SUBJECT: Electric Light for Chapel, Group II.

TO: Japanese Military Administration, through Channels.

1. Catholic services in Group II commence at 5:00 A.M. and continue each half hour until men leave for work. The daily program also includes evening devotions at 7:15 P.M. These services are held in the Group Chapel. It is requested that an electric light be installed for these services.

2. Often scheduled services are not conducted because the assembly is left in darkness. Candles do not serve here, as in an enclosed place, but, due to draft and wind, flicker and burn down, and often blow out. But at this time, due to the solicitude of the authorities as to the conduct of religious programs in this camp we make this request. The Chapel in Group II is conveniently situated for an extension of line, from the Southwest corner of the camp.

3. The use of an electric light in the Chapel is, after all, a facility to the men, and, it is in their name especially that the request is made. Over a hundred men daily assemble at the Chapel before and at the end of their labor in the fields.

SUBJECT: Suggested Plan For Hospital Mess.

1. It is requested that fifteen permanent quarters men be assigned to Mess No. 1 for duty. With the fifteen men remaining will make a total of thirty men. This Mess has twenty-three men at present, as it will be necessary to feed over 200 more men, and as ration detail must be available to carry rations, the extra men are needed. Permanent quarters men to be used are not strong and cannot do as much work as those leaving.

2. A new gate from the area where permanent quarters men are living into the hospital would facilitate feeding these men. A guard would be placed on the gate.

3. It is requested that the ranges in Mess No. 2 be moved to Mess No. 1 to provide hot water for treatments and sterilization. This would save wood now being used for this purpose.

This group furnishes about one half of the Kitchen crew in the Hospital Area, two Librarians, two Tailors, and other special duty men.

II. HOSPITAL.

No buildings have been made empty since last report, but the departure of twenty-five Medical Department men has brought the total down to forty. Three of these are used in the Camp Headquarters for administrative purposes, which further decreases the Medical Department men doing Medical work. All of the remaining Medical Department men are doing several jobs now and it is necessarily expected that the quality of medical care will be lowered.

The organization in respect to the Medical Officers remains the same.

1. I have been informed that lights and wiring in the hospital area are to be removed by the Japanese authorities.

2. It is earnestly and respectfully requested that the wiring in the hospital area not be disturbed for the following reasons:

a. All elective surgery is being performed at night due to the absence of flies during the night hours. The operating room is being used almost every night.

b. Many operations must be done at night because they are of an emergency nature. At least one death resulted from the absence of lights before they were installed in the operating room; this was the case of a traumatic rupture of the spleen which occurred in the evening hours.

c. A source of electric power must be available to operate x-ray and other electrical equipment in order to comply with the Japanese order to conduct laboratory and clinical investigations of the neuritides occurring in patients.

circuit is added a circuit which crosses the road
to the Japanese camp, having about 10 - 50 watt
globes - Total 500 Watts - Grand Total 1500 watts.

50 watt globes and 6 - 100 watt globes. Total
10 x 50 = 500 / 6 x 100 = 600 watts.
The third leg has no load at all.

CONCLUSIONS

(1) The system is in extremely poor condition due primarily to negligence in maintenance and operation, and secondarily to lack of material.

(2) At the present time the known load is about as follows:

First leg - 2800 / 1500W / 200W = 4500W.

Second leg - 2800 / 1100W / 200W = 4100W.

Third leg - 2800 / 0 / 200W = 3000W /

Total = 11600VA, or 12KVA

This does not approach the KVA capacity of the machine, but the load due to short circuits is not known, and the unbalanced load is extremely undesirable.

RECOMMENDATIONS

(1) With materials and tools now in possession of Japanese, put crew on system to repair and correct the system. Estimated 20 man days.

(2) By tapping the third leg at the northeast corner of the camp place the 500 watt load in the Nipponese area on that leg, removing it from circuit (a).

(3) Place 4 - 50W lights in each galley adding the galley in Group I to the new circuit in the Nipponese area, and the other two galleys to circuit (b). Resulting loads:

Second leg - 2800 / 1100 / 400 / 200 = 4500W.

First leg - 2800 / 1000 / 200 = 3000W.

Third leg - 2800 / 500 / 200 / 200 = 3700W.

(4) The above changes will not increase the critical load on the generator; they will improve the balance and will permit an expansion of 800 Watts in the Japanese and hospital area, without changing the load on the maximum side.

WATER SYSTEM

WELL - Reported to be 150 feet deep - started with 8" casing. Reported to pump 75 gpm., but this is not accepted as correct.

Pump apparently in good condition, described under power system.

TANK - Concrete - 15' diameter - 12' high, capacity about 12000 gallons. Condition fair. Elevation about 80' above pump, and above camp.

PIPE SYSTEM - 42 discharge from pump - reduced to 3". 2" outlet from tank. Tee to swine farm and to camp, both 2" lines. Numerous small leaks in swine farm system.

CONCLUSIONS:

System is in fair shape, but requires maintenance, with necessary tools and supplies available at all times.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) Establish a permanent maintenance crew with tools and equipment.

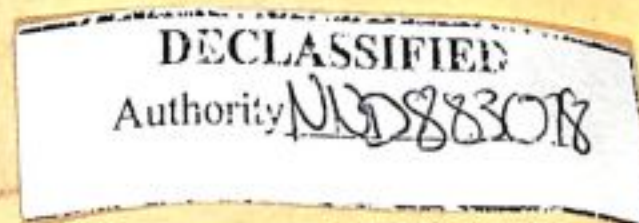
