5. FRAUD IN CLAIMS:

Elements of fraud in both individual claims and entire groups of claims are revealed in the study of Lth Inf Sett, and appear so extensive the subject must be given major consideration in determining All status of personnal. For that recess, a brief background of the conditions under which fraud developed is given.

a. Processing for Philippine Army Status.

Between 7-29 Jan 42; Nakar's group was assigned the sector between Balete Pass and Bayembong, for purposes of defense and delaying action, Unit was engaged in several delaying actions in the retreat through this sector. At the same time, stregglers from 11th, 12th, 71st and 72m juff Regis were picked up by the Init. (8-1,2,13)
- d. Between 7 and 29 Jan 42 Lt Col Werner formally designated Maj Nakar (promoted 18 Jan 42) as Bn Commander, and designated the troops under Nakar as 2d Bn, in his "lat Provisional Guerrilla Regt." (8-1_2,13) D-1)

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- a. On 29 Jan 42, the Sept retreated from the Begabes ashool to the Binatispality of Jones, Basolas. 38 im under Baker, operating as the embed En, acted as a rear guard, and carried out patrol activities, Dalaying action through Oreware Pass (Hep) was carried out until 10 Feb 42. In the meantime, Nakar established his 2d Bm Hop at Daligan, Jones, Isablai. (5-12, 21)

- (3) This left "Mg Co, jet Ne, 71st Inf" under 16 Sta Jea, and spo Co, 71st Inf, "under Disposing, ethout any place in the 70g, Jewever, the series "Jet Inf personnel, and as such, rest 70g, Jewever, Near's contains for the 70g units for 31 Ner 42 or 30 Apr. 42 have been nearest.  - (2) Capt Arnold, OO of the skeleton Headquarters Battalion, established his Headquarters at Depintin, south of Dumabato, and among other things, had his troops operate a farm to produce food.
 - (3) Units were scattered in small groups, even individual Companies being broken down and bivousced in widely separated places. (S-25)
 - (4) Patrol activity was apparently limited to search for food, and measures to provide security for the bivouc areas. Unit did not have either sufficient semunition or men to conduct offensive operations, (S-2)

Atter 14 Jul 42, a reorganization of the Regt was planned, and serverl micro changes in assignments of officers were made, but the reorganization micro changes in assignments of officers were made, but the reorganization (5-22), and on 21 Jul 42, yr 00 85, [0-88] was relieved as Regt1 8-3, and Heg Enriques was relieved as Regt1 Executive Officer. - hh 29 Sep 42, Nakar was captured at Mimuri a barrio of Jones, Isabela, with Lt Bueno. (8-9,13; D-131,132)
- 11 Oct 42, Col Arnold assumed command of the 14th Inf Regt. He gathered a group of sen from His one until, and picked up stranghers from the other Units of Nakar's Bm. Col Sarnold remained with this group until Oct 44, who the contented Col Volchemm of USAFIP, NL. (This With he heen called the "Eastern Branch" in histories for sake of clarity). (5-9,10)

- Radio Nessages from Lt Col Makar to Gen MacArthur are not acceptable as evidence with regards to personnel strength, assigments, organization, inductions, or presence of individuals in a given area.

Radio to MacArthur, 1 Jul 42 (D-65), Nakar gives FA strength as 62 Officers and 930 EM. 60.4 Armold states (S-9) this was an exageration, and that only part of the Officers and about 200 EM were on duty and inducted, the rest having been disbanded. Findings of this survey, and analysis of 201 file information confirm 60.4 Armold's attainent.
 - b. Radio Nakar to MacArthur o/a 15 Jul 42 (D-76) Nakar states all emlisted in US Amy as of Jul 14, 42. Statement is in gross error. Only those personnel (a few Officers and 40 20) in the Ragt'l Ras area were so inducted as of that date (S-45,13,9,25; Note that D-10) by Bakar confirms the error of D-76).

