It pains me very much to inform you that your beloved husband, Captain Tomas A. Delica, while in the performance of his official duties, died in the night of April 4, 1945. His remains was interred in the Municipal Cemetery of Carranglan.

Your husband whom I know personally for a long time had been very outstanding in the performance of his duties as Company Commander, of Company "I", 3rd Battalion, 1st Filipino Regiment. He is a severe loss to this organization and I know that it is hard to find one to replace him. The country has lost one of her loyal and patriotic sons. His deeds will be recorded in history and his example will become an inspiration to all armed men in the service.

I know how much it pains you over the loss of your husband but I wish to assure and console you that he died not in vain for he died fighting for the liberation of our dear Philippines.

Kindly receive therefore my heartfelt condolence and believe me when I say that the Filipino force now fighting in the front are sharing with you in your bereavement.

Subject: General information
To : Lt. Col. 1st Bn. 96 Inf.

(1) after breakfast in Mantawa - on Jan 11, 1945 one platoon of Co. "C" proceeded to patrol to Mt. Banaw. In this place we found civilians who returned to their homes. The civilians informed us that they did not observe enemy presence in this place. We went down to Cadatulan then to Bagacay where we took our dinner. In this two later places we found also civilians that returned to their homes and tilled their farms.

(2) after our dinner in Bagacay we went to Mt. Gatmon. we did not find civilians in these place. we patrolled the place, but we were unable to meet Japanese stragglers.

(3) From Gatmon we went to Tortura II. we meet civilians in this place and we decided to sleep in this place and the people told us that they have not seen any single enemy. Before breakfast we patrolled ~~the~~ Jan. 12, and the people informed us that they have seen (4) four Japanese stragglers who passed by the bario at midnight. we and the civilians searched for the enemy but we were unable to meet them.

we went back to Martuna to take our
breakfast. after our breakfast we went to
Laloria and patrolled the place. we found
few civilians who returned to their homes
and they told us that they have not seen
japs in their place. so we went up to
Bon-ot hill. In Bon-ot we were ~~informed~~
informed that there are some japs in
Egang and Cesaris Espira was shot and
killed by the jap, by the japs pistol and
the japs was slightly wounded by Espira
but that jap was killed by the other
civilians. By this information we decided
to go to Egang. In Bon-ot we passed
Pald Haya and Parasam. In this two later
places we found some civilians who
returned to their homes. when we arrived
at Meliton Amin's house we found out
that the people were making coffin for
the dead Cesaris Espira. The other house
was sent at once ~~to~~ with the civilians
to find out if there are some japs in
the bushes of Egang.

93rd Division, Samar Area Command

1. Following is a report of the accidental death, through the explosion of a Japanese mortar shell, of Sgt. Luis Albina, Inf., and Pvt. Gonzalo Obon, Inf., both enlisted men of this unit:

F A C T S: That on 6 March '45, Sgt. Luis Albina, as patrol leader, and Pvt. Gonzalo Obon, were sent to Bo. Malinao, Municipality of Taft, to get Japanese ammunitions reported to be in the possession of certain individuals in said barrio. They left by foot at about ten o'clock in the morning that same day. They were not heard of until the evening at about eight o'clock, 10 March '45, when the Bo. Lieutenant-Alternate, Apolonio Adigue, who resides at Sitio Lamato, Bo. Malinao, and Juanita Acang, accompanied by the Municipal Mayor of Taft, called at this Garrison to report that two soldiers were found dead at Sitio Biri, Bo. Malinao.

Due to inclement weather, no patrol could be sent that same evening to verify the information given by Bo. Lieutenant-Alternate Apolonio Adigue and Juanita Acang. But early the next morning, 11 March '45, the undersigned, Lt. Francisco Deculara and ten Enlisted men proceeded to Sitio Biri on the Garrison's truck. Then and there the dead bodies of Sgt. Luis Albina and Gonzalo Obon were found on the spot of the accident. Identification was not difficult because the bodies were not so badly mutilated and the deceased still wore army uniforms.

The cadavers were loaded on the Garrison's truck, and broken pieces of US Engfeld rifle of Pvt. Gonzalo Obon were gathered. Missing is the M-1 rifle of Sgt. Luis Albina, which is still the object of extensive search. In town the dead bodies were subjected to autopsy by Dr. Valerio Adigue, CO., Clearing Hospital, Taft. (Autopsy reports are hereto attached, that of Sgt. Albina marked "A" and that of Pvt. Obon marked "B".)

Burial took place on the afternoon of the 11th instant at the Catholic Cemetery, Taft, with full military honor befitting the ranks of the deceased.

The deceased could not give ante-mortem declarations. Death might have been instantaneous.

