

- 1. Forwarded for your information are two reports concerning a conversation with and an investigation of Capt Thomas McCremmens.
- 2. Capt McCremmens originally submitted an individual request for recognition. At the same time his name was included on the roster of Co "A," 45th Infantry, Barrion's Division which was pending investigation for recognition and inclusion with the Saber Force.
- 3. The above unit was recognized but the name of Capt McCremmens was withdrawn by this branch as a result of the investigations of both Lts Wilcox and Allen. The attached reports are subsequent to the unfavorable decision on this individual, initiated because he returned to this branch to inquire as to why his name was stricken from the list.

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MEMORANDUM: (Conversation of Maj Murray and Lt Wilcox with McCremmens, 4 Oct 46)

I Captain Thomas McCremmons

- a. 3rd Lt, 33rd Infantry, 31st Division, ex-USAFFE, escaped from Bataan after surrender.
- b. 0/a April 1942 he joined 5th Battalion of Maj Bermudez of the 45th Infantry under Colonel Ocario Santos.
- c. 0/a April 1943, by order of Maj Bermudez he joined Philippine Constabulary and was later transferred to the Manila Police Force.
- d. His duties in the MPF consisted of maintaining peace and order in Manila, Mariquina, Pasig, San Mateo, Montalban Morong, Tanay, Teresa etc. He arrested men for their own good yet at the same time claimed to have never personally arrested any man. When Japanese raided houses he went with them but claimed he did not point out nor instigate the raid.
- e. In the zonification the Kempetais went from district to district using the magic eye. He claimed to have seen the magic eye in operation only once. He stated that the zonifications were most active in 1944 at the time of the landing in Leyte.
- f. In September and October many PC officers deserted with their weapons. McCremmens knew they had deserted but did not know why nor where they had gone. He remained but was arrested by the Japanese on suspicion and confined in the Air Port Studio.
- g. Claimed that o/a September 1944 at the time of the first bombings in Manila, he escaped at noon by jumping into the Pasig River and swimming to the market place.
- h. Also claimed that he escaped in December 1944 by the abovementioned process. This escape was managed 15 December after his confinement.
- i. After his escape he hid in Calabas Road, Balic Balic.

 He gathered some sixty men of the 5th Battalion, 45th Infantry, which were under his command and informed them to be on the alert, this in December. Maj Bermudez at that time, according to McCremmens, was still operating with his Charity or Rehabilitation organization which supposedly was helping ex-USAFFE

men. According to Bermudez he ceased his work with that organization sometime in the middle of 1943.

- j. The Americans entered Manila on 5 February 1945 and McCremmens met them with a truck and 15 or 16 men. Benito Legarda, cousin of General Valdez, and Mr. Gerospi can vouch for his activities.
- k. During the liberation of Manila he led the 2nd Squadron, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division to Mariquina. He could not remember names of any American officers with whom he worked. He claimed that he did not know anything about recognitions although he was informed (by me) that it was a commonly known fact, particularly amongst the Marking's guerrillas, that recognitions were to be extended to the guerrillas when the Americans landed.
- 1. Combat in Batangas and Tayabas. In March he and his men went from Calamba to Sto Tomas*, to Tanauan* where he and 16 Filipinos together with the 2nd Squadron engaged the Japanese. After that his units gathered and only the Americans fought engagements in Batangas. During April and May his unit entered Tayabas and passed through Calumbay* Infanta*, and Lucena.
- m. Claimed he never caused the death of any guerrillas. Swore that his conscience was clear. Stated that he could get a job nowhere because he had not been recognized. Was asked why he had not thought of the consequences of joining the Philippine Constabulary. Was told that his case was closed.
- n. Captain Beltran was discharged from PC during the occupation for drilling men on the plaza and holding up traffic for half a day. Beltran is still alive, was seen by McCremmens two months ago.
- o. Bermudez, according to McCremmens, played a slick game with the Rehabilitation and Relief organization.

2. Comments on Statements made by Thomas McCremmens:

a. During the meeting with McCremmens, at which Lt Wilcox was present with myself, he, McCremmens, continually made contradictory statements and gave evasive answers. Most notable was his claim that he escaped from the Air Port Studio in September and then not two minutes later stated that it was December. First he said he never arrested any Filipinos but then he stated that he arrested some "for their own good." Although he was aware of the fact that a large number of PC Officers and men deserted in September and October, he did not know why they had nor did he join them. Instead, he hung on to his job and was finally thrown into the Air Port Studio on suspicion. He claims that he escaped at noon by diving into the Pasig River and swimming to the market place. This claim is believed to be patently false since an escape during bread daylight and by swimming in a river would be tantamount to suicide. After his escape he could not give any details as to the functioning of his troops, his responsibilities, their responsibilities or anybody's responsibilities. In explaining the fact that he knew no American officers of the 2nd Squadron by name, he stated that he was not aware of the need for gathering attachment papers nor, at first, was he aware that recognition had been promised guerrillas even before the landings. He later changed his statement to say that he was aware of the fact but could not give no further reason for not even knowing the 2nd Squadron (Battalion) Commander nor any of the Troop Commanders nor any of the Platoon Commanders. His accounts of his combat activities in Batangas and Tayabas were extremely sketchy and gave no facts whatsoever. When asked if he had caused the deaths of any guerrillas he stated that he had not, but when informed that this branch had the information to the contrary, he seemed somewhat surprised. In an initial interview with McCremmens sometime in June or July 1946, McCremmens stated to me that his desire for recognition was due primarily so that he could get sufficient money to return to his wife and children in the United States. On 4 October 1946 he made no mention of this original desire on his part but complained only that he was unable to get a job because he was not recognized. McCremmens has been investigated by Lts Allen and Wilcox at different times and both have uncovered essentially the same information concerning him. Any further attempt by him to gain recognition should be turned down with no further investigation. The man was definitely a collaborator who, like many other collaborators, joined up during the liberation days in an effort to cover up his past activities. Any affidavit submitted in his behalf by Major Bermudez should be completely discounted since Major Bermudez himself is a character whose activities and intentions during the occupation are open to severe question.

