This Executive Order pertains only to unrecognized guerrilla units that are now under control of the United States Army or Philippine Army. (Incl #3)
- d. Letter to the President of the Philippines dated 14 October 1945 signed by General MacArthur. (Incl #4)
- e. Letter HPA file 322 TAG, dated 18 October 1945, subject: "Disbandment of Unrecognized Guerrilla Forces." (Incl #5)

2. During the partial demobilization and reduction of the Philippine Army (inclusive of recognized guerrilla units) to the strength authorized as of 1 July 1946, you will be directed from time to time to inactivate and disband elements of that force as well as unrecognized guerrillas under your control. In the process of this demobilization there may be some instances where individuals may be

reluctant to turn in United States property, such as arms and ammunition and weapons captured from the enemy. In complying with directives mentioned above, you will be guided by instructions indicated below.

3. a. Prior to the disbandment of each unit it is desired that the matter of collecting United States property and captured enemy weapons and ammunition with which they are equipped, be considered carefully, and that a procedure be adopted that will be appropriate in each case and that will insure recovery of the maximum amount of property without employing force or measures resulting in bloodshed or violence. On separation from active service in the Philippine Army, individuals will be required to pay for lost government property on statement of charges.

4. It is understood that some unrecognized guerrilla personnel is still being employed by United States Army Forces contrary to the provisions of inclosure #3. Such unrecognized guerrillas will be disbanded at the earliest practicable date, in accordance with provisions of inclosure #3, unless recommendations for recognition have been initiated by United States Army units employing such personnel. You are authorized to pay disbanded unrecognized guerrillas as laborers in accordance with existing regulations, for the period actually employed by you. It is desired that a report be forwarded to this Headquarters indicating the designation of each unit disbanded, strength of unit, number of arms collected, estimated number of unauthorized arms retained by it, and date of disbandment.

5. The collection of unauthorized arms and other materials from personnel after separation from active service is a responsibility of the agencies charged with the enforcement of civil law and order in accordance with the directive and letter referred to in subparagraphs 1a and d above. Collection of United States property from unrecognized guerrillas under Army control will be accomplished as far as practicable before release and will be governed by the same policy as set forth herein for Philippine Army units. Property and records turned in by unrecognized guerrilla units will be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of Inclosures 3 and 5.

6. The inactivation or disbandment of Philippine Army units, including recognized guerrilla units, will be initiated only on specific direction of this headquarters. A directive setting forth a detailed procedure for inactivation of such units will follow.

SUBJECT: Maintenance of civil law and order in the
Philippine Islands.

TO : Commanding General, United States Army Forces,
Western Pacific, APO 707.

1. Reference is made to Proclamation No. 17 and Executive Order No. 68, issued by the President of the Philippines under date of 26 September 1945; to letter from the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, to the President of the Philippines, dated 14 October 1945, and to radiogram this Headquarters, CAX 53700 dated 22 October 1945.

2. It is desired that responsibility for the maintenance of civil law and order within the Philippines be returned to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines at the earliest practicable date. Such responsibility will be progressively returned to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines within appropriate areas as rapidly as necessary enforcement agencies now in the service of the armed forces of the United States in the Philippines can be prepared to assume the necessary functions.

3. a. You are charged with the maintenance of civil law and order within the Commonwealth of the Philippines, except as your responsibility therefor in specific areas is progressively transferred to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines.

b. You will arrange with the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines for the transfer thereto of operational control of units of the Philippine Army, Military Police Command, in appropriate areas as rapidly as such units become capable of full performance of their function in the maintenance of civil law and order in those areas. When operational control of the units of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, in any areas has been transferred to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, you will stand relieved of your responsibility for the maintenance of civil law and order therein.

c. Within areas in which you retain responsibility, you will employ units of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, under your command, in their normal functions of maintaining civil law and order. At the request of responsible civil authorities of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, or of its provinces

or municipalities, you may utilize such units or other units of the Philippine Army under your command, in carrying out special law enforcement measures, when in your opinion such measures are desirable.

d. In the event that the President of the Philippines declares an emergency in territories within which responsibility for maintenance of civil law and order has been passed to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, and states that the forces, Philippine Army, under his operational control are inadequate for enforcement, you will release operational control of additional units, Philippine Army, to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines in such strength and for such periods as may be necessary to meet the existing emergency.

e. In event of an emergency of such proportions within the territories of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, that the Philippine Army forces under your command are inadequate to maintain civil law and order, you will promptly notify this Headquarters and request, if you deem such action advisable, authority to agument Philippine Army forces under your command with United States troops for this purpose.