F I N D I N G S: One Damaso Adal, under oath, declared that on 8 March '45, two soldiers called at his house and asked if

he, Damaso, had any knowledge of any civilians having in their possession Japanese munitions. That he answered that he did not know of any and that voluntarily he surrendered to the two soldiers one Japanese mortar shell which he claimed to have been found by his children within the premises of the sitio church. That soon after the soldiers received the mortar shell, they left after taking leave of him. (Damaso Adal's affidavit marked "C" is hereto attached.)

Tite Gebricos, under oath, declared that at about 7 AM, 10 March '45, he left from the town of Taft upstreamward to see their carabaos on their farm; that on his way he passed by the house of Juanita Acang; that he had not long been there when Sgt. Albina and Pvt. Obon came up; the latter bringing in his left hand a Japanese mortar shell; that soon Sgt. Albina asked to leave because he was feeling cold; that Sgt. Albina was already about 15 meters away when Pvt. Obon followed him in a running gait with the Japanese mortar shell in his left hand and his right hand carrying his rifle. (Tite Gebricos affidavit marked "D" is hereto attached.)

Rufina Acabado, under oath, declared that at about 3 PM, 10 March '45, she heard a loud explosion which she took for dynamite blast from the direction of the Biri River. That thinking that someone was catching fish by dynamite, she and his little boy left her house towards Biri River with the intention to buy fish. That on her way she came upon a man sprawled on his face; that she guessed he was dead because she could smell blood; that she also guessed he was a soldier because she could see on the body some gun ammunitions; that she immediately turned homeward passing by the house of Juanita Acang where she saw several persons whom she told of what she saw. (Rufina Acabado's affidavit marked "E" is hereto attached.)

Juanita Acang, under oath, declared that at about 5 PM. 10 March '45, while she was on her way home, she came upon the body of a dead soldier near her house at Sitio Biri. That upon seeing it, she went to Sitio Puti to tell the Bo. Lieutenant-Alternate about what she saw; that the Bo. Lieutenant-Alternate then asked her and Francisco Ambede, Venancio Balmania, Blas Balicas, Catalino Deguinoy, Enrique Adayo and Ponciano Esplano to go with him to see the dead. That from the spot she and Apolonio Adigue, went to town on a baroto; that she and Apolonio Adigue went to see the Municipal Mayer who accompanied them to this Garrison to report the accident. (Juanita Acang's affidavit marked "F" is hereto attached.)

Apolonio Adigue, Bo. Lieutenant-Alternate, under oath, declared that at about 7 PM., 10 March '45, Juanita Acang and Ponciano Esplano went to his house to tell him that there was a man sprawled on his face at Sitio Biri; that he immediately left to verify with Juanita Acang, Ponciano Esplano, Maximo Balicas, Francisco Ambede, Enrique Adayo and Catalino Deguinoy as his companions; that when he saw the man sprawled on his face had ammunitions on his waist, he concluded that he was a dead soldier; that then he looked for a baroto for going to town to report to the Mayor and that from the house of the Mayor he went to this Garrison to report that there is a dead soldier at Sitio Biri. (Apolonio Adigue's affidavit marked "G" is hereto attached.)

CONCLUSIONS: The possibility of a foul play as the proximate or immediate cause of death of Sgt. Albina and Pvt. Obon is dismissed. The autopsy of Dr. Valerie Adigue, CO., Clearing Hospital, proves that the injuries sustained by the deceased were caused by sharpnels. Pvt. Obon was seen by Tito Cebrices (Affidavit marked "D") to have with him, when he dropped at the house of Juanita Acang, a Japanese mortar shell in his left hand and when he left the house fellow Sgt. Albina he was also seen carrying the same mortar shell. Damaso Adal testified (Affidavit marked "C") that he gave a Japanese mortar shell to Sgt. Albina and Pvt. Obon when they called at his house looking for ammunitions supposedly in the possession of civilians. None of the witnesses summoned to this Garrison for investigation could testify that he or she saw the actual tragedy.

How the shell exploded, is beyond the comprehension of everyone. But is not it possible that the Japanese mortar shell was mechanically defective that a little jerk would cause it to explode; that the trail being slippery because of the rain, Pvt. Obon stumbled down upon the shell with such a force as to cause it to explode?

The undersigned is of the opinion, and so holds and concludes that the death of Sgt. Luis Albina and Pvt. Gonzalo Obon was accidental. It was one of those things that happen when least expected.

RECOMMENDATION: Sgt. Luis Albina and Pvt. Gonzalo Obon died, as soldiers they should have died, in strict compliance with and obedience to lawful orders of their superior officers. They should, therefore, be considered to have died in the line of duty. As such, their survivors should be compensated consistent with law or laws providing for such compensation to survivors to deceased soldiers.

Sgt. LUIS ALBINA, is survived by Mrs. Donata Albina, wife, and Sergia Albina, daughter, both resident at Borongan, Samar. He was inducted by Major Aurelio Ramas on 1 June '44, as Sergeant, Infantry. Mrs. Donata Albina is going to deliver another child next month.

