

This recommendation was approved 2 Oct 59. (NOTE: Project 028 filed in Ref File of Hqs RPR BR)



In response to request from this office for information concerning OHTA Development Company 1943 - 1945, the USVA furnished a report (stamped confidential) containing background data, including pre-war, and extracts from CIC reports, pertaining to the company's general activities and functions in relation to the Japanese war effort. However, with the exception of numerous checks drawn against the company's accounts in the Yokohama Specie Bank, Manila Branch 1942 - 1944, (cys of 12 checks incl with report) the USVA and sources available to that office, were unable to locate any records or documents pertinent to activities and functions of personnel during period 1943 - 1945.

2. Report included the following information concerning claims for VA benefits by individuals who worked for the company involved:

"Claims for VA benefits have been received from claimants identified as having worked for OHTA Development Company. In most of these cases, the claimants would have it believed that they were brought to Davao as prisoners of war placed under the custody of the company, and forced to work in the plantations. Upon further inquiry it appears these claimants voluntarily or either in parole status, worked for the firm and received remuneration in the nature of living wages, rations, and other forms of subsistance not usually given a POW. The then Central Committee on Waivers and Forfeitures, Central Office, Washington, D. C., in considering the question of forfeiture of rights of a claimant (Procalla, Roberto L. C-17 815 440) who performed services under the Japanese including employment with the cited firm, rendered a decision on February 25, 1955, that sustained employment therein constituted rendering aid and assistance to the enemy.

- 3. The foregoing information indicates the VA does not consider alleged periods of POW or forced labor under custody of the OHTA Development Company, as acceptable evidence of POW service.
- 4. This evidence supports the previous recommendation (Project 028 8 Dec 58) that alleged periods at OHTA Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao, not be considered POW status.
- 5. No record or roster that lists names of individuals employed by OHTA Development Company has been found. 

- 9. In addition to the aforementioned 201 files, an extended search was made for archival records, diaries or any other evidence revealing information pertinent to POW service, forced labor or employment at Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao. However, this search failed to disclose any record or information relating to alleged place of POW or forced labor.
- 10. An analysis of the evidence contained in this study, concerning the period subsequent to confinement at Malaybalay, indicates that, although the individuals claim they were performing forced labor, the statements of many revealed contrary information regarding conditions usually prevalent at POW camps. Some claim they were accorded liberties and privileges including freedom of movement in and around the plantation area. Others stated that they received pay and other benefits, amounting to normal wages of the time, place and conditions, which indicates employee status rather than POW. These statements, plus the fact that many abandoned this employment without any apparent attempt by the Japanese to apprehend them, casts doubt on their alleged POW status during period involved.
- 11. In view thereof, and in the absence of any contrary official evidence, it is recommended that the alleged periods at Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao, not be considered POW status.



- 6. The foregoing data indicates that in almost all of the determinations involving alleged POW or forced labor at Malaybalay and Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao, the WCC certifications show the earliest terminating date of POW status. These certifications appear to be in accordance with WCC policy and reflect the earliest date claimants allege POW service at Malaybalay terminated. Under WCC policy, alleged POW or forced labor subsequent to confinement at Malaybalay was certified as not being POW service.
- 7. Reports of investigation located in several 201 files revealed the following information:
- a. Field Investigation in the case of Wenceslao U. Alcopra, service number 1038-E-26689 disclosed that numerous civilians were employed by and resided at the Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao, prior to and during the Japanese occupation.
- b. Loyalty Status Board Investigation in the case of Florentino F. Susalo, service number 067 987, contains his sworn statement to the effect that he received pay for alleged POW or forced labor at Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao; the plantation was managed by a Japanese civilian; the area was not inclosed by barbed wire; he was allowed freedom of movement in the plantation and was given Sunday passes to a distance of 2 kilometer away without guard; released 14 Dec 44 on the guarantee of his wife. (FM 23 shows married 13 Dec 44, at Davao City)
- c. Loyalty Status Board Investigation in the case of Angel A. Tadlas, service number 220 810, disclosed that although under repeated questioning he consistently refused to admit having received any pay, he did claim that a hospital fee of P110.00 was paid for by the Japanese, and in payment of such amount he was made to work in the Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao.
- 8. The foregoing examination of the 201 files of the individuals involved in this project indicates that:
- a. The Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation, Davao was a Japanese Controlled Agency managed by Japanese civilians.
- b. Some individuals received food, lodging and pay, comparable to normal salaries earned by Philippine civilians during the Japanese occupation.
 - c. The individuals had freedom of movement in and around the plantation area.
- d. Many were able to abandon their employment in the plantation area and nothing has been found to indicate the Japanese made any attempt to apprehend and return them to their employment.

