DISPOSITION FORM

- The basis for this memorandum is Memorandum dated 16 October 1952 from Walter E. Lang, Chief, Religious Claims Section.
- 2. The mases or identities of 100 ROTC castes from ROTC units of San Juan de Letran College, Nersus Institute of Technology and Quisumbing (Quesumbling) College allegedly stationed in San Juan de Letran College during 10 to 29 December 1921 have not been established for the reason that the same were not furnished this headquarters by the requesting agency, and that there are no archives on these ROTC units in this headquarters.
- 3. However, attached bereto are a list of NOTO tactteal officers, NOTO cadets and students of various schools and colleges in the Hanila Area as of December 1941, with brief summary of statements in their 201 records (Inclower A); clippings from "WIE TAILENS," issues of December 1941 (Inclours B); and contificate of Kr. Jose Taggis (Inclours C). From a study of these records, the following conclusions have been drawn:
- a. Subsequent to 8 December 1941 8070 codets of ROTO units of various colleges and universities in Manila rever ordered into extive cader training. The purpose of the training was to qualify cadets for sembership in the Philippine any reserve force, as required in the National Defense law of the Comnomnealth of the Philippines; and, because of the existing emergency, to preser the cadets for subsequent UNEFFE service.
- b. The cadets were trained by college units under tactical officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Army who were assigned to different colleges as instructors.
- c. The responsibility of training and expenses incurred incident to the ROTC cadre training were borne by the Philippine Commonwealth Government. The "cadets get no pay except their subsistence, which is supplied by the army."
 - d. The BOTC cadets undergoing cater training were ordered distanced by Fhilippine Army Headquarters on or about 25 December 1941. "Cadets returning home are given transportation allowance by the army. Those who are unable to return home due to take of transportation facilities will be given subsistence while they are in their respective training centers."
- e. Fhiliptime Army officers and enliated sen assigned to ROTO units as tactical officers and instructors allege induction into the USAFFE on various dates 14, 16, 17, and 19 December 1941 at UST or FBU by either Col Bienvenido Albo or Bejor Resaumel Cepeda.

- f. BOTO cadets <u>were not</u> inducted into the USAFFE during the period they were in cadre training. The purpose of the training is indicated in sub-paragraph a, above.
- g. After the disbendent of ROTC cadre training on or about 25 December 1941, some ROTC cadrest volunteered and we're scapeted for service either with the Anti-Tank Battalion or the 2nd field Artillery Regiment of the 2nd Regular Division, PA, units that were organized in the later part of December 1941 at the University of Santo Tomas. ROTC cadres who were accepted for service with these units were inducted into the USAFF on various dates, either in the University of Santo Tomas or in Battan, as indicated by allegations in 201 records. Two cadres of the Mapun Institute of Technology allege induction by Capt Vinluan, ROTC Commandant of Mapun on 12 December 1941, the allegations have no beads of fact because Capt Vinluan had binestif inducted only on 16 December 1942, and because the order training was for the purpose as indicated in sub-paragraph a, above.
- 4. On the basis of the foregoing findings, it is determined that SOTO units were not inducted into the USAFFE, and service with an MOTO unit is not evidence of any USAFFE status. Individual members of MOTO units may have volunteered for service with regularly established USAFFE units. Proof of USAFFE service must be established in individual claims.

- 1. The basis for this memorandum is Memorandum dated 16 October 1952 from Walter B. Lang, Chief, Religious Claims Section.
- 2. The mines or identities of 100 NOTO codets from NOTO units of Gas Juna de Letrus Collegs, Wayse Institute of Technology and cismosing (Quescubling) College allegedly stationed in San Juna de Letrus College during 10 to 29 Necceber 1924 here not been established for the reason that the same were not furnished this headquarters by the requesting agency, and that there are no archives on these NOTO units in this headquarters.
- 3. However, attached bereto are a list of SDT testical officers, HDTC casts and students of various schools and colleges in the lamila area as of December 1941, with brief summery of statements in their 201 records (Inclourse A); clippings from HER REMINES; lesses of December 1941 (Inclourse E); and overaficate of Mr. Jose Tagyts (Inclourse C). From a study of these records, the following conclusions have been drawn:
- a. Subsequent to 8 December 1941 BOTO ondets of BOTO units of various colleges and universities in Bunils were ordered into active coarse training, the purpose of the training was to qualify oudeds for sembership in the Fhilippine any reserve force, as required in the Mational Defence Law or the Commonwealth of the Thilippines; and, becomes of the wristing emergency, to prepare the cadeta for subsequent UNIFFE service.
- b. The cadets were trained by college units under tactical officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Army who were assigned to different colleges as instructors.
- c. The responsibility of training and expenses incurred incident to the ROTC cudre training were borne by the Fhilippine Commonwealth Government. The "cadets get no pay except their withsitsence, which is supplied by the army."
- d. The RDTC codate undergoing cadre training were ordered distanced by Philippine Army Headquarters on or about 25 December 1941. "Cadete returning hase are given transportation allowance by the army. Those who are unable to return home due to lack of transportation facilities will be given subsistence while they are in their respective training centers."
- e. Fhilippine army officers and enlisted men assigned to ROTC units as tactical officers and instructors allege induction into the USAFFE on various dates 14, 56, 17, and 19 December 1941 at UST or FEW by either Col Bienvenido Alba or Major Remanuel Capada.

- f. ROTC cadets were not inducted into the USAFFE during the period they were in cadre training. The purpose of the training is indicated in sib-rargeranh a. above. and -barakath a apone correctors alless induction for the least units
- g. After the disbandment of ROTC cadre training on or about 25 December 1941, some ROTC cadets volunteered and were accepted for service either with the Anti-Tank Battalion or the 2nd Field Artillery Regiment of the 2nd Regular Division, PA, units that were organized in the later part of December 1941 at the University of Santo Tomas. ROTC cadets who were accepted for service with these units were inducted into the USAFFE on various dates, either in the University of Santo Tomas or in Bataan, as indicated by allegations in 201 records. Two cadets of the Marua Institute of Technology allege induction by Capt Vinluan, ROTC Commandant of Mapua on 12 December 1941. The allegations have no basis of fact because Capt Vinluan had himself inducted only on 16 December 1941, and because the cadre training was for the purpose as indicated in sub-paragraph a, above,
- 4. On the basis of the foregoing findings, it is determined that ROTC units were not inducted into the USAFFE, and service with an ROTC unit is not evidence of any USAFFE status.
