- 2. It is the opinion of this office that John C. Alexander did not become a civilian employee of the War Department in active service within the meaning of the Missing Persons Act. However, as this matter involves the expenditure of public funds, it is a question upon which only the comptroller General can speak with authority. Accordingly, it is recommended that Congressman Hook be advised that Mr. Alexander should submit a voucher for such amount as he believes due him, thus furnishing an appropriate basis for reference to the Comptroller General
