- b. By 28 Feb 42 (R-8) the unit had 64 men, with only minor changes in personnel.
- c. By 15 Mar 42, (R-13) the unit had expended to 110 mem.
- d. On 28 Mar 42, the lat Bn discharged over 500 men, and by 31 Mar 42, "O" Co was reduced to a strength of 70 men. The Mar 31, 42 roster is the final roster of this unit. (R-24)
- Disposition of Unit.

  - (4) The March 42 orders of Hq, USAFIP, were to reduce strength to two standard Philippine Army Brs, each of which had a Hq Go, and 4 line Companies. (D-11a, 11b nust have been enforced in Merch 42)
  - Strength of the unit on 31 Mar 42 should have been about 70 EM, in line with the other companies of the Bn.
