1. The 106th Division having been organized by G.O. No. 168, par. 2, Hq 10th Military District, to be activated as of October 16, 1943 to consist of the 116th, 118th and 119th Inf. Regts., if and when organized, and to cover the territory occupied by these Regiments and the undersigned having been ordered to command the 106th Division by G.O. 227, par. 2, Headquarters, 10th Military District, the following transitional orders are hereby published:

(a) All orders in whatever form already issued to Regiments of this command by their former Immediate Commanders will be enforced by these Headquarters as soon as the existence of such orders is known and such orders will continue in force as orders of this command.

(b) All reports will be made to or thru this Headquarters. This does not effect reports that may be especially exempted by the G.O., 10th MD, nor does it apply to urgent needs of outlying stations concerning functions for which there is as yet no Divisional facilities available.

(c) I hereby assume command.

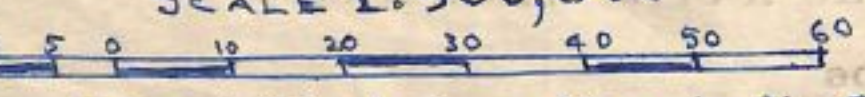

- (b) Location of supply establishments.
- (c) Property responsibility including arms.
- (d) Other duties will be assigned as their need arise.

1. Pursuant to authority vested in me by G.O. No. 168, Headquarters 10th Military District, 1943, the following changes are made in the Regimental Boundaries are ordered:


The 116th Reg. will occupy the southern portion of Davao Prov. up to and including the Davao portion of the Davao-Cotabato Road the southern portion of Cotabato Prov. up to the Mun. Dist. of Dulawan passing thru Kayakaya and north to the line in the Mun. Dist of Awang passing thru Tapian Point and Labungan.

The 118th Reg. will occupy the district north of the north branch of the Rio Grande River, east of the Cotabato-Lanao road excluding Mun. Districts of Barrira and Buldon, and including that portion south of the Rio Grando east of Dansalan River thru Sapan and north of Lake Buluan.

The 119th Reg. will occupy the Mun. Districts of Parang, Subpanganan, Kalanganan, Dinaig, Tumbao, north of the Tapian Point-Labungan line and the portion of Dulawan west of the Dansalan River and north of the East-West line thru Kayakaya.

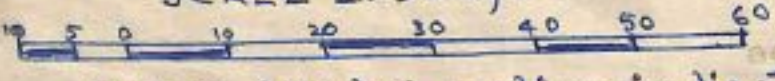

1. The Adjutant General's Service is headed by the Adjutant General, member of the Special Staff, with such assistants as are necessary. It is charged with the following specific duties:

- a. Handling all official correspondence, except that pertaining to combat orders and instructions, in accordance with regulations and approved policies.
- b. Authentication and distribution of all orders and instructions except those pertaining to combat operations.
- c. Maintenance of the office of record.
- d. Custody of records of personnel which are kept in some subordinate unit.
- e. Classification, assignment, promotion, transfer, retirement, discharge, procurement, replacement, recreation, morale and welfare of personnel.
- f. Supplying of blank forms, publications and instructional matter furnished by higher headquarters.
- g. Operation of office procedure as regards administrative matters, internal arrangement of headquarters, including recommendations as to similar arrangements in headquarters of subordinate units.

2. The Personnel (G-1) Section is headed by the G-1, member of the General Staff, with such assistants as are necessary. It is charged with the following specific duties:

- a. Execution of administrative arrangements pertaining to personnel as individuals, civilians under supervision or control of the command, and prisoners of war.
- b. Decorations, citations, honors and awards.
- c. Leaves of absence and furloughs.
- d. Rewards and punishment.
- e. Preparation of strength reports, casualty reports, prisoner of war reports, station lists and other personal statistics.
- f. Preparation of Monthly G-1 Periodic Report as per published instructions.

3. The Military Intelligence and Counter-Intelligence (G-2) Section is headed by the G-2, member of the General Staff, with such assistants as are necessary. It is charged with the following specific duties:

- a. Planning and preparation of orders for and supervision of activities concerning the collection, by subordinate units, of information of the enemy and of the terrain not under Army control, and of weather conditions affecting operations over enemy territory and for the employment of aviation, the location, construction, vulnerability, and defense of air objectives.
- b. Collection, by personnel of the section, of information bearing on enemy capabilities or terrain not under Army control.
- c. Maintenance of contact and exchange of information with intelligence sections of subordinate, higher, and neighboring units.

