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DETAILS:

1. 0930 hours 24 March 1947 and 1010 hours 17 April 1947, letters signed by Capt V. PILA with an unknown address, were received stating that several officers of the 31st Infantry Regiment, Bulacan Military District, ECLGA, through misrepresentations and false declarations, faked their claim papers, Form No. 23 and other supporting affidavits, filed at the Recovered Personnel Division, PHILRYCOM, APO 707. (Complaint Sheets A-2875 and A-2971, Exhibits No. 1 and No. 2)

2. Capt V. PILA stated that MANUEL MANLAPIG, Capt, 046206, FS, PA, APO 75, a guerrilla major, was inducted to the Bulacan Military District (BMD), ECLGA, in November 1944. A fake affidavit made by Maj. FEDERICO BAUTISTA, who had no authority to do so, made it appear that Capt. MANLAPIG was in active service since 1943. The ECLGA was not organized till about Oct. 1944 by Col. FAUSTO ALBERTO. Capt MANLAPIG could not leave his job as he was the accountant of the Meycawayan Tannery from 1943 to 1944.

3. NEMESIO A. BANEZ, Capt, 027840, HPA, APO 75, at present residing at Meycawayan, Bulacan, whose claim papers show that he had been in the service since 1943 is fake as he was not inducted till late in 1944 and did not report for duty till January 1945, because he was the agent and buyer of the Japanese Garrison in Meycawayan, Bulacan.

4. Mr. ELISIO STA CRUZ, formerly Capt, PA, and residing at Meycawayan, Bulacan, did not report for duty inspite of repeated call till the last week of January 1945 for the reason that since 1942 up to 1944, he was employee in the Meycawayan Tannery and was the consulting physician of the Philippine Hikaku. He could not be in active service as he worked with the Japanese all the time.

5. Mr. ERNESTO MIGUID, formerly 1st Lt and residing at Olongapo, Zambales, could not be in active service with the 31st Inf. Regt., BMD, ECLGA from 1943 to 1944 as he was the Charity Physician and was paid by the Government of Meycawayan, Bulacan.

6. Mr. AMADO DAZO, formerly 2nd Lt, PA, residing at Meycawayan, Bulacan was the buyer of the Meycawayan Tannery during the period he claimed for backpay. His original rank was sergeant but by clever manipulation of the roster, he changed his rank to 2nd Lt without the confirmation of HPA. (Letter of Capt V. PILA, dated 15 March 1947, Exhibit #3)

7. In another letter dated 6 April 1947, Capt V. PILA stated that VICTORIANO C. LANCEO, Capt, 0-49042, FS, presently attached with the Finance Section, RPD, PHILRYCOM, APO 707 was employed by the Japanese in Meycawayan Leather Goods Association from 1943 - 1944. Altho inducted late in 1944, he did not report for active duty till the last days of January 1945, yet his processing papers were made to appear

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that he was in the service months prior to January 1945. He is entitled only to about one week backpay.

8. ANGEL PORTUGAL, 1st Lt, O-35160, Inf., presently attached with RPD, PHILRYCOM, who was in active service only late in 1944 also faked his processing papers by making it appear that he was in the service since 1943.

9. Mr. TEODORO BORDADOR, formerly 1st Lt, MC, PA, and residing at Meycawayan, Bulacan was inducted late in 1944 and did not report for duty till January 1945 and yet his processing papers show that he had been in the service since 1943. (Letter of Capt V. PILA, dated 6 April 1945, Exhibit #4)

10. Capt MANUEL MANLAPIG in his Form No. 23 stated that from 11 April 1943 to 25 Sept. 1944, he joined the Bulacan Military District, ECLGA at Meycawayan, Bulacan, under Col. DE LA ROSA. His duties were to solicit funds and supplies and at the same time doing sabotage against the Japs. He asked voluntary contributions from the local supporters and symphatizers in the form of cash and commodities. From 15 June 1943 to 15 December 1943, he was detailed in the Manila Fire Dept. and led the firemen burned the Smith Bell and Co., Bureau of Labor, Erlanger and Galinger, all managed by the Japanese and destroyed communication lines in Manila. From 16 Dec. 1943 to 25 Sept 1944, he left his former unit and was inducted to Hqs Bn Staff (Ramsey) as Finance and Supply Officer. From 26 September 1944 to 15 October 1944, he was captured by the Japanese Kempetai as a guerrilla suspect. From 16 October 1944 to 31 October 1944, after being released, he got sick of dysentery and malnutrition. (Affidavit for Philippine Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of MANLAPIG, Exhibit #5)

