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Dec 8 - This morning has been spent not nothing but manning guns and standing by as yesterday the Japs bombed Hickel and Clark field - we were next who know - This afternoon 8,100's and I are enjoying our dinner and hear bombs ^{drumming} ~~drumming~~ - yep they are trying to ~~the~~ ^{date} and locate the Naval base all guns are ready but the drivers ^{very} turn around ^{very} back the other way. But one did not move & now and got it.

Dec 10 - This waiting and wondering when our turn will be - as northeast Luzon has been attacked by land troops. 80 Transports landed Troops there.

Dec 11 - This afternoon 1:30 Pavit is again bombed. (Pavit is only 20 miles from us) 27 planes with the big red sun After twenty minutes they swing into us. We are stamping around the plotting board watching the movement - Then ^a here they come - Our hour is here the public cannot be explained as we are not afraid or nervous but a little weak in the stomach. Capt. McMAHAN is gobbling and we watch. The motors are heard. Then our 3" guns go into action but still know

bombs fall - The planes are 20,000 feet up and flying in a long column to the west over North Channel - (B4+) The last plane is losing altitude and falls - "O" Battley has hit one - boy I'm glad that's over.

Dec 12 - This morning the ceiling is 1000 ft and too low for Planes (and thought) - 10:00 A They come over - Bomber first then Pursuits - about 50 B + 10 P - D We cannot see them but few many - They three always have to have a look - well the guns open up - but know hits this time - But one of our P's down two and men left the rest - so far so good old Mother Nature helped us out this time.

Dec 13 - This morning it has rained and know one expects a raid, so we all carry on; but at the dinner hour near end everyone is eating the air raid sounds again - it does fail just at meal time. So we all rush to the C.P. to carry on and hope if possible the may be our day-

(4) Ad 12:45 four flights of bombers (Heavy) start for Cavite and Nichols Field but form together and head for Ft Mills. The altitude is 3700 yds - some big jet. They pass between St Hughes and Ft Drum flying south - then they turn right back over Corregidor - this may be it - As they come in range the 5 guns open up. The four flights break up - one plane begins to lose altitude we have one - later we find out several others fall - the Heavy bombers are very hard to get out of action on the ground.

Misc.: - After bombing Cavite & Nichols Field the enemy planes flew toward Corregidor. When A.A. guns at Corregidor opened up, enemy planes split into two groups one flying off over the south channel and one over the north channel and Between area and it is believed that, and toward Ft. A.A. fire brought down one of these. The formation split so we would shot deeper. The Altitude is 12000 ft with cloud formations interfered with the enemy air action over Harbor. Separated during greater part of the day. The shots were almost correct in size and to last not in range found to be large M.V. as we thought the N.V.

(5) was 2830 but think it is near to 2725. A work about the sleeping we are located in the W.M.Y. powdered rooms - but there is 5 of basement and attal - which will stand 1000lb bombs - here today we have only 994 lbs. bombs. What few eggs the enemy dropped he landed in the sea with no damage. As a rule the raids only last long enough for the enemy to get out of all way.

Dec 14.

We expect the enemy about noon as many Obs. planes have tried to get us out - but we have not fired a shot as we want plenty of planes and not just one - A.A. unit that if we fire at all planes.


11:10 25 heavy bombers appear from the north east head to Corregidor to get us out - but we hold fire and the turn south between Ft. Hughes and Drum. Another group appear over Ft. Ward but they do not fire due to orders and 114 trouble. Not bad.

Dec 15. This marks the first week of war - as far as we have been on the law side - first the air force here is nothing. The

Japs have the run of the air.
 They have landed in several
 points and have one air base.
 The remainder of the remainder of our air force was
 knocked out the first day - which
 is night - but we are ~~now~~ forming
 habits which will help. At 12:16
 and 12:15 two flights of 27 were in
 view - one over Manila bay and
 one over Manila - the altitude
 is 6800 yds over Manila bay and
 the others are 24000 ft. over Cavite
 and doig their eggs. The last two
 days can be as - No Change.

Enemy still occupies Northern
 Luzon from Vigan to Agoo. Enemy
 has landed more to the south Legazpi
 Area. Enemy continues bombing
 attacks against our air fields.
 Alongapao was bombed. Three
 enemy planes dived on Ft. Went
 but dispersed quickly when
 Ft. Went opened fire. Enemy
 bombing operations were conducted
 at high altitudes and with much
 less accuracy than previous raids.
 Damage to our installations was
 very small. Enemy bombing planes
 had been severely shot down after

noon each day. The type of Bombers
 used was identified by H.A. as the
 "Mitsubishi" Heavy Bomber 98-page
 SI FM 30-38. Indications are that
 this bomber may be operating from bases
 in Formosa or Hainan. It's were
 scored on two enemy transports near
 Legazpi by our bombers. Our intercept
 or planes interfered to a great extent
 with enemy activities and although
 not confirmed several enemy bombers
 were believed to have been brought
 down. Enemy land operations in
 Northern Luzon and Southern Leyte
 may be only for the purpose of establishing
 land bases from which their bombing
 planes can operate. These locations
 will cover ship approaches to the
 Philippines on the North and South.
 Our flash system is as follows:

Dec 16. Another rainy morning with a very low ceiling which we do not expect the Japs to appear - but about 10:05 they again appear though we only see them once or twice as they never come down to look at us - so the rest of the day is spent in filling sand bags or cleaning the place up.

Dec 17. This morning I was on duty from 4 AM and about 1:15 AM the ship Corregidor ran into one of the Army's mines as the story goes this ship is one of the inter island ships but had about 1500 people trying to leave the Philippines to the northern islands. The captain did not ask the Navy to let him know or to locate the channel so he makes 2 mines but hits the third. These are new type, both contact and control which the Army was so wanted to test yet they work. The ship went down and it's minutes. In our figures the death ran very high. But the Japs did not come today as the ship was very low and almost

rained ~ From reports the last bombing the enemy did they used 1500 lbs bombs but our air force caused them to dump all eggs into the water so the fail to hit the marks. We still are wondering when they plan to drop the coal on us & boy they must have something ^{ONE} grand ~~ONE~~ in store for us. But the Germans on the run may cause the Japs to stop. Our remastered how is dinner in Tokioyo on July 4.

Dec 18. So Day has passed another day for Ft Mills as nothing happen. The Enemy is in North Luzon and has the extreme part and things are the same.

Dec 19. At 13:50 Two split flights came in North of Ft Mills, one splitting and bombing Cavite at 1400 lbs other split were high one anti aircraft only trying to get us out but we did not fire. Then at 12:30 Two flights were north of Corregidor with all 7000 yds. 9 planes in each flight, they circle us or the extreme south to east and Bombed Cavite at 12:45 P.

(10) Dec 20 - at 1230 several planes very high over Manila but one P-47 went down caused them to return into the clouds and we did not see any more of them.

Dec 21 -

This may be our second week of war and still we are holding in North Luzon - but Augie Uncle hasn't forgotten us. The only thing big attack was a few planes very high over Manila.

Dec 22 -

First of all 100 boatships reported at Lingayen Gulf of which 80 are troop ships - not so nice - but the Japanese troops used the 155's and found the Japs to be well drawn and take up landing at 8 loco which is north of Lingayen Gulf. One story which you can take or leave is, the Japs caught a car full of Philippine College School Girls and killed the driver. Then raped the girls - great things of war but may cause the natives to be hard to hold. There was one tank battle but reports were the enemy was held with many losses.

(11) As to air attacks we had three alarms. The first came in north of Corregidor very high but out of range of our 40's turned and bombed Cavite. The second came at 1342 which the boned Calabar air field killing 2 and wounding 1 of which one was a U.S.C.D. of course a piece of the bombs dropped in Corabon and its the old 11.5 Toms - the steel is cast iron with very sharp edges - one piece would cut your toe pieces. That - this was an alarm. We have a few funny moments as today Capt O'Toole reported to H.Q. Manila that a bomb was over Corregidor - and after great staring into the sky we found it and it was only a large star near the moon - the first star I have seen in the day light. The third alarm was at 1434 which turned out to be one Jap plane just taking a good look at things. Main purpose they havn't a ship that will reach it.

