1. The reproduction of rosters of guerrilla organizations as furnished by Guerrilla commanders to Guerrilla Affairs Division, US Army and a complete set of the official recognized rosters have been requested by the Republic of the Philippines.

2. There are approximately 62,150 pages of organizational rosters and 8,100 pages of the official recognized rosters which will have to be reproduced. Total reproductions will be 70,250 pages.

3. Comparison of the three (3) methods of reproduction are as follows:

A. Photostat method: To reproduce the 70,250 pages would require approximately Seventy (70) days at a cost of eight (8) or nine (9) cents per copy. (Total costs \$5650 to \$6300)

B. Autostat method: To reproduce the 70,250 pages would require approximately 260 man days. (Several machines could be put into operation) Reproductions cost about eleven (11) cents to twelve (12) cents per copy (\$7750 to \$8450) Special efforts would have to be expended to gather supplies for a project of this magnitude.

C. Copy-Flo method: This method is only limited by the number of images that can be taken by a microfilm camera and to the number of pages that can be printed. Camera limitation is estimated at 5,000 per day. If a camera can be rented and devoted exclusively to this project, it would require approximately fifteen (15) days to complete all reproductions.

Based on the cost of six (6) cents per copy of ~~normal work and adding one and one-half (1 1/2) cents per copy for rental expense and additional cost of legal size reproductions~~, it is estimated that cost would be ~~\$5300~~ ^{\$4650}.

Based on the foregoing, it is apparent that the Copy-Flo would be the most expeditious, uniform and cheapest method of ~~producing~~ reproduction.

4. The Guerrilla Affairs Division (GAD) organizational folders are tabbed to indicate the rosters to be reproduced. The following plan for reproduction is recommended:

- A. Remove GAD folder from file
- B. Extract papers to be reproduced
- C. Place papers in folder bearing identical GAD file number (Folders containing identical GAD numbers are available)
- D. Microfilm contents of each folder
- E. Compare reproductions with originals (Take necessary steps to have illegible copies reproduced)
- F. Place reproductions in folder and return original papers to GAD file.
- G. Refile GAD folders and keep folders containing reproductions in order.

5. The official recognized rosters ~~which are to be reproduced~~ can be reproduced ~~XXXX~~ from "Work Copies". The following plan for reproduction is recommended:

- A. Remove Work Copy of rosters to be reproduced from file and remove papers from under Acco fasteners.
 - B. Make folders identical to those containing work copy of Official rosters and place papers to be reproduced therein.
 - C. Microfilm contents of each folder.
 - D. Compare reproductions against originals. (Take necessary steps to have illegible copies reproduced)
 - E. Place reproductions in appropriate folders.

6. To assure completion of this project each folder containing the official recognized rosters should be cross-referenced to the GAD folder containing information on identical Guerrilla Unit. (Note: Many GAD folders will have no counterpart with recognized rosters.)

7. An alphabetical index to the GAD folders is available. An index to the recognized rosters can be reproduced.

8. Recommended personnel requirements to handle this project are as follows:

A. One (1) clerk to remove papers from folders, and replace papers in folders after reproduction.

B. One (1) microphotographer

C. One (1) clerk-typist to make necessary folders, cross-references etc.

The duties of one (1) clerk can be absorbed by this section. Clerk-typist and microphotographer are not available in Section or Branch.

Dear Dr. Noble:

Reference is made to your letter dated 29 September 1958 requesting a report regarding a request by the Chairman, Philippine Veterans Claims Commission for guerrilla records or microfilms thereof. Action on the request was suspended pending receipt of the legislative history to Republic of the Philippines Act 1889.

It is the opinion of the Department of the Army that information contained in the guerrilla records should not be made available to the Philippine Veterans Claims Commission for the following reasons:

a. Release of the information would no doubt result in pressure being brought to bear upon the U. S. Government to reopen the guerrilla recognition program. Republic Act 1889 authorizes the Philippine Veterans Claims Commission to negotiate further benefits on behalf of those individuals who were not granted guerrilla recognition by the United States.

b. Republic Act 1889 states that a great number of Filipino guerrilla claims were unjustly denied by the United States. The position of the United States is that all deserving individuals were granted guerrilla recognition. In connection with this matter, there is attached a copy of a diplomatic note to the Department of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Philippines, dated 25 May 1950. This note sets forth emphatically the position of the United States with respect to its guerrilla determinations and the release of data from guerrilla records. There have been no new developments warranting a change to the position stated in the note.

c. Guerrilla records have been administered under a strict policy which limits access to and release of information from the records. This

policy was adopted to safeguard against the disclosure of information obtained in confidence in the course of investigations. Release of such information would prove to be embarrassing to the United States Government.

