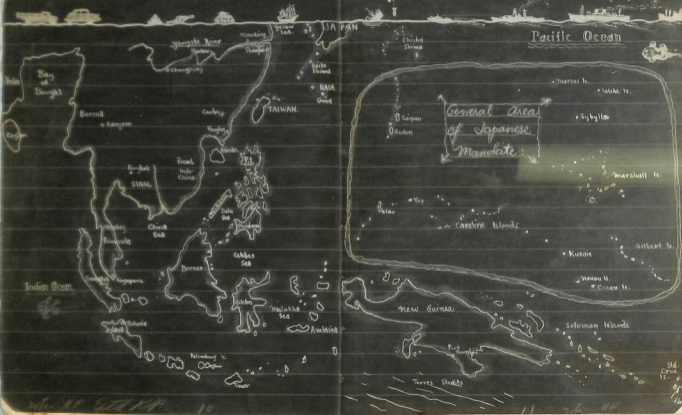

Map of the SW Pacific Area:

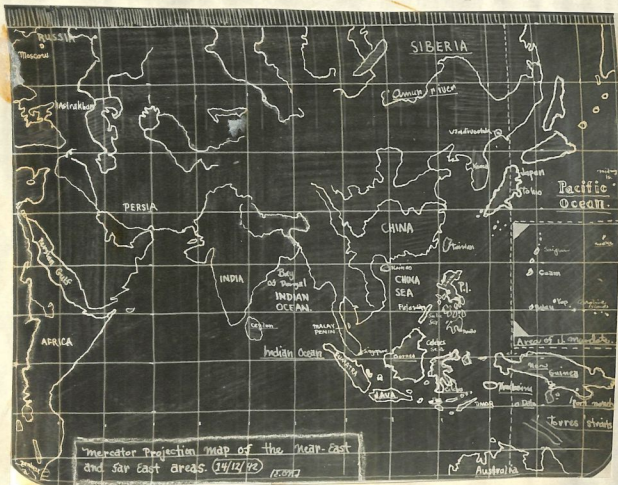

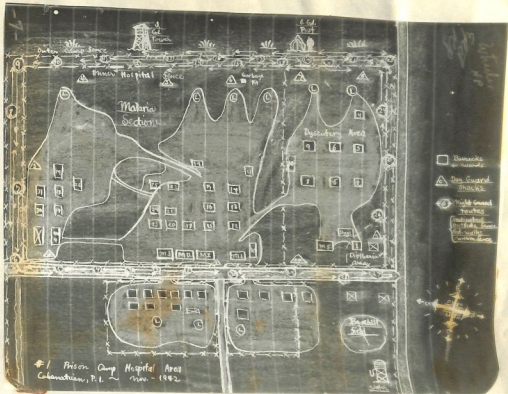




Mercator Projection map of the Near-East and Far East areas. (14/12/42) 13.072

Memorandum of instruction for: Colonel C. C. Helbock, P. H.,
 Chief Field Artillery

1. You will proceed at such time, or hours, as you deem necessary, but in time to arrive at our first force at daylight as an envoy of the Commanding General, Luzon Force, to the Commandant of the Japanese Japanese Forces of Cebu.
2. You will be accompanied by Major Maxence H. Huey, Jr. v.s. Infantry. When received by the Commandant of the Japanese force you will present my compliments and request a designation of an hour and place where I may meet the Japanese Commandant & discuss terms for the cessation of hostilities.
3. If the Japanese Commandant should decline to receive me you will ask him the terms under which he will accept the surrender of the Luzon Force on Cebu.
4. In discussing terms, it is desired that you mention specifically and seek full consideration of the following:
 - a. The large number of acid and unexploded in the last general hospital, particularly hospital, which is dangerously close to the area wherein artillery projectiles may be expected to fall if hostilities continued.
 - b. The fact that our forces are completely disorganized and that it will be quite difficult to assemble them. Their assembling and organizing of our own forces, necessary prior to their being shellshocked as prisoners of war, will necessarily take some time and can be accomplished by my own staff under my direction.
 - c. The physical condition of the command due to the long siege, during which they have been on short rations, which will make very difficult to move them great distances or fast.
 - d. In order to assist in this matter, I have issued orders directing the non-destruction of motor transportation as far as practicable, to permit the use of such transportation in assembling and delivering the personnel to our place as may be desired.
 - e. Request consideration for the vast numbers of civilians present at this time in Cebu, most of them now completely depleted in and whom we have not to find and feed.

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Case of. These people are in no way connected with
the Ambalco and Filipina forces and their presence
is simply incidental due to the circumstances under
which the Batuan force of hostility was precipitated.

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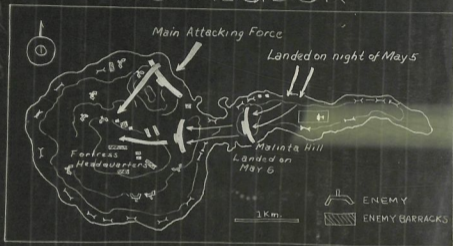

W. G. Ponce - Robert Stone Smith - July 24, 1952

Coast central rd. of group - orig. may have formed cone of lg. volcano. Whirlwind fascinated by structure - young basis for 1 of most recent legends in this section. He says - needs to begin only on land on sides of channel led to Chovía sea. N slope - foot of Mt. Moma. They - close by - a convent. *Sanctus antecamera* (S.A.) at Brown Upper Lippi & lower Lousaigia erected before the renaissance, the now famous gateway. Young from face on base of nun - escape for Mt. side.

