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- II. INTERNING OF P.O.W. AND REMOVAL OF THEM
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I OPENINGS OF CAMPS AND REMOVALS OF THEM

On 8. 7.1942 the formation of THE TAIWAN P.O.W. CAMP was completed, and since 17. 7.1942 the Headquarters and branch camps have been removed as follows:-

The Headquarters:	From RYUKO-CHO to DAICHOKU, both in TAIHOKU (April, 1945)
Camp No.1	From KINKASEKI, ZUIHO-GAI, TAIHOKU PREFECTURE to KOKUTSU, SHINTEN-GAI, TAIHOKU PREFECTURE (In June, 1945)
Camp No.2	From KOKUTSU to MATSUYAMA, TAIHOKU CITY (In August, 1945)
Camp No.3.	From MANTOROKU, MUHO-SHO, TAICHU PREFECTURE to INRIN-GAI, TAICHU PREFECTURE (In July, 1945)
Camp No.4	RINRAKU, CHOKO-SHO, TAKAO PREFECTURE (No removal)
Camp No.5	From KARENKO to SHIRAKAWA-GAI (In June, 1943)
Camp No.6	MOKUSAKU, SHINKO-SHO, TAIHOKU PREFECTURE (No removal)
	DAICHOKU, TAIHOKU CITY (No removal)

Since October, 1944 some number of p.o.w. were sent to Japan proper. After Camp No.3 was air-raided Camp No.2, and Camp No.3 were closed (Camp No.5 was closed in January, 1945) Camp No.1, Camp No.4, and Camp No.6 were left as before. And recently the Imperial Rescript of Truce was promulgated, and KEELUNG being pointed as the embarking port of p.o.w. those remaining branch camps were gathered to TAIHOKU CITY as the following:-

Camp No.1	MATUYAMA, TAIHOKU CITY
Camp No.4	MARUYAMA MILITARY HOSPITAL, TAIHOKU CITY
Camp No.6	DAICHOKU, TAIHOKU CITY (As before)

To intern p.o.w. who were on their way from Philippine to Japan proper Temporal Camps were opened in November, 1944, at INRIN-GAI, TAICHU PREFECTURE, and TOROKU-GAI, TAINAN PREFECTURE. And they were closed in January, 1945 when they were sent to Japan proper.

II INTERNING OF P.O.W. AND REMOVAL OF THEM

(1) NORMAL INTERNMENT:

From 2. 8.1942 to February, 1943

- (a) 400 p.o.w. (High officers) and their batmen) from Philippine, Malay, Java, Honkong, and Zentsuji and
- (b) 2000 p.o.w. from Malay

were interned.

From March, 1943 to Autumn, 1943 no change were seen only excepting the removal of a few p.o.w., but in accordance with the development of war situations, in October, 1944 349 p.o.w. (high officers and their batmen) were sent to Manchuria, 90 General grade p.o.w. (including batmen) were sent by air) and others were sent by sea. In February, 1945, 702 p.o.w. were sent to Japan proper.

(2) TEMPORAL INTERNMENT:

These temporarily interned were

- (a) 500 p.o.w. on their way to Japan proper in August and
- (b) 1134 p.o.w. (on their way to Japan proper from Philippine)

And they are out in Japan proper. The details of process of internment and removal are to be seen in the table attached to this report.

IV MORTALITY

- (1) The total of mortality at present (At the end of August, 1945) throughout normally and temporarily interned is 403 in all as shown in THE TABLE No.4. (THE LIST OF DECREASED P.O.W. AND DEATH REPORTS ARE TO BE HANDED OVER)
- (2) A deceased p.o.w. among the temporarily interned was enlisted as normally interned p.o.w. on the date of his death, following the orders from the authorities concerned.
So the death rate is 10 percent against 4000 (Gross total of all) p.o.w. It is very regrettable that recently according to the hardship of getting food supply, insufficiency of nutrition, nervous exhaustion of their own, great heat in summer, air-raid calamity (29 men), the number of deaths has been increased.

V MEDICAL AND SANITARY CONDITIONS

- (1) The medical capacity is composed of dispatched Japanese medical officers with their medical members of enlisted medical soldiers, and P.O.W. medical officers with their medical members of enlisted medical soldiers. The medical treatment is done in cooperation with each other parties. At each camp doctors' office room, patients' rooms, and isolated rooms ~~with~~ are provided. Serious patients are to be put into Japanese military hospitals and treated just like the patients among Japanese army. But in accordance with the development of war situations the number of patients increased greatly. So Camp No.4 was reformed as the p.o.w. hospital camp to hold patients coming from all branch camps, in 1944.
- (2) As to sanitary conditions, great number of patients were found at the beginning of the time since the branch camps were closed because of war actions, hardship given while they were transported and difference of food stuff from their own they get used to, etc. But since 1943, the number of patients were decreased year by year gradually, the body weight as well returned to their original average and thus general conditions were very satisfactory. But ~~in~~ accordance with the worsening war situations, in general the cases of insufficiency of nutrition, and malaria were greatly increased and extended among Japanese nation as well as among p.o.w. Thereupon the best way was taken to attend patients among p.o.w. and every way to check malaria was adopted. And moreover to get good nutrition back the farming field and stock farm for their self supply were encouraged and entrusted to their own administration.