11. Mr. FAUSTO S. ALBERTO, formerly Colonel and the District Commander, Bulacan Military District (BMD), ECLGA, and presently residing at 60 R. Papa, Barrio Obrero, Manila, stated that Maj. MANUEL C. MANLAPIG was not a member of the Bulacan Guerrillas, ECLGA, from 11 April 1943 to 31 October 1944; Maj. MANLAPIG was a member of a Japanese Firm in Meycawayan, between the above-mentioned dates and reported for duty in the guerrilla organization 1 November 1944; that Col. DE LA ROSA was only authorized to organize guerrilla movement in the town of Bulacan, Bigaa, Guiguinto and Bocawe and that the Meycawayan sector is under Col. MARIANO EXALTACION. (Statement of ALBERTO, Exhibit No. 6)

12. FEDERICO M. BAUTISTA, by virtue of his authority as Major, Asst. Chief of Staff, G-2, BMD, ECLGA, on the 3rd paragraph of his affidavit stated that he personally know MANUEL C. MANLAPIG, who was inducted into the service of the ~~USARV~~ Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, ECLGA, Bulacan Military District on or about 11 April 1943, with the rank of 1st Lt and assigned Intelligence Operative (G-2) BMD.

Annex "A", a form ~~of the USARV~~ Luzon Guerrilla Forces shows that Special Order No. 1 issued ~~by the ECLGA~~ was dated 14 September 1943, which gave the commanding officers authority to make appointments in the field. (Affidavit of BAUTISTA and ECLGA form for appointment, Annex "A", Exhibit No. 7 and No. 8)

13. NEMESIO BANEZ stated from 30 September 1943 to 2 February 1945, he joined the 31st Inf., BMD, ECLGA, in Meycawayan under Lt Col. M. EXALTACION and served as Asst. Supply Officer. He helped in the procurement of foodstuffs and supplies for his Unit from voluntary contributions. He engaged also in intelligence work and propaganda activities. (Affidavit for Philippine Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of BANEZ, Exhibit No. 9)

14. Dr. ELISIO STA CRUZ stated from 30 September 1943 to 30 October 1944, he was inducted with the rank of Capt and assigned Regt'l Surgeon, 1st Regt. Bul. Mil. Area, Meycawayan, Bulacan, under Lt. Col. S. CASTRO. Unit was engaged in intelligence, combat and sabotage activities. 31 October 1944 to 27 May 1945, he was Regt'l Surgeon, 31st Inf. Regt. Bulacan Mil. Dist., ECLGA under Lt. Col. M. EXALTACION. (Affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of STA CRUZ, Exhibit No. 10)

15. ERNESTO NUGUID, stated from 15 August 1943 to 15 June 1944, as 1st Lt, he joined the guerrilla and assigned with 112 Regt., 1st Bn, ECLGA as Bn. Surgeon in Meycawayan under Lt. Col. M. EXALTACION. From 16 June 1944 to 6 February 1945, he was Asst. Div. Surgeon, BMD under Maj. E. RAMSEY. He went to Camalig, Meycawayan, Bulacan and treated wounded and sick guerrillas. He sometimes went to Manila to solicit much needed medicine and clothing for sick guerrillas. On several occasions, he was forced to carry rifle and engaged in some light encounters with the enemy. (Affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of NUGUID, Exhibit No. 11)

16. AMADO DAZO stated from 30 September to 25 October 1944 he was a M/Sgt., 1st Bn. BMD, under Major M. EXALTACION. From 26 October 1944 to 2 February 1945, he was still a M/Sgt, 31st Inf., BMD under EXALTACION who was then a Lt. Col. He gathered information regarding positions and movements of the enemy and submitted reports to higher Hqs.. On 28 March 1945 he was a 3rd Lt. and on 1 Nov. '45, he was promoted to 2nd Lt. (Affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of DAZO, Exhibit #12)