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c. Radio Nakar to MacArthur, o/a 21 Jul 42 (D-87) - Nakar recommends presitions, listing 7/0 positions of Officers. These are in gross error:

- j. That in disbanding troops, the personnel whose homes were in North Lunon were generally disbanded, as they could get back to their homes to eat, while the Visayans who had no may of getting home, were generally retained on duty in the Eagt, or surrendered.
- k. That personnel whose statements in both 1945 and later processing for AUS status show AUS service, are generally telling the truth.

The explanation probably lies in the fact that when outposts and patrols were cut off from Regt'l Hos, the Wissyans, who couldn't speak the languages in Luzon, had no place to go, so surrendered, while the personnel who lived in the area simply went home. (S-19.32
- Lt Tesoro Reyes was the Officer who inducted the personnel of "A" Co into AMS at Ouinalabasa.
 - a. Analysis of claims of personnel who have excellent support for AUS status and those who alleged in 1945 processing to have AUS status, preponderantly show Lt Reves as the inducting officer.
 - Personnel who have no record of 1945 processing, and who processing for AUS status was done after Dingcong made the statement (S-13) that only Obins and Perdigueros were authorized to induct personnel, generally name Obina as the inducting officer.
 - Personnel whose claims for AUS status are potently fraudulent generally name Obina as the inducting officer.
 - The prior experience of USAFFE was for the Co CO to induct his own men, after he hinself was inducted. It Sta Ana, who gives one of the few uncolored histories of 14th Inf, states Co Comdrs inducted their own personnel, (3-32), as does Galina (8-28).

- d. That personnel who stated in 1945 processing that they were disbunded prior to, and civilians on, 14 July 48, and who in later processing for ABS ellegs they were on active duty and actually inducted into ABS, were not eligible and were not inducted into ABS.
- e. That personnel whose homes were in the G_Dm and Mallig Plains regions of Isabela, and allege duty in this Unit or on "intelligence missions" as of 14 Jul 42, were not eligible for, and were not inducted into, AUS.
- f. That there is a possibility that 2 or 3 personnel who later became members of this Unit may have been inducted into AUS in the Quinslabsan cres in other Unite, and that such cases should be treated as members of those other Units.
- g. That no personnel, as members of this Unit, were inducted into AUS.

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"B" Co. 1st Bn (Nakar's) Lt Januario Loneno

Note: The 14th Inf Regt had three (3) separate and distinct "B" Cos, 1st Bn, during the period Jan to Dec 42. The first "B" Co was in the Bn commanded by Capt Minton, which was disbanded o/a Apr 42. The second "B" Co was formed 6 May 42 by redesignation of the Combet Co, Hq Bn. The third "B" Co was formed unknown date in 1942 by redesignation of the Tuso Detachment. This report deals with the second "B" Co, 1st Bn, 14th Inf.

- 1. Unit designated as "B" Co, 1st Bn, 14th Inf" on 6 May 42, as per Memorandum, Hg 14th Inf. (D-50).
- Source of Personnel. Unit was composed of USAFFE men, primarily from 71st Inf. Unit was expanded by picking up stragglers from 72d Inf and 11th Inf Div.
- 3. Unit was stationed as follows:
 - - 7 Jan 42 Initial personnel, as part of "A" Co, 71st Inf, arrived at Aritao, N.V.
 - b. 7-29 Jan 42 Movement north from Aritao to Bagabag, N.V.
 - c. 30 Jan 10 Feb 42 Delaying action at Oriwong Pass.
 - d. 11 Feb o/a 15 Mar 42 Daligen, Jones, Isa.
 - e. 16 Mar 15 Jul 42 Vicinity of Dupax, Aritao, N.V.

