- 1. Reference DD Form 96, Comment No. 1, same subject, dated 25 January 1952, by the Executive Officer (see attached).
- 2. The following is a report on projects and problems now in this section:
- a. US-CVP the compilation of the file on this unit was completed on 2 October 1951. This file is now in the Closed File Section, Records Branch.
- b. The study of the history of the Fre-War Philippine Constabulary units is still in progress. Seven unit histories have been completed and sent to Records Branch Historical Files Section. There are a total of 126 pre-war constabulary units. One Initial Examiner has been employed full time on this project for three months. Mr. Fronk spends an average of three hours per week on this project.
- c. There are 18 cases still awaiting report to TAGO, Washington 25, D.C. on the War Department Casualty Report Project. These cases are presently insoluble.
- d. The R&A Section completed its SOP last November.
  This SOP incorporated the procedures and steps used in the examination,
  determination and certification of service and the processing of the various
  types of work units. In December, this SOP was mimeographed and distributed
  to all personnel of the section.
- e. The work on the payroll records from Bacolod City is still incomplete. However, all documents have been reproduced in photostat or true copy. What remains now is to complete the segregation of these copies in alphabetical order so that they can be turned over to Records Branch for inter-filing. After that, we will begin to reassemble the original records and check them against the lists in the Investigation Branch in order to be sure that we are returning everything we borrowed.
- f. Mr. Elliott is still working on the letters from VA inquiring about cases on which they have had no report of a redetermination. He still has five letters involving 27 names. Replies from VA on several of the letters we have already sent them on this project are expected to continue coming in. These replies will give us identifying data on some of the cases that we have nt been able to locate. He works on these letters part time now and spends the major portion of his time on regular review.

- 3. 201 files of thirty-eight (38) of the one hundred and forty-two (1/12) names searched were found. ARCER ?
  - 4. Examination of the thirty-eight 201 files showed the following information: under MIT as
- Four individuals were determined to have been WD civilian employees and paid for periods from Jan 42 through 1945.
- Eleven individuals alleged they were last paid on 31 Dec 41 or their last working day a shortly prior to 31 Dec 41. They were determined not to be entitled to pay under MPA.
- c. Eight individuals appear on 31 Dec 41 payrolls as paid for services rendered during December 1941. They were determined not to be entitled to pay under the MPA.

- d. Two individuals were determined not to be WD civilian employees.
- e. Thirteen individuals allege they did not receive all or part of their wages and each individual was determined not to be entitled to pay under the MPA.
- 5. Reference to determinations of non-entitlement to pay under MPA in paragraph four (4), this is based on the following:
- a. "subject does not meet the requirements necessary to bring him within the terms of Public Law 490, as amended, for the following reasons:
- (1) Subject did not remain on duty status as a civilian employee of the War Department until enemy action precluded the continuance of such duties.
- (2) Subject was not interned by the enemy and did not suffer serious deprivation by reason of former official status."
- 6. WD civilian employee status is accorded individuals on the merits of their particular case however the determination of such status does not necessarily entitle an individual to/benefits under the MPA.
- 7. Payrolls for 1942 fail to show any of the individuals for whom 201 files
  - An initial check for twenty-five (25) 201 files was made along with request to Kansas City Records Center for loan of civilian wage claim files for those twenty-five individuals and any files on the Luzon Brokerage Company. A wage claim file for one individual was located in KCRC and adjudicated positive.
  - The Luzon Brokerage Company file Contained an affidavit of Jose M. Luna, WD civilian employee of the Philippine Motor Transport Depot regarding the payment of salaries of employees of the Luzon Brokerage Company, photo copy attached.
  - The Luzon Brokerage Company file from MCRC contained a request for information, dated 2 Nov 52 from an attorney acting in behalf of a group of employees
    of the Luzon Brokerage Company.

- 2. Pursuant to the verbal request of Mr. O. D. McCool the names of one hundred and forty-two (142) individuals appearing on the aforementioned list were selected. A search for records at ARCEN revealed thirty-eight (38) personnel records which could be identified as pertaining to these same individuals.
- 3. Twenty-five (25) names of these one hundred and forty-two individuals were selected for search at Kansas City Records Center for "wage claim files," which resulted in locating only one file. This one file was identified with a file located in ARCEN.
- 4. Examination of the thirty-eight 201 files and the "wage claim file" from KCRC showed the following information:

a. Four individuals were determined under MPA as WD civilian employees

and paid for periods from Jan 42 through 1945.

b. Eleven individuals alleged they were last paid on 31 Dec 41 or their last working day shortly prior to 31 Dec 41. They were determined not to be entitled to pay under MPA.

c. Eight individuals appear on 31 Dec 41 payrolls as paid for services rendered during December 1941. They were determined not to be entitled to pay under

the MPA.

d. Two individuals were determined not to be WD civilian employees.

e. Thirteen individuals alleged they did not receive all or part of their wages and each individual was determined not to be entitled to pay under the MPA.

(1) One of the aforementioned thirteen individuals filed a claim for unpaid wages (KCRC "wage claim file") which was adjudicated positive for arrears in pay to last working day 2 Jan 42.

5. Records show determinations of non-entitlement to pay under MPA in paragraph four (4), above were based on the following:

a. "subject does not meet the requirements necessary to bring him within

the terms of Public Law 490, as amended, for the following reasons:

(1) Subject did not remain on duty status as a civilian employee of the war Department until enemy action precluded the continuance of such duties.

- (2) Subject was not interned by the enemy and did not suffer serious deprivation by reason of former official status."
- 6. As a matter of policy, WD civilian employee status is accorded individuals on the merits of their particular case however a positive determination of such status does not necessarily entitle an individual to pay benefits under the MPA.
- 7. A search of available U. S. Army civilian payrolls for the period subsequent to 31 Dec 41 fails to show the names of the individuals for whom 201 files were located.
- 8. A request was made to Kansas City Records Center for loan of any files on the Luzon Brokerage Company. The Luzon Brokerage Company file loaned this office by KCRC contained an affidavit of Jose M. Luna, WD civilian employee of the Philippine Motor Transport Depot regarding the payment of salaries of employees of the Luzon Brokerage Company, photo copy attached.
- 9. The Luzon Brokerage Company file also contained a request for information, dated 2 Nov 52 from an attorney acting in behalf of a group of alleged employees of the Luzon Brokerage Company.
