

It is contended that your headquarters can and should submit determinations of status of individuals who have died or whose whereabouts have become unknown subsequent to their final status under the Act for the purpose of establishing of record their or their heirs or legal representatives entitlement to certain arrears of pay. But the fact that the individuals died or their fate became unknown after their official status ceased is entirely irrelevant to a determination under the Act. It is analogous to a situation wherein a War Department employee might sever his connection with the Federal service (or a soldier be discharged), and before his account with the government has been settled and while certain arrears in pay are still due and owing, the individual dies. Certainly since all official connections had ceased, the War Department would take no action to process a death report, notify next of kin, etc., but would merely note the information as to reputed death in its records so that the accounts settling agency might be advised that payment due could not be made to the individual but must be made to his legal representatives.  - b. That a similiar distribution will be made in the cases where a finding of death is attempted to be made; but since no allegation of reputed death may properly be made, that a notation of "whereabouts unknown" be made on the distribution. Attached are samples of the proposed distribution forms in the cases of Leonico Saliba (death report) and Regino Cosme (death finding).

Your headquarters is requested to submit, in the future, determinations only in those types of cases where the individuals are not in absent casualty status at the date of reported death or the presumptive date of finding of death, and not death reports or findings of death, and that such determinations include periods for which individuals were in absent casualty status under the Act, and determination that individuals had no subsequent status under the Act with the reason for such negative determination, with a notation of unofficial receipt of evidence of death being reported subsequent to termination of status, or receipt of evidence of whereabouts or existence of an individual being presently unknown subsequent to termination of status. The name and address of the emergency addressee or next of kin should also be reported when known.

Leoncio Saliba and Regino Cosme were in Beleaguered status under Missing Persons Act from 7th December to termination of service.

Claims have been filed by heirs for pay under Missing Persons Act. Facts reveal individuals were not in casualty status after termination of service because they were not interned or restrained and were living at home with families and did not suffer any material hardship as a result of their former status. See Paragraph E, Section 4, War Department. Plan.

Aptwithstanding considerable period during which such individuals were not in casualty status prior to date of actual death or presumed date of death right to pay accrued during period they were beleaguered as under other casualty status. Therefore, it is believed necessary to make determination of death or finding of death in order to establish entitlement of heirs and to accomplish settlement of any arrears in pay. Such action considered authorized by see 9, Missing Persons Act, providing for making "All determinations necessary in the administration of this act".

No emergency addresses have been notified by this Headquarters to date.

Claims for arrears of pay are being processed by this Headquarters with final determination as to legal heirs made by Judge Advocate General of Philippine Army pursuant to OSSA Letter, 14 January 1946, file SPFKB-A 154-General.

Reurad WCL 24626 dated 14 March current in all civilian claims under Missing Persons Act where evidence of death is in affidavit or other form, or inconclusive, payment of amount due would have to await determination of death and probate of estate by judicial process. In case where evidence of death is completely lacking payment would be delayed for period of 7 years. Such cases constitute approximately half of cases in which determinations of death or findings of death have been made. Majority of such cases involve small payments. Therefore, it is requested that this headquarters be granted authority to make determinations of death or findings of death in all cases for purpose of settling claims under the act as provided for by section 9 of the act, but without issuance of official reports of death for other purposes.