VI SUPPLIES

Principal food, side dishes, sweets (Candies), tobacco, and daily commodities have been supplied just like the rear service members of the Japanese army, and additional supplies have been given too to the heavy working p.o.w. But in accordance with prolongation of war and economical hardship the decrease of food supply was inevitable, so to cover this shortage we did our best toward the self supply, and each branch camp was provided with some 25 --- 50 acres of farming field and was raising cattles, pigs, sheep, poultry (fowl, ducks, geese, turkeys, etc.), and particularly at No4 Camp, the HOSPITAL CAMP, six cows are kept for milk supply to patients there.

VII LABOUR

- (1) Sorts of labour since camps were opened are as following:-
- Camp No.1Mining work at KINKASEKI MINE
 - Camp No.2EMBANKMENT WORKS at UKI
 - Camp No.3Reclamation of waste land belonging to TAIWAN SUGAR MANUFACTURING CO.
FACTORY WORK AT THE SAME FACTORY ABOVE
Collection work of ballast
 - Camp No.4No labour given, spontaneous work for self supply
 - Camp No.5No labour given, spontaneous work for self supply

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Camp No.6 The extension work around the TAIWAN SHRINE
The Railway Factory

- (2) The working time a day is 8 hours in average excluding the noon recess, and four(4) holidays are given a month.

VIII COMMUNICATION WITH RELATIVES

- (1) Dispatch of messages:

All p.o.w. were admitted to write cards or letters as soon as the list of p.o.w. was compiled, and the standard is as following:

- 1) No restriction for higher officers(above colonels)
- 2) Officers can write one letter each month.
- 3) Those below W.O.Class including soldiers can write one card each month.

The total number of letters and cards all together is up to day about 56,000; and specially favoured with telegraphing if necessary.

- (2) Receiving of messages:

In 1943 the first mail boat arrived;and in 1944 by the exchange boats, TEIA-MARU and via Siberia a great number of mails arrived, but in 1945 as the war situations become furious, no mail boats arrived. The total number of messages received by p.o.w. here amounts to 12,000, 1,300 personal parcels, and 460 telegrammes.

IX RECREATION AND AMUSEMENT

The relief goods donated by various parties were distributed and purchase of goods from markets was free, they were provided with music instruments, sports articles, gramophone, trump cards, etc. They amused themselves opening music parties, athletic meetings, drama performances, etc. The library of their own was provided and many books given by the International Y.M.C.A., The International Red Cross Committee Relief Department were kept with those which were very satisfactory.

X RELIGIOUS SERVICE

Service on every Sunday, and every observance on Easter, Christmas, etc. were left for p.o.w. to observe freely and solemnly.

XI CRIME AND PUNISHMENT

There are a few p.o.w. who were punished conforming to the Japanese Military Disciplinary Law, but no criminals. There are two p.o.w. who were shot down when their escape breaking through the fence with resistance was tried to be stopped.

XII BURYING AND CEMETERIES

- (1) The funeral ceremony as well as burying was all done following their own customs by their own hands with presence of Japanese officer(s).
- (2) Ten (10) corpses were cremated because of their death with epidemics or some other special reasons and the remains were buried, others were all buried.
- (3) At every cemetery a grave-post with his card number and names each is standing, sketches showing locality of graves at each cemetery have been recorded each time. All the graves have been given attention respectfully.

NOTE: THE LIST OF DECEASED P.O.W. (Classified along cemeteries) are to be handed over.

XIII THE REMAINS

The 19 remains of p.o.w. who died at TAINAN BRANCH HOSPITAL of TAKAO MILITARY HOSPITAL where they were put into when their boat touched TAKAO on their way to somewhere else in October or November in 1942 and fell ill on the ship. are kept in the TAIWAN P.O.W. CAMP following the order given by the SUPERVISING DEPARTMENT, THE MINISTRY OF ARMY, JAPAN (The records at the hospital is insufficient owing to unfamiliar inspection, but the lists and cards were made with the possible data at the hospital are to be handed over)

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XIV THE WILLS AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

The wills and personal effects of deceased p.o.w. have all been sent to the Information Bureau, The Ministry of Army, Japan following the regulation, but those which have not yet been sent as they died recently are ready to be handed over. (THE LIST OF WILLS, THE LIST OF PAY CREDIT, and THE LIST OF PERSONAL EFFECTS which are all not yet sent are to be handed over)

XV THE SAVINGS

The savings of p.o.w. which had been taken in charge of the camp were all paid in the Japan Bank Notes.