Dec 23. This morning we find that the Japs have 100,000 troops in Northern Luzon and the 1st division - no reports today as hasn't come but hope at 1 p.m. to high

commander at the Far east has vowed to Corregidor no things must be hot. Last night another plane went off and this morning bubbles are still coming to the tops so we hope another guy but pit the water. As I was in the Hospital getting my shot for tetanus, the air alarm went off again - we could hear the planes but can't see them. Again the bomb came & soon the place won't be there. From the USFFE says the forces are holding their own but the enemy had great air activity all day.

Dec 24. Just one more day until Xmas which got busy if I want to catch up with my men shopping. This morning all was clear but at 14:48 light - 2 motor Bombers came in our direction, but they turned just out of range of Corregidor and circled over Morvalle first time making a dive but not dropping their bombs, over our battery opened fire, but always short they circled again and dropped one bomb which made a direct hit on a 14x15 French

boat which caught on fire. The men went for their life boats as the plane circled again and machine gunned and drops about 1000 bombs on them. After this cleared only one life boat was left and it was upside down. The boats started picking up the hurt and dead like wool. At 1300 6-2 motor Bombers came down from the north at 19500 ft and circled and crossed Corregidor. We open fire and one plane was hit and fell, but no bombs were dropped. To night all the big ships from Manila came to the rock as McArthur, Flanily and the President of P. F. The island is full of tanks and B. C. This after noon O'Tool and I had two mugs up for dinner and then we all went to the hospital, boy the place is very lousy more like a mad house.

Dec 25 - yet this xmas and wet

- Today is a round up. Heavy fighting continues in Lingayen Gulf Area. Enemy has landed reinforcements. Enemy has started landing expectation's at Antimon and Tayabas. About 40 Transports reported in Zambo Bay area. Enemy bombed Manila Bay Area killing many but 3 P-39's came along and shot down all 8 of the enemy bombers.

Dec 25 - Many Xmas - rather nice, and one could not believe that it is half time as the sky is clear and so peaceful out there. More Troops came to 7 miles during the night and just wondering where we will pull them. We were hoping they wouldn't bomb. We slept at 120127-2 motor bombers came over but still out of range they did bomb one of the ships in the Manila bay, but they did not make a hit. The ship that was hit yesterday is still burning and has not sunk yet. This morning things looked very bad but I feel much better tonight.

Dec 26. Today has been just another day but not very much to worry about - all we did was just work and wait - no bombing.

Dec 27st still nothing - no bombing

Dec 28 - This morning the clouds are very low and should keep the plane off, but at 1455 - a great number planes came from the north - and after a total of 2:30 for endless numbers of planes came a total of about 34. And was the only one left to buy the C.P. I had to flat all the covers of the jeep seats. This was our first big raid - we did not know just what to do. About the middle of the raid we had two delayed jets over us - and found out later that it was 1000 lb bombs - but did not get them - lucky. But they hit our house and left nothing but just a bed. They did give us a one over hit lightly. In total we lost 5 men and about 11 hurt - but after a few hours we were back again. Our P-4's - gun brought down - 13 planes.

Dec 30 Jan 1 - The last few days nothing it was very clear and ~~not~~ Japs came - as something is black Manila fell today which puts only 30 miles of water between us and the Japs, bay I hope that a stops them. All the traps have been pushed back and guess the so called help is out of the question or we just dont know if they are even on their way. Guess the states have forgotten us and its only a matter of time until we fall into the hands of the Japs - It will be a very fast and dreadful battle and many men will be killed. We got one more Jap plane today - so far they have not used their flying but 96 ~~had~~ type bombers Korean made.

Jan 2

The sky is still very cloudy ~~but~~ ^{overcast} guess the Japs will come - And they did appear about 12:55 by flying out of the clouds - at 2:00 they cut their motors and dives at us, we didn't fear them and the bombs hit go - almost

caught the stuff - off guard. They dropped about 80 bombs weighing near 300 lbs each. We lost 3 men and one officer. From looks of things we won't last very long if this keeps up. They have been on down to two meals per day and very light bay we all are losing weight and I have not slept 140 which is a dog of 20 lbs - in 5 days - so many moronay I won't weight a thing. One thing today I received a telegram from Hattie which helped greatly - if I could only keep her from worrying - she is the greatest person I know and love her very muchly. Hope tomorrow will bring us good cheer as help etc.

Jan 3 - This was our day we all wish to forget but never can. This morning we prepared for the enemy by making more sand bag implacements around the C.P. - Then at 12:55 the first Jap formation of 9 came in sight and ended with a total of 3. They made several passes at us before letting their bombs go. The first

bomb that hit came near our C.P. and struck us up rather hard. Then on their second pass they really let us have both ends - we figure the bombs weight near 500 lbs. each. But the thing which caused them to go crazy was - first the lights went out - then we forgot the doors finding dark lights - the building rocked and flames came thru the doors. Then on top of that someone called G.H.S. - it was a cry of death if I have every heard one. If you have ~~never~~ faced death one will never know just how you can react - you heart speeds up about 200 times and you try to think but can't - the worse trouble I had was trying to find my gas mask - I couldnt find my gas mask - I couldnt find my gas mask - I couldnt find my gas mask but had to take them back later after we found out that the bombs hit one of the C.R. tanks near the C.P. and the gas comes ~~into~~ the door. We lost two no men but of Jap planes were shot down and they did come plenty of trouble. Tonight we are moving to the tunnel because we are afraid the C.P. won't take many more bombs.

It did feel good after we did get to bed near 2:00 P.M.

JAN 4

We all feel just a little soft now in the tunnel and as to whether the Japs came near to noon and dropped their eggs. The altitude was 24000 - 25000 feet and don't let anyone tell you that they can't hit their marks. They were after the water front and bombing led at very early. We had no deaths that last 6 plus for them and our air force of 5-140 brought down 3. The raids last about three hours. I still have my fingers crossed that help today come.

JAN 5 - Today was another air raid which only lasted a few minutes because the sky was clear and our AA fire in full hot clear days. They tried for the water front again as some of the bombs remain. They still came on near 24000' ft before bombing. One of the things we will find is they make several low runs over the island letting out a balloon for wind and direction before

dropping the eggs.

Jan 10 -

Another air raid at 12:55 which lasted 3½ hours - the total planes in air near 57. The sky was rather cloudy and they dived into them. The total planes downed was seven. The worse thing that happened was a cave in caused by the bombs, which killed 31 men. Rather bad there the 60th didn't have any death. This was one of worse raids we have had. The place was rather damaged. But not much hurt. We still can take it in more ways than one. The old tunnel rocked rather badly but we still are at.

Jan 7-10 -

They didn't give us anything these days but we wonder what's up. The days off is like Sunday on the farm - we had our first bath in one week - the food is light but enough to keep young. Calvert and I had the old hair cut we needed it too.

Jan 11 -

This ends our 5th and starts the 6th week of war with the Japs - So far we have been on the losing end; They have taken the Philippine Islands with little trouble in a few weeks. At the present, I think the Batasan area is the only holding of our forces, but now we must fight as this is our last stand.

There were several Ob planes both this morning and part of the evening. This is our third day of rest, ad guess that tomorrow they will give us the once over. Most of the light planes have been placed at Clark field and are getting ready for a last drive. The forces in Batasan have stopped the enemy for the present. Most of my day I was spent in sleeping. The only thing we do know is help should the here soon or there will be little to hope for. Things still look very dark and there one cards. The Navy and Air corps have just sat down and have done nothing or very little.

(22) Jan 12-13.

Still a very dull day as only
plane that came over were Ob's
and we didn't fire. The men are
in very high spirits. Those we are
wondering what the Japs have in
the hat - but it must be something
good. One thing that troubles
us most is the 5th Column who
rest on the rocks, and there is little
or nothing we can do. It's hard
and that's all - you can't trust
a person.

