INTELLIGENCE REPORTS

1. General provisions. (a) District Commanders will submit to this Headquarters or directly to the Chief Intelligence Section, a complete S-2 report each month covering their respective districts. This report will be submitted so as to reach the Chief Intelligence section on or before the twentieth (20th) of each month. (b) District Commanders will submit informally each week, intelligence information. The weekly informal reports will include all intelligence items that come to their attention, within and outside of their respective districts.

2. Additional S-2 Reports: The following additional areas will be covered and reported on separately each month by the indicated Dist. Comdrs. These reports will be submitted so as to reach the Chief Intelligence Sec. on or before the twentieth (20th) of each month.

- a. First Dist: (1) Pangasinan, from Highway #3 (incl) east (2) Bontoc.
- b. Second Dist: (1) Pangasinan from Highway #3 (excl) West. (2) Kalinga.
- c. Third Dist: Cagayan from Highway #5 (incl) west (2) Apayao (After Fourth Dist. becomes active, Third Dist. will cover only its own area.
- d. Fourth Dist: (1) Dist. area only.\*
- e. Fifth Dist: (1) Nueva Ecija as far south as S. Jose. (2) Baler Area. (3) Casiguran Area. (4) Cagayan E of Highway #5 (excl) Aparri (incl) south. (When Fourth Dist. becomes active the Fifth Dist. will be relieved of prov. (4)).
- f. Sixth Dist: (1) Nueva Ecija (their Dist. Area will probably be Pang. east of Hwy. #3)\*.
- g. Seventh Dist: District area only.

3. The S-2 Reports mentioned in Pars. 1 and 2 above will be submitted in the form shown on the attached sheet.

4. The Intelligence Section USFIP, NL., will provide such special details to cover other sectors of Luzon in accordance with orders issued by the Chief Intell. Sec.

GENERAL ORDERS  
NO.....8

1. In order to facilitate the handling of administrative matters, the provisions of this order will be effective upon the cessation of hostilities or as soon thereafter as possible within respective districts of USFIP, NL.

2. DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS: District Commanders will establish and maintain their Dist. Headquarters at the Capital of the province within their respective Dist. (Second-Third within Second Dist; Fifth Dist. N.V.). If for any reason it becomes necessary to move said Headquarters, this fact will be reported to this Headquarters at once, and necessary arrangements will be made to insure continuous communications until this Headquarters may re-route communications to the new Headquarters location.

3. LOCATION OF UNITS: Units under respective Dist. Commanders will be concentrated at various places throughout their Dist. as dictated by the problems of supply and admin. and the desires of the Dist. Commanders.

4. CONDUCT: Units will not be disbanded nor allowed to roam at will. During this period Officers, NCOs will be held strictly responsible for the conduct and activities of the members of their respective commands.

5. Bandits etc.: Bandits, spies, etc. that are apprehended will not be executed, but will be held for proper investigation and trial.

6. ROSTERS: Dist. Commanders will submit rosters of officers and men by units. The first roster will be submitted at the earliest possible time and at the end of each month thereafter.

7. RECEIPTS: District Commanders will take necessary measures to make and compile duplicate copies of all Government Receipts issued within their Dist. This includes receipts issued by other units. These receipts will be held at the respective Dist. Headquarters pending further instructions from this Headquarters.

8. SERVICE RECORDS: District Commanders will issue necessary orders to insure that each Company has an up-to-date service record on each and every man. All remarks involving financial settlements must be accurate and initialed by the officer entering the remark.

9. CITATIONS: District Commanders will compile and keep on file recommendations for citations of members of their command and deserving civilians.

10. REPORTS: Each company will submit, thru Dist. Commanders, a summary report covering all important actions (engagements with the enemy etc.) of their respective units. Although these reports should be brief, they should cover date, place of action, nature of action, results and the name of officer or NCO in charge.

11. ARMS: Each company will make and keep on file a record of all fire-arms (by serial number) held by members of the unit.

L-DAY AND L PLUS DAY MISSIONS

GENERAL MISSIONS:

1. To destroy enemy lines of communications; i.e. roads, bridges, telephones and telegraph lines.
2. To harass, delay, if possible, destroy all enemy troop and supply movements.
3. To destroy enemy supply dumps, truck parks, troop concentrations, and command posts.
4. To prevent the enemy from securing locally food supplies, materials (bridge and road, etc.), labor and means of transportation (i.e. cargadores, horses, carts, trucks, etc.).
5. To be ready to carry out the above missions by September, 1, 1944 (i.e. reconnaissance, plans, formulated orders, detailed instructions, training, assembled materials, supply details, etc. must be completed by 1 September 1944).