17. Capt VICTORIANO LANCERO stated on 26 October 1944, he joined the ECLGA as 1st Lt. under Maj. M. EXALTACION. From 27 October 1944 to 2 February 1945, he was assigned Asst. Dist. Finance Service Officer of the Div. Hq., Bul. Mil. Dist. with the duty of procuring supplies and money. 3 February 1945, the unit to which he belonged was recognized. From 4 February 1945 to 28 February 1945 his Unit was attached to the 11th Corps, USA. He was assigned as Div. Supply Officer and at the same time Finance Service Officer of the Guerrilla Hq., ECLGA. On 1 March 1945, he was recognized with the rank of Captain by AFWESPAC by virtue of SO Memo. No. 189. (Affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form 23 of LANCERO, Exhibit No. 13)

18. ANGEL PORTUGAL stated on 1 Oct. '43, he joined the 1st Inf. Regt. BMA, ECLGA as 1st Sgt. up to 25 Oct. '44. As clerk, he kept

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and prepared Morning Reports and handled all the records. By virtue of SO No. 1, effective 26 Oct. '44 he was promoted to 1st Lt., under Lt. Col. M. EXALTACION and assigned S-1 of the Bn. (Affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of PORTUGAL, Exhibit No. 14)

18. TEODORO BORDADOR, stated from 30 Sept. '43 to 25 Oct. '44 he was Asst. Regt'l Surgeon, 1st Regt, Bul. Mil. Area, ECLGA, in Meycawayan, under Capt STA CRUZ, From 26 October 1944 to 27 May '45, he was Asst. Regt'l Surgeon, 31st Inf. Regt., BMD, Meycawayan, also under STA CRUZ and at the same time engaged in intelligence, combat and sabotage activities in Bulacan province. He also acted as Intelligence Officer. As a guerrilla, he was allowed to stay at home when not on duty. (Affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form No. 23 of BORDADOR, Exhibit No. 15)

19. Mr. MARIANO C. EXALTACION, formerly Lt Col, CO, 31st Inf., BMD, ECLGA and presently residing in Meycawayan, Bulacan stated he was the organizer and commander of the 31st Inf., BMD, ECLGA, a unit duly recognized by the 6th Army of the United States. He know personally LANCERO, BANEZ, STA CRUZ, BORDADOR and PORTUGAL and DAZO, all having been active members of his Unit. As far as BANEZ services are concerned, his affidavit (Form No. 23) will verify his past services. Although he had been dealing closely with the enemy it was because he was permitted to do so for the advantage of the resistance movement by which he was able to procure supplies for the men on duty in the field and at the same time deceiving the enemies of their movement. LANCERO joined his Unit in October 1944 and rendered full time service, serving as Supply Officer and Finance Officer. STA CRUZ, prior to his being consulting physician of the Japanese sponsored tannery, was Regimental Surgeon, treating soldiers in the field and when medicine was scarce, he (STA CRUZ) was assigned in the tannery to get medicine and at the same time to do some intelligence work. STA CRUZ was already with him even before 30 Sept. 1943. BORDADOR was with him as stated in his affidavit (Form #23). PORTUGAL was an enlisted man when inducted and later promoted to 1st Lt. DAZO had worked for the Tannery, but it was with his authority for the good of the underground movement. His (DAZO) change of rank is not fake for the records show there had been no alteration of their roster and could not be done without his having it. With respect to induction and call to active duty, the men of the 31st Inf. BMD, ECLGA not only rendered services from 30 September 1943 to the date they were discharged or released from active duty, but from date long before that, as he began to organize and form his Unit in the early part of 1942, shortly after the arrival of the Japanese forces. (Statement of MARIANO EXALTACION, Exhibit # 16)

