

- 2. It should be noted that almost 6,000 claims were received during January and that 60 percent of this number pertained to individuals without Philippine Scout service. This influx of claims from individuals who are not covered under Public Law 85-217 is resulting in a considerable workload, as in each case, a claimant's status must be identified. A large number of the 1,266 claims in process or awaiting records will undoubtedly fall into this category.
- 3. At this time, your attention is called to the excellent service which has been provided by the Personnel Records Branch in furnishing us records on individuals in either active or retired status. As of 31 January, there were only 30 requests over 10 days old and the average over the past 2 months has seldom exceeded this figure.

- 2. a. The above figures indicate that the original estimate of 12,000 cases was probably high. Determinations awaiting policy decision are those of members of the Constabulary or the Manila Defense Corps.
- b. It appears that there will be less than 5,000 claims to be processed (current data 11,042 less 6,407 paid in full leaves 4,635). Two thousand, nine hundred eighty have already been received, so not over 2,000 more are expected from those individuals who will be entitled to pay or be denied pay due to anti US activities. Determinations have already been made on over half of these cases.
- 3. As of 31 December 1957, this project is well on its way to completion, Provided the policy determination on individuals with service in the Constabulary and the Manila Defense Corps the legal decision on entitlement of former Scouts who served in AUS status or under Reserve Commissions, the legal decision on the terminal date for mandatory payment and the procedure for processing survivor claims are received at an early date the major portion of this project will be completed in February 1958.

In addition to the 420 claims transmitted to the Finance Center, 622 determinations have been completed and are ready for forwarding either;

on receipt of a claim, or en approval of precedure for precessing claims of survivors living in the Philippines.

Our efforts have been directed to date with the objective of completing the "clear" cases as seen as practicable after which the doubtful cases will be processed. Since there are still some points upon which the DA apparently is not clear regarding constabulary service or other employment with the Japanese, no effort has been made to complete the review and determination of any of these doubtful cases. We therefore do not have particulars on them. A report is being furnished Mr. McCool covering a detailed analysis of approximately 23 cases that he has asked for by name.

- 2. Any attempt to dig into the doubtful cases now will simply divert personnel who would otherwise be able to complete action on "clear" cases upon which we have or will soon receive claims. In accordance with the original agreement reached here at the time of the conference on this project, primary consideration is being given to those cases upon which payments can be made.
- 3. One additional item of information is that at the time of our last contact with the Finance Center about 10 days ago, we were informed that they had not as yet received any funds for payment of claims which were being sent to them.