- d. Supervision of the collection of information of the enemy by secret agents.
- e. Evaluation and interpretation of information obtained to determine its probable accuracy, significance, and importance, and based thereon the estimation of the enemy's capabilities.
- f. As it influences the Division Commander's decision for the employment of aviation, the evaluation and interpretation of information regarding the relative importance and vulnerability of those enemy activities and objectives susceptible of air attack.
- g. Distribution of military intelligence to the Division Commander, interested staff sections and when appropriate to higher, subordinate and neighboring units.
- h. Determination of the need for military maps and surveys; recommendations as to the general character of such maps as are to be produced; supervision of map reproduction and distribution.
- i. Sabotage of enemy property and installations.
- j. Preparation of Monthly G-2 Periodic Report as per published instructions.

4. The Operations and Training (G-3) Section is headed by the G-3, member of the General Staff, with such assistants as are necessary. It is charged with the following specific duties:

- a. Organization and equipment of units.
- b. Preparation of training directives, programs and orders.
- c. Organization and conduct of schools.
- d. Continuous study of the tactical situation as affected by-
 - 1. The enemy situation.
 - 2. Instructions from higher units.
 - 3. Actions of adjacent or supporting units.
 - 4. Location, morale, and capabilities of the troops.
 - 5. Needs for replacements and reinforcements.
 - 6. Terrain and weather conditions.
 - 7. Status of equipment and supplies.
- e. Preparation of estimates, reports and recommendations based on the tactical situation.
- f. Preparation of plans for and supervision of activities concerning-
 - 1. Reconnaissance and security measures.
 - 2. Troop movements.
 - 3. Tactical employment of units.
 - 4. Defense of administrative installations and lines of communication.
 - 5. Tactical measures to preserve secrecy and effect surprise.
- g. Maintaining contact with the commanders of subordinate units; observing or supervising troop movements and tactical operations as directed by the Division Commander.
- h. Establishment of liaison with adjacent, higher, and subordinate units.
- i. Preparation of Monthly G-3 Periodic Report as per published instructions.

5. The Finance Section is headed by the Division Finance Officer, member of the Special Staff, with such assistants as are necessary. It is charged with the following specific duties:

- a. Advise the Division Commander and staff on fiscal matters.
- b. Payment of the command, and payments for hired labor, for supplies purchased or requisitioned, for damages or claims, and financial aids as may be authorized.
- c. Custody of financial records.
- d. Custody and disbursement of all Government funds, including such special funds as the Division Commander may direct.
- e. Preparation of Monthly Financial Statement showing-
 1. Cash on hand:
 - a. In custody of Division Finance Officer
 - b. In custody of Agent Officers.
 2. Allowances paid:
 - a. To officers
 - b. To enlisted men
 3. Rations paid:
 - a. To officers
 - b. To enlisted men
 4. Payments for procured supplies.
 5. Property lost?
 6. Travel expenses.
 7. Financial aids
 8. Other expenses not included above.

6. The Division Signal Officer, member of the Special Staff, is responsible for-

- a. Storage, accounting for, and distribution of codes and ciphers.
- b. Determination of requirements, procurement, storage and distribution of signal equipment and supplies.
- c. Procurement and operation of signal maintenance and repair facilities.
- d. Technical inspection of signal equipment, within limits prescribed by the Division Commander, and recommendations relative to its care and utilization.
- e. Technical supervision, within limits prescribed by the Division Commander, of signal operations of the command, including coordination of the employment and of the training of signal agencies of subordinate units.
- f. Supervision of the installation, maintenance and operation of the signal system, including the message center of the Division.

7. The Division Surgeon, member of the Special Staff, will advise the Division Commander and staff on all matters pertaining to-

- a. 1. Health and sanitation of the command and of occupied territory.
2. Training of all troops in military sanitation and first aid.
3. Location and operation of hospitals and other medical establishments and of the evacuation service.
- b. Supervision, within limits prescribed by the Division Commander, of training of medical troops, including inspections.

- c. Determination of requirements, procurement, storage and distribution of medical and dental equipment and supplies.
- d. Supervision, within limits prescribed by the Division Commander, of the operations of elements of the medical service in subordinate units.
- e. Preparation of reports, and custody of records of casualties.

8. Other duties will be assigned as their need arises.



GENERAL ORDERS
NO. 4

1. Regimental boundaries of the Regiments comprised by the 106th Division are hereby fixed as follows:

(a) To the 116th Inf is assigned that part of Davao Province south of the city limits of Davao. Its north and east boundary thru Cotabato Province shall be on east-west line thru the southern shore of Lake Buluan and ending on the west at Ala River, thence northward along that River to and thence westward along the line extended thru Kayakaya to the southeast corner of Awang Municipal District, thence northward along the eastern boundary to its intersection with the Talayan-Dalican-Labuangan trail, thence along that trail to Labuangan, thence westward on a straight line to Tapian Point on the beach of Iilana Bay.