20. Mr. TRINIDAD C. EXALTACION, formerly Major and CO, 2nd Bn, 31st Inf, BMD, ECLGA and residing in Meycawayan, Bulacan, stated he personally know BANEZ, LANCERO, STA CRUZ, BORDADOR, PORTUGAL and DAZO, they having been active members of the 31st Inf., BMD, ECLGA and included in the official roster of said Unit recognized by AFWESPAC. The two complaints signed by one Capt [redacted], the authenticity of which he doubted,

was motivated by impulse or misunderstanding and not by reason and fairness. As he understands PILA was a ranking officer of the Valenzuela Regt, Bulacan Military Area, who is still working for his recognition and that of his men. As far as the affidavit of MARIANO EXALTACION is concerned, dated 14 May 1947, he believed and affirmed that it is true and correct. (Statement of TRINIDAD EXALTACION, Exhibit #17)

21. Extract of Special Order No. 284 dated 28 Oct. 1945, shows that M/Sgt AMADO DAZO, 31st Inf. BMD, ECLGA had been appointed 3rd Lt. effective 27 March 1945. Special Orders No. 61, dated 11 March 1946 show promotion of 3rd Lt. DAZO to 2nd Lt., effective 1 November 1945 as published in Several Orders No. 273, dated 20 December 1945. (Extract of SO No. 284 and No. 61, Exhibit No. 17 and 19)

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CONCLUSIONS:

1. That Capt MANUEL MANLAPIG by stating in his affidavit for Phil. Army Personnel, Form No. 23, that he joined the Bulacan Mil. Dist., ECLGA, under Col. DE LA ROSA, in Meycawayan, Bulacan, was a misrepresentation as he joined the guerrilla organization only on 1 Nov. 1944, as certified by the District Commander, Col. ALBERTO, being a member of a Japanese firm (Meycawayan Tannery) from 11 April 1943 to 31 Oct. 1944 and could not be under Col. DE LA ROSA as the latter was authorized to organize guerrilla movement not in Meycawayan, which was then under Col. MARIANO EXALTACION.
2. That FEDERICO M. BAUTISTA also misrepresented facts by stating in his affidavit that he personally know Capt. MANLAPIG who was inducted on or about 11 April 1943, when aside from the facts mentioned in Conclusion No. 1, he could not be inducted on or about the above-mentioned date as the authority to induct or appoint by virtue of Special Order No. 1 issued by the Hqs., ECLGA, began 14 September 1943, six months later.
3. That there is insufficient evidence to substantiate the complaint against the remaining eight offenders: Capt NEMESIO BANEZ, Capt ELISEO B. STA CRUZ, 1st Lt. ERNEST O. NUGUID, 2nd Lt. AMADO DAZO, Lt ANGEL PORTUGAL, Capt VICTOR LANCERO, Sgt AMADO DAZO, and 1st Lt. TEODORO BORDADOR.

Sir:

In connection with the Back Pay anomalies that have been going on for the past several months, allow me to bring to your attention a few specific instances where the claimants have faked their papers through misrepresentations and false declarations in their form 23 and supporting affidavits as now filed in RPD, PHILRYCOM:

1. Capt. Manuel Manlapig (Guerrilla Major), Finance Service, HAP. Inducted with the Bulacan Military District, ECLGA, on November 1944 and did not report for active duty in spite of repeated calls until January 16, 1945 because he could not leave his job as an accountant of the Tannery owned jointly by the Japanese and Mr. Vicente Hermoso of Meycauayan, Bulacan, and consequently had to report daily to his work from 1943 to 1944. Yet because of a faked affidavit made a cousin, Maj. Federico Bautista, who has no authority to do so, his processing papers which I had been informed were changed or altered to suit his claim, now show that he was in active service since 1943 which is not true. The Bulacan Military District, ECLGA was not organized till about October 1944 by Col. Fausto S. Alberto, who was also his inducting officer.

2. Capt. Nemesio Banez, who still has a case against him with the Judge Advocate Service, HAP, also was not inducted till late in 1944 and did not report for duty till January 1945 because he was the agent and buyer of the Japanese Garrison in Meycauayan, Bulacan, and he was too busy with the rice black market to answer the call of the underground movement. His unit the 31st Infantry Regiment, Bulacan Military District, ECLGA, was not organized till late in 1944. His papers also show now that he had been in the service since 1943 which is a lie.

