- Reference 2d Ind AGO, DA, 16 Aug 48, file AGAF-A (22 Jun 48) to letter this beadquarters, subject: Storage of Official Querrilla Records, File GSOF 313.6 dated 22 June 1948, (copy attached) action as indicated in reference indersement in as follows:
- a. Records were peaked in accordance with pare 20 and 21, 7% 12-29, except that official record boxes were not available and amphibitous packing causes substituted therefor. Type and source of records were intentionally outside from the boxes for security reasons, since steweforing at port is by local civilians. Shipsent departed Manila viz USAT General Testagle for STMT (Locking For All-5-1) on 25 September 1943 (TAX STM 10 of 12) and 12 September 1943 (TAX STM 10 of 12) deliver resords to Oldef, Organizational Records Branch, Records Administration Center, 200, 4500 Geofficial will deliver. St. Louis, No.
- b. Packing lists were prepared as directed and are fastened to lid of each box. One copy of packing list is inclosed. One copy of packing list has been forwarded Records Administration Center, AGO, with info copy of this communication.
  - c. These records are composed of four parts as follows:
- (1) Part 1 are Individual Mon-casualty case files and includes boxes numbered 1 through 124. These files consist entirely of 201 files of individuals, arranged alphabetically. In these files are requests for recognition, with supporting papers, submitted by claimant and of the sation taken on the request by Guarrilla fiftairs Divicion, this bendgausters.
- (2) Part 2 are Individual Casualty Case files and include boxes number 1.5 through 180. These files are essentially 201 files as above except that each one is a claim of a Guerrilla Casualty.
- (3) Part 3 are Guerrilla Unit Case files and includes boxes unibered His through 221. These files consist of the request for recognition, all submitted papers, affiderits, correspondence, etc, and the action by the Guerrilla Affaire Division on the Guerrilla Unit. These files are armneed obremologically and induced in each folder.

(4) Fart 4 are miscellaneous Files and are in box numbered 222. These files consist of reference material, special and general orders of Philippine Army affecting Guerrilla Units.

d. This shipment consists of 222 boxes numbered sorially with a total volume of 555 linear feet.

2. The following procedures have been used by this headquarters in the utilization of these records:

a. All records were handled by officers working in the Guerrilla Affairs Division as if they were classified SWRET. Forsonnel receipted for all records received and returned them before leaving their work.

b. Interested and authentical personnal from the two apencies of this beadquarters closely related to the generilla recognition program, Giains Service and the Secovered Personnel Division, were permitted to peruse the records in the confines of the Generilla Afrairs Division and with an efficier of the Division on hand. Frior to this, the records were perused to reserve any controversial information not descend necessary by the inquiring agency. The records were not permitted to be taken out of the Omervilla Affairs Division.

c. Other divisions of this headquarters and agencies of the U.S. Government were not permitted access to the records. If it was possible to satisfy their requirements, the information required was extracted by personnel of the Guerrilla Affairs Division.

d. All agencies of the Philippine Covernment were denied access to the records, and no request for extract information was honored.

3. In view of the scope of these records, official personalities of a foreign government involved and the interest and value they may have for a commercial historlographes, it is believed that agence to these records should be created to authorized arm personnel ensured in arm research only and not to satisfy insirtedual solon inquiry.

 Attention invited to pars 2 and 3 basic communication referred to in par 1, supra, to again emphasize the importance of these records.

1. Request authority to ship direct to the Adjutant General's Office, Records Administration Genter, St. Louis, Missouri, approximately 245 record boxes (box, amphibious, stock No. 7 H 12810) containing personners TONFIDINITIAL Proceeds of the Army and of International import, Records to be accompanied by a Cargo Security Officer and to be personally delivered to the Records administration Genter.

- 2. These records are the basis of decision of the U. S. Arry in swarding official querilla recognition to Filiptines who activalt resisted the Japanese during the late war, such recognition being tentamenut to industion into the Filiptine Commonsetalt havy which at that time was in the service of the armed forces of the United States. Thus, solidir esculents and benefit are covoliny to recognition, for which disbursement of an appropriation of approximately two hundred million dollars (820,000,000) was involved and representing an estimated future obligation to the Veterans Administration of a una approximating one billion soliars (81,000,000,000). The sugnitude of this task and the hexards involved may be appreciated by the fact that over seven per cent of the Philippine population, 1,276,646 persons, requested generalla recognition for which 201,912 received favorable decision.
- 3. The constant public attention, political pressure, vitual pressure, resudent claims, and machination of many claimst for personal aggrandisement and licerative purposes caused extreme substransament to the intest States Government. The execution of this stated results of the state of

4. The station of greating generalla recognition is concluded no 3 June 1963. This sentiated that the values of replaced correspondence to be received by this headquarters will require their retention until December 1945. For security purposes it is desired to ship these records the instant they may be declared EDI-CUERNT; therefore, prior authority is requested as to their storage.