The U. S. Army prepared a roster of individuals who were granted guerrilla recognition. A copy of the roster was furnished the Philippine Army, however this copy was not kept current. The Department of the Army will make available to the Philippine Veterans Claims Commission a reproduction of a current roster to replace the one previously furnished the Philippine Army.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that only a copy of the roster of individuals granted guerrilla recognition by the United States be furnished the Philippine Veterans Claims Commission.

AN ACT CREATING A COMMISSION DISPOSE OF
ALL UNSETTLED CLAIMS OF FILIPINO VETERANS.

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 21 of President Osmeña,
dated October 28, 1944, declared all persons who were
actually serving in military forces in the Philippines under
a commander who has been appointed, designated or re-
cognized by the Commander in Chief, Southwest Pacific
Area to be entitled to all the rights and privileges of
members of recognized guerrilla organizations;

WHEREAS, the said Executive Order was subsequently
embodied in Circular No. 100 of the USAFFE headquarters
dated November 17, 1944, and its provisions partly im-
plemented by the United States Government;

WHEREAS, there are still a great number of Filipino Vet-
erans who, during the last war, actively served in military
forces in the Philippines under a commander duly ap-
pointed, designated or recognized by the Commander in
Chief of the Southwest Pacific Area but who have not
been extended the rights and privileges by members of
recognized guerrilla organizations;

WHEREAS, at the time R.P.D. (Recovered Personnel)
Division which was established by the United States in
the Philippines for the purpose of processing and deciding
upon the merits of claims presented before said organiza-
tion and directing payment thereof was closed, there were
around 5,000 claims involving the amount of \$70,000,000
which have already been processed and approved but with-
out any known justified reasons were not paid; and

WHEREAS, according to our knowledge and belief many
other claims similar to the 5,000 claims referred to in the
preceding paragraph were also unjustly denied by the
R.P.D.

NOW, THEREFORE, in fairness and in justice to Filipino veterans who have been unjustly denied the benefits due them,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION. 1. There is hereby created a Commission to process, determine, screen and adjudicate all unsettled claims of Filipino veterans to work and make negotiations for more benefits for Filipino Veterans from the Government of the United States in conjunction with such other diplomatic or other agencies of the Philippine Government working in favor of the veterans.

SECTION. 2. The Commission herein created shall be known as the Veterans Claims Commission under the Office of the President and shall be composed of one Chairman and two members to be appointed by the President with the approval of the Commission on appointments. The Chairman shall receive an annual compensation of twelve thousand pesos and each Member, ten thousand pesos. The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

1. To appoint its own personnel and fix their compensation;
2. To prescribe rules and regulations to carry into effect the provisions of this Act; and
3. With the approval of the President, it may establish a branch office in Washington D.C. or send representatives to the United States to work for benefits to Filipino veterans.
4. Request the government of the United States directly or through the President or the Ambassador of the Philippines in the United States to turn over to the Commission all the papers, evidences, or certified copies thereof, of Filipino veterans whose claims have been denied filed with the R.P.D.

SEC. 3. The members of the Commission shall at the time of their appointment be citizens of the Philippines:

Provided, however, That at least one member of the Commission shall be a veteran of the last world war of good standing; and another a member of the bar who has practiced law for at least five years prior to his appointment or held during a like period an office in the Philippine Government requiring admission to the practice of law as an indispensable requisite.

SECTION. 4. Any person who shall file, in whole or in part, a false claim, or certify to such claim knowing the same to be false, shall be imprisoned for a period of from six to twelve years.

SECTION. 5. All claims of veterans shall be disposed of by the Commission within the period of three years from the date of the approval of this Act. All records of the defunct Screen Board shall be turned over to the Commission.