Jan 14-

The Japs started out early
this morning with the Ob's so,
we expect action - and it came
at 1255 about 23 planes came
over at altitude 8500 yds. mostly
98. The first 9 came over and
one plane was hit directly
and exploding out the second.
On the next 4ars they lost 2
more planes. They dropped bombs
on the first 4ars hitting the
island but doing very little
damage - those they have still
left them on the island where
they will stay. They still know
what and where to go.

It lasted only 1 hour. This
time the troops in Bataan have
quelled the Japs back. We
have found out that the Japs
are using Jap women to fight.
Jan 15 - to Jan 19.

The last few days have only been
a no target duty. There have been
plenty Ob's planes but no longer
graziers flying around. The
Japs left several Ob. planes from
AF fire or about 1/4nday. The
troops in Bataan are still
very busy. The Japs will
fall back drawing the USARV
troops in but at the same
time leaving a few Japs in
trees which fire at the officers.
But as a whole the Japs have
fared for the ground very
poorly. The Jap planes still
strike the bridge in day light.
as a rule the Japs make most
of their dives at night and
the planes strike during the
day. Our trooops are holding
very nicely but can't keep
it up. That helps should be
here in the week or else.

(24)

This morning the P-boats went out and sunk a supply ship off the west coast of Batabas. One P-boat was lost but one returned so guess the price was 60 - the we don't lose many. In dog fight this morning we lost one P-40 and the Japs lost one S., and another P-6 was shot down by ground fire. We hear all types of help coming but so far it has only been in the air. I wonder if help is comin. This war is alreadied turnt all but the bad bug which is having fun eatting on us. Bay of pepe the Japs are tired of this war so we are. From the reports we find the Japs are threatening the Philippines.

Jan 20

This day - has a few things. At 4:00 A.M. I was at the radio station to work signal plan. which did not appear, but did get 2 hours of sleep before then. The morning was only the regular duty with 2 or 3 Jap planes circling around. but none of that nothing.

This afternoon I received the news of Captain - not bad - only wish Narina could be here to enjoy it with me - enjoy it with a dash of ice cream. The plane flying was very lightly and guess it has lost 20 lbs or more - We still havent received any help - it better come or the Japs won't wait always.

Jan 21-29

As a great many things have happened but very little to this island. On the first of this period the Japs have still kept up the fight and costing them very heavily. One thing happens - 200 Japs landed on the east part of Batabas. They caused great trouble and thought he was mean - so left there. At first they just that they were dug in and had been there about 1 month. We were given them a load of 15 shells and killed about 3/4 of the Japs. On one night the P-40's stood up with 5 shells and dropped them in the open fields near there. It landed nearly four hours and gave the Japs time to get one over. Resulting many Americans. The first P-40 landed in George.

which was a great place to go to. We all felt sure that the States would give us the least help. I have no one who will give us gaso and today all the talk about fight on and you are putting up a grand battle. The boys in Butuan were shorter also and caught the Jeeps off guard. They made several dives but lost. Tonight I made the round and all four men are in the best of spirits. A few things about the Japs. First they keep getting through the lines and shoot only their men. They were a bit of green with leaves on their hot and sit in trees until someone comes along then "Bam". They speak very good English and trap many American Officers. We are now about twenty five miles from the front and can hear the 105's and see the bursts. It might rain tonight, full moon - may give my big ~~toot~~ set to be here enjoying a good time with Nanna Janet made an alarmist a few days ago and another 180 starting from 100%. May I do hope the island giving us a little help - it should be here by now.

Jan 30 -

This marks almost the end of this month yesterday was the end of two months of war. On the 6th - Today we find only another day - one sort came in another night from Australia with 3 M1s - for arm our which turned out to be only good for you sent was 1817 stuff and only 25 rounds of that stuff - soon some fun, but guess we can take it - This morning was very quite - nothing - the kids say we will be back in Manila by Feb 5 - will we be like Butuan and the rocks will be here. The boys in Davao are banting very hard and keep your fingers crossed they need it. This afternoon it is sleeping and dreaming what Hanna - Tonight Beam Crosby gave a program to the Philippines - slides rotten - almost the states wants realizing that we are fighting a war and not playing - we need help soon or else.

Jan 31 -

This marks the end of Jan - and not much can said - we are holding onto only a margin edge - our hopes are high and still continuing on outside help to stop us - soon - land or night wake - something each in our favor should happen.

This morning was spent in preparing the traps - it didn't rain until about noon so we had time to go up all the traps in the creek or about there. After noon I spent a few hours with Calvert watching the planes come in to Manila - we only had some planes that could go one and gone, then hell - it still kept planing & Calvert in the beginning said "I don't think that something will break - as he yet we still have had only the bad break. Tonight I heard fire on an advancement at the Japanese the main land all night long the result were of the best. - I hope so. We know the Japanese are starting up large amounts of new gear. They plan to stay. We know it will take for help somehow - This morning we always been my husband and say that the tide will change for the better.

Feb 1-

To day marks our first month of good luck - Today has really been a very little activity. The enemy last night started a drive on the western plains. An enemy plane crossed the river but did no damage.

The only thing which makes us tired is lack of sleep. I remain in bed until 2:00 and stay up several hours later just absolutely exhausted.

Feb 2 - Last night drive were stopped by our traps. They were ready for them. Our planes did plenty of damage and with the ground traps. This one was destroyed. After the morning duty I spent the remainder in bed. Hard to sleep as someone would get me up. Today the Col is sending a word of welcome to each officer's wife & to Capt. Hansen. Still is buying her chin-up - I hear a long anyone from them. Her it would be Hansen - someday I will give her a talk for all the hard work. Please cause she will tell all my heart. And I still trust in God that I and I will carry on in this world together. I feel sure that it isn't his will to separate us - (Help is half way over.)

Feb 3 - I was planning today - but the Japs are taking up right attack and we are under air raid. They better send help on the next two day or none at all - I guess the states are just going around as the red wings do. But I know we can't keep this up much longer.

Feb 3 -

Last night didn't develop into much but they had us worried. This morning about 10:00 we gave another air raid which developed the plane tried to drop a few fuses but all missed the island as our guns gave him a work out no hits - nothing until 1:00 when one of our batteries cracked open and started to smoke and go into the clouds. I sat on top of the hill with Calvert and we planned a trip to Lake Louise in Canada when the war was over. Also the radio was playing "I'll never smile again" which made me very home sick as Hanna did enjoy this piece very much, which brought back great thoughts. I still say I'm going back to Spain (Alto).

Feb 4 -

Last night we received a large numbers of AA shells from the subs by sub - this would really find welcome help we can say that has arrived. This was one of the large subs and from their account there was no fuses around. This morning my first took that of "Quiettie", I hit him but I felt much better this afternoon. Several numbers of fuses - ships in Manila last time.

Calif reports that 61 ships from Formosa are headed south - while well out there for about two days from here. The subs put out no subs to fight also that one can't believe them either. From reports of Japanese they don't want to fight, but there isn't much they can do - they are fighting only because they are ordered to. Good to fight after the first letter I wrote to Hanna - I hope it gets there - Well tomorrow is the 5th - I do hope we can soon hear from welcome help.

Feb 5

This day brought nothing as to something good the enemy was of little action and not much aerial activity. Just another day and no word from home.

Feb 6 -

This morning we were faced with a new problem. At 8:45 AM the enemy began to shell us from the sea land. First they fired at Grant, Drew, Newell and then at the island. Drew was hit several times knocking out the searchlight for good and damaging the guns. T.M. was hit many times.

