1. This project was initiated in an attempt to verify the authenticity of Morning Reports (March and April 1942) and 2 Duty Rosters (covering period February to May 1942) pertaining to the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, submitted as the basis of a claim for benefits, under the provisions of PL 85-217, in the case of Simon Agnapan.

2. A history of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, has been previously compiled and is on file in Records Section, RPR Branch. This history contains a list of the names of 38 known members of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC. All those names, except Avelino Ancheta and Henry S. Bangyad, also appear in the Duty Rosters in question. The Duty Rosters and Morning Reports both indicate the strength of the enlisted men as 41.

3. Upon completion of a study of the Morning Reports in question it was noted that the initial entry in these records was on 4 March 1942, which shows, "Capt. Manriquez ordered verbally by Col. Horan PS reorganize 1st Bontoc Co." Aforementioned date is also the first date of strength accounting in the Morning Reports. These entries indicate that either Morning Reports were not being kept before the date Capt. Manriquez assumed command of the Company or that a new set of Morning Reports was started on that date. The initials of the authenticating officer, entered in the Morning Reports, after the remarks for each day, appear to be identical with the initials of Romulo A. Manriquez, contained in his records on file in this office. The entry of 4 March 1942, in the Morning Reports regarding Capt. Manriquez is compatible with the entries concerning him in the Diary of Col. Horan.

4. The back cover of the Duty Roster for April, May, and June 1942, contains a remark showing, "1st Bontoc Co, PC, Bontoc Bontoc, mass induction March 30 & 31, 1942 by Col. J. P. Horan, U.S. Army, with Major Haidrich & Capt. Guiter of U.S. Army 43d." However, the Morning Reports do not contain an entry nor any indication that this organization was ever inducted either as individuals or as a whole. In an affidavit of Julian N. Esquejo, who was Provincial Inspector of the Constabulary of Bontoc, it is stated that, "on 30 Jan 1942, I together with the officers and men of the 1st Bontoc Co were inducted into the service of the USAFFE by Col. John P. Horan." In an affidavit of Alfredo C. Abueg, who was the Junior Officer of the 1st Bontoc Co, it is stated, "that the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, was inducted into the USAFFE on 13 April 1942, by Col. John P. Horan, U S Army."

5. Of forty-one (41) names listed on Duty Rosters, thirty-seven (37) files were located. Examination of the thirty-seven files shows the following:

a. All allege Col. Horan as inducting officer, (alleged inductions during the period 17 Dec 41 to 13 Apr 42).

b. Twenty-five (25) files are inconsistent regarding date of alleged induction, showing two or more dates.

This project was initiated in an attempt to verify the authenticity of Morning Reports (March and April 1942) and 2 Duty Rosters (covering period February to May 1942) pertaining to the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, submitted as the basis of a claim for benefits, under the provisions of PL 85-217, in the case of Simon Agnapan.
2. A history of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, has been previously compiled and is on file in Records Section, RPR Branch. This history contains a list of the names of 38 known members of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC. All those names, except Avelino Ancheta and Henry S. Bangyad, also appear in the Duty Rosters in question. The Duty Rosters and Morning Reports both indicate the strength of the enlisted men as 41.
3. Upon completion of a study of the Morning Reports in question it was noted that the initial entry in these records was on 4 March 1942, which shows, "Capt. Manriquez ordered verbally by Col. Horan PS reorganize 1st Bontoc Co." Aforementioned date is also the first date of strength accounting in the Morning Reports. These entries indicate that either Morning Reports were not being kept before the date Capt. Manriquez assumed command of the Company or that a new set of Morning Reports was started on that date. The initials of the authenticating officer, entered in the Morning Reports, after the remarks for each day, appear to be identical with the initials of Romulo A. Manriquez, contained in his records on file in this office. The entry of 4 March 1942, in the Morning Reports regarding Capt. Manriquez is compatible with the entries concerning him in the Diary of Col. Horan.
4. The back cover of the Duty Roster for April, May, and June 1942, contains a remark showing, "1st Bontoc Co, PC, Bontoc Bontoc, mass induction March 30 & 31, 1942 by Col. J. P. Horan, U.S. Army, with Major Haidrich & Capt. Guiter of U.S. Army 43d." However, the Morning Reports do not contain an entry nor any indication that this organization was ever inducted either as individuals or as a whole. In an affidavit of Julian N. Esquejo, who was Provincial Inspector of the Constabulary of Bontoc, it is stated that, "on 30 Jan 1942, I together with the officers and men of the 1st Bontoc Co were inducted into the service of the USAFFE by Col. John P. Horan." In an affidavit of Alfredo C. Abueg, who was the Junior Officer of the 1st Bontoc Co, it is stated, "that the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, was inducted into the USAFFE on 13 April 1942, by Col. John P. Horan, U S Army."
5. Of forty-one (41) names listed on Duty Rosters, thirty-seven (37) files were located. Examination of the thirty-seven files shows the following:
 - a. All allege Col. Horan as inducting officer, (alleged inductions during the period 17 Dec 41 to 13 Apr 42).
 - b. Twenty-five (25) files are inconsistent regarding date of alleged induction, showing two or more dates.