- 1. This project initiated as result of a letter from Mrs. Lucia G. Banaag dated 18 June 1958 with 2 affidavits, appearing both VA and WCC certifications and claiming that her son, the late Prudencio D. Banaag, was still a prisoner of war at the time he was killed by the Japanese on 1 May 1945, at Biao Plantation, Davao City.
- 2. Archive reports in subject's 201 file show that he was a POW at Malaybalay, and indicate he was assigned to Company No. 2, while confined at that POW camp. Archive reports fail to show any record that subject was a POW subsequent to his confinement at Malaybalay. However, his 201 file contains affidavits wherein the affiants allege subject was brought from Malaybalay to Davao and was forced to work as a POW at the Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation in Davao. One affiant also states that subject was the Sergeant-in-charge of his group at the plantation.
- 3. In connection with the foregoing allegations regarding POW or forced labor, a search was made for 201 files of individuals confined at Malaybalay and claiming subsequent POW or forced labor at Ohta Development Company, Abaca Plantation in Davao. This search included the 201 files of affiants attesting to deceased veteran's POW or forced labor, names listed on Company No. 2, Malaybalay POW Roster, and Field Investigation Reports.
- 4. The foregoing search resulted in the location of 201 files for 25 individuals who claimed such POW or forced labor, and upon further examination revealed the following information:

This will conclude that my deceased veteran sen is a genuine member of the Armed Forces of the United States of America (USAFFE), and in this connection please certify the fact and please furnish one copy each to the Veterans Administration, Central Office, Washington 25, D.C., the Director Claim Service in connection with my deceased claim of my sen, Ex-Sgt Prudencio D. Bausag per claim no indicated above at top margin.

Also furnish one copy of that certification to the War Claim Commission in connection with my claim for additional benefit as a Prisoner of War of the Japanese Emperial Forces in the Philippines.

I wish I could have furnished each copy to the US Veterans Administration, Central Office, Washington 25, D.C., and the WCCommission so that they will readily believed that my son be a member fully of the Armed Forces of the United States (USAFFE) and died in line of duty on May 1, 1945.

- I, FELIX U. Estrada, ox-Private Engineer, with Army Serial No. 220821 (3, of legal age, married, after having been duly sworn to according to law, hereby depose and say:
- 1. That I am a reservist, UMAFFE called to active duty on December 15,1941 assigned Engineer Battalion, 101st Division and inducted by Captain Rose Miller (USA) on December 15,1941 at Camp Evangelista, Cagayan Misamis Oriental, Mindanao, Philippines.
- 2. That I personally know ex-Sergeant PRUDENCIO BANAAG, USAFFE assigned "B" Company, Engineer Battalion 101st Division. We were together when we surrendered to the Japanese on May 10,1942 at Malaybalay, Bukidnon until he was bayoneted killed to death by the Japanese on May 1, 1955 at Biao Plantation, Davao City. On May 10, 1942 to Jarmary 10,1943 we were yet at Malaybalay, Bukidnon, we reached Cagayan, Misamis Oriental on board S.S. Escano boat on January 11,1943 going to Davao City arrived January 17,1943.
- 3. That we Engineer personnel were separated from different branch of service as that of Infantry, Medical, and Signal Corp. We same branch of service Engineer Battalion were separated to an stationed in one barrack only in the concentration camp at Biao Plantations Davao City.
- 4. That since from the firing line sometime in January 1942 we were together fighting side by side against the Japanese until we were in the concentration camp from Malaybalay, Bukidnon to Davao City until I personally saw him bayoneted killed to death on May 1,1945 by the Japanese at Biao Plantation, Davao City.

- 3. That I personally saw ex-Sergeant PRUDENCIO BANAAG bayoneted killed to death on May 1, 1945 at Bano Plantation, Davao City. He was assigned "B" Company Engineer Battalion 101st Division.
- 4. That I know the aforementioned facts because we were in the same barrack, and concentration camp where we also very close together from the time we
 were concentrated by the Japanese on Maylo, 1942 at Malaybalay, Bukidnon until
 I personally saw him bayoneted killed to death by the Japanese on May 1, 1945 at
 Biao Plantation Davao City.