4. You will complete the prescribed organization, training and equipment of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, as rapidly as is practicable, utilizing therefor Philippine Army personnel under your command and such United States equipment and supervisory personnel as are available and required.

5. Units of the Philippine Army transferred to the operational control of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines under the provisions of paragraph 3, preceding, will remain in the service of the armed forces of the United States in the Philippines for the time being.

Dear Mr. President:

I am aware of the natural desire of the citizens of the Commonwealth to have the normal functions and agencies of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines become operative, under the actual control of their Government, as soon as possible. Recognizing the soundness of this desire, I hereby propose a method for the early return to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines of the responsibility for the maintenance of civil law and order.

Since the agencies which should be employed in the process of applying the Commonwealth's laws to its own citizens should unquestionably be the forces of the Commonwealth, and since these forces are primarily the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, I have directed my Military Police Command to prepare units of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, for performance of their function in the maintenance of civil law and order. At this time the units are not uniformly prepared, therefore, it appears that the return of responsibility for maintenance of civil law and order to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines would be expedited by the progressive return of responsibility in appropriate areas. As responsibility for maintenance of civil law and order in an area is returned, the operational control of units of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, in that area, would be transferred to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines.

Should occasion arise for you to declare an emergency in an area in which the responsibility for maintenance of civil law and order has been returned to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, and should you state that the forces, Philippine Army, under your operational control are inadequate for enforcement, I will release operational control of additional units, Philippine Army, to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines in such strength and for such periods as may be necessary to meet the existing emergency.

In areas in which the responsibility for maintenance of civil law and order has not been returned to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, I will use units of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, under my command in their normal functions of maintaining civil law and order. At the request of responsible civil authorities of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, or its provinces or municipalities, for special law enforcement measures, I will utilize units of the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, under my command or other units of the Philippine Army under my command, if in my opinion such measures are desirable.

Units of the Philippine Army transferred to the operational control of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, as outlined above, will remain in the service of the armed forces of the United States in the Philippines for the time being. Therefore, supply, financial and administrative problems can be solved after the transfer of operational control.

The responsibility for maintenance of civil law and order can be transferred to the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, in the provinces listed below during November 1945:

- Misamis Occidental
- Bohol
- Ilocos Norte
- Ilocos Sur
- Zamboales
- Capiz
- Bataan
- Laguna
- La Union

Additional provinces can be transferred in like manner in the immediate future.

I suggest that you authorize some agency of your government to make the necessary detailed arrangements for the transfer, with the Military Police Command of my command.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 68

DEMobilIZATION OF ELEMENTS OF THE PHILIPPINE ARMY AND OTHER
GUERRILLA UNITS, IN THE FIELD.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Government has been advised by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, of the termination of hostilities and the surrender of Japanese forces;

WHEREAS, the Government has further been advised by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, that this termination of hostilities and surrender of the Japanese forces has rendered unnecessary the maintenance for further field service of elements of the Army of the Philippines in addition to regularly activated units and of those guerrilla units already recognized;

WHEREAS, continued assembly and maintenance of headquarters is not a prerequisite to recognition of guerrilla units; and

WHEREAS, the demobilization of guerrilla units in the field will not prejudice the continuance of recognition of such guerrilla units as can produce evidence showing that they have maintained organized military forces in the field in effective opposition to the Japanese, which will be the basis for award of such benefits as may be authorized to members of such units;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMENA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the Philippines, do hereby order:

1. That all unrecognized guerrilla units be disbanded and that all members thereof return to their homes and engage in their normal civilian pursuits.
2. That all arms, ammunitions, and military supplies and equipment in the possession of unrecognized guerrilla units or of individual members of such units be immediately turned in to the Commander of the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Army of the Philippines.
3. That all records of unrecognized guerrilla units disbanded in conformity herewith, together with any request for recognition and evidence in support of such request, be assembled and turned in to the

Commander of the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Army of the Philippines for forwarding to Headquarters, Philippine Army.