(82) Not until about three hours later did our guns return fire - why? only the great heat forced us back as the fire was returned the Japs stopped. By then they had allways needed another place. Crossing was big but the fire was put out. The Engineers think the guns were 155's which the Japs picked up as the ranges they found from warhead 20,000 yds. At night we can see large numbers of tanks on the rubberland moving toward Haie which in my mind they plan an attack from the sky water. One of the tanks had a large gun which killed Capt White (one of the officers which came over in the boat with me) and hurt 7 other men. This afternoon Lt Brumba returned fire in about the same location of the Japs guns but everyone felt that it was a waste of time as we feel sure they were not in new position. He radio made a statement that the school children in the state were saving their money to buy 26 aeroplanes for General McArthur and the first to be named "City of

Washington" - now isn't this just too-coo-coo grand. Here death is knocking at our door and they are having the school children to do such things - sometimes I wonder? - The states will be saying remember McArthur wrote of remember the Alamo - someone better get their stuff hot and plenty fast or it will never soon. Just to guess - I think the Japs will try to U-boat from the mainland near Haie on Ft Mill also by sea and air driving us to Batavia then putting the fired dragon us from the 2nd story houses which I think won't work and why wait - We need planes badly which the states say we don't need - its too much newspaper talk which is playing us up instead of getting us the jump. The next truth

Feb 7.

This morning about 8:45 I went out to shave and was almost ready to wet my face when something whistled over head and bang - I hit the dent - the Japs are firing again. They paid all morning doing no damage but

waking it very unpleasant for everyone - The jeeps got tired and stopped of which we returned fire for about 6 rounds. This was great - (One M.P. had his foot shot off - and no damage to our material. This afternoon after a dinner of rubber fish I spent it with Colvert so we just slept. To night the jeeps are taking another landing on western side of Batuan also Lubcabin which may cause plenty of trouble. The states are putting out that the other marines have landed yet they did 1 month ago - 700 - What a great help - I can't figure out why some one didn't get wise - Feb 8 1942

Well this morning we were all ready to meet the shelling from the enemy, but they didn't fire. We may have caused a little damage yesterday tho our guns did give the shavers tho one over lightly. Nothing very new - the landing was just snubbed, partly which was met by an force, and stopped. Then this morning the navy lost one ship and 4 killed. This afternoon I found out that Paul Brown who

here so I found him and we had a long talk section - It's very good to see an old face - say that helps greatly. Well that's all - a large help some tomorrow Feb 9.

This was rather a day - of several things. This morning the enemy gave Ft. Hill the once over again but nothing was hurt - we returned fire with our fingers crossed in case that we hit something. It is the air set of our P-40's looking for the Japs. 3- Black last 6 Jap fighters came up. The dog fight lasted 10 minutes. Out flying that down 5 Japs. And the 6th landed behind the enemy lines which was destroyed at once by our Artillery (55-a).

Then we lost on P-40 - and the plane that brought him down missed judge and hit the mountain. On the return from the front it's a mere something one will never forget or can write about - parts of bodies laying all over dead Japs all over. Should say about 600 and the flies were passing field day. About half mile our forces were fighting not the enemy hand to hand. You could hear them crying - screaming

(6) for their lives and help. The machine gun fire was unbearable. trench mortars and projectiles were fire away - the soldier ~~was~~ cried out - bring me more projectiles to fill these yellow S. D.s - life is just as art here. know one goes to heaven - you wonder why all this killing because some of your buds die always safe place is trying to reach some crazy goal - There we are fighting - Lives being taken - Throats broken - minds broken - never to recover - men being thrown to the wind - Why - yes answer that question - I of a few so called big "Shots" could see only a small picture of war. They would not wait one minute before us help to stop this great machine - Don't think I for one minute ~~that~~ that the Japs don't have a good army - they are plenty smart and willing to fight until dead. They did I find one german officer in the group of Japs killed - he was wearing the German uniform.

Feb 10 -

Today not much - Spent the evening looking at the main land - We think we had found the jeep track out on the mainland - Received good news from home - You only know what the wife left about to do with us - the letters say "We are with you minor ~~now~~" - Great stuff - Breaks up -

Feb 11 -

Boy what a job to get up this morning to eat on pile of bread. When I get back full of my kind will but just too good for me. This afternoon about 1:30 we had our air raid in about two weeks - one bomb was dropped in the north channel. We had 3 gap heavy bombers and 3 dive bombers. Our guns did not hit a thing and the raid ended at 2:00 P.M. Our guns returned fire with the enemy batteries across the way - what damage is unknown. The enemy was active on all fronts - But at last the states find out that we are in great danger and need help - great stuff - here we thought they would realize a few things and now nothing ends are most meager of the

great fighting is on; they change
front all the time - help and
face a great damage. ~~then~~
some Japs - but still have
things in the general - it won't
be his fault if this time, fol-
lowed through, he is getting all he has
but there is something missing
somewhere - he was very smooth
from us the way - say they could
only get my hands on a few
and put them in my place.
I think things would be different.

Feb 17 -

This morning the Japs were
at Frank's the ones over lightly -
no damage to either guns or men.
This evening is same - nothing over
12" guns fired from here - One of
our batteries at Batasan shot down
two planes. One thing the English
fear especially is that we
are rest - and still the states
give us no help - damn it.

Feb 13

This day we should all stay in bed
but nothing happens - the Japs just
keep going and go and
nothing very much going.

Feb 19 - Well still not much happening
we all are wondering what and
when will they bombard.
I'm afraid its soon as we have
seen their boats just out of our
range coming near. Just keep
your fingers crossed.

Feb 19 - 18th

Well for the English gave up the
ship at Singapore - the reason
was out of water - so they blow
up their water supply but not the
oil or guns and see this for reason.
this puts us in a very ~~bad~~ position.
we all counted on that place holding -
so now we expect our turn to come
any day - nice - but to the same
old song the English never could
fight and always have to leave
someone else do their dirty work.
The Japs across the water have
killed us about six hours this
each day the last three. So far
only one man has been killed and
no damage to material. Its a very
funny feeling to be walking very
quietly around then buzz buzz -
bang - one shell over head - before
you realize it you're on the ground.

Not much we can write - the Japs have won all battles so far - the state keep saying we'll give them hell in 1943. But that's one year off - we at Batan and 77 miles from that 1943 is too far off and the Japs will have this place by then if we don't receive help - All the men are rather blue and a greater part of our food supplies are running low. Bay Island are why the great Gods don't any act up and neutral - bad things! Here the Japs keep putting shells on 77 miles and all they do is just as here at take it. Some time I wonder - Hanna - if you should need this reminder I have thought of you yesterday and love you more each moment - I guess and know you are the main cause it hasn't given up and send help with it all - You are all I have to live and fight for - I do hope it is soon written that we will remain together always but if not it in states -

Feb 18th - 20th

The last two days have been very blue ones - we all at St Mills have only our faith in God at something might happen to improve things. The Japs from the mainland sunk one more of our ships near St. Frans which makes it hard to get supplies to them. Also the Japs has up the dam or St. Frans water supply so now they have to take water from here to them. Only a few boats have been over but the sailing has been very bad - I guess they will keep it up for something until someone goes and gets a shot from here. Well today marks the 25th year I have spent in this world. I do hope the next 28 years will be spent with my very beloved wife Hanna - If it were not for her I feel sure that life would be very lumpy for me - I do love her with all my heart. Cleveland and I have planned to start the ranch shortly after we ride up on returning, not to make a great amount of money but to just have a very easy-living offspring life. If that we will be very today to get along with.

Feb 21 -

This morning we had another air raid at 10:15. 16 planes came in from the west side of Bataan and came south-south toward us but turned north east in direction of Cabcaben. They unloaded their incendiary bombs in that area. It is very damaging to personnel as the burns are very hard to heal. This raid was made by dive bombers flying at 2,400 yds and glide down. They broke up into groups of 5 three in each group. This afternoon I just rested. The Japs did not shell us today. We hear plenty of no straight only the bad news seem to be true. Well last night President of the Philippines left on the Sub-for the United States. I hope he makes it as the President is very sick and they may be able to bring him back to his feet. And he may be able to make the states give us some help.

The new saying here is "We are getting Baster of Bataan, No Mom, No pop No Uncle Sam".