c. Seventeen (17) files contain a true copy of a certificate of induction. Certificates are dated 30, 31 Mar or 13 Apr 42. Five (5) files show dates other than shown on certificate of induction. A certificate in the file of "Francisco Calsiman" dated 31 Mar 42 (showing induction as of 31 Mar 42) lists thirteen (13) individuals. Seven (7) of these thirteen (13) do not have a certificate of induction in their file. (Six of these seven allege a date of induction other than 31 Mar 42.) One of the remaining files has an induction certificate dated 13 Apr 42 and one of the other individuals is listed in a certificate in the file of "Benito Gayochan" dated 13 Apr 42.

d. Ten files have been certified to VA. Five (5) as positive for USAFFE-PA service, four (4) based on pre-war archives (GO #17, dated 22 July 40, Memo dated 8 July 41, T/C of certificate of induction, GO #216, dated 11 Nov 41 and Unit History) one on interim policy. Five (5) files were certified as negative for USAFFE-PA service. Twenty-seven (27) files have no VA claim.

6. Discussion

a. Covers on Duty Roster in question indicate service for the period from January thru June 1942. The rosters cover the period from February thru May 1942 only. The back cover of "Duty Roster" (titled April-May-June 1942) contains a hand-written pencil notation of unknown origin and indeterminate age, that alleges the mass USAFFE induction of the 1st Bontoc Co, P.C., by Col. J. P. Horan on 30 & 31 March 1942.

b. The Bontoc Provincial PC Inspector, Julian N. Esquejo, alleged that the 1st Bontoc Co, PC was inducted by Col. Horan on 30 January 1942 (conflicts with "A"). This statement is in opposition to entry in Col. Horan's diary for 20 March 1942, date that he received authority to enlist all Filipinos who have been with any of his units since 1 January.

c. Alfredo C. Abueg, 1st Lt, Jr. Off. of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC alleged they (Company?) were inducted by Col. John P. Horan on 13 April 1942 (this is incompatible with "A" & "B" above). There is only one (1) individual who alleges induction on 13 April 1942 with no other conflicting allegation of date of induction. Seven (7) other individuals claim to have been inducted on 13 April 1942 but they also allege prior inductions. It is apparent that more individuals would have alleged being inducted on 13 April 1942 if a mass induction had been held.

