STANDARD PARAGRAPHS

Reconstructed History of 14th Infantry (PA-AUS) Dated 17 May 1951

DISCUSSION:

It has been recently held by the Department of the Army that the "Reconstructed History of the 14th Infantry (PA-AUS) dated 17 May 1951" is not an authoritative document per se for any administrative actions by any agency of the Department. It was assembled or compiled by personnel of AGED at their own volition, and is believed to include only those documents, affidavits, statements, etc., which would best support the administrative actions now being recommended by AGED in the current review of the individual POW files of members of the 14th Infantry. The inclosures upon which this reconstructed history is based are controversial in nature and do not provide a clear cut and indisputable standard upon which any logical conclusions must necessarily be based. In general, it propounds a radically changed application of policy - or interpretation of basic criteria - from that used by Hqs, AFWESPAC and Hqs Philrycom in the original determinations of eligibility for AUS recognition made prior to July of 1948. It contains no information or other data not in the possession of AFWESPAC and Philrycom at the time the original determinations were made. The compilation of this document had not been authorized by the Department of the Army and, therefore, cannot be quoted as an official basis or authority upon which the AUS status of an individual should be, or should remain, revoked.

CONCLUSIONS:

That all references to the "Reconstructed History of the 14th Infantry (PA-AUS) dated 17 May 1951" made by AGED in their mimeographed work sheet dated _____ should be considered as having "informational value" only. This history should not be considered as indisputable authority upon which a revocation of AUS status may be based.

STANDARD PARAGRAPH

(Subject not (Question of "disbandment" or "tactical dispersal") and certified
to by Colonel Arnold -- Paragraph 14, AGSD Worksheet)

DISCUSSION:

DISCUSSION: With reference to the statement of AGSD to the effect that certain elements of the 11th Infantry were "disbanded" prior to 11 July 1942, and therefore could not be considered eligible for induction into the AUS, attention is invited to the fact that such a presumption is contrary to the heretofore accepted belief of APRESPEC, and Philrycon that such a disposition of troops as occurred in May and June 1942 in North Central Luzon was a "tactical dispersal" ordered by their immediate commanders, rather than a complete disbandment.

After the surrender of General Wainwright in May 1942, the Japanese diverted large forces of ground troops to North Central Luzon, where units of the newly designated 11th Infantry were organizing and beginning to operate. The nearness of large Japanese elements to various companies of the 11th Infantry would seem to emphasize the apparent impossibility of the regiment being able to maintain a coherent force under a unified command. Any decisive battle at that time between 11th Infantry units and Japanese troops, estimated at upwards of 3000 - 4000, could only have ended in disaster for the 11th Infantry. Such facts were then known to the local commanders (including Colonel Makar), and the only alternative to complete annihilation or capture by Japanese forces would seem to be for the units of the 11th Infantry to go "underground" until Japanese pressure eased-off against what they (the Japanese) knew to be the last effective fighting force of the United States still in the Philippines.

There is much controversial testimony as to whether the disposition of troops during May, June and July 1942 was a tactical dispersal or an actual disbandment. It should be sufficient to note that in the compilation of the reconstructed roster of 1942 Bq, Philrycon obviously considered this disposition of troops as a "tactical dispersal" and adjudicated their claims accordingly.

AGSD has not been given authority to reverse or set aside this particular interpretation of policy as initiated and applied by Philrycon.

CONCLUSION:

That previous Department of the Army policy, as applied by Bq, Philrycon construed the disposition of certain 11th Infantry units during April, May and June of 1942 as a tactical dispersal rather than as a complete disbandment.

STANDARD PARAGRAPHS

(Subject not listed on the rosters prepared by Major Dingoong and certified to by Colonel Arnold -- Paragraph 4a, AGRD Worksheet)

DISCUSSION:

DISCUSSION: With reference to Paragraph 4a of the mimeographed worksheet of AGRD dated _____, it has always been an accepted fact that these particular rosters were prepared from Major Arturo Dingoong's (Adjutant, 11th Infantry) personal memory and from his consultations with selected comrades. Few, if any, official documents were used in the preparation of these rosters. DA agencies, including AFWESPAC, Philrycom and AGRD, have heretofore considered these rosters for their informative value only. The fact that a person's name did not appear on the rosters did not necessarily preclude recognition of his AUS status. They were used mainly to lend strength or credence to the claims of individuals whose names did appear thereon. The reconstructed roster prepared by Philrycom in July 1948 was compiled with this understanding -- and no official change in this application of policy has been authorized.

CONCLUSIONS:

That the fact that subject individual is not listed on the 1946 roster compiled by Major Dingoong does not necessarily preclude the recognition of his AUS status.

STANDARD PARAGRAPHS

(Regarding the practice of AGHD in reopening and redetermining cases which were previously determined by an authorized headquarters) since (1948) and were subsequently taken into consideration at the time his original AUS status was granted.

DISCUSSION:

That there is no evidence in the file of erroneous recognition under the policy in effect at that time. Neither is there any. Another appropriate point for discussion in this case revolves around the question as to whether or not a determination made in the past by a headquarters duly authorized to make such determinations shall be subject to an arbitrary review and possible reversal by the same or by a succeeding headquarters. It has always been understood to be the Department of Army policy to reopen and redetermine past administrative actions only where such actions have been found to have been originally made in error, or to have resulted from an act of fraud or misrepresentation on the part of the individual concerned.

CONCLUSIONS:

That the AUS status of _____ was formally recognized by an authorized headquarters on _____, operating under an approved policy in effect at that time.

1. 1. The proposed plan of discharging members of the 14th Infantry (AUS) from the 20th Station Hospital is concurred in, if a team can be furnished from another source to effect the discharge procedures. 1. After conference with all interested organizations and agencies, the following procedure has been agreed upon by all units and organizations concerned. There are at present attached to Co. B, 60th Tank Battalion (PS), approximately 200 persons claiming status as members of the 14th Infantry (AUS). Approximately one-half of this number have been determined to be members of the (AUS). The status of the remainder is being determined as rapidly as possible by the Recovered Personnel Division and Company B, 60th Tank Battalion, is being notified of the findings of the Recovered Personnel Division. The following procedure has been agreed upon for processing this group:

a. COMPANY "B", 60TH TANK BATTALION

(1) This organization will continue to ration, quarter, and equip all persons presently attached to that organization.

(2) No further personnel of the 14th Infantry or persons claiming membership therein will be accepted by Company B, after 25 January 1947.

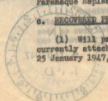
b. PARASQUE REPLACEMENT AND DISPOSITION CENTER

(1) Will continue processing, paying, and effect discharge of all 14th Infantry personnel attached to Company B, 60th Tank Battalion, on 25 January 1947, when their AUS status has been finally determined by RPD.

b. 20th Station Hospital (PS) will accomplish the following:

- (1) Receive all persons given written initial AUS determination by the Recovered Personnel Division as soon as such notification of status is received from the Recovered Personnel Division.

- i. Prepare an alphabetical roster of all positive AUS cases together with other essential data. Distribute to interested agencies. Those agencies are determined to be:
- j. Send letter to each claimant wherein case is determined negative from positive informing them of determination (Held in abeyance until approval received from TAGO)