Feb 22 - Today is Sunday and the W.M. birthday - the Japs from Manila give us until 10:30 today to leave or else they will send over 300 B-52 planes and immediately destroy us - with only one B-52 plane came

over - but at 11:00 we did see ten barges loaded with supplies and men running try runs or landing in the Subic Bay area - so they must be planning a few landing parties. Today has been too quiet - we are wondering what will happen. Tonight I planned to attend church with the men but someone missed the time and not church - but I did have it in mind. You Hanna - I do love you very dearly and hope to see you soon - if this Gods will. We are all ready for the worse. We hear of heavy fighting in the south and great damage on both sides - that plenty of survivors are coming out of there - so good and some bad.

Feb 23

Today has been just another day - we all are wondering if and what the president will tell us. I hope it will be good.

Feb 24 - Today we did hear the good. The Japs tried their best to cut the station out but no luck. The only word we had for us was - worse catched and nothing can be done - well I hope he is only trying to bluff the Japs - We know

(44) the states are in this world war
and giving all they have. So far we
are hoping. The high command
left for the states. I guess its so -
but only make one wonder if things
are worse or what.

25th Feb -

Today not much just a few run around.
The Japs have pulled back and are
digging in - it is reported that
they are leaving and going to the
cavite area - many are sick and
dying.

26th Feb -

Still just the same old thing we
are wondering how the folks are
and what they are thinking.
No air activity over here but
little over Captain.

Feb 27th -

This quietness is getting every one
we can't figure out. Today the
Japs have been so still they go
up to & no good. Last night the
Japs turned their searchlights on
us cavile area, the Philippines are
running wild now and storming
small bands - which have fled
day on cutting off Jap roads -
not bad -

Feb 28 - This morning was spent in
gassing the men again - and by
noon they were very busy in playing
poker - I am not knowing what
some day they might need. A few
dollars soon. The Japs are still very
quiet and we all are wondering
why - about 1:30 one did drop
out of the sky over our heads
but think he was lost before
he hit the clouds. He sky was
very low with clouds and we were
just a little worried that something
might happen. Calm and bright
most of the evening taking
pictures of his foliage for the
Regimental History. We received
very little news from the states
as they are running over each
other about the 15 planes and shells
from 1 sub. We hear they fire 1400
rounds and hit 0. The Japs don't
want Gen. MacArthur to the N.P.L.A.
comes to hold out 30 days and we
will send them help. There is another
naval battle in or around Java and
understand that they have 2 to 1 -
I hope the boys win. This will be
the Jap's next test. The food is
cut down another 20% - boys would

sell and for just one ham sandwich. We just receive enough food to keep alive and no more - I couldn't stand up to a real hard day's work - but I am. Meal time, sleeping and learned to fall down causing his gun to go off a shooting him throw the leg. Now the guy is doing nicely. But looks like death it self. We - I hope tomorrow is much better and receive news from the states.

March 1

This is dear old Sunday - day of rest - but not in war time - have all nearly think about going to church. And many can not. One thing we do see is no one seen reading the bible and beginning to prepare for death. As many as this is very short for most of us. We expect the Japs to pay us a visit but nothing happens - very quiet.

March 2

This morning two Jap planes dropped two bombs on Ft. Franks. They got into the sun and cut their motors and flying a glide into the fort. The first was at 11:15; but I sand them the

water. I was sitting out taking my sun bath and happen to see a large column of water rise between lens and Franks. There were sounds of motors and then the bang - so that ended my sun bath. Then at 5:45 they repeated the same from the other side of the island of Ft. Franks, but also missed. In the Capite area the Japs are building many robots planes the island and must be planning an all out attack on us. Here is another great fight up here with the U.S. Navy being out numbered by 1 they they do win. Our P-40's went out at 6:15 and sank 3 ships for the Japs in the Subic Bay. One merchant ship about 12,000 tons and two smaller ships. They gave the Japs the order of an returning three of the P-40's over spot the field and were received but from the three they will be able to make one. All pilots returned safe.

26

March 3rd.

This morning was very hard to get up and go on duty, but after the bath and shave - I felt better and made it. You will never realize how long way will make me feel good - as we are out of bath soap and have to use laundry soap - also the toilet soap is running low. What night things went on fire until 10:00 P.M. and 50 D.B. type 98 light bombers made a show over Batan. They circled twice and headed for us, but we were ready and they returned back. They come in from the north west going back north east, and dropped bombs. Our air guards remained up - but they had us worried about the evening with Calvert talking over what we will do and I hope much it miss Hanna. We had two pieces of bread - and made out it with the white meat of a chicken - very little enjoyment life when one has to live the normal life. Tonight the Japs are up again and

the moon is very full - weather beautifully - still could only be under it with Hanna. I hear that our air force is growing tonight of nothing happen - flying by your fingers crossed. The fighter battle is worse and the Japs are putting all they have into it.

March 4th

Today things look much better - we understand that our force there in Java and killing many of the Japs. They have landed in other places. The air force are giving them a fight. Things here are very quite there and report of color has broken out on both sides. The Japs are very busy building roads and air fields in Cavite area. Wait here with only a few planes. —

March 5. This morning the Jap air force of two planes bombed a boat or a T.T. boat but missed. Our H.A. guns fired but missed a mile - killed the Japs. The rest of the morning quiet. Our guns fired again at the Cavite area, hope they are doing some good. Major Peterson and myself made a few rounds to the third Battalion and "C" battery also having dinner with

with them, rice and "slop". The food is getting very low or sometime. The Japs are sending more Division into our lines to help eat up more of our food, also they say they are going to bring the mail tomorrow to us from Manila. In Java area is very bad - Japs landed 60,000 men troops and our forces are moving back. They have the air also the sea. Very little can stay tomorrow. There is a group of Japs trying to fight while they still land more men in Europe - what a war - if they lose Java it will be their own damn fault. They had three months to send aid, and not to Europe - the next two weeks will tell all out come - which we have stopped sending our selves its only a matter of days until the Japs kill us by us. I am afraid March 6

Today - ? This morning we are all worried as to the out come of Java - and find out that they are falling but need help - now is the time for U.S. to step out and kick hell out of the Japs. This afternoon I laid the body down and just

rested - Only again I made another traps back to the states and enjoyed being with Hanna - See I did it know how lucky I was being with her - I do hope she will keep the home front burning. I'll be very happy to be back with her soon and I hope she is well and not too worried - I know it must be hell on the people back there. This afternoon Clea find and the reports came in later that they shot down the plane. We hang in. The battle in Java is very bloody and holding. There is a strong Hitler tent in the mouth of the river - hear they are sending more troops to Europe - why - just open it they are given us up or don't give a damn what becomes of us. One thing I won't fight another war for anyone - one is enough for any man. The next two weeks will be the turning point. March 7

Today just to think - here we are located in the Philippines and know where to go. - Frank and Dennis gave the Japs another waltz out but wonder what damage - nothing of real importance happened.

March 10-8th-

Sunday is Sunday and as a rule the Japs will give us the once over. At 8:30 the C. B. plane comes over and Trans goes up and brought him down - another Photo Joe. I think they don't like it. We also hear that Java is holding and all depends on help arriving - the same old stuff they pulled or no - its just talk and trying to keep up the men's spirits. Also the Victory Convoy is told by the English papers to arrive in Australia - that Convoy has been arriving every week of this war - but right now an artillery shot 29 trucks to pieces killing a great number of Japs going back Batavia area. The total rounds per plane varies 128 Rounds.

March 9 -

Well this morning the Japs gave us a few rounds from Corbie Point. A bit we heard they are still there - but mostly them went over the island into the North Channel.