XVI THE RELIEF GOODS

(1) THE RELIEF GOODS:

The relief goods were those which were carried by the exchange ships, HAKONEMARU, TEIAMARU, and AYAMARU and those books, music instruments, sports articles, etc. which were contributed by the International Y.M.C.A., the P.O.W. Relief Department, etc. The relief goods were all distributed among p.o.w. or let them keep in charge of. The receipts of these goods were sent to the representative of the International Red Cross Committee stationing in Japan through the Information Bureau, the Ministry of Army, Japan.

(2) THE RELIEF FUND:

The daily goods were purchased by the relief fund and distributed among p.o.w. and a few p.o.w. received them in cash and saved. Their thanksgiving messages were soon sent back to the contributor with their receipts..

XVII THE INSPECTION BY THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS COMMITTEE AND THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE RIGHTS AND INTERESTS OF THE ALLIED COUNTRIES

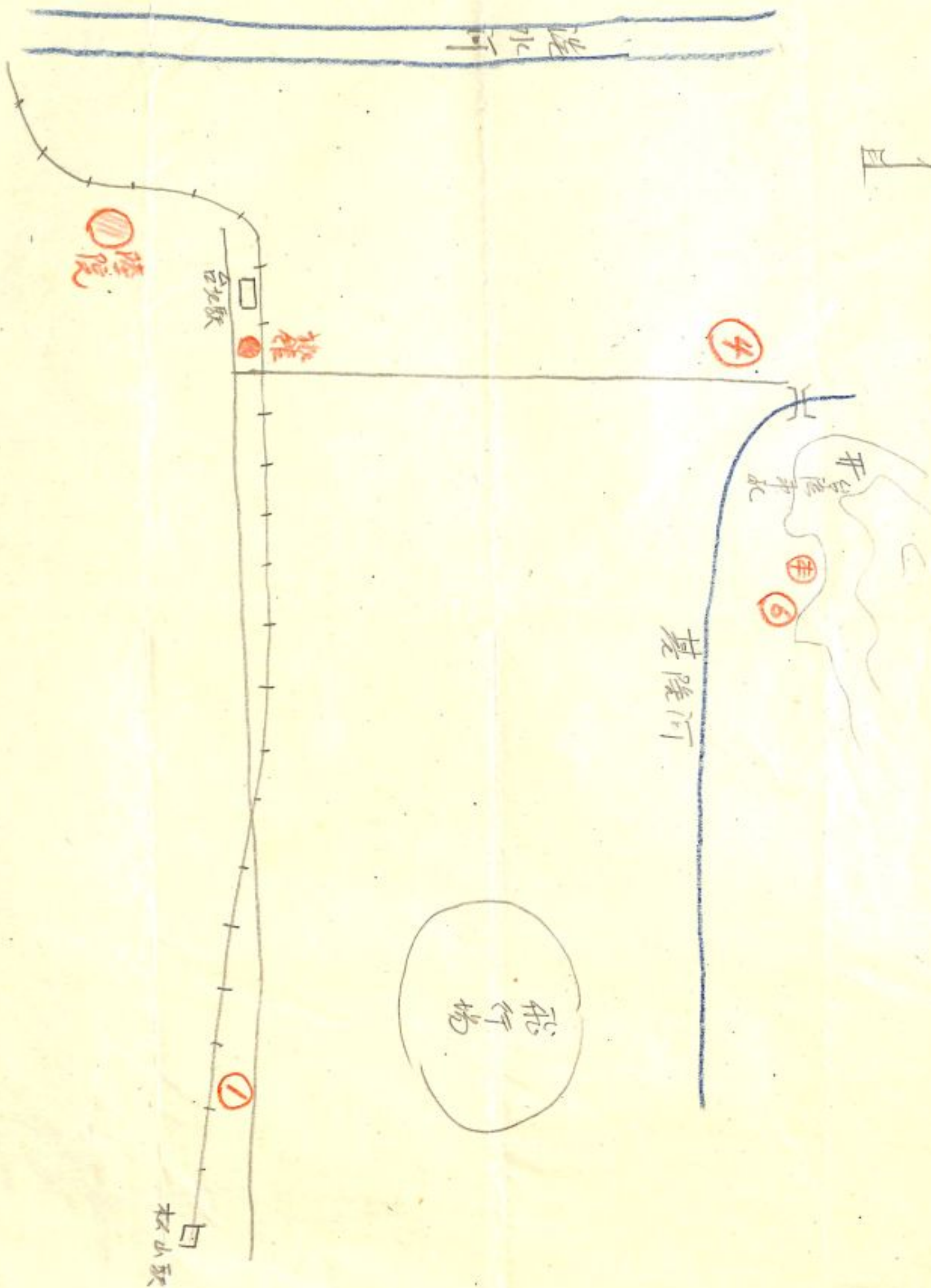
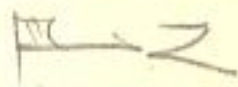