SECTION - VII  
(Seventh Dist.)

FIRST PHASE (To be carried out on Orders)

Task 1. Bontoc - Bagabag Rd.

- a. Destroy one bridge and block road in two or more places between Bagabag and Banaue and leave detachment in vicinity of Lamut with mission of:
  - (1) Harassing enemy's attempt to open road.
  - (2) To harass enemy troop movements.
  - (3) Report any enemy info to higher Hq.
- b. Destroy or block road in two or more places from Kianganto to Lamut.
- c. Block road in two or more places between Banaue and Talubin; also destroy bridge in vicinity of Talubin and leave thereat a detachment with mission of: (same as 1. a. above).

Task 2. Bontoc - Sabangan Rd.

Destroy small bridges and tunnels.

Task 3. Bontoc - Lubuagan - Enrile Rd. and trail

- a. Block or destroy road in two or more places between Bontoc and Lubuagan.
- b. Block or destroy road in two or more places between Lubuagan and Enrile.

Task 4. Be prepared to take over from Fifth District the following:

Destroy or block road in three places between Bagabag and Santiago and leave thereat a strong detachment with mission of

Santiago and leave thereat a strong detachment with mission of: same as l.a. above.

### SECTION VIII

#### SECOND PHASE

1. To harass and delay enemy movements throughout Dist. and to report to HQ USATIP, NL (thru channels) all enemy movements and action that is being taken against this movement.
2. To attack and destroy such objectives as ordered by HQ USATIP, NL or Dist. Hq (See Gen. Mission).

### SECTION - IX GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Re first phase, in areas where it is impossible or inadvisable to destroy bridge or road beds, the following methods maybe employed:
  - a. Fall large trees at close intervals along a Km. or more of the road.
  - b. Cause slides by blasting, at deep cuts. Where this is done details must be available to harass the enemy in the event they attempt to clear Rd. These methods should not be looked upon as desirable where it is possible to either destroy a bridge or the road bed.
2. Avoid dissipating your commands in small groups. Is so far as the situation and missions permit keep units intact and together.
3. All Companies and Bns. must be prepared to move with one week's rations on call. They should have definite and workable plans to continue to supply their units on extended missions.
4. Enemy information, in as much detail as possible, must be continually be forwarded from lower units to the next higher units, Co. and Bn. Hq. that this information passes thru will, in the absence of special orders initiate appropriate action, notifying the next higher Hq. of action taken.
5. The name, rank and organization of the Officer immediately in charge of the tasks listed herein under FIRST PHASE, will be submitted to this Hq. on or before Sept. 1, 1944. Thereafter any change of task will be submitted without delay.

2. The following designations ~~xxx~~ of message centers as established, or to be established as indicated, are as follows:
  - a. 5MC-1 GNT.. VIA?G UBAMA
  - b. 5MC-2 RPT.E .NRPA VCP AY K.AA
  - c. 5MC-3 For the 3rd Bn; place to be reported in code.
  - d. 5MC-4 .TV GANAN BHAL
  - e. 5MC-5 For the Hq Bn place to be reported in code.
  - f. 5MC-6 For the 1st Bn; place to be reported in code.

3. Designation numbers of relay stations between message centers will be based from the message center more distant from this HQ. For example, relay stations between 5MC-2 ~~KRS-XIXXIXNE~~ ~~KAXXEMG-2(RS-2)XTNTYIXXAAABNYXNXX~~ and 5MC-1 would be designated as 5MC-2(RS-1) TCAA NMPAP 5MC-2 (Rs-2) TACNE AA 5MC-2(RS-3) TNT,I AAABN NAS etc., instead of 5MC-1(RS-1) TNT,I AAABN NAS etc. That is, Bn Comdrs will be responsible in establishing relay stations from their message centers to the next message center closer to this HQ.

4. Bn Comdrs may expand the numbering of the relay stations between their headquarters or message centers and their company's Hq in like process, as relay stations of Company He to 5MC-4 would be designated as 5MC-4(HRS-1), etc.

5. Bn Comdrs at the earliest possible time will submit to this HQ the following:
  - a. A sketch route map showing the location of all relay stations and their message centers with their designations in their respective areas. (Names of places will be in code.)
  - b. Name, in code, of the NCO in-charge.
  - c. Hiking hours between adjacent message centers and relay station.
  - d. Number of runners (messengers) in each message center and relay station. (Pursuant to S.O. No. 3, HQ-1122, CS, runners will go in pair. A minimum number of six (6) EM each MC and RS will be sufficient.

6. Any change in the location of msg centers and relay stations and their corresponding changes in the designation should be reported.