3. Capt. Eliseo B. Sta. Cruz, MC (USAFFE-GUERRILLA) was inducted in to the 31st Infantry Regiment, Bulacan Military District, ECLGA only on November 1944 after requesting transfer from the Bulacan Military AREA Guerrillas under Col. Alejo Santos which is not yet recognized, and did not report for duty in spite of repeated calls till the last week of January 1945, for the reason that since 1942 up to 1944 he was all the time employed with the Tannery owned jointly by the Japanese and Mr. Vicente Hermoso of Meycauayan, Bulacan and he was the consulting physician of the Philippine Hikaku. He purposely, omitted these facts in his processing papers so as to favor his claim for back pay. His affidavits are also faked for how could he be in active service since he was working with the Japs all the time.

4. 1st Lieut. Ernest [redacted] also faked his affidavits. He was the charity physician and being paid by the government in Meycauayan, Bulacan, from 1943 to 1944 during the period he was supposed to be in the service of the 31st Inf. Regmt, Bul. Dist., ECLGA.

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5. 2nd Lieut. Amado Dazo, also presented faked affidavits. He was the buyer of Mr. Vicente Hermoso during the period he claims for back pay. His original rank was that of a sergeant but by clever manipulation of the roster, he changed his rank to 2nd Lieut. without the confirmation of HAP when the supplementary roster of the 31st Infantry Regiment, Bul. Mil. Dist. ECLGA, was sent to AFWESPAC.

The above mentioned are only a few examples how they set their back pays by misrepresentations and false declarations. I hope you would not let this pass by unnoticed and I hope further you would prosecute the guilty parties to the limit as an example for therrest. For verification of the foregoing, I wish to invite you the see and examine the rosters of those units for 1943-1944 (NOT THE POST LIBERATION ROSTER OF 1945) as submitted by Lt. Col Edwin P. Ramsey to AFWESPAC before the dates of recognition of all units of ECLGA have been revised according to directive dated 10 Dec 1946 of AFWESPAC Subject: Revision of Recognition dates for East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area (ECLGA).

Sir:

This is a second exposure of the frauds being committed in connection with claims for back pay of officers and men of the 31st Infantry Regiment, Bulacan Military District, ECLGA:

1. Capt. Victor Lancero, FS attached with RPD in Mandaluyong. He was employed with the Japanese sponsored Meycauayan Leather Owner's Association during the year 1943-1944. Altho he was inducted late in 1944, he did not report for active duty till the last days of January 1945 in Barrio Libtong when the Unit came down from the mountains so he never was in the service except shortly before Meycauayan was liberated. Yet his processing papers were made to appear that he was in the service months prior to January 1945 which is a lie. He is entitled only to about one week's back pay. He was one of those whose ranks were altered by Sgt. Amado Dazo without the confirmation of his promotion in the guerrilla rank when the supplementary roster of the 31st Infantry Regiment under Lt. Col. Mariano Exaltacio, was submitted to AFWESPAC while the unit was still in Bayambang, Pangasinan.

2. Lieut. Portugal of RPD also faked his processing papers as he had access to records in RPD. He was not in active service till late in 1944 when the 31st Infantry Regiment was organized.

3. 1st.Lieut. Teodor Bordador also gave misrepresentations and false declarations in his processing papers. He was not yet a full pledge physician in 1943 because he was still a medical student studying in Manila during the time he claims he was in the guerrilla service. As a matter of fact it was his brother who accompanied him to the Headquarters of the 31st Infantry Regiment for induction as a medican officer attached to his brothers battalion. His brother Major Apolinar Bordador a Battalion CO, was inducted into the service on October 1944 yet Lieut. Teodoro Bordador whom his brother accompanied for induction now appears to have been in the service since 1943 which is not true. Lieut. Bordador was inducted late in 1944 and didn't report for duty till January 1945 in Barrio Libtong, Meycauayan, Bulacan, where he evacuated his family.

4. One big mistake that authorities failed to look into is the fact that almost all officers and men of the 31st Inf. Regiment, Bulacan Military District seemed to have been inducted at the same time, Sept. 30, 1943, as if by strange coincidence hundreds went to the front and were not detected by the enemies or spies.