4. History

- On 7 Jan 42, personnel who later formed the unit, as part of "A" Co, lst Bn, 71st Inf under Lt Tesoro Reyes, arrived at Aritao, N.V., in their retreat from Bauang, LaUnion, and were included in the force Lt Col Marner was gathering together. (S-1,2)
- b. On 29 Jan 42, concurrent with the retrest from Bagabag, N.V. into Isabela. Lt Col Warmer formally organized the 1st Provisional Guerrilla Regt. He designated Copt Nakar as 2nd Bn Commander, and the 71st Inf personnel under Makar, formerly CO of 1st Bn, 71st Inf, remained under the latter's commend. Subordinate units retained their 71st Inf designations until
- From 29 Jan &2 to 10 Feb &2, personnel of Hakar's Ba, under the command of Lt Longno, Executive Officer of "A" Co, 71st Inf, fought delaying actions from Bagabag Ferry through Oriwong Pass. (S-2)
- 11 Feb 42, personnel maintained patrol activity, and based on Daligan, Jones, Isa. (S-1,2)
 - 7 Mar 42 Nakar was designated Bu Commander, Hq Bu, and the 2d Bu (71st Inf personnel) was redesignated as Hq Ba. "A" Co, 71st Inf, was split into two (2) companies, a "Hq & Sw Co" under the command of It Tesoro Reyes, and a "Combat Co" (subject of this report) under the command of Lt Januario Longno, formerly Reyes' Ex. Off. (S-26; R-32,27)
 - f. 0/a 15 Mar 42, Combat Co under Longno moved to the Dupax-Ariteo area of Mueva Vizcaya. The main Japanese forces had been withdrawn, and the 14th Inf retock the entire Province of Nueva Viscaya at this time.
- g. On 12 Apr 42, the Japanese reentered Nueva Virosya, and placed garrisons

in all the towns south of Criwong Pass. Combat Co moved into the hills in the Dupox sree, and established Camp Nakar. Unit remained in this area until 15 Jul 42. (8-1,25,5; 10-52)

- h. On 6 lay 4E, Unit Combat Co. was redesignated "p" Co, lat En, lath Inf in the reorganization of Hakari & Gommand. (LD-50) Note in 7 May 4E Unit did not know of the redesignation. (LD-52)
- O/e 23 Jun 42, Lt Longno and Lt Roserio, Executive Officer of "E" Co, initiated surrender proceedings (3-57,1,2).
- On 15 July 42, Lts Longno and Rosario surrendered the "5" Co, 1st En, 14th Inf at Dapax. The Unit moved by Jap truck to Bayombong, where formal surrender coremonies were held on 15 July 42. [D-166,82,83; 5-57,59,1,2]

5. Strength of Unit.

- a. The only surviving valid roster of troops of the Unit is one dated March 31,1948 (2003) which lists 114 man. Soater of Officers of Mar 31, 42 (2003) shows a same of the Same of the
 - b. The list "Men of B Co., let Bm, l4th Inf R36]" dated o/m Jul 14,42 may be the list of personnel surrendering on 15 July 42.
 - This is the only record or statement including 201 files that shows 3d Lt Teodoro Andaya, Note he signed a receipt (D-52) for Combat Co on 7 May 42.
 - (2) List contains nearly all of the names of Viesyons in the Manila Tribune list of Viesyans of this unit released from POW Status, in April 1943.
 - (3) There is reason to believe either Vidad or Rumbans or both had access to the Jap sponsored Bureau of Constabulary records, where such a list may have been retained.
 - (4) Note the officers appearing on the 31 Mar 42 rosters (R 32):
 who do not appear on this list.
 Action & Helb were in Planpagen as of 14 Jul 42
 - Action & Heat were in Fingings and of the Market Periido & Misbungs have no record of surrender & both later show up in the sector commanded by Lt Gol Manuel Enriquez.

. Miscellaneous information:

- a. Dupax was several days travel from the Regt'l Hqs in Jul 48 (8-11,12,105,52), so word or ADS could not have reached Longno prior to surrender of the Unit.
 - Lt Lougno, CO of the "B" Co, alleges induction personally by Lt Col Nakar at Expex on 14 Jul 42 (3-65) Lt Col Nakar did not leave the Eegt'l area (3-85) so any such induction would necessarily have been "matcastic".
- c. Longno is a non-acceptable afficint for repeated flagrant felse statements (3-59,60) (3-61,62) Note Diagong also makes a false statement on this
- d. Most personnel claiming AUS status name Longno as inducting officer.
- e. Manila Tribune article states Unit surrendered 15 Jul 42 (D-82.