This came from Cavite area which is about 10 miles away. We worried that they are using time shells. Well we know now about Java - its only known up to now that the place will fall. The Japs are landing in great numbers and having no trouble. I guess that great Conway is out it has died out just a great deal we heard it. The great U.S. is still gathering out that we will have a great air day - \$30000 - why don't some of the Islam people get off the god and send a force in the region and turn this thing - at the present its only a matter of a very short time until they take us over - its no use hiding any selves anymore - the states are fighting us & this is too much Robert Calif. than a few men in Boston fighting for life. But I still trust in God and hope he won't turn his back on us. - There is a little navy battle on at Labuhan and guess the Japs are trying to land and destroy the two planes we have. March 10-12 The last three days has brought us nothing but continuous bad news as to how long we will hold out.

The states are now asking why the Japs in Beaton haven't received help - up we wonder also - the Japs have just about ended the war in Java - and now taking on New Guinea - also sub activity is developing around us and are wondering if it will be long until they try again. The number one Jap left the other night to take command of the forces - which may be tagged help for us - I think he is the only one that will pull us out of this mess - We all are counting on him and bed - I think God will give him a hand in this matter - there are many reports about the treatment of the British officers which I hope are not true - We have our hopes hanging and waiting - And tomorrow is another day.

March 13.

Today is Friday and we are all keeping our fingers crossed but not much - there was 15 planes over Beaton but moreover H.M.L.L. This afternoon - the Islands finished

the Japs in the Cawle area, but from here I could not understand what they were firing at. There from here we can see that the Japs have made roads and are moving in new guns each day. Tonight the 75's opened up on a very small boat in the North Channel and destroyed it. No one knows but they think the Japs were in it. They have started their drive on the east front and pulling out our front line.

March 14.

This morning the only air activity was one Beaton for about 30 minutes dropping a few bombs. About 12:30 P.M. two small Jap armed boats tried to run the north channel but failed. Our 155 guns opened upon them at 9000 yds. One ship was hit and the other boat had a smoke screen around it so we could not board it. The boats were very small and our guns were hitting very near. I hope they got away. I think they were feeling our guns. They ordered the Navy to go out and destroy them but that's report. The Japs claimed says they will

Saturday, 11. Mills say the 20th.
 of March weather period we
 have to live there. After our
 General has left the opinion
 of the men has dropped. But
 I hope the General will send
 us ~~as~~ aid soon. He left orders
 to hold out until he returns
 which I hope is soon. The President
 had to order himself three times
 before he would return back
 to the south. We have no idea
 as to what comes. If he has any
 thing to say we can expect help
 soon. Tomorrow is Sunday and
 the Japs are always tried something
 out that day - say I wish some-
 thing would happen out of this
 region. Just a side note. About
 our mess up or food.

 2 small pieces of bacon very small
 lunch.

Night meal or dinner.
 1 piece of bread
 2 pieces of mule meat (eggs to the
 good old mule and is water good when
 one is hungry.)
 1 spoonful corn and gravy to rice.
 Coffee - no sugar milk watered
 just enough to color the coffee.
 For sweets - only a tiny small piece
 of coconut - so you can see we
 don't have much to eat -
 Buy my weight is down very
 late and how - . We hear from
 that the women of U.S. are
 forming clubs to help give
 boulders to the bay in Boston.
 This is rather slow in the war
 dept. feels not necessary to send
 some things here. It sent another
 to Hanha by air and last
 night and says it gets there.
 Buy I wonder if anyone may
 tell. have gotten there?
 yet give us.

Sunday 15-

Up the Japs didn't fire - they
 started at first 7:30 AM and never
 stopped more than half an hour to
 let the guns cool all day. From
 all accounts they fire about

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100 rounds at the islands. Ft. Franks and Ft. Drum received about 600 rounds each. The damage was great as they were using 8" & 10" shells at this, and 105 mm at Ft. Haughey and Ft. Mills. No lives were lost and only one marine hurt, but not bad. The H.A. guns at Franks and Drum were put out of action for good. Also one battery of 155's and one 6" battery of Ft. Drum was also put out of action for good. Our guns returned but no damage to the enemy. The sky was very hazy and the sun was in the eyes of our batteries. Some one should start thinking or the Japs will take the place soon. We hear that Japan landed in the south and wonder if they will try to start things. Two light boats came in near Batasan and fired but they receive a warm welcome and went back to Manila. Tonight it is reported that a ship is coming near the island, we would let the nice of that now, some supplies. At the present we could regain the Philippines, but couldn't keep them.

March 16 - This morning a group of sea planes landed at Subic Bay from Japan - with several fighters planes moving about to be bombing very little. Only a few bombs dropped on the front lines but nothing hurt. This after noon I watched the Cavite batteries fire at Ft. Franks and Ft. Haughey. The Jay batteries are well hidden so they have many rice fires causing smoke. Also we cannot see the flashes or smoke but only hear the sound. Very few of the shots go wild and many find their mark. They fire from 105 mm to 240 mm. ^{incendiary} One falling into the powder ~~mag~~ but did not cause any trouble. The states have forgotten us and never say a think about anything to this place.

March 17 -

This marks the 100th day of war - so far we have fought on the losing side - as we have lost nearly all battles and won very few. The Jay fire very few salutes today and only a few at Ft. Franks. I wonder if that most of our firing would land

targets. From the grape vine the Japs General was killed Saturday (March 15) before our shells - But I think this was only wishful thinking. Was the same General that won the battle of Singapore from the English. It reads now still very light - but death horse (I mean male) is suppiling and keeps the stomach filled out. We understand that the west coast is ready for the Japs - Why? The news only tells about the port - about Heavy Jap bombers went north two loaded with bombs for some unknown reason. The war is still very crazy.

March 18th -

All today has been one of the very empty days which we are facing. From all indications we have been sold down the river boats, stocks and board. The Japs report that this (MacArthur having) was the same thing the British did before the fall of the Philippines. I don't really know what it is to think but something smells and it isn't nice.

The Japs are the only ones that are putting out true information and very little blinks. The weather today is - we will have cloudy, overcast here but Saturday - the same all stuff. I wonder how long the people in states will put up with that bunch. The so-called leaders have been putting all kinds of faint laws on their mouths. If this place falls someone should be made pay dearly for this - Next to the Chinese, have been paying good money out in Japs. They would be granted from the Japs and what happens to the Japs just well we can without any trouble. Great people those Americans.

The president was making all kind of black water today - What someone had to look the W.C.T.U. and a group question had she made so the Chinese were scared. This upsets - I wonder if they will take that as my list.

The only reason the Japs held out here - we could not and didn't have boats to leave. But there are many thoughts in the Philippines that the U.S. never left the streets doesn't know. Now what have we done here in the way of holding the Philippines? We never

into a very small area with only a few months of food on hand, without rice for eight or ten months come - no plans we made to move from before the Japs were in stone houses of Manila. I'm afraid the Japs here have a little different story - but at the same time if they think he is great it may raise the spirit and drive the men to put out. It has been reported that our planes in Australia sink 11 ships and damage 12 others yesterday - I hope so - but on the ships I wrote about yesterday are going south today & they are running in blocks code here so we won't receive any help. Today was the dead line for us.

