are bring sent

The men in that in that camp moved north yesterday. We here in this camp are also scheduled to moved; any day now. Two alerts today. No local raids tho.

I havn't received any mail for quite a while, I don't know when I shall received any either. "Kritzon" and are running a shee repair shop at Shewa Denkog on the detail I'm work "Homeho" (boss) So instead of working "Kritz and I" repair shoes for the different "Mips" who work on the same detail (D' Ryusru) we st 10 to 15 cimrottes for each pair that we fix, today we made 40 cigarettes, not all bad, considering that 5 cigarettes can puronase a ration of rice; cigarettes seal for I yen each, really expensive, However, you cannot buy snything except eigerettes, so the money is partically worthless. I've had a headache for 3 days, can't figure it out, I'm eating OK. Regular etc. Maybe I'm just tired of Japan. "Europe is finished, how much

longer before we go home? Mey 17th, - 3 years ago today I turned in and surrendered myself and the rest of ; my air corp group to the "apanese in "Nesipet". Quite a long while are. Yesterday & Americans came into the camp for some rae, they were shabby, tired looking, hungay and what a tale they told, really herrible. The are in a camp west of us, their total strength, 160 men, Mostly Dutch and English, the Englisht prisoners come from "Thailand" where tis said 30,000 prisoners died mostly from "Colere and Dysontery", they came here last Saptember, and have suffered rough treatment, I man was beaten to death, another was killed (burned) during the big raid that we had a month ago. They've been with out rice for a month, all they have had to eat was "onion soup" their comp was destroyed, everything burned, even their clothing, all they have how are the things they stand up in. Many more things were said which I can't write

"o moving rumors today. No other news, Cur Shoe reparing business care o an end today the "Boss" is siraid of the "Military Folice"----hwe taken over the plant, and are they big dealers, cigarettes cost 1 year shoes, boots etc. There is going to be trouble, I can see it coming. May 22nd - Two years ago today the "Dutcy" party errived. 15 Butchmen have died during the time, much has happened more than I could possibily record. Today it has rained considerably and it is darm cold. On the 20th I had a day off, played cards all day, Lost about 50 digarattes, easy come, easy co.

A lot of new books came in, a line has formed for the issue, I'm not even going to try to get one. Doctor Kauffmon has been lecturing on "samplogy" What a subject for a POW Camps we have had a couple of cases of perversion already, I wonder what his (Doc's) idea is? Educe tional or what?

We've been routed out of bed 3 detail, however, I don't intend to fight any fires, let the place burn, Our side stable then so why should we try to get then out. To 7:00 pm. by 2000 planes, it looks as though the big pash is how on . Here's horing. Since we've been here we have no two shots for digtheris, and is my

arm sore. I am now down to 68.4 kilos, a hew low, however even the boys who have been here for 22 years. Lost, so I don't feel so bad.

Fleas have come out the past few days, almost ad bad as "Kowasaki". The camp library has some good books, but are hard to get. Most of the books are biographies. July 20th - What a hectic a days. On the 17th at 11:001M,13 cruisers and

otherships of the line shelled us. It was reining "Blue Blazes" and again I hit the "Fox Hole" believem me I did ht expect to come through that one. The shelling was a complete success, we havent been to work since on the 18th we were again strafed, by P51's & FGF's, they also dropped borbs about 50 vards from us. They were ster transportation and were after a couple of trucks which were on the road right by our camp. We could'nt get out of the building if we were seen our Boys" would nt know whether we are "Nips" or not. Lest right we were eggin underfire, and the whole area with the exception of the upper end of the welley, where we live, was completely destroyed. It's awful, women and kids are simlessly walking around, going up and down the highway. These people had better "Pack" in soon. Today we also want down to the factory to work, cleaning up. At 8:45 am one (1) lone B-29 making a routine reconscance, meing so many men working dropped a big bomb, about 500 lbs, on one of the buildings that had no burned, we were only about 50 yards away, fortunately we heard it coming and hit the ground, later on we went up into the hills that surround the factory ares. 5 Japanese were casualties, luckily non of us were look. Too close for comfort though

Food in this came is about the same as in our old camp, however, it is prepared a lot better. We no longer get breed, as our jover line is door.
