GENERAL ORDER,
NO. 171

1. Par. 4, G. O. no. 15, headquarters, USAFIF, NL, 29 August 1944 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4. 2. The Third District, USAFIF, NL will extend from the Tagudin-Cervantes road, exclusive, north to include the provinces of Ilocos Sur (north of the Tagudin-Cervantes road), Abra and Ilocos Norte.

b. The commanding officer, Second-Third District will further sub-divide the Third District into two sub-sectors, i.e. north sub-sector and south sub-sector. The exact details of the sub-division of the Third District will be reported to this headquarters.

c. The commanding officer of the south sub-sector of the Third District to be the commanding officer of the north sub-sector of the Third District to be the commanding officer, 15th Infantry (PA)

2. The commanding officer, Second-Third District will organize a headquarters and staff, to be hereafter designated as Headquarters 2nd and 3rd District, USAFIF, NL, independent of 121st Infantry (PA) and the 15th Infantry (PA). Authorized strength of officers and enlisted personnel will be that of a regimental headquarters, P.A. plus such additional service and communication personnel as recommended by the commanding officer 2nd-3rd District and approved by this headquarters.

3. The 2nd Bn, 12th Infantry, P.A. (Ilocos Norte) is hereby redesignated as 15th Infantry.

4. Effective upon receipt of this order, the heading, signature rank and organization in all communication from said headquarters will be in the clear with the exception of intelligence agents. Important secret information in the body of a communication will, however be in code.

1. Effective on receipt of this order, all troops will assemble into company or platoon camps. All officers and enlisted personnel will be present for duty twenty-four hours a day, i.e. all personnel will live with their respective units.

2. Passes and leave of absence will only given under extreme emergency and then only when approved by District, Regimental or Battalion Commanders.

3. All personnel, except when engaged on mission, will undergo rigid training of not less than eight hours daily. Training emphasis will be placed on the following:

a. Disciplinary subjects:

Drill, close order... not to exceed 20 min. daily max.
Drill, extended order
Physical training... 1st half hour daily,
Inspections ... daily
Guard and Out Post Duty

b. Technical Subjects:

Weapons (rifle, auto rifle, pistol) care and cleaning
Field fortifications, i.e. hasty fox holes
Demolitions
Rifle Marksmanship (dry run exercises)

c. Tactical Subjects:

Scouting and patrolling
Combat Principles, to include security measures,
Squad, Platoon and Company.
Field exercises and problems
Night operations

4. Training directive for Hospital and Medical Companies will be published at a later date.

5. District, Regimental and Battalion Commanders will make such inspections and will cause such inspections to be made by members of their staffs to insure the provisions of this order are being carried out and will make necessary corrections in training procedure to insure that the highest state of efficiency is reached by all troops in the shortest possible time.

6. All Headquarters and troop camps will establish and maintain rigid and efficient outpost systems. Personnel on guard and on outpost duty will be inspected by an officer at frequent intervals to insure that men on duty are alert and not sleep on post. (In this connection frequent inspections will be made between retreat and midnight, and midnight and reveille as well as during day light hours.) After personnel have been properly instructed in their duties, harsh disciplinary measures will be taken against personnel found not to be alert on duty or sleeping on post. In addition to an outpost system every Headquarters and troop camp will prepare plans for local defense measures of their respective camps in case of enemy raid thereon. These defensive plans should be drawn with the view to ambushing and totally destroying the view of inflicting severe losses on larger enemy patrols.

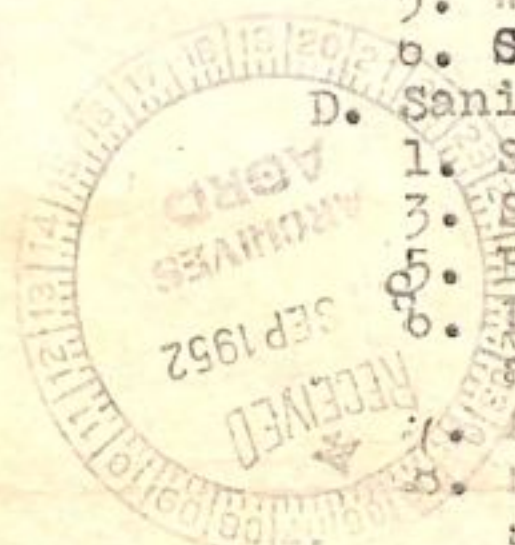





Before any new men are taken into the organization; any "loose parts" that you may at present have in your organizations, provided such personnel is physically fit for combat service will be accommodated. One example of what "loose parts" has reference to, is male intelligence personnel who are no longer of any value as intelligence personnel. Another example, civilian employees whom you may have who are other than intelligence agents.

c. In the near future it is contemplated that the following additional organizations will be authorized:

(1) A Signal Company for each District of USAFIP, NL. Personnel now functioning in existing land message centers will be members of these organizations. Hence, it is not necessary that your message center personnel be included as members of your Regiment.

(2) An Intelligence Company for each District, USAFIP, NL. Into this Company will be placed your agents who are not capable as combat personnel and who are not authorized as a part of your Regiment as prescribed in the enclosed GO.