(b) The 118th Inf is assigned that part of Cotabato Province bounded on the south by the area of the 116th Inf and on the west by the Ala-Dansalan River to the Rio Grande de Mindanao, thence westward along this river to the western boundary of Fuling Municipal District, thence northward along that line to the Buldon Municipal District boundary, thence southeastward along that line to the Buldon-Midsayap boundary and along that boundary to Lanao Province.

(c) The 119th Inf is assigned the remaining part of Cotabato Province not incorporated into the 106th Division. It includes the northern part of Dulawan, west of the Dansalan River, the northeastern part of Awang, all of Dinaig, Tumboo, Kalaingan, Subpaingan, Balut, Parang, Bugasan, Barira, Buldon Municipal Districts and the Municipality of Cotabato. (See accompanying map.)

2. All previous orders to the contrary are hereby revoked.

In view of Par 1-D, Bulletin No 1, 5 May 44 HQ "A" Corps, WM, it is that a clarification of GO No 2, 12 Nov 43, of these Hq, is necessary.

1. The G-4, Procurement and Quartermaster functions of these Hq are organized as specified in FM 101-5, U.S. Army. This was reported to and vocally approved by the CO, "A" Corps, WM, Tab.

2. The G-4 is charged with the procurement of all food, except viands which are procured by Mess Officers and such other exceptions as the Division Commander may specify. He does this thru assistants designated as Procurement Officers. They may store procured food under the Q.M. or issue to Regimental or Bn S-4's.

3. The Quartermaster is in charge of quartermaster facilities; transportation, storage, distribution, etc. He is charge with the procurement of quartermaster supplies only.

4. In the reading and application of orders or instructions concerning procurement from any higher Hq using or contemplating another nomenclature, the term "Division Quartermaster" will be interpreted as Division AG of S, G-4".

1. Regimental boundaries of the Regiments comprised by the 106" Division are hereby fixed as follows:

(a) The 118th Inf is assigned that part of Cotabato Province bounded on the south by the area of the 116th Inf (as per G.O. No. 4 of this Hq dated 4 June 44) and on the west by the Dansalan River to the Rio Grande de Mindanao, then westward along this river to the mouth of Libungan River, thence along the Libungan River to the mouth of Manuangan River, then along this river to the boundary of Nuling and Buldon Mun. Districts thence southeastward along this boundary; thence northward along the eastern boundary of Buldon Municipal Districts to the boundary of Cotabato and Lanao Province.

(b) The 119th Inf is assigned the remaining part of Cotabato Province. It includes the northern part of Dulawan, west of the Dansalan River, the northeastern part of Awang, all of Dinaig, Tumbao, Kalanganan, Subpangan, Balut, Parang, Bugasan, Barira, Nuling, Buldon, part of Midsayap west of the Libungan-Manuangan Rivers, and the municipality of Cotabato.





NO. 8

1. The area of the 106th Division is hereby assigned to the 118th Inf Regt, 119th Inf Regt and 1st Separate Bn as follows:

a. The boundary of the 118th Inf Regt starting from the point where the Cotabato-Lanao boundary is joined by the eastern boundary of Buldon Mun, District running clockwise is as follows: eastward along the south boundary of Lanao and Bukidnon provinces to Davao, then southward along the boundary of Davao Province to Sta Cruz Mun. Dist. thence along northern Mun. Bdry eastward to Davao Gulf, then southward along the beach to Malita Mun. Dist. then westward along Mun. Bdry to Busyan, thence along Mun. Bdry southwestward to along Mun. Bdry, Mun. Dist. of Kling, then westward along Mun. Bdry to Sebu Mun. Dist. thence northward along Mun. Bdry to Dulawan, thence westward along Mun. Bdry to Ala River, then northward along the Ala-Dausaian river, to southern point of Buldon district, thence northward along the east boundary of Buldon District to point of start.

b. The 1st Separate Bn comprise that portion of Awang District south of a line from Tapian Point thru Labungen to Dalican, the Districts of Salaman and Lebak and that portion of Dulawan Municipality south of an east-west line 10 km south of Kayakaya and west of Ala River.

c. The 119th Inf Regt is assigned that portion of Cotabato Province that is east and north of the area herein assigned to the 118th Inf Regt and the 1st Separate Bn. excluding the undefined areas of certain MMF units of the 108th Div near the Lanao boundary of Cotabato.

2. All previous orders to the contrary are hereby revoked.

3. Regimental commanders will submit new allocations of their Regimental areas to their battalions.

4. This will not be construed as an order to occupy the entire area assigned when lack of personnel prevents it.

5. Intelligence coverage is to be provided for the entire area.

6. The ex-USAFFE men who have reported subsequent to 27 Sept 44 will be placed on a separate roster as "Detached Service, 10th Military Dist.". Forward to these Hq such records and affidavits of these men as have not already been sent.

b. The Municipal Districts of Kling, Kiamba, and Sebu remain to be with the 116th Inf.