Done at the City of Manila, this 26th day of September, in the year of Our Lord, nineteen hundred and forty-five, and of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, the tenth.

Dear Mr. President:

I am in receipt of your letter of September 20th and have noted your Proclamation of the 26th of September directing the surrender of all unlicensed firearms and ammunitions by the Philippine citizenry.

In this connection your Executive Order No. 68 directing demobilization of Guerrillas should be taken into due consideration. When this latter step is accomplished, the great bulk of arms and ammunition will have been withdrawn from the possession of other than authorized forces. This demobilization should be permitted to proceed in an orderly manner before initiation of any action which may be necessitated by deliberate violation of the Firearms Law.

The agencies which should be employed in this process of application of the Commonwealth's laws to its own citizens should unquestionably be the forces of the Commonwealth. The primary force for the purpose would be the Military Police Command, Philippine Army, which is being organized and equipped as rapidly as conditions permit. If this should prove inadequate, other forces of the Philippine Army will be released to you from my command at your request.

In view of the shortness of time which has elapsed since the cessation of hostilities, I advise that the enforcement of the law in these matters be pursued with tact and patience in order to obviate any incidents of extensive bloodshed or similar occurrences. The most unfortunate consequences would result if this matter should be handled by your Government in such a way as to precipitate banditry or irregular guerrilla activities.

SUBJECT: Disbandment of Unrecognized Guerrilla Forces

TO : All Unit Commanders, PA.

1. All unrecognized guerrilla forces disbanded pursuant to Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, will turn in any arms, ammunition, and military supplies and equipment to the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Philippine Army. Military property and supplies turned in to units of the Philippine Army may be used to complete the authorized equipment of such units to the extent practicable, property to be taken up on the equipment records of the unit. Surplus and unserviceable property will be turned in to the nearest United States Army base or supply point for disposition. Appropriate receipts for military property turned in will be issued by the Unit receiving such property.

2. All military records of disbanded unrecognized guerrilla forces will be turned in to the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Philippine Army. All such records will be forwarded by the most direct practicable means to Headquarters Philippine Army, APO 501. Appropriate receipts will be given by units receiving such records.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 22 BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES. The following Executive Order No. 22 by the President of the Philippines is published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

Executive Order No. 22

FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS
AND ENLISTED MEN OF THE PHILIPPINE ARMY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section No. 90 of the National Defense Act and of the Emergency Powers Law, I, Sergio Osmena, President of the Philippines, do hereby prescribe the following schedule of salary rates and quarters allowances for officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Army, effective on dates as indicated herein, and extending for the duration of the war and for six months thereafter unless sooner terminated by competent authority.

The rates of pay and allowances proscribed herein shall become effective for officers and enlisted men of any unit upon the date on which the unit is returned to or constituted under organized military control, and for any individual officer or enlisted man upon the date on which he reports to a unit under organized military control after having been called or recalled to active duty or after having been enlisted for such a unit. A unit shall be considered as being returned to or constituted under organized military control on the date of announcement thereof is made by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area.

(EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 22, Continued)

No increase of pay or allowances shall accrue because of foreign service.

During the period that the rates of pay herein prescribed are effective, there shall not be paid to any person an increase of pay or allowance by reason of length of service.

During the period that the rates of pay herein prescribed are effective, there shall not be paid to any person an increase of pay for duty requiring regular and frequent serial flights.

Any provisions of existing Executive Orders in conflict herewith are hereby superseded.

Done at the seat of Government in the Field, this 28th day of October, in the year of Our Lord, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-Four, and of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, the Ninth.


