
FINDINGS AND COMMENTS

Due to the nature of the information requested, and the fact that persons in Baguio City are so well known to each other, it is virtually impossible to secure complete information.

CONCLUSIONS OF INVESTIGATOR

The printed affidavit forms were printed by the Mendoza Printing Press, #49 Trinidad Road, Baguio City, but information cannot be secured as to who placed the order, and who accepted delivery and paid for them. According to the printer, one thousand were printed at a cost of twenty five pesos.

A Wage Claims Form CS-ID 619-A has also been printed by this printing firm.




SPECIAL CASE PRINTED FORMSOUR FILE # 2531FIELD MEMORANDUM

So far as can be learned, the printed Affidavits (Proof of USAFFE Status), were printed by the Mendoza Printing Press, #49 Trinidad Road, Baguio City, which is owned by Gonzalo B. Mendoza & Sons.

The printer states that one thousand were printed for twenty five pesos, but he does not remember how long ago, and he cannot (or will not) remember who placed the order and paid for them. He mentioned the name of Leon O. Paraguas whom he thought ordered them, but Paraguas denies having anything to do with these forms. Paraguas did admit ordering the wage Claims Form, which is attached. Paraguas is known in Baguio by the title of Major, and is connected with the CUSHING BRIGADE USAFIP VETERANS LEGION (CONVETS), Baguio, Mt. Province Chapter.

This printing Company is about two blocks north of the public market. No Ramos Printing Company could be found. The Llamas Printing Company, which is near Gonzalo B.