SECTION. 6. The sum of three hundred thousand pesos is hereby authorized to be appropriated out of any funds in the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated to carry out the provisions of this Act. The Commission should render report within a year from the approval of this Act stating the amount needed to pay in cash or in certificates the claims of the veterans and their widows and orphans so that the necessary amount may be included in the annual Appropriation Act.

SECTION. 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

12. An alternate proposal for consideration is to furnish, the initial rosters and the officially approved reconstructed rosters with any changes and corrections thereto. This would make available all names submitted by purported guerrilla leaders on rosters and the final officially approved rosters with any changes thereto. At present rosters maintained by the Philippine Veterans Board and The Adjutant General, Armed Forces of the Philippines are not consistent with the record copies of USARCEN. Their files still contain revoked rosters and other changes prior to 30 June 1948 were apparently not posted to the appropriate approved rosters. The estimated costs to accomplish this alternate proposal is \$9,777.27.

13. The foregoing information is furnished as a basis for considering the propriety and effect in either favorable or unfavorable action on the current request. Nothing herein should be construed as favorably recommending reopening of the Guerrilla Recognition Program. The request has been considered in the light that the Philippine Guerrilla situation has remained unsettled in the minds of thousands of Filipinos and any honest intent on the part of their government warrants serious consideration. Furnishing "releaseable information" on a "need to know" or "justified" basis may in this instance be in the best interest of both the U. S. and the Philippine Governments.

1. References:

a. Letter, Armed Forces Attaché, Philippine Embassy, Washington, dated 22 August 1958 (Incl 1).

b. Letter, Headquarters, National Defense Forces, Quezon City, Philippines (undated). Subject: Evidence and Allied Supporting Papers of Individuals and Organizations Denied Guerrilla Recognition, with 7 indorsements and 11 incls, (Incl 2).

2. The requested records are a part of the Guerrilla Affairs Division files maintained in Recovered Personnel Records Branch, USARCEN.

3. The information is for use in processing of claims to the Philippine Veterans Claims Commission. The latter was established by Philippine law and the understood purpose and intent includes discussions at government to government level of the now closed U. S. Army Guerrilla Recognition Program and presentation of evidence.

4. Specifically requested are "initial rosters", "individual applications", and "Determination sheets". These terms have accepted meanings as follows:

a. "Initial rosters" are those submitted by purported guerrilla leaders, containing the names of purported members arranged by company, battalion, regiment, etc.

b. "Individual applications" for recognition are those submitted by purported guerrilla members or their next of kin for individual recognition.

c. "Determination sheets", in this instance can be assumed to mean the correspondence showing the action, favorable or unfavorable, on either the Unit or the individual applications.

5. Essential to the consideration of this request is the indisputable United States ownership of these records. The Guerrilla Affairs Division records are distinct from those which were at one time, considered for eventual release to the Philippine Republic when no longer required by the U. S. Army. The guerrilla

recognition activities were never a function of the Philippine Army, nor were any of these records in their custody or use in any manner whatsoever which would furnish a basis for approval of the request for their return. A previous "Screening Board" established under earlier Philippine directives was denied access.

6. The current request includes as an alternate, authority to microfilm the records so that the commission can start processing applications intelligently and without delay.

7. The Guerrilla Affairs Division records consists of Unit and individual application files.

a. The unit files are maintained as a separate entity of approximately 168,000 sheets in 1,392 separate folders or 96 lineal feet. They consist of:

- (1) Initial rosters
- (2) Team Leader Reports (consisting of the evidence, investigations, evaluations, recommendations, approvals and disapprovals)
- (3) Record copy of official actions
- (4) The officially approved reconstructed rosters
- (5) Any changes or corrections subsequently approved (none after 30 June 1948)

b. The "individual application" files are not maintained separately. These files were interfiled with the 800,000 individual claims and service files of Philippine Army claimants for arrears in pay and other benefits. An index of 52,000 individual application files acted on by Guerrilla Affairs Division is available. An estimated 11,500 of these files have been consolidated with the Master file for the individual. The average individual application file contains 20 sheets and consists of:

- (1) Application form
- (2) Evidence in the form of induction papers
- (3) Affidavits on periods of service
- (4) Affidavits or other evidence of promotion
- (5) Proof of marriage, births, etc.
- (6) Affidavits on injury, wound or death of alleged guerrilla

8. The Unit files, specifically the "Team Leader Reports, pose the principal objection or obstacle to release of copies of the entire files. These "Reports" constitute the investigations made, the evaluations, recommendations, concurrences, approvals, and disapprovals. Incorporated in these "Reports" are statements favorable or unfavorable of many recognized guerrilla leaders and others concerning their knowledge of guerrilla organizations and personnel. The record shows that this information was for the exclusive use of the U. S. Government. The resulting effect would be to eliminate some of the most important essentials and evidence used to establish the number of individuals, the periods of recognition, and the various components of the purported organizations to be approved.

9. Certain aspects of the guerrilla recognition program may be considered as establishing a basis for releasing copies of these records are as follows:

a. Recognition was approved in two phases. First, for an initial period usually beginning in January 1945. Second, for many units a revised period setting back the date to 1942, 1943, or 1944.

b. The first rosters were not always approved as recommended. Names, grades and periods of service were changed. Many initially approved rosters were later reconstructed. This resulted in changes, the more serious being deletion of names or revocation of the entire roster of certain components. Units not favorably considered for initial recognition under one designation might have subordinate components recognized under a separate designation or only a casualty roster recognized to the exclusion of all others.

c. The separate consideration in establishing dates of recognition beginning in 1942, 1943, and 1944 resulted in many units not being favorably considered for any revised date. Those favorably approved were either by units, rosters, or a composite roster of all personnel of the command. Reconstructed rosters in many instances constitutes the final action of Guerrilla Affairs Division. Revocations of Unit rosters for revised periods also were effected. The results are that many persons on officially approved initial rosters and recommended by their guerrilla leader are not on the officially approved revised reconstructed roster.

d. Many of these persons were paid arrears in pay on the basis of the first rosters approved by the Guerrilla Affairs Division. This was possible because reconstruction of rosters was one of the last phases prior to closing date, 30 June 1948. These same persons applying for Veterans Administration benefits if not on the final rosters have no recognized service. Also where a person is only listed on an initial roster his alleged service prior to that date is not recognized because he is not on a roster with a revised date of recognition.

10. The Philippine Veterans Board, an agency corresponding to our Veterans Administration, approves pensions payable from Philippine Republic funds, until the claim is favorably acted upon by the U. S. Veterans Administration. Favorable action by the Philippine Veterans Board has no effect in the reporting of service data by USARCEN to the U. S. Veterans Administration. The purpose in bringing that agency into this consideration is twofold. First, the information to be found in the Guerrilla Affairs Division records, if furnished, could either establish a basis of a claim being approved or denied benefits from their Philippine Veterans Board. Second, the paying of pensions and compensation to guerrillas by the Philippine Veterans Board, will eventually be presented as liabilities of the U. S. Government arising out of World War II.

11. The estimated costs which would be involved in furnishing the material requested is as follows:

a. Searching, screening, refiling approximately 52,000 individual files.

The Philippine Veterans Claims Commission, created under Republic Act No. 1889, will soon start processing application forms to determine who are entitled for benefits under said Act. Benefits will come from the Philippine Government. In order that the Commission could process each claim justly and equitably, there is an imperative necessity of securing the "initial rosters", "individual application for guerrilla" and "determination sheets" of all former members of guerrilla units whose rosters were submitted to the defunct Guerrilla Affairs Division, AFNESPAC, and which are presently in the United States Army Records Depository at St. Louis, Missouri. There are no copies of these records existing in the Philippines except for a few.

In order, therefore, that the determination of the Commission as to whether or not a certain applicant should be entitled to said benefits could be made authoritative or would be supported by some documentary evidence, it is very essential that the records mentioned above be made available to the Veterans Claims Commission.

The assistance of your Office is, therefore, requested to have these records returned to the Philippine Government. If this is not feasible, authority to microfilm said records by the Philippine Veterans Claims Commission be secured so that the Commission can start processing applications intelligently and without delay.
