- 1. Radio contact was made with Lt Col Guillermo Nakar on 29 June 1942 through the War Department on an intercept.
- 2. The first message to Makar from MacArthur sent from Port Darwin, Australia reads as follows:

"(NAKAR) KRANAPEONG, JAVA PKIJC

June 30, 1942.

THE COURAGEOUS AND SPLENDID RESISTANCE MAINTAINED BY YOU AND YOUR COMMAND FILLS ME WITH PRIDE AND SATISFACTION STOP IT WILL BE MY PRIVILEGE TO SEE THAT YOU AND YOUR OFFICERS AND MEN ARE PROPERLY REWARDED AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME STOP UNDER EXISTING CIRCUMSTANCES THE GREATEST SERVICE THAT YOU CAN RENDER IS THROUGH FURNISHING OF INFORMATION STOP OBTAIN THE WIDEST POSSIBLE COVERAGE THROUGH YOUR AGENTS AND MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO MAINTAIN YOUR RADIO STATION REPORTING SUCH INFORMATION AS YOU CAN GATHER STOP MY AFFECTION AND BEST WISHES

5. Later, certain recommendations from Makar for promotions of officers were approved by CinC and special orders cut by CHQ, SWPA. The writer of the letter does not appear in the list of recommended officers nor in the special order. However the radio file to Makar is not complete. Several messages were lost, both those from SWPA and from Makar. Nakar stated he had placed his rosters in a safe place (perhaps the subject person knows where this is).

6. It col Nakar was captured in the late fall of 1942, and his radio with him, After that time the majority of his force broke up, some surrendering and the others breaking away to go home or join other units.

#### DISCUSSION

- 1. The 14th Infantry was authorized by GHQ, SWPA in July 42, and all personnel formerly PA became AUS. There is no indication that civilian volunteers, if any, had other than PA status.
- 2. Records of strength as of July 1942 are available and list of certain officer promotions are available. The roster of the organization was kept by Lt Col Makar and is presumed lost.
- 3. Radio quoted by subject person was transmitted and is, in meaning, correctly restated.
  - 4. The letter of 26 April 1945 to TAC, PA cannot be located.

Dear General MacArthur,

Sir, I have been waiting for a chance to see you personally but because I do not seem to have any hope of having that chance, I dared to write you this personal letter.

I was the CO of the Hq. & Hq. Co., lst Bn., 71st Infantry, 71st Division under the then Capt. NAKAR (Bn Comdr). On 21 Dec. 1941, we retreated from Bauang, La Union to Nueva Vizcaya thru the Caraballo Mountains. We gathered the disorganized forces of the 11th, 13th and 71st Infantries and formed them into one Regiment subsequently called the 14th Infantry as per radiogram of Gen. HQ., USAFFE. After the fall of Bataan and Corregidor, attempts to contact the General Headquarters, USAFFE, Australia, were constantly made and succeeded on July 1942. The first radiogram that we received from Station VNDN, Port Darwin, North Australia, was as follows: - "Lt. Gol. NAKAR, Your spleddid resistance fills me with pride and admiration. It will not be a long time that you, your officers and men will be amply rewarded. (SGD) MacARTHUR".

In view hereof, may I please be informed at your earliest convenience in the mann'r and form you deem proper whether orders of army rank promotions sent then through this Station were valid and confirmed. This information will be of great help to my request for rank verification dated 26 April 1945 addressed to The Adjutant General (PA) and to similar request made by other Officers and Enlisted Men of the said Regiment because I happened to be one of those Officers in said Regiment whose order of promotion was believed to have been sent thru this Station.

Lt. Col. WARNER, FA, USA, Maj. ARNOLD, MC, USA, Capt. MENTON, Cavalry, USA, Sgt. HEIB, USA, and several other American Reserved Officers of the USA then working in the Mines were with us, we offered resistance against the Japanese in the Cagayan Valley, part of the Pangasinan Province and Mt. Province for five months after the fall of Corregidor. When our radio transmit-

ter and Regimental Commander were captured and in obedience to memorandum received by me from Lt. Col. NAKAR, I surrendered with my unit to the Japanese Imperial Forces at Bayombong, Nueva Vizcaya.

Ever since the organization of the 14th Infantry, I was the CO, Hq. & Hq. Co., 1st Bn., 14th Infantry, 11th Division and S-2 at the same time, thus, I was well informed of all outgoing nad incoming official communications.

When Gen. MARSHALL and Gen. VALDEZ visited the 2nd Repl Bn (PA) Camp Calasiao, Pangasinan, I asked Gen. MARSHALL the same q uestion but I was not very much clarified of his answer. So Sir, I dared sending this letter to you for a definite and clear statement for the sake of the Officers and Men of the 14th Infantry who have now reported to duty.

1. The 14th Infantry, (PA) is one of the recognized regiments of this command. All records pertaining to this regiment are in the possession of the Hq of the regiment. Due to the fact that this headquarters is at present located in the vicinity of Kiangan behind the enemy lines, physical contact for the purpose of securing such records is not possible at this time. However, the 6th Division, now driving up Highway No. 4 toward Kiangan, should be able to make contact with this regiment in the near future.

- 2. This headquarters requests to be informed more specifically what records of the 14th Infantry (PA) are desired or whether it is merely your desire that a representative of Headquarters, Philippine Army, be allowed to go to the headquarters, 14th Infantry and examine same when this becomes feasible.
- 3. In order to save possible questions regarding the 14th Infantry, this headquarters wishes to give a few facts regarding the history of the 14th Infantry (PA).

The 14th Infantry (PA) was originally organized in Cagayan Valley by Lt. Col. Warner in the early part of 1942. He was assisted in this work by Major Nakar and Major Manuel P. Enriquez. Following the fall of Bataan, the enemy reentered Cagayan Valley in force and the 14th Infantry was split into two parts -- one battalion under Major Enriquez in the west and the balance of the regiment under Lt Col Warner and Major Nakar in the east. When General Wainwright issued his surrender order, Lt Col Warner surrendered along with some of his troops, and Major Nakar assumed command, assisted by Major Robert H. Arnold, AUS, who had joined the command. It was Nakar's unit which maintained radio communication with Australia following the fall of Corregidor and, so this headquarters understands, secured the induction of a number of soldiers under his immediate command into the Army of the United States. (It is known that some of the surviving Filipino officers have United States Army officer's serial numbers.) Later, Major Nakar was captured and his radio was destroyed, and Major Arnold assumed command of the remnants of his unit. Meanwhile, the branch in the west under Major Enriquez survived quite successfully -- in spite of the voluntary surrender of Major Enriquez in April,



1943. Major Romulo A. Manriquez assumed command of the western branch following Major Enriquez' surrender. Due to the lack of contact between the eastern and western branches of the 14th Infantry, the ties of command were severed following the capture of Major Nakar and the western branch of the 14th Infantry carried on and gradually organized itself as the entire 14th Infantry. Late in 1944, Major Manriquez established contact with Major Arnold, whose command had then been reduced to about the size of a company, in the vicinity of Jones, Isabela. As the western branch of the 14th Infantry had now expanded into practically a complete regiment, Arnold's men were transferred intact to Major Manriquez' command, and Major Arnold was transferred to take command of the newly organized 15th Infantry, (PA) which position he now holds with the rank of Lt. Colonel in this organization. Manriquez, now a Lt. Colonel in this organization, still commands the 14th Infantry. All records of the eastern branch of the 14th Infantry were turned over to Lt. Col. Manriquez upon Lt. Col. Arnold's transfer. Lt. Colonel Arnold can be contacted thru this headquarters for queries regarding the eastern branch of the 14th Infantry, (PA).