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Further states Lizon personnel released earlier, but Viseyans kept at Bonful until Agr "45. While not stated in article, Megros was a troubled area, and USAFFS personnel from Megros captured on Lizon were generally not returned there until 1947.

- f. At least 63 persons were previously granted AUS status in this Unit.
- 7. Chart ensitysis of Yisayan personsal listed in Health Tritume as having surrendered 15 rules, and released in Apr 43. This group is used as a check against the entire Unit, these personnel are all comes for which recovered archives give a clear proof of dates and unitaritance of activities.  - 1-Was not processed in 1945. Alleges surrendered 31 Jul 42.
 - 2-In 1945 processing, do not mention AUS. Claim induction in later AUS processing.

 - That award of AUS status to members of this Unit was obtained through submission of felse testimony, and concealment of true facts surrounding surrender of the Unit.

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"B" Co, 1st Bn (Nakar's) Lt Julian Perdigueros

NOTE: This is not listed as one of the three "B" Co's that were in existence during the period Jan to Dac 42. The inclusion of this report is occasioned by a group of 17 claims alleging induction into AUS in "B" Co under Lt Julian Perdigueros.

(Ref to Report on "C" Co - Perdigueros)

- There is no record of the existence of this Unit.
- 2. Claims of the 17 persons alleging AUS induction into this Unit are as follows:
 - 4 Allege in 1945 processing that they were disbended prior to, and were civilians on, 14 Jul 42. In later processing for AUS status , they alleged continuous service, and actual induction in 1945.
 - 13 Were not processed in 1945
 - 5 were listed on early rosters of other Units, and not on later ones, indicating they were disbanded.
 - 2 are listed on the fabricated Magunga rosters.
 - 2 tell such conflicting stories that none of it is believable.
 - 4 allege induction into this Unit, give no other data that can be used for checking purposes
- 3. Conclusions
 - a. That there never was any "B" Co under Perdigueros in existence.
 - b. That there were no personnel inducted into any so-called "B" Co under Lt Julian Ferdigueros.

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Combat Co (Aritao Detachment)(Makar and Enriquez) Lt Pedro H. Makunsa

- Note: This unit was listed as the "Aritao Detachment", attached to "B" Co, Lith Inf. The only evidence of the existence of this Unit as an integral part of Lith Inf, prior to 29 Sep 12, is found in fabricated rosters and
- Unit designated "Combat Co, 14th Inf" on some date subsequent to 4 Oct 42, backdated to 29 Sep 42.
 - a. On/a 4 Oct h2, Lt Col Martin Moses received word of the surrender of Lt Col Makar. Lt Col Moses at that time assumed command of all USAFTP forces in Morth Hanon, and appointed Lt Col Marmel Euriques CO of 1Ath Inf., effective as of 29 Sep h2. (Volckmann's Reports)
 - b. Eurofiques land beam Descritive Officer of the Regi, and land organization assessed and third flux of a 25 al. Al. 2. Gold armold, (then Regio) Commonded the Ng Region Land Region and Region Land Region and Region Land Region and Region Land Region and Region Land Region Land
- Source of Personnel Aritae Detachment Volunteer Guards, and additional personnel recruited from Aritae, H. V., some with prior USAFFE service. (C-18)
- 3. Station of Unit Aritao area of Nueva Viscaya.

