Chief of Field Artillery.

1. You will proceed at such time or hour as you
deem necessary, but in time to ar. at your fr. lines at
daylight at an enemy of the Comdg. Gen., Major
Force, to the Comdg. of the Dep. J. Governor Batavia

2. You will be accom. by Maj. Marshall H. Hunt,
Jt. S. A. Inf. Then recd. by the Comdg. of the J. forces
you will present my compliments & request.

As designation of an hour and place where I may
meet the J. Comdg. & discuss terms for the ab-
sation of hostilities. *M. H. Hunt*

3. If the J. Comdg. should decline to acc. me
you will ask him the terms under which he
will accept the surr. of the J. Force on Sat.
& on discussing terms, it is desired that you
mention specifically and ask for consideration
of the following:

a. The lg. no. of sick & wounded in the 2
Gen. Hospitals, particularly Hosp. 1, which is
dangerously close to the J. lines, & which
projectiles may be expected to fall if host. continue.

b. The fact that our J. forces are somewhat
disorganized & that it will be quite difficult
to assemble them. This assembling and
organizing of our own forces, necessary prior
to their being delivered as prisoners of
war will necessarily take some time & can
be accomplished by my own staff under
my direction.

c. The physical condition of the command
due to the long sleep, during which they