Report says General MacArthur said upon his arrival in Australia that one of the two reasons why he accepted his new assignment there was he was anxious to hasten reinforcement to the Philippines. An announcement was greeted by the USAFFE forces in Batasan Camp Corregidor with anxiety and apprehensive uneasiness. See if anyone has been helped this. It's the only way we can expect to give us any real supplies. At the present things are just at a stand still - Both sides and just waiting. We could take the Philippines tomorrow but couldn't hold a thing. The Japs are in Batasan and have lost plenty of men in officers. More than he might expect. This afternoon I walked to the top of Manila hill - boys just about killed me off - About a little food & a few things would

and can't do any heavy work. We have just about enough food to last until the middle of May - Then what - rainy season - mud - water - sickness and war - will it think of anything worse. The simple things of life will be plenty nice for me. One of the boys just returned from Batasan and its rather rough there. The Japs could just leave us alone and we would have plenty of trouble by our selves - just from climate and food alone. Not much activity. The planes are dropping things just trying to supply our troops. March 21

Today - has been one day we should never forget here in the Philippines - As on this the Japs from Corregidor area (7:30 AM) started firing on St. Frans and Dolores and stopped near the 1:30 PM. After the smoke cleared the things were in favor of the Japs. At 9:30 AM they hot top side of St. Frans causing the Officer quarter to park the fire noise high-int. The sky and jumping about

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so thought the devil himself was laughing at us. Death was also sitting aside him counting his many deals for the morning. The rest round landed in the tunnel killing twenty-one and wounding forty-seven. I hope the devil who sacrificed - will be upset. He then made a grand and record breaking jump to Driam. But death was too busy laughing and battering himself off the backs toJacouney him on this taiga. Driam had 17 wounded. A few rounds fell on Haugh but no damage. As to St. Mills - nothing but another day - and we were glad to live another day. Each day we all thank God for the last day and hoping he will give us another. The snow was very light - only several MacArthur is speeding up things, or trying to give us a greater kind of one thing we all know the English have lost each battle due to lack time, man - eating or

taking time out to drink a cup of tea - or getting off until later date to do something and then too late. But they have plenty of speed in running - we all wonder how they beat the worlds record in with drawing 10 miles per day. Not only has Mac Arthur plans to return but the people of dear old U.S. thinks we are boldily out - well just between us gals "the less an taikong toughening water - and the hand plays on while St Peter opens the gate - General Wainwright was also promoted to three stars today and given full command of the Filocomian troops here. The man has one of the best records of leading men there - many a time he has turned the Japs giving them a piece of their own medicine. He is a grand leader and plenty of stuff on his tail. He can not guess will give them still plenty of headachs. The troops are fully depend him one hundred Prozent -

(12) March 22 -

The days are growing longer as the war is going into waiting of ships that never come in & stop. The states try to give us a break. They are still giving more money to the soldiers in the Philippines but never find time to put that money into bullet and explosives. As you may know the high commissioners of Philippines cleared up the state bonds over. After statements - he told the people if they expected to see the boys in Bataan they better give them some help and stop passing new bills; that the Bataan boys get their seven bills back day with all the shelling and bombing. That 36 million are behind 30,000 boys - big - the boys are behind you now what are you going to do? If you remember the new papers and radio have never made any comment about Mac's speech. He's the first man that told the real truth about us and the "great" American public don't like the hear the real story - they like such things like pieces of Bataan - and this "biggest Mac" stories.

All the stories you have heard about news of Bataan and Corregidor has caused us to suffer more than anything. And yet - believe all this, we'll ask a few of the boys that saw action here I hear stories will sound sound like night rains -.

To day the Japs dropped dinner menu to the boys - the SB's - they had eggs - coffee with sugar - ham etc - it make your mouth water - some stuff, they are full of twists.

The B-5 Plane came over again this morning and received several rounds from our gun but no hits - and about the same time two heavy bombers came up from down south and landed near Manila. From reports they have seen such types here doing patrol work around Philippine waters to keep this blockade going. But believe it or not they still get thru. Planes go and come at will - except a few fighters we needn't at the

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present we are seeing trainers
the state was out ten years
ago to bring us supplies. Now
but they will have to do it
must I hold out another
two months and then came
the rains." Melbourne is given
General MacArthur a hearty welcome
and we wish they would stop
and go to work.

General Wainwright has become
full command of the Philippines
with a new staff - and so would
be expected the Japs made a push

March 23-

Tuesday - Monday - I think - it's rather
strange to find one losing all
track of time so fast. Each day
news about the same with only
one thought on mind - the Empire
from reports the moros in
Tamboraga and going a little
night work on the Japs there.

It was reported last night that
a great number attacked
the Japs there, killing many
and doing great damage
to things there. They have
young boys as wagons
and very good. It would be
very nice to sleep with them.
Thought that your head might
fall off next morning if you
turned the darn thing.

The news today was little
or none - only a few things
but no great action. A few
planes damaged the Japs
are faster and save one more
heavy cruiser (10,000 ton).

This morning two D.B. Planes
passed over the island at
very high altitude, which
may be by nineteen thirty

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To see if they we have made any more changes. But on the other hand we may cause us some unpleasant moment of less activity.

This afternoon we had our shots for ratione, not bad but made the arms rather sore. But much better than having the sickness.

From reports Manila is coming back to normal as the natives are bring back food to sell in the markets. The great number of Jap soldiers are leaving but only the high officials are there with enough soldiers to control the people.

The Filipinos from here are returning to Manila but few are working only when they have to. They do no more work than the Japs made them do. The people are ready to make a drive as soon as General MacArthur gives the word.

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Our troops in Batuan made a push last night killing a great numbers of Japs and pushed them back and only lost a few of our troops.

The Ft Franks tragedy number has reached 30 - and several more may die - but the greater number will come out on top.

So far the effectiveness of fire from our guns on the jeep battalions has been fully zero effect. The Japs fire one day and spend the next three bringing up more ammunition. So as a rule every third or forth day can be expected to receive a few shots.

Last night I sat out side looking out toward Cavite province - it was very peaceful - quiet only for the waves working on the beach area. One would never guess that this world was after. At the time I wondered what the Japs were thinking about us.

(78) There hasn't been much news but some have we expect a few help planes and supplies soon.

March 24, 1942

Well? - Today was one more day of hell on earth. This rat race started about 8:30 with planes coming from the north west toward Corregidor, at 9:20 - first flight of planes came toward us - first in a group of nine which dropped two smoke bombs; this group passed over to the east but we did not fire on them group. Then 8 more planes followed this group and dropped a number of bombs; but one of their planes was hit and blew up in the air. rocking all the others. After this 27 planes followed which really gave us a work out all passing over going to the north. This group also lost 1 ship. Then 18 more followed doing the same thing. We were greatly worried but our guns brought down one more plane. with a total of 3 and thought one more. The 27 went south but came back and gave us more smoke over. They dropped a total of over 100 bombs and a

greater number fell into the water. From the last of the whole the smallest bomb was near 500 lb. Exposed a few and the greater part were 25 ft over. One bomb hit the middle side ammunition dump and blew up. This cause a fairly war itself. Another bomb hit the top side barracks which was filled with cleanest wheat. blew up. This threw bread all over the place. Another bomb hit one of the sea coast guns and damage not known. All of our communication lines went out. Only two men were hurt but not very badly.

Then at 2:30 27 planes came back and passed over the landing field - but this cost them 3 planes. A number of border civilians were dropped killing. This kept up all the evening but only one live did they pass over us.

All the planes were new types never seen here. Also this afternoon there were 25 single motor planes with machine guns in the tail. They will use the best of guns against us to get that

(80) final knock out blow.

Capt. Shewer came over to visit the rocks today and from his report the Japs are forming to make another drive on the front. He thinks our lines won't hold due to lack of food and a great want of the necessary kits.

As you may know the food is slow and not enough to feed a man if he has to work. Also there are a few women (Japs) running the machine guns. So you see all this stuff about us being no great and heavy fighters - is just so bunk. We are suffering very greatly and 104 people here in the states are rejoying life at our expense. Nice - So the men are becoming very tired of it all and wear feed a rest - bid you my dear Mr. Smith just sit there are bad papers - while we do have like a bunch of rats, so night we had another air raid two planes came up from the south singly and bombed. We think they were only trying

night bombing. Our lights went into action and carried both - we put this running legislation. A few minutes later another plane was reported in the south which turned out to be our own coming up from the south. As you may know what became of the 16 Heavy bombers? - well they landed in Manila and are planning to stay here and finish us off - Great - And 104 - great people have had four months to send us help or planes and we sit here. What a fine bunch of friends 104 turned out.

Now the news breaks out with head lines about Russia with a great number of P-59's. And we are asking only for a few P-40's and what do we get - Nothing just a write up as to the hero's of Batan - great -

Now they have changed our name from "MacArthur Magnificent" to "Wainwright Wonders" - What stuff - with a few as 104 could just be in the next big fight - enemies once, now they would be difficult.

