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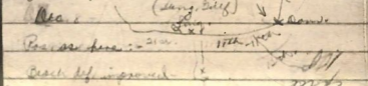

Evening of the 22d. Brig "H" found the 1st action to be  
a bloody slugging match & the 1st. Co. Co. engagement of  
the war. The City threw N. E. into the bloody m. &  
at ranges of fr. 400-500 yds & so the enemy with  
clearer sight & more men, as it was night & dark  
and it was M. D. to find effort in a close m. & fight  
fight. The enemy had approached to within 75 yds.  
fr. Brig. Co. & Co. food before they withdrew at about  
10:00 a. at which time the am. fr. was evacuated  
and about 1/3 of the City was dead or wounded &  
all combat vehicles were withdrawn successfully  
but 3 of the 4 half tracks were badly shot up.

The same night of 22d. & on the 23d. the next evening  
of the enemy in Lingayon Bay. Brig. Co. Jones  
Brig. & Company's ship left City. Me. Co. was able  
to find effectively beginning at dawn of the  
23d. in the evening & transport to and landing boats  
at Cavanay but were forced to withdraw when  
they found themselves w/o. Inf. sup. 3 time lost  
to enemy fire in this action. The am. I wrote  
to Bagley's where, cut off they were forced to  
destroy their gear & withdraw to Balite  
Place. In poor. They. Co. then they took over 2 days  
brought N. by May. J. at 10:30

The am. Co. lefts. fought some very effective  
withdrawal actions operating with our own  
tanks, with our Inf. or alone as opportunity  
offered. At Binolonan, Lt. Donder Lester with  
2 guns non-intern and back. He was killed  
and his gun destroyed but not till he  
had himself hit and damaged 2 in. base  
and succeeded and a M. D. shot. At Malabon  
Lt. Perovich waited for tanks to come  
up to a blown up bridge at night and

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and later in combat actions along with  
2046

a pair of Maj. Es. Bn, with some losses  
of the tank Co. (192d), checked the retreat of  
our forces at Tambo on Apr. 8th. Maj. Es.  
held his position until daylight of Apr. 9th,  
operating directly under orders of Gen.  
King and Lt. Col. Es. and Co. in Bn along  
with the rest of the Bn, all guns were destroyed.  
And the Bn disintegrated as did all other  
companies.

Summarizing the S.P.Ms. full extremely  
proud of their own role of F.A. and with  
tank 4 likes to quote Gen King's statement  
that in the world's view into Patton no  
weapons performed greater service or  
were more skillfully handled than the  
S.P.Ms. "That our Army's history shows  
together on the boys who began should per-  
form so creditably as to win commend-  
ations on all sides in a matter of weeks  
all can be proud."

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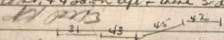

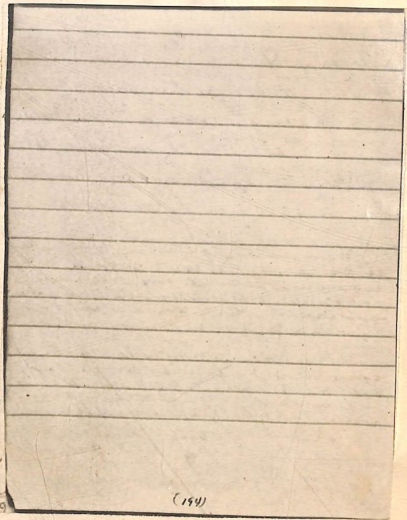

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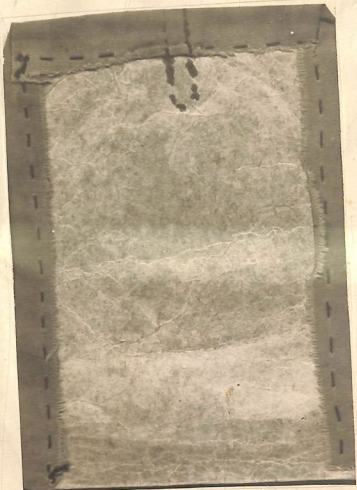