5. Another error which authorities have not realized is the difference between "being inducted" and "called to active duty". In the latter case the duty of officers and men

did not commence on the date of induction as most of them after being inducted went home to town, pursued their normal daily occupation and reported for duty only after liberation. Why not require copies of induction instead of affidavits? Or better copies of Special Orders calling them for active service.

I was a District Finance Officer, Disbursing Officer and Asst Chief of Staff G-4 - BMD, keeping records and disbursing expenses. Our unit was recognized - 3 Feb'45.

Line 5 -- Reported for processing at Camp Murphy under Major. Nocete, and finally processed - 23 Apr '45.

Means of support of family and I were from my brother-in-law and mother-in-law.

NOTE:

I was commissioned as 1st Lt in the PA around 19 Dec'41. I was unable to be inducted for active duty because of the confusion in the office of the Records Section - Far Eastern University. In spite of all efforts I have made I was not able to induct myself to any of the USAFFE units still in Manila then. I came to know that the papers were all taken to Bataan when the officers concerned left.

I helped in the procurement of foodstuffs and supplies for our Unit from voluntary contributions of the loyal civilians, I engaged also in intelligence work and propaganda activities. My family survived thru the help of my wife who engaged in buying and selling rice to the civilians earning from 10 to 20 pesos daily for family subsistence.

Line 2 - Recognized and attached to US Army outfit and was assigned the Supply Officer (S-4) of our Unit.

Line 3- On leave, stayed at Manila and rested. (Sick Leave)

Had a tough time with the enemy because of increased activities against all guerrillas. Received no compensation from my parents. Got married and my wife not give any quarters and allowances. My work was not only confined, to the Medical information of enemy movements to our headquarters. My wife was very indispensable in the soliciting of food and clothing especially rice from our relatives which helped very much our outfit.