 - As of 31 Mar 42, 3d Lt Pedro Mabunga was a Junior Officer of "B" Co, 14th Inf., under Lt Jamuario Longno. (R-32)
 - b. Habunga was promoted to 2d Lt on 16 Apr A2. (D-36)
 - c. On roster of o/a 30 Apr A2 (R-25) 2d Lt Mabunga was an officer of "B" Co, lith Inf, on duty in Mueva Wizcaya.
 - d. On 15 Jul 42, "B" Co, 14th Inf, surrendered to the Japanese at Dupax, Haver Viscaya. It appears LF Mahunga did not surrender at this time, as his mass is not listed on the twop roster (R-36)believed to be the one turned over to the Japanese. (8-57,58.59)
 - On or about 29 Sep A2, Lt. Col Enriquez, new CO of Math Inf Regt., assigned Lt Mabunga as CO, and the "Combat Co, Lith Inf" was formed. (UMAFT, ML Archives)(5-65,72,71)
- Aritao Detachment was a Volunteer Guard organization, and as such, had no military status. (See Par 6, Report On "G" Co-Bagunu) (8-67,68,72)(8-121)
 - a. Unit was apparently formed as the Volunteer Guard of Aritao, prior to 14 Jul 42. (S-67,68,69,72)(R-37)(D-47)
 - b. Ouerrills status was claimed and was granted to personned of USAFIP, HL for services rendered prior to 14 Jul 42 in Volunteer Guard Units. In such cases, military status was given retreactively as a reward for
 - Eligibility for AUS industions required personnel to have had actual military status as of 1h, Jul 42, and such status could not be granted

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- 6. The so called "records" and "restars" that have been presented to prove that seven one of the Aritab Detachment of "ge Co were utilizery personnal, amounted into lith Inf prior to 12 Aul 12, are fabrications. Presentation of such response constitutes frund. As previous greating of MNS status to personnal of this lutit was based on the balief that the "records" were we id, it senses the entire Unit washes record to the contract of the lutit was based on the balief that the "records" were we id, it senses the entire Unit washes records.
 - a. Roster signed by Lt Jamurio Longno, dated 30 June 42 (R-34).
 - This is not one of the lith Inf archives recovered in the group that the 31 Mar 42 roster was in.
 - (2) Heading showing "Initial Roster" was a later guerrilla practice. This was not a new organization, as Combat Co had been redesignated sps Co on 6 May &2, and heading should have been "Monthly Roster".
 - (3) Upper left corner of page 1 shows spelling "Rooster" instead of the correct spelling, which was also common in guerrilla units of a later period.
 - (A) So called "Aritac Detachment" on page 2 shows personnel having joined as early as 8 Peb A2, yet not a single one of them is in the 31 Mar A2 roster of Occebst Co. (2-32), which clearly shows they were not military personnel of Co "B", Julia Int.
 - (5) Under "Attached From other Organizations" on page 2, [Drigh] both Vidad and Bimbaum here entries conversing 16. On Theorem Endamin: Elainink was then, Bilmeright's personal representative ont to effect a department of the property of the property
 - (6) Innocenio Palma is listed as "Died in Action-Tayug, 14 Apr 42". Palma was one of the man under Antiporda, who had not joined 14th Inf prior to their deaths. (8-26,15) libts that Montejo Mists Palma in his "G" Co. (8-91)(Sec B-79)
 - (7) Records of USAFIF; NL show information concerning following men listed on p2 of "roster".

Biagan, Jose "Roster" shows "Jd Feb 20/42".

Tukay, Lucio (Lucilo) "Roster" shows "Jd Mar. 28/42" USAFIP, NL Record shows "POW & Civ released 4/23/42-5/1/43"

Garcia, Melecio - "Roster" shows "Jd Feb 20/42" USAFIP, NL Record shows "Enl., ind & jd 9/10/44" etc.

- b. "Rosters" dated 15 Jul 42, to 31 Dec 42 (8-35,37,38,39,40,41,42,43) are fabricated.
 - (1) Items listed in sub-par a above are pertinent.

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- (2) Roster 31 Jul 42 (R-38) uses form and terms established after Oct 44. (Use of term "page" in line 1, and listing of months and days of service)(p-167 thru 174).
- (3) Personnel continually added to succeeding rosters, many showing dates of joining prior to 31 Mar 42, but none are on 31 Mar roster. Not carried as Gains, just show up on succeeding rosters, yet rosters are of the type to show gains.
- c. Recommendation for promotion, dated 1 Oct 42 (D-122).