MEMORANDUM: (Investigation of Tomas McCremmens's record while stationed as a Sgt in the Japanese sponsored PC in the town of Binangonan, Rizal)

On 19 October 1946, on the advice of Marcial Villanueva of Marikina, Rival, Lt Wilcox and M/Sgt Songsong proceeded to Binangonan, Rival, a 2d class municipality on the eastern shore of Laguna de Bay, 38 kms from Manila, to investigate the record of Towas McGremmens who was stationed as a Sgt in the Japanese sponsored PC in that town for a period during the years 1943 and 1944.

Information as to the record of McCremmens can be easily obtained anywhere around the town of Binangonan. McCremmens has a nasty record in this town covering pro-Jap leanings, furnishing information against Filipinos and hunting down, arresting, torturing, even causing the death of several Filipinos in this town and its out lying barries.

According to the people of this town, 117 people were victims of McOremmens's cruelty during his tour of duty with the PC in this town. Seven, or more, of these victims were killed or died later. The following listed people were among McOremmens's victims, and they may be found in the town of Binangonan, Rizal to testify yet further against Tomas McOremmens:

In 1943 after the Japanese conified the barrie of Tayuman, Binangonan, Bgt Tomas McCremmens of the PC went to that barrie and arrested Pedro Simagala and brought him to the Rizal Cement Plant, Hq of the PC and the Japanese Military Porces. After two days of torturing by McCremmens's PC Force, and the Japanese, Simagala was sentenced to death and executed for guerrilla activities. It is believed that McCremmens induced the Japs to bring about Simagala's execution.

Alfonso Arabit was arrested by McCremmens, grilled as to the whereabouts of Col Marking Agustin and Lt Mendoza and location of different outposts of Marking's Guerrillas. Because no information could be obtained from Arabit, he was left hanging throughout the night by McCremmens, by his wrists which were lashed together behind his back. The next morning Arabit was taken down and was beaten in the abdomen with a baseball bat. As a result of this torture at the hands of McCremmens, Arabit was a helpless cripple for a month.

Col Marking Agustin, CO of Marking's Fil-American Troops, the guerrilla unit which dominated this region, was contacted and stated that he has been siming to and in the near future will see to it that McCremmens will be arrested and held to face the charges of brutality and pro-Jap activities.

In the opinion of this investigating officer, McCremmens was pro-Japanese and in furnishing information against, hunting down, arresting, torturing and even causing the death of several Filipinos, he was a direct aid to the Japanese war offort.

In investigating this case, the surname of Tomas McCremmens has been found spelled in four or more different ways. It is quite possible that the spelling of his name in this report is one of the incorrect ways.

Attached to this report are the affidavits from three of McCreumens's victims.



Thru Channels-

1. The name of Captain Thomas Mc Cromens was not included in the inclosure number 3 on (letter dated July 22, 1945W-3ind.) request was sent for approval, his name was not included because of clerical error but however, in compliance with the instructions of Major Miller officer in charge of the guerilla afrairs in your office at that time instructed me to make a duplicate copy of the same including his pame.

2. The right of Captain Mc Cromens name to be included for

recognition is leased in the following reasons .

(a) Captain Mc Cremens was inducted to the fefth (5) battalien 45 th Infantry Regement organized by the undersigned and Colonel John E. Hoover USSAFFE who escaped from the battlefield in Bataan after the surrender of Bataan so that Colonel Hoover was not brought in the concretation camp.

(b) Captain Mc Cromens was a second Lieutenant in the

Philippine Army: USSAFFE also fought in Bataan.

(c) He was with this unit attached to this cavalry (\$\forall th) second brigade under the command of General Huge Heffman on February 3rd up to Mażch 24 where he was wounded in action without the knowledge of the undersigned and the 7th caralry so that at the time the 45 th infantry rooster was prefered his name was not included but however his name was registered as missing in the office of the adjutant of the 7th caralry.

(d) Captain Mc Cremens reported to this unit after he was

released from the field hospital in Intramuros .

(e) On June 30th by order of General Hoopman this unit became the 4th battalien of the sater force which was organized by the 1st. cavalry division as a page of guerilla organization to take charge of the remainding unconquered mountainous town of the province of Tayabas of which Colonel Alfredo Veleso is Chief of Staff and who signed the 1st. endersement recommending approval knowing fully then of all the circumstances in his case and also because from the 30th of June 1945 of this date Captain Mc Cromens has rendered services.

(f) Captain Mc Cremens was a commissioned officer second Lieutenant in the Philippine Army which fought in Bataan

under General Bolmel and Major Holmes.

(g) Captain Mc Cremens was also commissioned as Captain and inducted into this unit on April 1943.

3. Captain Mc Cremens has not reported to the USSAFFE or to the Philippine Army on the ground that he was in active service in this unit besides the undersigned understand that all USSAFFE men need not report to the US\$AFFE headquarters upon the arrival of the American forces in Manila because he was then in active duty as a commissioned efficer (Captain of this unit attached with the 7th cavalry as stated above.

4. In view of the foregoing explanation Capation Mc Cremens should be recognized in fairness to the service rendered by nim like other guerilla officers that justice should be accorded to

whom it is due.