d. Col. Horan's diary (excerpts in history of the 1st Bontoc Co., PC) indicates that he was in Bontoc on the following dates: 15, 16, 17 and 28 to 30 January 1942; 26 February to 4 March (at or near); 8 to 11 and 27 to 31 March 1942; and 12 to 15 April 1942. On 20 March 1942, USAFFE Hqs, radioed Col. Horan authorizing him "to enlist all Filipinos who have been with any of our units any time since 1 January." Col. Horan never included any information concerning the

c. Seventeen (17) files contain a true copy of a certificate of induction. Certificates are dated 30, 31 Mar or 13 Apr 42. Five (5) files show dates other than shown on certificate of induction. A certificate in the file of "Francisco Calsiman" dated 31 Mar 42 (showing induction as of 31 Mar 42) lists thirteen (13) individuals. Seven (7) of these thirteen (13) do not have a certificate of induction in their file. (Six of these seven allege a date of induction other than 31 Mar 42.) One of the remaining files has an induction certificate dated 13 Apr 42 and one of the other individuals is listed in a certificate in the file of "Benito Gayochan" dated 13 Apr 42.

d. Ten files have been certified to VA. Five (5) as positive for USAFFE-PA service, four (4) based on pre-war archives (GO #17, dated 22 July 40, Memo dated 8 July 41, T/C of certificate of induction, GO #216, dated 11 Nov 41 and Unit History) one on interim policy. Five (5) files were certified as negative for USAFFE-PA service. Twenty-seven (27) files have no VA claim.

6. Discussion

a. Covers on Duty Roster in question indicate service for the period from January thru June 1942. The rosters cover the period from February thru May 1942 only. The back cover of "Duty Roster" (titled April-May-June 1942) contains a hand-written pencil notation of unknown origin and indeterminate age, that alleges the mass USAFFE induction of the 1st Bontoc Co, P.C., by Col. J. P. Horan on 30 & 31 March 1942.

b. The Bontoc Provincial PC Inspector, Julian N. Esquejo, alleged that the 1st Bontoc Co, PC was inducted by Col. Horan on 30 January 1942 (conflicts with "A"). This statement is in opposition to entry in Col. Horan's diary for 20 March 1942, date that he received authority to enlist all Filipinos who have been with any of his units since 1 January.

c. Alfredo C. Abueg, 1st Lt, Jr. Off. of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC alleged they (Company?) were inducted by Col. John P. Horan on 13 April 1942 (this is incompatible with "A" & "B" above). There is only one (1) individual who alleges induction on 13 April 1942 with no other conflicting allegation of date of induction. Seven (7) other individuals claim to have been inducted on 13 April 1942 but they also allege prior inductions. It is apparent that more individuals would have alleged being inducted on 13 April 1942 if a mass induction had been held.

d. Col. Horan's diary (excerpts in history of the 1st Bontoc Co., PC) indicates that he was in Bontoc on the following dates: 15, 16, 17 and 28 to 30 January 1942; 26 February to 4 March (at or near); 8 to 11 and 27 to 31 March 1942; and 12 to 15 April 1942. e. Thirty-seven (37) files show induction during the period 17 December 1941 thru 13 April 1942. Approximately seventy-five (75) percent of these individuals allege induction in Bontoc by Col. Horan on dates that the diary of Horan shows he was in other named places. Twenty-five (25) of the thirty-seven (37) files show, two or more dates of induction, indicating a suspicious lack of knowledge. Seventeen (17) files contain a certified true copy of certificates of induction, indicating various dates of induction. Service of five (5) individuals was certified to the VA as positive for USAFFE-PA service based upon questionable archive information (see par 5d).

f. Although the records in question appear to be authentic and are for a period that is usually indicative of USAFFE-PA service, they do not contain sufficient evidence to establish that the Bontoc Co, PC was a duly inducted unit, or individuals listed therein were members of the USAFFE-PA.

7. Recommendation

In view of the foregoing it is recommended that the Duty Rosters and Morning Reports of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, covering the period February to May 1942 be accepted as Philippine Constabulary records and that no change be made to policy concerning the establishment of USAFFE-PA status (as stated in history of 1st Bontoc Co, PC) for listed individuals. Further recommend that the Duty Rosters and Morning Reports be filed as an appendix to the history of the 1st Bontoc Co, PC, on file in Records Section, RPR Branch and that a memo for record be placed in each identifiable 201 file indicating the existence of the history and stating that history and documents should be consulted prior to adjudication of case.