"Document" contains names of personnel long absent from the Unit.

·Bulan - surrendered to the Japs on 13 Jun 42.

Santos - captured at his home near Tunsuini 19 Sep 42.

Dumlao - broke leg on 6 Apr A2, went home to Tumauini 9 Apr A2, and never reported back to any military unit until liberation.

Hanzano - broke arm on 6 Apr 42, went home to Pangasinan, and no contact with unit until o.a Nov 42, when Hanriques retreated to Pangasinan.

Sahalburo - Left Regt on disbundment in May 42, and by June 15, A2, was a Go Commander of La Union Regt (121st Inf) under Col George Barnett, until 1944, when he was transferred to 14th Inf.

Note that the last paragraph of the "Document" contains entirely unnecessary information, and is in a grasmatical style completely unlike Erriquez, who had a fluent command of English. (See P-147)

d. Letter, subject: Enlisted Personnel, dated Sept. 1, 1942, alleged by Enriques. (D-112)

 - c. That some personnel secured Guerrilla recognition for service rendered as Volunteer Guards prior to 14 Jul 42.
- d. That record supporting AUS inductions of personnel of this Unit are fabricated.
- That personnel whose homes were in Aritac, and who later joined USAFIP, HL, were listed on the fabricated papers to secure fraudulent recognition.
- That personnel from this Unit were not eligible for, and were not inducted into, AUS.

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"C" Co., 1st Bn (Nakar's) Capt Alfonso Bagunu

- 2. Source of Personnel

Persons living in Cabsan and surrounding Barrios. 56 of the 110 listed allege to have been USAFFE personnel, mostly from 11th Inf Div units that were cut off before they could get to Bataan. (C-19)

- Unit Station Cabagan, Isabela. Unit did not at any time leave the Municipality of Cabagan.
- 4. History
 - a. Unit was formed unknown date prior to 6 May 1942, by Capt Alfonso Bagunu at Cabagan, Isabela.
 - Unit designated "C" Co, 1st Bn, 14th Inf" by Memorandum dated May 6, 1942, Hos 14th Inf. (D-50)
 - c. Unit disbanded 10-12 May 1942, in Cabagan, after the Japanese cut all communications to the Regt'l Reg area south of Jones, and occupied the province of Isabela. (8-76.74).
- 5. Documentary evidence of Unit
 - Memorandum dated May 6, 1942, Hqs 14th Inf. (D-50) is the only known surviving document regarding this Unit.
 - b. Noteres and orders submitted by Bagmus, in support of claims for Alig status by sumbers of this Cinti, are clear-out fabrications (2-75). They contain headings that were not in existence at the time, names of percental two centraction the activities described, and when the head of the percentage of the containing was in operation. Note that 85% of the percental of this alleged tutt were proceeded in 1947 or later. (Our percentage of the containing was in operation.)
 - c. History written and submitted by Bagumu is clearly a figurat of his imagination, and bears little resemblance to the true occurrence of events. It contains a number of proven false statements. (S-77)
- 6. Wilitary Status of Unit
 - a. Unit was apparently a Volunteer Guard Unit.
 - (1) Personnel all lived in Cabagan and Vicinity.
 - (2) Personnel with prior USAFFE service were members of many

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organizations, all of which disbanded on cut-off from Bataan.