Channel - living salt mound to Conita badlands. Main Maximilian & Juan get house for nearby village - try to mine across. Claims & presents. 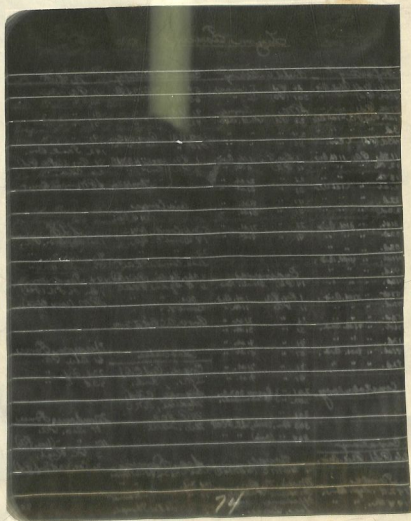

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(17) Prevalent Diseases in P. of H. Camp.

Disease, Signs, Cause, Treatment

1. Dysentery:

- a. Bacillary: Frequent bowel movements, mucus and blood in the stool, much loss of weight & extreme weakness. Fever, rapid, poor personal hygiene, contact/feces & carcasses. Alkaline mix. of sodium sulphate & sodium sulphate also; calcium oxide mix, also charcoal mix.
- b. Amoebic: Freq loose stools/liquid or no stool, extreme loss of body fluids, rapid loss in wt., extreme emaciation, blood in stool & finding of the amoebic organism (microscopic). Same as above plus SOB & tachypnoea (when available). Continue, Carbon zone and Yachtie, Slovansell.
- c. Extreme diarrhoea: Same as above w/o blood, mucus or specific organisms. Some plus adulterated foods & water or allergic to certain foods. Britany and physis, soft bland diet w/abstinence of sweets or roughage.

2. Malaria:

- a. tertiana: autumnal: chill & fever every other day.
- b. tertiana: (Very few cases here) chill & fever every other day.
- c. tertiana: chill & fever every 4 or 5 days.
- d. tertiana: any time / biliverdin & coma.
 Treatment for all types: Iodine, baro, iron, sulphate form & dihydrochloride, plasmaquin (very limited amt), sodium (lin. amt)

3. Anemias:

- a. Vitamin A: Night blindness, extreme watering of eyes, blurring of vision, inflammation of the supuration & cervical ulcers. Poultry, vegetables, eggs, Cod Liver oil.
- b. Vitamin B: D. Beri-Beri: Pain in joints & along long bones, swelling of lower extremities, extreme weakness & enlargement of the heart & paralysis of extremities. D. Pellagra: extreme pain along feet, legs & thighs, a mottled skin, rash on legs, scurvy, red face, diarrhoea & extreme weakness. 79

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3. Tricusitis: Pruritus & burning of toes & fingers and feet. Yell. thick, tickle teeth.
 4. Vitamin C: Scurvy - Extensive soreness of sides and tip of tongue including a part of columns of lips, bluish discoloration of gums, bleeding of gums (bleeding of) loosening of teeth, and actual falling out. Lemons, oranges, grapefruit.
 4. Oriental Scurvy (Yaws): (Bran. blisters) Pruritic burning, ulcerated, punched out sores, which is very resistant to all types of local medical acid treatments (of which it can be few). Specific organism. Central infection. Antimonials & gold. Spherotheca.
 5. Bergers Disease: Irregular high fever, intense toxic. nec. generally acute, enlargement of lymph glands and punctate red nose. Merguils. Aspirin. Quinine & Cold compresses.
 6. Yellow Jaundice: (acute catarrhal): Bore nausea, vomiting, loss of eat, yellow mucous membranes & skin. Infectious process that causes inflammation of bilious tract. Sugar, no fat.
 7. Hypoproteinaemia: (extreme lack of protein): Swelling of legs, mild brainy complications. (nephritic), fish, meat & eggs.
 8. Dalrymple: Very frequent excretion - eating large quantities of food. Lack of protein. Fish, eggs & meats, less water & salt.

I was told by Nip officers that their losses were 10-20 times more than they had started with/12,000 Troops and had lost 1/2. I am inclined to believe this in light of my observations. I was also told that the assault troops are independent units & were given looting privileges for deserting. A finger on a hand was cut off each Nip body to be presented & added sent to Generalissimo Chiang in Tokyo, dedication to soldiers killed in battle.

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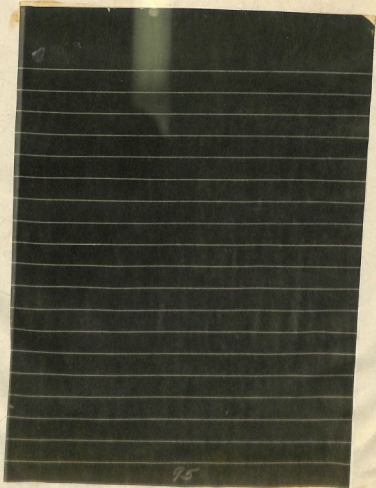