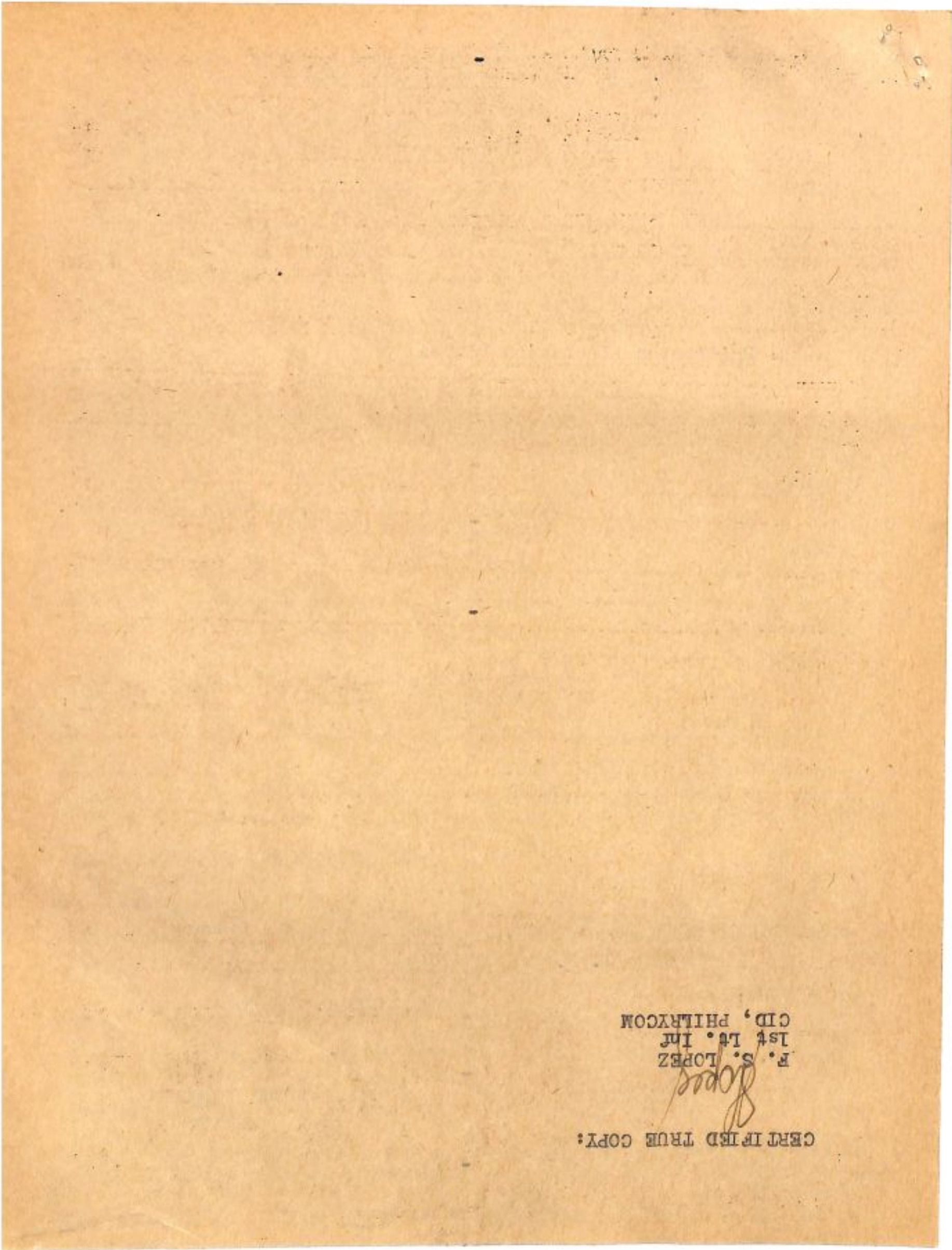

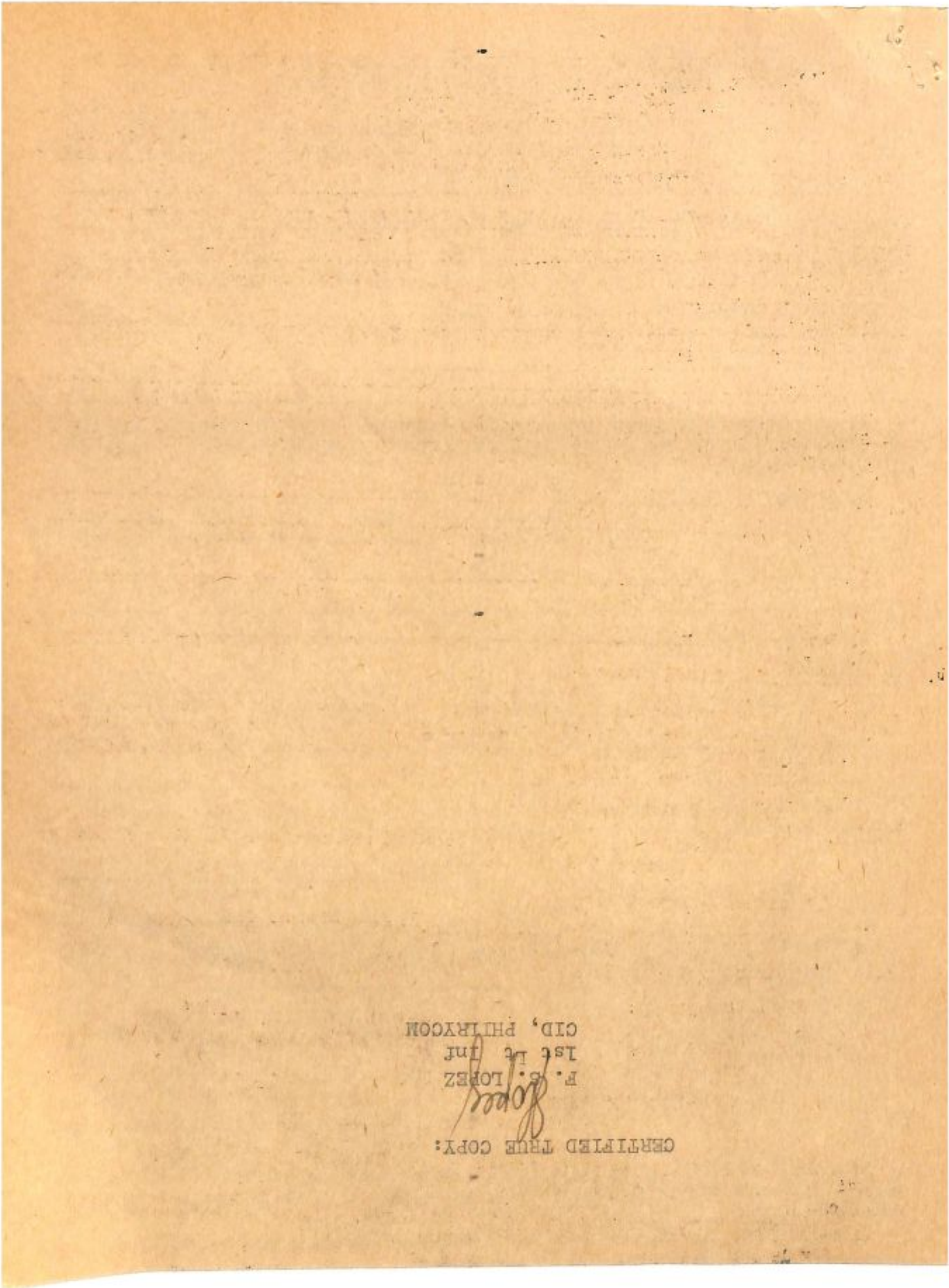



1, Mariano C. Exaltacion, of legal age, married, filipino citizen, and now residing in meycauayan, Bulacan, after being duly sworn to in accordance with the law, hereby depose and say:

1. That I was a Lieutenant Colonel in the P.A. with ASN O-35171 and that I was the organizer and commander of the 31st Inf., Bul. MD, ECLGA, a unit duly recognized by the 6th Army of U.S..

2. That I know personally the following named officers, they having been active members of my unit:

- a. Capt. Victor Lancero
- b. " Nemesio A. Banes
- c. " Eliseo B. Sta. Cruz
- d. 1st Lt. Teodoro E. Bordador
- e. " " Angel Portugal
- f. 2nd Lt. Amado Dazo

3. That as far as Capt. N. Banes service are concerned, the affidavit submitted by him will verify his past services and although he might have been dealing closely with the enemy it was because he was given permit to do so, for the advantage of the resistance movement by which he was able to procure every possible means of supplies for the men on duty in the field and at the same time deceiving the enemy of our movement.

4. As for Captain Lancero, he joined my Unit in October 1944 He rendered full time service since he joined my unit serving as Supply Office and Finance Officer also.

5. With regards to Captain Eliseo B. Sta. Cruz, he was a USAFE having been from Bataan, before he joined my unit. Prior to his being consulting Physician of the tannery he was my Regimental Surgeon treating soldiers in the field, but when medicines could not be secured I planted him in the tannery to get medicines and at the same time do some intelligence work. That he did not report for duty as implicated by Pila is false and malicious for he is always there whenever we need him. He was already with us even before 30 September 1943.

6. 1st Lt. Teodoro Bordador with us as stated in his affidavit for his services rendered in the past. If he was not yet a full pledge physician by the time he joined the unit I do not think it was a handicap then to be commissioned as a medical officer, since he is ^{not} a ^{qualified} Medical Officer our Regtl. Surgeon Capt. Eliseo B. Sta. Cruz.

8. 2nd Lt. Amado Dazo has his papers for his services. He might have worked for one Mr. Vicente Hermoso but it was with my authority to do so for the good of the underground movement. His change of rank is not faked as shown by certain Pila for his records show that there had been no alteration of our roster and he could not have done it without my knowing it.

9. Much to say about the date of induction and call to active duty; the men of the 31st Inf., Bul. MD, ECLGA not only rendered services from 30 September 1943 to the date they were discharged or released from active duty, but from date even much prior to that, as I began to organize and form my Unit way back in the early part of 1942, shortly after the arrival of the Japanese forces. The fact is that the authority to induct such a big number of men came to me officially on 30 September 1943 by authority of SO No. 1, dated 14 September 1943 issued by the HEADQUARTERS, EAST CENTRAL LUZON GUERRILLA AREA.

10. That I have personal knowledge of the foregoing facts and that they are true and correct as stated.