- (3) There is no record of Unit having participated in any anti-Japanese patrol activities of 14th Inf, although personnel almost uniformly claim having joined in January or February 1942.
- (4) Volunteer Guards were generally established through help of the Military, but they were strictly civilian Municipal organisations to enforce law and order. This practice was common long before the War, and is still in use today, as Municipalities do not have funds to maintain adequate police forces. Members were residents of the Municipality, assigned by the Mayor or his chosen Guard Commander, to give free time to guard duties, such as guarding Municipal buildings, warning the population of approaching armed groups, and other functions as assigned by Municipal officials. They did not operate outside their own Municipalities.
- b. Bagunu offered the services of his group to lith Inf. Lt Col Nakar accepted that offer, as witnessed by assignment of the Unit on the May 6, 1942 Memorandum. Maj Dingcong states (S-26) that Lt Col Nakar assumed Bagunu and his men had previously been inducted into USAFFE when he made the assignment of the Unit. Study of 201 files shows that 56 of the 110 listed claim prior USAFFE status, while 54 allege initial service in Cabagan Detachment,
- c. Bagumu himself had no USAFFE or military status. (201 file)
- 7. Analysis of 201 File Information (C-19 and other charts)
 - a. Breakdown of Claims
 - (1) 109 persons have 201 files containing claims of some sort. 13 do not claim AUS status
 - 12 allege unit disbanded 1 deceased
 - 96 claim AUS status
 - 45 allege in 1945 processing that Unit was disbanded, and make no mention of AUS. In 1946-48 processing, they claim AUS status.
 - 12 do not mention AUS status in 1945 processing.
 - In 1946-48 processing, they claim AUS status. 4 Deceased had claims filed for them.

 - 4 Decessed and claims filed nor them. 3d Have no record of 1945 processing. In 1946-48 processing, they claim AUS status. 1 Has no record of 1945 processing: Homever, retained records of USAFIP ML shows disbanded in April 42.
 - (2) Of the 61 granted AUS status;
 - (a) 40 either allege Formal induction, or make no mention of type (b) 21 allege Automatic induction

b. Comments

- (1) Note that where some record of statements made prior to AUS procossing may have been available, about 10% were granted AUS status.
- (2) Where there was no record of statements made prior to AUS processing, 85% were granted AUS status.
- (3) Large percentage of personnel alleging automatic induction raises a serious question as to other allegations of formal industion.

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8. Conclusions

- a. That the Cabagan Detachment ("C" Co) was a Volunteer Guard Unit with no military status.
- how do are built b. That the Unit was given a paper assignment and designation as a 14th Inf Unit, but was never formally inducted into lith Inf.
- c. That the Unit was disbanded o/a 10-12 May 42.
- d. That no valid rosters of the Unit were recovered, and that the rosters and other papers submitted by Baguna were fabricated to support claims for ANS status.
- e. That the members of this Unit were not eligible for induction into AUS. and that they were not so inducted.

- b. That personnel who alleged in 1915 processing that they had disbanded prior to, and were civilians on, 14 Jul 52, were not eligible and were not industed into AUS. resurgless of later allegations.
- c. That personnel who joined lith Inf after 14 Jul 42 were not eligible for, nor inducted into, AUS;
- d. That personnel who were in a POW status as of 14 Jul 42, but who later claim they were on duty and formally inducted into AUS, were not inducted

- e. On 29 Jan 42, Unit left Bagabag, N. V., and moved to Dapigan, Jones Tambela, arriving there o/a 2 Feb 42. (5-2,13)
- f. On 14 Feb 42, 1st Provisional Guerrilla Regiment was redesignated "14th Inf Regt".
- 8. On 7 Mar 42, the 2d Bn under Nakar was redesignated "Hq Bn, 14th Inf." of the "Du Co, Tlat Inf., had no place in the T/O of a Nos Bn (see Report of Na Co, 14th Inf. *Rakar) in that reorganization. The CO Lt Dimgoons.

- On/a Sept 42, Unit was dispersed by Japanese overrunning the area.
- Attached Troops Tuao Detachment. (B Co, 14th Inf)

Personnel listed on page 2 of Roster of "D" Co dated May 5, 1942, (R-29) are members of the Tumo Detachment (later designated FB Co, 14th Inf" in the Appre-Caggern Force). This Detachment is dealt with by a separate report. Personnel so listed are not a part of "D" Co under Lt Dingcong.