(82) (83)

March 25 - This morning after last night I wonder. Last night we had our first night attack. The first try was three planes from east of Corregidor crossing island length wise, dropping bombs with hit at bottom side. Our lights carried the planes until last but no gun fire. One hour later another three planes tried but the lights picked them up and guess they bleded the planes so they did not drop bombs. Our AA guns fired causing one plane to corruption fire but the Japs put out the fire. The next try one hour later was also a miss - our lights picked them up before reaching the island and all bombs fell into the water. Alt. was 4300 yds. During the day we had six air attacks - even tho the newspapers reported no damage to harbor or reserves. The flights were in 3 planes and come in waves from one to two hours - just enough to keep us in ride. A great number of planes went hit but only 4 were brought down. The planes fly as high as 3000 ft and still lay bombs on the island. One can do very good if they are just half as good as the Japs. As far as they just nearly all

bombs on the island. The men are showing signs of breaking up as the strain and firing does take of enough food is breaking their reserves and bodies. There has been several reports of many boats in Manila Bay moving around as those they planed blind attacks on Corregidor. We are expecting almost anything.

March 26

This morning the air attacks started out at 0800 - as I had my bath at 0700 just ahead of them. One thing the bombs really make don't they. Last night the fire dept let one fire get away from them burning all of our communication no heat or more heat for a time. The attacks were made by smaller type of planes but group of heavy as 5 in a group. This caused us to wonder. Has its no way to make up use by the Americans which isn't a bad idea. The Japs have changed all the time methods of approach and numbers of planes. Which thing they never use the same method. Some shelter during the day from Canice. They started another grass fire in the evening

which our brave pilots kept getting out of control and burn up a great amount of small ammunition. Some times I wonder what goes on in a few of the big shot heads. The news from the states is nothing in the way of supplies to the Philippines. They are either not doing a thing or getting. But we are in the dark. The Japs are evidently every time we get in an all clear signal has been on come and see Plans. Only a few hours was spent out today. No planes brought down as the group was small and very high. At 800 PM they started the night raids. One plane came over and dropped while phosphorus but did not do any damage. The Corregidor towers are always lit up when the Jap planes return at night. We are sure they are receiving all our communications somehow. I hope soon we give us a relief or supplies soon, the men can't stand up to this much longer. Sure we will receive a touch soon if not too late.

March 27 - This morning the same air activity over Corregidor - the bombers started about 8:00 and continue until about 5:30 P.M. Activity in Bataan during the past 24 hours was confined principally to patrolling and harassing battery fire. The hostile air forces subjected the front line and some points of our rear areas to bombardment. Hostile bombing of Corregidor continued until early afternoon of the 26th. Heavy bombings based on Luzon against Corregidor today although number of bombs dropped has been relatively small - they just found their all over the place. Anti Aircraft artillery is taking a heavy toll today hostile bombers.

March 28th - Capt. Carlrent's search lights went into action last night and caused the night raiders to drop all bombs onto the water. Corregidor was under continuous air raid over 14 hours continues to force the enemy to fly so high that his bombing is very inaccurate - they all hit the island, and farfall

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into the ocean. It altitude was
far less than from 8000 yds to
12000 yds - or the top of our 44's.
The bombs are own their way before
our guns go into action. One
Japanese heavy bomber (Type 97)
was destroyed by our guns. The
batteries of the fortified islands
shelled enemy targets on the
Cavite mainland. In Zamboanga
there was very active patrolling
and ambush fighting. Our
patrols penetrated to within
one kilometer of the City where
with hand grenades and
rifle fire they raided the
Japanese and fought effectively,
with no casualties suffered
by our troops. In Batangas
enemy patrols were particularly
active. Our Artillery fired
counter battery and intensive
concentrations causing Japanese
battery to discontinue fire and
numerous enemy killed caused
casualties. Up to date the 44's
have scored 127 planes.

March 29th - 30th -

The same - air raids from early
morning until evening with
little or no rest. We became
gray very tired and the men
need rest along with food. The
forces in Batangas are having
trouble with lack of food -
they are growing very weak
and a planned attack would
cause great trouble. Our
150's gun blazed away at
the huge bombers but one
soap. They use now sending
over only one or two ships
to cause us to use up shells
and not have their ships
brought down. In Alt. we
still 9000 yds and they
always fly with the sun
to their backs both
morning and evening.
They did not have been raided
many times, up to date no
success to our 150's guns - The
bombs have been flying near
but little damage. Our
concentrations are the only
thing that gives us small
trouble - but you know what that

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March 30th -

Enemy forces in Bataan have remained relatively quiet since they failed to gain any ground in their attack on the night of March 28th. Our forces have confined active patrolling and have attacked hostile patrols successfully on several occasions. The hostile air forces continue to bomb our front lines and rear areas in Bataan. Base hospital number one in Bataan was bombed at noon today and scarcely numbers casualties resulted. This hospital is plainly marked and has been a decidedly avoided by the enemy air forces until today. It is believed that much the attack was unintentional. Day and night air raids continue against our harbor defenses. Effective as P.T. fire caused hostile planes to fly at such high altitude that their attacks are ineffective. The harbor defense ports against fire on enemy targets are ineffective.

One of the greatest sights today was - two planes came one from east toward the island dropping bombs - but all guns opened up and the planes were hit. The leading plane left wing fell off. The other caught on fire and fell went into a gully. The leading plane fell near the island in the north channel. Several pieces were brought out as and one could see that these were of the first grade and nothing of poor quality.

March 31.

In Bataan the enemy attacked last night in force with artillery and mortar support. Our forces struck back fiercely and had a hard fighting hand. Superior enemy fire power and much numbers compelled our retreat to withdraw a short distance. Enemy forces paid heavily in casualties. Our losses were slight. The enemy has now reduced the number of bombers used over Corregidor to not more than two per flight. An air raid yesterday afternoon was abruptly terminated when

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both of the heavy bombers taking part were shot down almost simultaneously over Corregidor.

April 1.

To day is Pat's birth day - and I hope that he never has to go thru war - its a tear living hell on earth - one's mind goes in a constant circle not knowing which way to turn. Our battle position on Batasan was heavily bombed and shelled during the past 24 hours.

The artillery concentration was very heavy. Last night an attack was made by enemy troops in boats to land on the east coast of Batasan. Our Artillery fired on the wood laden barges and several are believed to have been sunk. The attack was repulsed with severe losses to the enemy. Corregidor was ~~too~~ ^{too} far away to stop the planes to drop at high altitude but they still are dropping their bombs on the place as if almost on the spot - you don't know but they

hit each spot they see.

April 2-5

The last days have been trying you don't like to think of the Air attacks here has stopped as the losses to the enemy has been too great - the total strafing down was 13 during the last strafing on Batasan. The colony has started a great drive and so far has thrown back our lines, fit the present things are not so good. The summer is over - we expected supplies on last night but as you know nothing. More there has been a great amount of sea patrols. And KAE I still think abouting off that the Japs can't hurt us I say that's one station that should have our plenty - I wish they could be here just one last and then would be more action than big talk. So far four months and no signs of help has come - and we are wondering if they hasn't just forgotten us. The food supply is very short and can only last about two more weeks - so you see the picture.

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we are going through our darkest days and the next seven will tell the story. I hope it is God's will that we will pull thru - we all still have great faith in him.

Hatch April 6 0

This morning the front lines are still having plenty of trouble - there was plenty of hand to hand fight with the enemy and our troops had to withdraw to the front line. But four hours on they held their own. The troops have been put back on full rations and many put this things out of the fire. General Sir Wright has been in Bataan the last few days seeing that all things could be done. As to air raid we had two this morning but nothing happen. In fact too no one knows just what sort come of things. We still have only hope that some to our good will turn up.

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Most of air activity has been over Bataan and front lines. Last night several small boats came near shore but the gun boats sank one and set fire to the other one. We still are passing those a very dark duty and the states are getting the Japs hell on the radio and some the news papers.

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