Pvt. GONZALO OBON, is survived by Roberto Obon, father, and brothers and sisters, all of whom are residents at the Municipality of Borongan, Samar. He was inducted private by the undersigned 28 May '44 and served for the most part as Courier and Operative. Although he had been in this Unit since the early part of February, he could not be included in the roster of 15 February '45 because then he had no arm yet. Neither was he included in the Initial-Special-Final Roster as of 13 March '45 no authority had then been obtained for such inclusion pursuant to par. 2, Memorandum dated 21 Feb. '45, that Headquarters.

ROMAN DISCAR and MANUEL CATAGUE, both members of "A" Co. of this Regiment, deserted their posts and went to the house of Remegio Julaton and drink tuba. While drunk they get into trouble and there after, Discar fired at Catague several times. The former after shooting the latter and believing that the victim was already dead presented himself to Lt. Angel dela Pena at Barrio Tarabucan, Oquendo, Samar. The body of the victim was found still alive by the soldiers of Lt. Dela Pena and was at once brought to the Regimental Aid Station at Oquendo for Medical treatment, and died on the same day.

2. Attached Autopsy and Affidavits signed by Messers. Enelio Dogalis, Remegio Julaton, Leon Bellarino and Miss Bonifacia Macajesus, which are self-explanatory, and sketch of the scene of the crime, with sketch of the cadaver showing the location of the wounds.

3. The body of the victim was buried in the Roman Catholic Cemetery, Oquendo, Samar. The murderer is in confinement in the Municipal Jail of Oquendo under proper guard.

Unluckily however, they were seen by enemy snipers of about 5 Japs and were fired at. Pvt. Hoyla was hit immediately at the right hip and he ran to call for help. Pvt. Madobla was hit at the abdomen and because he could not run he just drop to the ground and returned fire. The Japs hit him again at the left hip and throw him a grenade, sharpnel of which hit him at the right hip. He continued firing until the Japs retreated and left him alone. He crawled with the help of pointed bamboo sticks until help came to him.

They were caught unaware due to darkness and their foxhole was close to the bushes only around 3 yards, thus giving good chance for the Japs to get into the foxhole within a short time. 4 Japs fought against Pvt. C. Catingub inflicting Catingub 6 wounds due to bayonet thrusts and one bullet wound. Cpl. T. Fernandez battled out for the other 3 Japs, luckily he made a good escape unscratched and went out to the middle of the bridge and commanded fire to the rest of the squad to save Pvt. C. Catingub. After firing for several minutes the Japs run away to mountain.

1. Enemy in small groups are being reported from time to time to have appeared in the hills of barrios polahongon and pinamonoan, Abuyog, Leyte.

2. Likewise in the hills west of the Abuyog-Baybay road, principally in barrios odiong and carayi, enemies are still found in groups. On February volunteer guards of carayi killed 1 Jap out of 5 who were surprised near the foot of the hills.

3. In pinamonoan, Abuyog, near boundary to sogod, some 16 to 20 Japs robbed foods from civilians and one man was reported killed.

4. In an encounter with these same enemy in southern Abuyog, Corporal Remojo and Vol. guard Capt. Filomino Dador died in action on 8th February, '45. Immediately 31 men composing the 3rd platoon of this Company were sent there under Lieutenant Kanen to mop up these stray enemies, who are causing much trouble there to our civilians.

5. These Japs according to reliable reports are still well armed specially with their 38 caliber automatic rifles like that of the Tommy guns. Estimates of Japs around the hills within the jurisdiction of Abuyog is around 100 still.



1. This Headquarters requests a clear definition or opinion re status of personnel actively participating with the guerilla who were killed in action before they were processed or taken into the regular force. Particularly involved in this case are two enlisted men under this command, pvt. Dominador Caboboy and Alfonso Lauzon, who were killed during the encounter with the enemy at Sitio Malidong Data, Lope de Vega, this province, on 16 April '45. Pertinent papers to this effect have already been forwarded to the CO, 93rd Division, SAC.

2. When the elements of this command left the islands of Burias and Ticao, they were made to understand that they were to proceed to Calbayog, Samar to be processed. But upon arrival and before not one of them was processed, an order was received from the CO, 1st Fil Inf thru CO, 93rd Div, SAC to take the field immediately and to send 50 men to Lope de Vega where the enemies were concentrated, whether processed or not. The men were reluctant to go much that they need a little rest, and more so because they were not yet processed. But order is order - we took the field. The loyalty of our men has been once again demonstrated. The detail left for their station. They fought the enemy. Two of them died - but how about their status? What reliefs are expected for their families?

3. For the good of the service, for the satisfaction of parents and relatives of those who died in action, and to bolster up the weakening morale of the men, this Headquarters further requests that immediate attention be given this matter.
